Asians happy in Rhodesia says M.P.

The British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, said yesterday that it was impossible to judge the relations in Rhodesia because they were based on repression.

He was replying in Parliament to a Conservative M.P., Mr. John Biggs-Davison, who said race relations in Rhodesia remained good and that no Asians there were seeking entry into Britain.

He was referring to a threatened exodus of Asian holders of British passports in East Africa because of new trading and other regulations.

Mr. Biggs-Davison urged the Government to consider constructively any proposals received from the Rhodesian leader, Mr. Smith.

The Prime Minister assured Parliament he would do so, and added: "I do not think it possible to judge the state so far as all race relations there are based on repression."

Asked about the imprisoned African nationalist leader, the Rev. Ndatshani Sithole, he said: "I do not know anything useful about him at this stage about all could be the charges against him, and the nature of his proceedings."

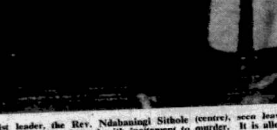

MR. PRAFUL PATEL BARRED IN KENYA

Kenya's Vice-President, Mr. Moi, yesterday declared the secretary of the United Kingdom Citizens Committee, Mr. Praful Patel, barred from entering Kenya within 24 hours.

Mr. Moi recalled that in a statement on January 13 he warned the Association of British Citizens and the United Kingdom Citizens Committee to stop activities in Kenya, failing which the Government would take action.

"It appears that this warning has not been heeded and the attention of the Government has been drawn to the presence in Kenya of Mr. Praful Patel of the United Kingdom Citizens Committee," Mr. Moi said.

"Attention has also been drawn to the Press statement which Mr. Praful Patel made on arrival."

"I would like to reiterate what I have already said, that the Government will tolerate no racialist pressure group activities in Kenya."

25 KILLED IN GOLD MINE BLAST

HUNGRY VIETCONG HOLD U.S. ATTACK

A ragged band of North Vietnamese and Vietcong, reported to be holding out in a phou village after three days of attack by American tanks, guns and aircraft.

South Vietnam's Prime Minister, Mr. Tran Van Hung, yesterday said he was "pessimistic about the outcome of the Paris talks" on Vietnam. This was because of the "stubbornness" of the Communists, he told reporters.

Replying to questions, he confirmed that replacement of United States troops by South Vietnamese forces was now being considered, but would take place "gradually from a date and according to a timetable which would have to be agreed by the U.S. Commander, Gen. Creighton Abrams, and the South Vietnamese Chief of Staff, Gen. Cao Van Vien."

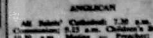

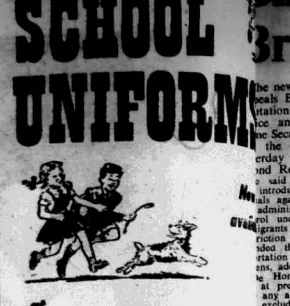

Two-way trade rise

As a foundation member—since 1947—of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, Australia has for many years subscribed to the principles of multilateral trading. An important advantage to

Australia, and other G.A.T.T. members, is that a setback in demand for major commodities traded internationally in any particular market can be offset readily against increases in demand in other. Today Australian industry—both manufacturing and primary—is exporting to markets around the world and constantly seeking new outlets.

Equally important, Australia recognises the need to provide a market for the export industries of other countries.

The Australian trade mission which visited Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and Zambia in recent months reported that many of these countries could increase their exports to Australia and thus strengthen the developing trade bonds with Australia.

Australia is a major importer of important Eastern African export commodities. In 1967/68 total imports into Australia of tea, coffee, sisal, tobacco and edible nuts were worth \$60,500,000 of which Eastern African countries supplied \$4,400,000.

In addition to the existence of this large "commercial" market Australia has introduced a special tariff preference scheme to assist African and other developing countries. This tariff preference scheme is directed especially at assisting manufacturing industries including handicrafts in developing countries.

Countries in East Africa which require additional information on the Australian scheme should contact the Australian Trade Commissioner, Mr. R. S. Barham.

In addition to providing improved access to markets Australia is willing to facilitate contact between exporters and importers. Again the Australian Trade Commissioner can be contacted if assistance is required.

The Australian Trade Mission also reported that significant changes are taking place in the commercial field in Eastern Africa particularly in the need for closer contact between people at all levels of commerce and industry in Australia and the countries visited.

Not only are Australian businessmen finding it necessary to visit Africa but also they are anxious to see more African businessmen visiting Australia.

It was a welcome event to have our Minister for Agriculture from Kenya, Mr. Bruce McKenzie, visit Australia in November last.

AUSTRALIA DAY IN KENYA

During his visit, Mr. McKenzie held discussions with experts in the fields of agriculture and bulk storage and handling with the objective of identifying areas of Australian knowledge that could contribute to Eastern African development.

Mr. McKenzie understood that Mr. McKenzie found a great deal of interest in Australia. Australia is looking forward to 1969 to additional visits of both officials and businessmen from Eastern Africa, including Zambia.

Metals benefit flow from personal contacts of this type. For example, Australia has benefited from the adaptation of indigenous grasses from the Kenyan highlands Australian eucalyptus, Macadamia trees and wattle are now well known throughout Africa and contribute to the forest and productive resources.

The wide range of geographic conditions in Australia has resulted in the development of agricultural techniques and machinery that will benefit rural production in Africa. This knowledge is now becoming widely appreciated in many countries around the world.

Scientific research is also developing products which may make a big contribution to the nutritional requirements of African countries.

The Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (C.S.I.R.O.) has developed milk products which can be kept for long periods and easily transported over great distances without special or expensive handling techniques. An example of this is the milk biscuit which contains many of the nutritional qualities of fresh milk and is extremely palatable.

Australia is a net importer of capital but would welcome more joint venture inquiries from Eastern African businessmen. Australian production techniques are generally regarded as being more suitable to the conditions existing in African countries, at their present stage of development, than those of many other major industrialised countries.

Production techniques in Australia are naturally geared to meet a variety of conditions especially of

the more rugged kind and these should be capable of meeting the requirements of African countries, particularly in building and construction, agriculture and motor vehicle maintenance.

Shipping companies operating between Australian ports and Dar es Salaam and Mombasa have anticipated the need for faster and larger capacity vessels and it is therefore timely that new ships will be introduced into the service during 1969.

Australian exports to East Africa while still relatively small in value are now expanding both in range and volume. The table below demonstrates the nature of the development of trade.

Australia is looking forward to the sixties with an expectation that trade will develop to our mutual advantage and that Australian exports and investments in joint ventures will make a useful contribution to the development needs of East African countries.

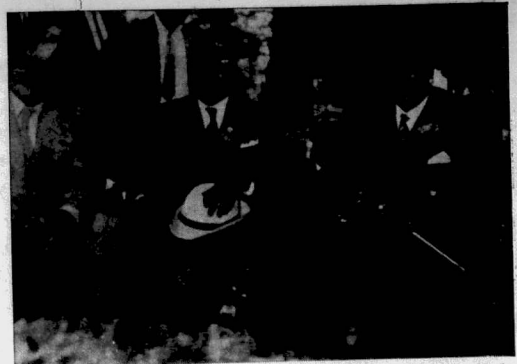

IMPORT THE BIRD—EXPORT THE PRODUCT

The little bird which sits on a million tons of polish is known as an inhabitant of New Zealand, which often leads to some confusion. For although the bird is a Kiwi, the company which makes him world famous is as Australian as the Koala bear.

A woman must take the credit for this rather unusual state of affairs. It was Mrs. William Ramsay, wife of the man who invented manufacturing Kivis boot polish in 1906.

She hailed from New Zealand and came to Australia after marrying in 1901. Five years later, when the new type of polish was ready to be launched on the market, a name was required.

Mr. Ramsay discussed the problem with his wife and she suggested Kiwi, in honour of her own origin. Not only did the Kiwi make a neat and attractive brand symbol, but the name was easy to pronounce and read in most languages.

These factors no doubt contributed to the widespread acceptance the product was to receive across the world. Today Kiwi polish is being sold in 102 countries and manufactured in 16, including Kenya.

Manufacturing operations began in Nairobi in 1962 and today a full range of shoe polishes are made here for sale in the three East African countries and for export to Ethiopia and Somalia.

Kivi Home Products (East Africa) Ltd. has built up a local company, Kivitek Chemicals Ltd., to produce and market the polishes, to find and carry out with the marketing of floor polishes and insecticides. However, no good business stands still and more products are being added continually to the range. These

currently include a toilet cleaner, disinfectant and Bleach. The local company employs about 40 staff, more than 80 per cent of whom are local citizens.

Despite the varied climates and many languages of the countries in which Kivi products are distributed the original design is immediately recognised and accepted by the people of every nation.

Who would have saved from extinction by enlightened Government action it is still a rarity even in New Zealand. The export of Kiwis and their eggs is prohibited.

The talons body of the Kiwi is covered by a thick mat of hair-like feathers beneath which hide its tiny, useless wings.

Although the Kiwi is smaller than a domestic fowl the female bird manages to lay an egg five times larger than a normal hen's egg. Having accomplished this prodigious feat she then takes no further interest and leaves the male bird to do the hatching.

Unlike most birds the nostrils of the Kiwi are situated at the end of its long beak. By thrusting its beak into the ground the Kiwi sends the worms on which it feeds. The bird is largely dependent upon its sense of smell since it has extremely poor eyesight, being a nocturnal animal.

There are very few live Kiwis outside New Zealand and even stuffed examples are comparatively rare. Indeed, in most countries of the world the most readily available example of the remarkable Kiwi is on the lid of a tin of the equally remarkable product that bears its name.

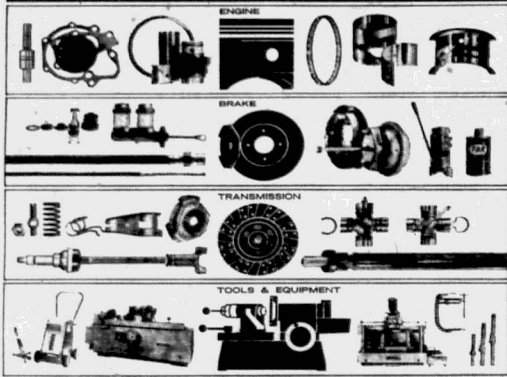

Saving time by bulk handling

There are few farm crops today which are not handled in bulk, at least from the point of harvest until the time they reach the consumer.

Looking at progress of current research programmes it seems likely that in ten years' time, at the least, techniques will be available for handling all crops in bulk, including soft fruits, such as peaches and grapes and vegetables such as tomatoes.

In Australia, the wheat industry provides one of the best examples of the use of bulk handling. Bulk harvesters on farms has been the common practice for more than a decade.

A typical bulk harvester may be either tractor drawn or have its own power engine. It has a width of cut of 16 feet, with big models taking up to 22 feet a time, giving a harvesting rate of ten to 11 acres an hour.

Cutting heights may range from a few inches off the ground for a storm damaged or rangled crop to more than three feet, the threshed grain being fed into a centrally mounted bin holding nearly 100 bushels. When the bin is full discharge is by auger into a bulk

wheat truck which takes the grain direct to grain silos at the local railway siding.

The only time that most Australian wheat farmers handle grain in bags is during sowing, but even this practice is being challenged by a few innovators who see no reason for doing any job by hand if it can be done more quickly and cheaply, and with less fatigue, through mechanisation.

For example, one farmer has developed a successful sowing system in which he handles neither seed nor fertilizer. Movement of both is done in bulk. This farmer has made special equipment to fit on 12-ton tipping trucks to help him do this job.

Each truck body is divided down the centre, with one side filled with fertilizer using a self-propelled loader working from a bulk heap, and the other side filled with seed wheat delivered by a grain auger drawing from bulk grain silos.

The loaded truck is then driven to the paddock where sowing is going on, and the tipping body is elevated. In the paddock the sowing drill is raised from the truck, using engine driven augers to deliver the seed and fertilizer to the sowing boxes on the drill.

A drill can be recharged in two minutes by the method without any heavy personnel work compared with at least 10 minutes of hard work if seed and fertilizer is handled in bags.

From the wheat-growing districts grain is moved by rail to seaborard shipping terminals. To help cope with an increasing volume of traffic (the current harvest is likely to involve the movement of about 500,000,000 bushels), railway systems in Australia are introducing a new type of bulk wheat truck made from aluminium which greatly improves on previous efficiency.

The new trucks have a capacity of 2,000 bushels and a loaded weight of 57 tons. This compares with older type wagons which have a capacity of 800 bushels and a loaded weight of 22 tons.

Improvements in the bulk grain handling system do not finish with the railways. The Grain Elevators Board of New South Wales, for instance, has just completed modernisation and extension of its Sydney terminal at a cost of \$45,000,000.

The work gives the bulk terminal the capacity to ship 105,000,000 bushels of 48,000 tons annually. The maximum outloading rate is

now 3,200 tons an hour with 2,000 tons an hour being applied to the same bulk handling system.

Kenya to attend big dairy congress

Sydney, Australia, will be the venue of the 18th International Dairy Congress in October 1970 — the first International Dairy Congress to be held outside Europe.

The Congress is likely to attract up to 2,500 delegates from about 60 countries including Kenya and a committee, representative of all sections of the dairy industry in Australia, already has drawn up plans for the Congress and made bookings for the meetings and for the 45th Annual Sessions of the International Dairy Federation, which precedes the Congress by a week.

The International Dairy Congress will meet in the Sydney Opera House if it is completed in time. If not, an alternative venue has already been chosen.

The earlier meetings of the International Dairy Federation are to be held in Australia's second largest

city, Melbourne, with a population of about 2,250,000. The site for International Dairy Federation Sessions will be Clarendon House, opened on May 30, 1968, and one of the main institutions for the interchange of scientific and technological information in Australia.

Australia has one of the world's large dairying industries — she is the third largest exporter of butter in world trade — and delegates to both the International Dairy Federation Sessions and the International Dairy Congress will see the Australian industry in operation in climate, terrain and conditions vastly different from those of Europe.

Study tours throughout Australia are being planned for delegates to the Congress to enable them to see a wide cross-section of Australian dairying, and special tours have also been arranged in conjunction with the Annual Sessions of the International Dairy Federation.

Specialist committees in Australia are also working on plans for an international exhibition of dairy equipment, and of dairying films and advertising material which will be shown in conjunction with the Congress.

Livestock to suit conditions

In Australia the livestock industry is well developed and annually contributes more than \$42,000,000,000 to the gross value of rural production.

Australian farmers take great care to see their livestock look nothing in quality and a measure of their success lies in the world reputation of some of their stock which are known for their freedom from disease and high production standards.

Australia is geographically well suited for the supply of stock for the improvement of herds and flocks in developing African countries.

Australian sheep numbers are now 167,000,000 and are growing when they were first introduced. The Merino, in its strong medium, fine and superfine wools, forms all Australian sheep.

The Merino, suitably crossed

with one or more of the British breeds of sheep noted for meat-producing ability, is also the basis of Australia's large output of prime lamb.

Australia's 5,000,000 dairy cattle are descendants from European breeds, the most important of which are the Jersey, Dairy Shorthorn, Ayrshire, Friesian, Guernsey, Red Poll and Hereford.

Jerseys are the most popular dairy cattle because of their good milk production and high butter fat yields, averaging well over five per cent. Next in popularity are the Australian-developed Illawarra Shorthorns.

There are about 65,000 commercial dairy farms in Australia. Commercial cow's milk output varies greatly with breed, locality and season. Some breeds produce more than 1,000 gallons a year or 500lb butterfat. The national average production is about 400 gallons.

About 14 million of Australia's 18 million cattle are beef breeds and almost half of them are raised in the tropical State of Queensland.

While British breeds of cattle, such as Angus, Hereford and Shorthorn have been the basis of the country's cattle population, these are now being crossed with cattle evolved in Asia's tropical regions, such as Brahman and other similar breeds. The aim is a type of cattle eminently suited to increase production in Australia's tropical areas.

The Australian pig industry is composed of a large number of small producing units. There are a few pigs on many farms, but relatively few farms are devoted entirely to pig raising.

Pigs are raised in all the agricultural and dairying areas, their distribution depending mainly on food supplies from grain or skim milk rather than on climate.

Australia has an obvious interest in what goes on in the countries of Africa and has developed many strong links with many countries. This has been evident in the fields of diplomacy, trade and aid, and in exchanges of visits. On Australians, Africa's greatest impact is made by the presence in Australia of students and trainers from many African countries. There has occurred simultaneously tremendous growth in service industries, the number of school pupils has increased about 50 per cent, and the number of full-time university students by around 170 per cent.

Government spending on education has risen at a rapid rate.

In the rural sector, output has increased about 40 per cent in the last ten years, due partly to improved mechanisation but far more to intensive application of fertiliser without any increase in rainfall.

World accord for new fashion look

Vitality and originality are the essence of Australian fashion today. Sophisticated buyers from many parts of the world have found in Australian styles something new to offer their customers.

Success and the quick rise to fame of young designers have brought a sudden upsurge in the Australian fashion industry. Established manufacturing firms previously had little difficulty in selling garments which faithfully followed the trends set in the traditional fashion centres of Paris, Rome, New York and London. Their only real opposition was from "imitation" garments which had a glimmer appeal for the average woman.

The more progressive of these firms looked for and found young design talent locally and established designer ranges and new labels. For the first time in the industry, history original designs became fashion houses.

Many well established business houses took up the challenge presented by the "young movement" and kept a grip on the burgeoning fashion market.

While some top overseas designers have their styles made in Australia, others have made in Australia garments which have rarely been. Indeed the top Australian manufacturers, mostly by far the overseas "big names" selling under franchise.

International styling with a recognizable Australian look has become a fashion market overseas. Australian designers are doing enough to the established fashion centres to be aware of new developments, but are far enough away in distance and environment to see

and use them in a new perspective. An example is the use of colour. While much of the summer fabric for Australia is imported, converters are well aware that the Australian public has a subtle different taste. This would be to update the Australian look and inject a new freshness into current fashions.

An "Australian look" is particularly evident in sports and leisure wear and such merchandise has been recognized by overseas buyers as having a distinctive sales appeal. Excellence in this field is perhaps natural since the Australian market for sports and casual wear rivals the day wear field and exceeds manufacturing capacity.

Co-ordinated casual wear, knitwear and swimwear featured fashion merchandise at Australian trade fairs in Los Angeles in 1966 and 1967.

One knitwear firm created an export division following its Los Angeles success and is now selling throughout the United States, Canada and South-East Asia.

White sportswear and day dresses are the best known Australian fashion products overseas; one small field, the kangaroo for trade, is unique. Velvety, satinnable and inexpensive kangaroo fur is becoming a favourite with women in many parts of the world and two Sydney companies have won international success with kangaroo skins.

One company was awarded the F.I.R.A. trophy at the International Fur Exhibition at Frankfurt last year for craftsmanship, design and quality. The trophy was donated by the American Milk Breeders' Association.

The talent of a Melbourne girl, Prue Acton, in her early twenties has been rewarded by her designs becoming best sellers in the United States and Britain, where the

garments are made under licence by designer, Trent Nathan, has taken him from sports wear to high fashion styling. He is a consistent winner of awards for his avant garde styling of Australian wool fabrics.

A Melbourne designer, Norman King, who went to Australia from his native Holland, has shown her Australian collection through the Australian collection through the United States and in Britain.

Many more new names on the Australian design scene, and many manufacturers, have found ready overseas markets.

A leading Sydney manufacturer recently won a Caswell-Moore award in New York in competition with the world's top suit manufacturers. The firm, a manufacturing company selling ready-to-wear mens suits, has a reputation for leadership, but is challenged by many rivals.

In the men's wear field Australia is finding export success in knitwear, high quality shirts and slacks. High quality workmanship is essential for the Australian clothing industry. Wool takes pride of place in any discussion on Australian textiles, but the impact of the new era of synthetics has increased.

The wide range of yarns available to the textile industry has broadened the scope of the garment manufacturer, who little more than a decade ago was limited largely to wool in a wide and improved cotton fabrics in summer.

Other young Australian designers are equally well known. One, Norma Miller, who started as a seamstress with a small business, soon emerged with her still youthful, but slightly more sophisticated styling. Her garments are made under licence in Japan and are related through her department store boutiques, which have been modelled on her Australian shops. Thirty boutiques will be operating in Japan by the end of next year, and her work will also be represented in many South-East Asian countries.

Another successful Melbourne designer, Kenneth Purrie, who began designing and making women's clothing above his father's suburban men's wear shop, earned a reputation for the outdoor apparel he injected into his fashion line for the young.

Mr. Armstrong is convinced that, given this wave of popularity, there is plenty of room for other bands from Kenya to make their name. He is already making arrangements for Kenya artists to tour in Addis Ababa, which may be the basis for an exchange of performers.

Among the honours which the Abazin have received is dinner at a special festival at Asmara, and Emperor Haile Selassie, who is reported to be one of their most enthusiastic fans.

The car for special people

During the last few weeks I have devoted considerable attention to the changes which have been made to 1969 models produced by well-known car manufacturers. Within a short space of time the new family cars will appear on the roads of East Africa and the majority of motorists will be able to differentiate between last year's Peugeot 500 and the 1969 version.

This article commences with a description of a luxury car which will be imported into this country in the near future. My subject is the Lincoln Continental. Lincoln cars are made in America by the Lincoln-Mercury Division of the Ford Motor Co. and are ranked together with Cadillac as America's prestige cars. The Lincoln Continental is the most expensive of the cars produced by this manufacturer. The overall length is only four inches short of 19ft, and the body is 71 in. wide. This car is a solidly constructed and weighs over two tons.

In order to provide this enormous car with an acceptable performance, a 7.5 litre engine has been fitted. This V-8 power unit pushes out 365 b.h.p. at 4,600 r.p.m. and has excellent torque characteristics. With an engine of this size and power it is not surprising that the fuel tank has a capacity of 25 gallons.

The list of options for the Lincoln Continental is fairly short as many luxury items which cost extra on medium-priced cars are standard equipment. Automatic transmission, power-steered steering and brakes and electrically operated windows are part of the normal specification of this exclusive car. There is a choice of 22 exterior colours, including seven metallic finishes.

Considerable attention has been laid on safety in the design of the Lincoln Continental. The front end crumles progressively under impact leaving the passenger compartment comparatively unaffected. The steering column and wheel absorb much of the energy created by crash and the mirrors and rear of the car are crushable. The car is equipped with disc brakes on the front wheels and a dual hydraulic system which makes the possibility of complete braking failure a thing of the past.

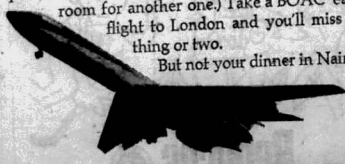

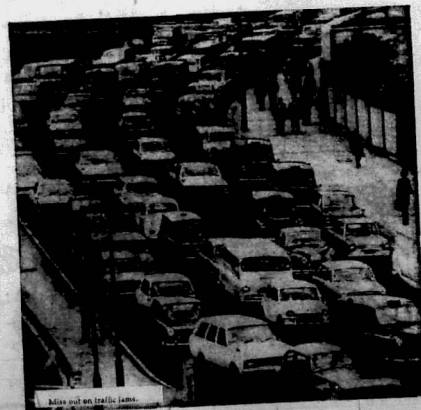

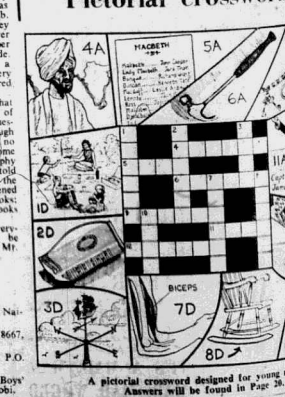

If gardens reveal the characteristics of those who created them — and I firmly believe they do — then Mrs. Desire Bayer and her husband must be one of Nairobi's most artistic couples.

Had Mr. and Mrs. Bayer planned their house and garden right down to the last shrub, it could not have been more of a haven than it is, but like many things it was built up gradually from modest beginnings. From a blank canvas to a masterpiece, one could say.

About 12 years ago, Mr. Charles Bayer, who is a shop designer, built their present home on Bernhard Estate. Shortly after, Mrs. Bayer planted a pepper tree just outside the open-plan living room, and this in my opinion is now the showpiece of the garden.

On every branch and in every nook of the tree cluster bromeliad plants, foliage plants and orchids, luscious and colourful and looking entirely natural in their abode.

To achieve this, Mrs. Bayer had bound young plants wrapped in moist paper and they had quickly established themselves, with their roots clinging to the bark.

Beyond the tree is the Bayer's swimming pool and this looks like a picture from the living room — framed by the overhanging branches of the pepper tree.

It is difficult to single out one species of plant which has emphasis in Mrs. Bayer's garden, for she has a little of much of everything: orchids, African violets, cacti, shrubs, foliage. But she is very selective, as a walk through her garden proves for every plant.

Begonia Rex, however, can be propagated in a similar way to the African violet, and Mrs. Bayer should me how. She took a medium-sized leaf from one of the plants, breaking it into...

She laid it down flat the wrong way up and with a razor cut through the five main veins of the leaf, but otherwise left it as it was and planted it in a box of moist, rich soil, with the stem sloping downwards at an angle into the soil, and the leaf held down against the earth by weight.

When propagation does occur, Mrs. Bayer explained, leaves will start to grow from each point where the main veins had been cut and also from the stem. This can then be divided up and each bit transplanted.

Once the plant is growing well, it will spread quickly and can be quite easily be divided up further.

"I had no idea what to do with the thing," she says, and though her present collection of Begonia Rex is comparatively small for an orchid grower.

She is also a member of the Horticultural Society of Kenya and is well known for her expertise in foliage and house plants. Her advice to beginners can be given in simple terms: to start with Begonia Rex, which are not difficult to grow and have very showy leaves.

She has a firm belief in the use of trial and error, and told me: "You can read all the books you like on gardening, but it is all a matter of trial and error."

Logically, she pointed out that even in a greenhouse, conditions may vary from one district to another, and one has to find out for oneself what plants are suited to the conditions prevailing.

Mrs. Bayer has many varieties of Begonia Rex which she keeps in the light, but not in a position where they would be getting direct sunlight. They are kept watered and Mrs. Bayer is careful to see that they have good drainage. Begonia Rex is a fish soil plant.

Her living-room is so built that the garden extends into it, about the size of the room. In what could almost be described as a large flower bed, Mrs. Bayer has a large variety of her most attractive plants, all pots on their own feet. The pots are arranged as she pleases, some on stands and some on the ground.

Heliconia has always fascinated me for its exotic orange bloom, used much in flower arrangements for shows, and clumps of this also used as an arrangement in the bedroom, matching those in the bathroom, matching those in the veranda, matching those in the veranda.

Of the bromeliads Mrs. Bayer has many varieties, some of the loveliest of which are *Neoregelia caroliniana* which has bright red centre leaves, and *Tillandsia*.

The current move to transfer private businesses from nationals to citizens should be phased and controlled, Sir Colin has said. He urged businessmen to maintain confidence and also to minimize the risk of citizens being thrown out of work.

The move was urged yesterday by Sir Colin, president of the Federation of Kenya Employers, at the annual general meeting of the Coast branch of the federation, held at the Oceanic Hotel.

Sir Colin was the chief speaker at the meeting, which was held to discuss all developing countries and to maintain its

foreign exchange position in balance. The confidence was, therefore, all important in this regard.

He began his speech by reminding the employers that they should not do their best if they refrained from constructive suggestions.

The federation was grateful to the Kenya Government for its willingness to listen to the thoughts of employers.

He said that, if it was accepted that the main consideration was the creation of a maximum number of employment opportunities, then he would say that the business would be a pre-requisite of the rule of law, but it is desirable that the number and complexity be kept to the minimum.

Referring to a timely and efficient manner, he added:

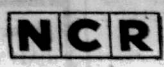

Down into the depths

MICHAEL BOYDELL describes the preparation and plans for the Kenya Sub-Aqua Club's first expedition

that normally stops water going up the nose. This is important later on in case the face mask is knocked off at a greater depth. It is only after qualifying as a competent "scorer" that a diver is allowed to put on the aqualung equipment that will enable him to stay under water at depths up to 150ft. for up to two hours.

The training, using full equipment, which all members of the club have undergone, is even more thorough and resembles a pilot's training schedule, although even beginners can go on field excursions, which are accompanied by an experienced diver; indeed, it is part of the training.

The full equipment consists of a mask, flippers and aqualung, and usually a weight belt to ensure neutral buoyancy so that the diver can sink or rise with the minimum effort.

The aqualung is, of course, the key to staying for long periods underwater, and one of the most remarkable things about it in East Africa is its price, between £30 and £35. The money received in subscriptions to the club — 100, and 25, a year — will largely go towards equipment.

In the lung, which is strapped usually in pairs, on the back of the diver, air is compressed up to 200 atmospheres, or 15 tons, a square inch, although usually half this is sufficient. At very high pressures, the lung can burst with the force of a bomb, but this never happens if the equipment is properly maintained.

The greatest depth for normal diving is 150ft, although 300ft. can be reached before "nitrogen narcosis" sets in, caused by a build-

up of nitrogen in the bloodstream through increased pressure. When this happens, divers have been known to do such irrational, and often fatal, things as offering their breathing apparatus to fish.

Another consequence of the nitrogen build-up, which can happen below 150ft., is "the bends" caused by air bubbles in the bloodstream which cause a temporary blockage of the blood vessels. Although pure oxygen is used to treat the diver, an oxygen "repatriation" effect not unlike nitrogen narcosis effect can occur.

Another must in the business of exploring the deep is to ensure that the tanks are filled with pure air delivered by a pump working to perfection. Ordinary air pumps, like those used at petrol stations, would almost certainly oil particles from the lubricating system be sent

the lung where they could cause no end of trouble.

The lung has a special device which regulates the air pressure to match that of the water, and an added advantage is that it gets lighter as the air is used up which makes the diver more buoyant when he wants to surface.

In the unlikely event of one of the lung's air lines becoming blocked, a diver can borrow the mouth piece of his co-driver on a rotation basis until both reach the surface. As part of the training as many as eight divers will sit on the bottom of the swimming pool panting round the breathing apparatus in turn — a real test of control and endurance.

All these things have been taught at the Thursday meetings and in addition lectures, especially on physiological problems, are held at alternate meetings.

When the divers make their first field exploration in the waters of Lake Chala, they will be fully experienced and equipped. The lake, which is 300ft. deep and contains a greater volume of water than any other lake in Kenya apart from Victoria and Rudolf, is something of a mystery in that it is not known from where it derives its water, although this may come from underground streams from Mount Kilimanjaro. The Sub-Aqua Club hopes to solve this mystery.

Other field trips, to places like Lake Naivasha and the Coast, where several expert divers are waiting to join them, are planned by the club.

In the meantime, the search is on for more members, until we have between 50 and 60 enthusiastic divers", as Mr. Davies puts it.



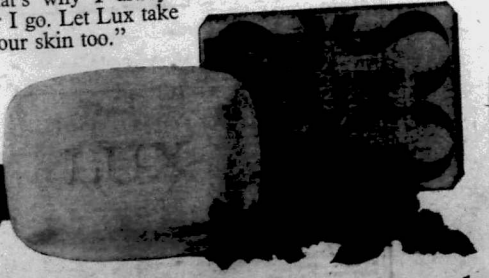

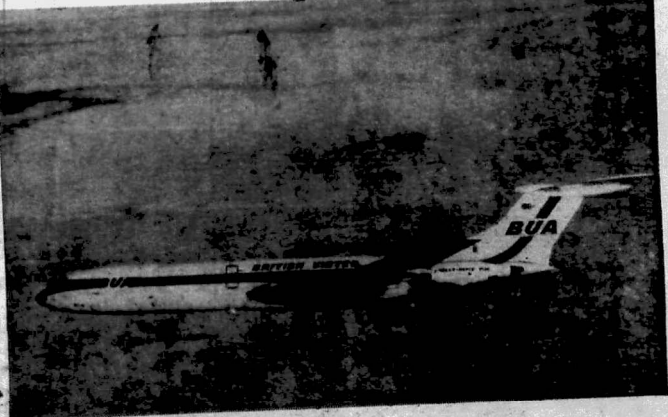

Pilot flies back seized plane

Tucked away on the right-hand side of Switzerland, Liechtenstein (65 sq. miles) is one of the smallest countries in Europe. In keeping with its size it had an army with a strength of one unit a few years ago when the men died.

Despite producing some fine postage stamps and hundreds of thousands of phonograph records it has also produced one pilot who has been seized by the Swiss.

Mr. Kurt Jaeger, 33, flew into White Airport in the aircraft which was involved in an incident in August on an attempt to land in the Central African Republic when an official was killed when he walked into the propeller of an aircraft flown by two Nairobi airmen. The two men were imprisoned and returned in December.

Mr. Jaeger said: "I am based in Lagos with Pan African Airlines, a later company of Safar Air. It was agreed that I would be the best person — as I speak French — to go to Bangui and negotiate the release of the plane. I flew there and spent five days hanging around Government offices, seeing this and that official. Finally, after passing a considerable fee, the plane was released to me."

"I flew the plane to Safar Air and it is now being stripped down for a thorough check, although most say the plane was in pretty good condition after being on this side in Bangui for six months."

Mr. Jaeger says he is the only man from Liechtenstein who is a professional pilot. There may be one or two who can fly as private pilots and there may be a couple of sports glider pilots. The State's population is 15,000.

"I had to go to Switzerland to get my basic training. Then I went to Port Harcourt, Nigeria, to get my advanced training."

"In Nigeria I have been doing what you fly and food and other goods in the liberated areas of Nigeria."

"I did not get much chance to look around. It was just a case of winging it and making it as long as I could and off again for another job."

Time for peace

Violent protest by Negroes in the United States has achieved its effect and the time has now come for peaceful consolidation, according to an American Negro Civil Rights leader who is in Nairobi as part of a tour of Africa.

The executive director of the Philadelphia office of the Urban League, a Civil Rights organization, Mr. Andrew G. Freeman, says the violence brought the problem of discrimination against Negroes to the attention of people who would rather have ignored it, and now most people thought something should be done.

But he did not rule out the possibility of more violence if the Negroes were provoked and he mentioned "White backlash" as a possible source of such provocation.

Part of this has been the introduction of the "Safe Streets" Bill which gave the police more powers of arrest, obtaining confessions and wire-tapping.

Mr. Freeman said that Philadelphia is better than most U.S. cities for race relations — "We haven't had a riot since '64."

The one thing that united all Americans was the war in Vietnam which nearly everyone wanted to stop even though it meant letting the Communists take over. "We are losing too many of our kids," he said.

Mr. Freeman, who is a graduate of psychology, gave a talk on Civil Rights at the United Kenya Club on Wednesday. He leaves Kenya tomorrow for a tour of West Africa.

RARE BORAN HANDICRAFTS ON VIEW

When Crown Princess Beatrix of the Netherlands pays a private visit to Kenya next week she will be shown an exhibition of rare Boran handicrafts.

The exhibition is being held at Studio Arts 68 in Nairobi and the items on show include decorative leather panels, camel leathers, cattle horns, drinking vessels, food containers and other domestic utensils.

Mrs. Sherri Head of Studio Arts describes many of the items as museum pieces. She has bought some of the panels for her own collection.

The panels and some of the containers, which she believes may be fifty years old, are decorated with cowrie shells, once the "currency" among the Boran but now rarely found.

Mrs. Head showed me an old wooden goblet which is reminiscent of medieval styles in Europe and we wondered how the influence had reached one of the remotest parts of Africa. As with many tribal utensils, it has a double use. Turned upside down it forms a small stool.

Some of the "beetles" are made of plaited grass impregnated with camel dung. Over the years they have become as hard as iron. Some of the older utensils appear to have been made from giraffe skin.

The exhibits were brought from the nomads who wander with their herds over the hot, dry areas between the Uaso Nyiro and the borders with Ethiopia and Somalia.

When Princess Beatrix visits the exhibition she will also see some attractive studies of Boran girls by Giselle Rosen, the first-born of Africa for more than 40 years.

All the items are for sale but purchasers will have to be left in the exhibition until it closes.

Next week the exhibition will be expanded into the Standard Street entrance to this newspaper when a potter, Reuben Chege, and a sculptor, Johnson Njeme, will be seen at their craft.

A good thing in a small pack

For the major automobile manufacturers with mass production facilities the most lucrative market for new cars is the increasing number of economy-minded family motorists. The essential features of a car which is successful in this highly competitive field are a favourable purchasing price, low operating costs and an engine with a capacity of approximately one litre (this has the effect of placing the car in a low road tax bracket in most countries and also keeps insurance premiums at a reasonable rate).

As in the case with all car buyers those interested in economy cars are very conscious of the appearance of the vehicles from which they are obliged to make their choice. Another factor which is becoming increasingly important is performance, with the emphasis on acceleration in addition to top speed.

The Datsun 1000 which was recently submitted for testing emerged from its temporary quarters at a very favourable price for sales honours in the small car league. The appearance is neat with a large area of glass which provides the occupants with the impression of a greater space than is actually available.

The 1000-door version of the Datsun 1000 which drives for several days costs £740 in Nairobi. A four-door version is available and sells at £725. The price of the station wagon is £790. These prices are extremely favourable for a car which is powered by a 1,000 cc. 62 h.p. engine coupled to a four-speed, all-synchronous gearbox and is equipped with a radio and heater as standard fittings.

My first thoughts on being informed of the price of the Datsun 1000 range were that the general standard of finish would prove to be utilitarian in the extreme. An examination of the car disproved this idea and the test drive indicated that the Datsun 1000 should stand up to hard usage.

The fore-and-aft adjustment of the driver's seat is a feature for a small car and I found that my legs were comfortably located when the seat was positioned at the limit of its backward movement. An individual of over five feet 10 inches in height would probably find the legroom rather inadequate. This is compensated for, to an extent by having adjustable backrests on the front seats, a feature which I did not expect to find on a low-priced touring car.

After positioning the seat to suit my preference, I studied the controls and found that the two-spoke steering wheel provides an excellent view of the longitudinal type speedometer and the fuel and temperature gauges.

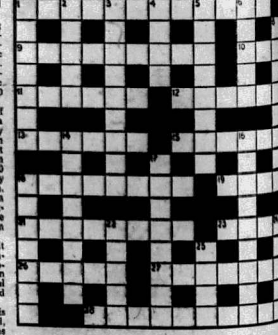

The diary of a literary scavenger

MAKING IT, by Norman Podhoretz, Cape, 36s.
 Book-reviewing is, I fear, not much more than a form of literary scavenging, and it seems extraordinarily conspicuous for a mere critic to write his autobiography, especially at length (356 pages) and under the title of *Making It*. But as the author says in his preface, this is not a success story. It is the story of a man who, after an education of how the author came to be in the position of fame and fame are unqualifiedly delicious.

After this arduous introduction, the author goes on to tell how he left his home town of Brownsville, left his home town of Brownsville, where his father was a milkman, to frequent the halls of Columbia and Cambridge. His journey began when his teacher in Brooklyn took it upon herself to "educate" him socially, for one of the lessons of this book is that you can get nowhere in America unless you are acceptable in society.

So the tough little slum boy from the Brownsville Social Club, proud wearer of the red satin jacket embroidered with the letters S.C.C. became a Wasp, and started worrying about suits and ties.

The early parts of the book are the most interesting, awakening consciousness and the difficulties encountered in remaining friendly with his parents and the literary set. Today I think a slum background would be a disadvantage to any literary aspirant, but in the early fifties when Mr. Podhoretz was writing, it was apparently not.

Mr. Podhoretz is more concerned with fame and success than the qualities which make it. He tells us in the later sections of the book exactly where everybody is on the New York literary ladder, and he says why there should be. The only exceptions are Marilyn Monroe, John F. Kennedy, and Mary Magdalene, whom he does not mention.

It is clear that the spirit does not read writing easy. In his left hand, he holds a pen, and in his right, he holds a pencil. He has been occasionally for over 12 years and had published almost 100 books. He has had to publish a book, *The Hundred Hours*, in 12 weeks.

As the author became an editor

(of the Jewish intellectual magazine *Commentary* in 1960, his blocks were not of paramount importance. However, he says that he overcame some of them by forcing himself to write regularly for a popular magazine, telling himself that it did not count as work.

How well known in fact is the author? He was consulted by both Presidents Kennedy and Johnson for ideas on policy-making as he was deemed an intellectual in New York. And an editor of *Commentary* he was widely respected by a small but influential number of people. *Commentary*, as a magazine which was more talked about than read.

Since this book was begun (writing it had taken him three years) the increasing reputation of the magazine *Commentary* has affected that of *Commentary*. I did wonder, in fact, the author did not played down this excellent publication in order to enhance his own. But the major success of *Commentary* is a political nature, and it seems to me that Mr. Podhoretz is far more interesting about current affairs than literature.

Some of the most interesting parts of this book are about changing attitudes towards Vietnam, and the problems of race, which deal with a friendship with James Baldwin.

Mr. Podhoretz does not give much advice to writers who wish to follow in his footsteps. Even if he uses the metaphor of a job, it is not clear how it is to be used. It is a book which should be read.

What really emerges from his book is the importance of the author's life. He has been writing for 12 years, for they contained his first articles. His association with *Commentary* in New York, and *Leavis* in Cambridge, were two of the most important steps in his literary career.

This is a readable and surprising book, despite the author's dreadful habit of dropping literary quotations like overripe chestnuts in an autumn gale.
