3. As you are aware from my Confidential telegram No. 209 of the 13th December regarding the appointment of Mr. C.R. Lockhart, C.B.E., as Financial Secretary, the question of the reorganisation of the Central Government of this Colony now forms the subject of consideration by my Executive Council. Pending a final decision in this matter it is regretted that it has not yet seen possible to repart to you, as required by your Confidential despatch of the 23rd September, 1936, what measure of reorganisation is proposed in respect of the Treasury Department.

It is observed from your Confidential despatch of the 4th December that you have made certain proposals to the Governor of Uganda regarding the staffing of the Accountant General's Department. While it has not yet been decided that such a Department shall be formed in this Colony I am prepared to agree provisionally that your proposals would be suitable for adoption in so far as Kenya is concerned whether the Treasury Department is to remain as at present organised or.
