

Sir,

I have the honour to request that the Colonial Office be approached with a view to the appointment of a Medical Officer to succeed the late Dr. Baker, on as early a date as possible. Owing to the vacancies in the staff it was not possible to detail an Officer to carry on the work of the Sleeping Sickness Camp, and it has had, therefore, to be closed down. All the work and initial expenditure in connection with it has been thus rendered useless, and will have to be commenced over again, when the camp is re-started.

2. While on this subject I have the honour to draw your attention to the fact that no intimation has been received regarding the second Medical Officer for the Sleeping Sickness Camp: nor for the appointment of a successor to Nursing Sister Dunne, nor for the new appointment of a Nursing Sister.
