I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 70054/1919 dated Dec. 12th and its enclosure.

I note that if the nurse is required to look after my wife on the journey, she will require to obtain a medical certificate to this effect, but as the nurse is required to take care of a baby about two months old, surely this will not be necessary and I should like to hear from you again on the subject as it must be obvious that a baby of that age cannot travel without a nurse without a medical certificate to say so.

Dear Gentlemen,

I am directed by Viscount Milner to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 13th of Dec., and to inform you that it is now too late

for you to apply under the East Africa Land Settlement Scheme in this country, but that application may still be made to the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate for consideration in the event of any of the farms reserved for ex-service men and women remaining unallotted as a result of the lottery already held.

2. The enclosed leaflet shows the ordinary arrangements for the alienation of Crown land in the Protectorates. These arrangements will be resumed after the conclusion of the Land Settlement Scheme, but it is improbable that any Crown land will be available for alienation for some time.

3. For general information as to prospects and conditions in the Protectorate, you should apply to the Overseas Settlement Office, 59, Victoria Street, London, S.W.1.
