The proposed re-organisation of the provincial administration and the position of the Chief Native Commissioner were discussed with Mr. Martin at a Conference in Mr. Bottomley's room on the 30th January.

## STATUTE NOTICE NO. 500.

## ORGANISATION

NOTIFICATION that a redistribution  
of Native Areas approved by Government  
of Kenya and will come into operation on

the 1st day of October, 1929, and that the new administrative areas  
will be known as the Native Areas of the Province of  
Kenya.

The Native Areas of the Province of Kenya will be  
arranged in Provinces under the name and title of Native Areas.

It is the intention of Native Areas under the  
Native Areas Act, 1928, to provide for the  
protection of Native Settlements, Native  
Land and the development of Native Areas  
and it has become desirable to form a Native Reserve  
Districts and Native Settlements, Native Areas  
and Native Land boundaries, and to define  
the boundaries between them. Government has therefore  
arranged Native Areas where geographically possible, as follows:

It is not at present advisable, and  
therefore, to include Nairobi, Naivasha and Machakos are not  
at the time being, whereas the old Fort Hall and  
Machakos Districts are divided into two Native Reserve  
Districts, and one Non-Native District within the same Province.  
Again, it is not possible at present to incorporate the  
Districts of Naivasha and Laikipia with any Native Reserve  
Districts, as they have been done in our Province.

It is, however, the case that, pending the completion of district boundary demarcation, certain administrative arrangements already in force must remain with that sanction only.

Thus the Nairobi District is to be taken, pending official gazetttement, as the area of the Nairobi District Council, the Nakuru and Kericho Districts, as the Nyeri District Council and the Uasin Gishu District, as the Uasin Gishu District Council are. In order to enable magisterial jurisdiction to continue to be exercised as at present, magistrates will, where necessary, be given general jurisdiction over a group of districts, and as soon as possible district boundaries will be formally re-gazetted.


