Sir,

When Mr. Ainsworth was in Nairobi at the beginning of the month, I discussed with him the question of proclaiming the Districts of Kisumu and South Kavirondo (or Ureya) provisional native reserves and closed districts.

Mr. Ainsworth is very anxious to have the boundaries of these districts gazetted as soon as possible as difficulties are frequently experienced by the Police and by the Administration owing to no ruling having been given on this matter. But at the present time it is even more important that the two districts should be closed. Gold and graphite have recently been discovered South of Kisumu and a few claims have already been pegged out. If the gold find turns out to be a valuable one there will be a rush, and it is most important that prospectors and others should be provided with permits before they are allowed to wander over the country. Both districts are densely populated. Kisumu district covers an area of 1,200 square miles and has a population of

250,000 inhabitants; South Kavirondo is 4,000 square miles in size with 200,000 inhabitants. The revenue from the tax collected in these two districts last year amounted to close on Rs. 400,000.

In course of time when we know of the country it will be possible to split up the districts into definite native reserves, but until a survey has been made this is impossible. It would be most useful if a reconnaissance survey could be made of Kisii as a start, and I have the honour to suggest that the Director of Surveys be approached to ascertain whether this is possible. Kisii covers an area of about 500 square miles and has a population of about 70000.

I enclose herewith two draft proclamations for His Excellency's signature, one proclaiming the Districts of Kisumu and South Kavirondo closed districts, and the other excluding certain areas from these closed districts. I am aware that it is necessary to submit to the Secretary of State the boundaries of districts and native reserves before they are gazetted, but in view of the urgency of this matter I would ask that the two districts be proclaimed closed districts in next Official Gazette and the matter reported home.
