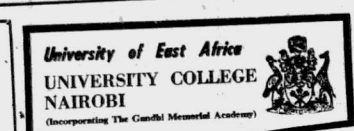

# 'School in a stable' shows the way

'The atmosphere of this harambee school is the happiest I have enjoyed in 40 years of teaching.'

— Mrs. Anne Walbe, headmistress of Atraha Secondary School, Nakuru

"Jesus was born in a stable, but I live in the stables where rats are as much a part of myself as anything else", wrote Alex Joel, a 14-year-old student at Atraha Secondary School, Nakuru.

In Kenya many students like Alex have their beds on odd, bare floors, no appetising meals are served and up to seven hungry but co-operative students share a pound of meal.

For some living in the stables is even a privilege. But they are happy, despite the hardships, because they are endowed with something which millions remain without — education.

The Atraha Secondary School ("Atraha" in Swahili ironically means "happiness"), a private, non-Government-aided Harambee school, illustrates the circumstances under which some schools have to work. Though often condemned, Harambee schools are the only source of inspiration to the thousands who pass C.P.E. and yet merit school.

The Atraha School is situated on a site where once people wandered to what use a row of stables, a bar and an abandoned restaurant decorated with cobwebs could possibly be put.

When President Kenyatta performed the opening ceremony on June 6, 1966, of the "School in a Stable" he gave new shape to the lives of hundreds in an area where struggle is the motto.

At the Atraha School the classrooms have no ceilings. Old nails in the corrugated iron roof of the former stables, now converted into classrooms, allow rain to pour through on to the pupils. The wind blows blindingly between the walls and the iron roofs. Bats fly by at night, birds and bees by day.

Students have got accustomed to being grilled like sausages under the hot tin roof during the summer months, and then take one of Air France's many daily flights to New York and the other main American cities.

is no piano, there is a reading room but without books, newspapers or periodicals. Subjects for the school cannot afford these are rarely depicted on paper because the school cannot afford crayons. They give blood when themselves are in need of new vigour.

Long, cold nights out in the stables or "dormitories", after their one meal of the day — maize meal ground and boiled in thick chunks like lumpy, hurriedly cooked porridge — are spent singing choruses. Then at the moonlight fades from the stable doors, they stretch out on a string of coarse mat blanket around themselves and lie down. Sometimes six or seven students occupy the area which once housed one horse.

"They started from nothing, nothing!" Mr. John Mwangi, a founder of the school and a member of the East African Legislative Assembly, said as he heard his stage at the conclusion of the 1968 Drama Festival.

Mrs. Anne Walbe, the headmistress, summing up the school's achievements, said: "For children with no opportunities to enjoy the luxuries or refinements of modern life, the atmosphere of this 'School in a Stable' is, for the greater part, the happiest I have enjoyed in my forty years of teaching. Everyone who visits our unusual school expresses surprise and pleasure at the gleaming smiles, the good manners and the team spirit of the teenagers."

All this despite the fact that lunch breaks are often spent probing into dustbins or searching the country gutters for edible remains. Hot meals on dining tables are not available.

Pupils try to arrange entertainments on that they can buy the National Flag and see it flutter on their self-made flagpoles. The students see other children driving off to school buses to play matches with neighbouring schools.

The pupils of Atraha School walk and work with hunger as many of them are, they are often exhausted before the match starts. They enjoy singing but there

a lovely dress that would make for my mother, I thought. But I have no money to buy it!"

"As I stepped out," Nairobi-bound bus rumbled by. Suddenly a twenty-shilling note fluttered out of the window. Picking up the note, I ran after the bus, waving it. A European shouted "Keep it", through the window. So back I went to the shop."

This is the dream of every student, to possess money, often not for himself but for others.

What else is there to dream about when the student so often hears an ultimatum to bring fees (60%) within a day or, not to return to the school?

It is not uncommon for a family of up to ten to reside in one-room hovels, not even beds. Yet the students tread steadily along the path of education, without ever shedding a tear.

At night a student sees his candle flicker and die, his homework remains undone. Next morning the courageous student does not plead lack of time or want of ability.

Instead he submits to the cane. The student alone can judge the predicament, if only his uncle had not refused his meagre allowance!

The evil, both social and economic, which arises from the large number of children being deprived of opportunities for their education after their first few years in schools, are great and the repercussions are now apparent in towns. The worst effect is their relapse into complete illiteracy.

Facilities outside the school are practically non-existent. The bare-foot student asks himself whether he will be welcomed by the local librarian. He gains courage to enter

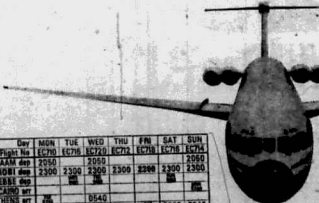

# Ways of cutting a pretty figure

method of making a pattern, as illustrated on Mrs. Brablik's blackboard, looked highly mathematical to me, but apparently it is all a matter of logic. The student makes up a basic pattern from brown paper and from this draws out a pattern for whatever style garment she wants to make for herself during the course. "If after the course a pupil loses or gains weight, she can always make herself another pattern," said Mrs. Brablik.

During the 20 lessons in a course pupils make about four dresses for themselves. If they devote more time to their work at home, they can make many more.

Mrs. Brablik arrived in Kenya from Czechoslovakia with her husband and started taking in dressmaking work in 1951. She held the Master Tailor Diploma and Certificate of Dressmaking and Tailoring from a school of dressmaking. "But I had to learn English first!"

The courses at her college give basic pattern making and fundamental dressmaking elementary courses in cutting, draping, sewing and advanced dressmaking and tailoring.

During the first course, instruction is given on the general background of technical aspects of dressmaking, particularly in cutting to special measures, practical creative designing, styling, draping and grading. Every kind of garment is included in this course, except for tailored suits and coats.

The second course is specialised patternmaking and designing. The students may be introduced to a variety of methods of pattern modelling is included in order to give another method of work and

the third course consists of actual advanced dressmaking and tailoring, intensive practical instruction in the most modern professional methods of creating and making all women's fashion garments.

"Morning and evening classes are held to suit both the housewife and the working wife. "We used to have afternoon classes too, but at present we are not busy enough to hold afternoon classes in addition to morning and evening classes."

In a bid to attract young working girls, Mrs. Brablik decided to start a simplified course, omitting many sections in her present courses for a smaller fee. So far the idea has not had much response, and pausing over this, Mrs. Brablik feels that the young girl has got away with sewing almost anything.

However, Mrs. Brablik feels firmly that the course, with its practical training in the fundamentals of fashion creation and styling, is just what is needed to make the dress shop and spend at will. And as her pupils get more mature she will be glad to know how to dress in the most flattering way, with perfect fit and stylish tailoring.

Mrs. Brablik also teaches her pupils to make a pattern for children and the principles of dressmaking which apply to children's wear, so that if necessary a pupil can make clothes for all the family.

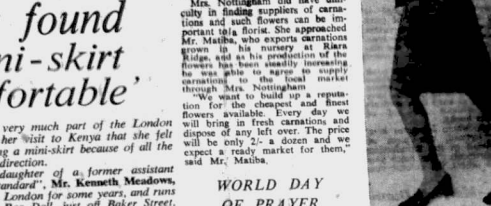

## The grand old lady who fights illiteracy

India's major problem in the 20th century is to educate her illiterate millions. An 88-year-old woman, inspired by the poet Tagore and the visionary Gandhi, set out 15 years ago to do her best to help.

But she knew her aim: to teach teachers to penetrate the remotest villages. She studied the books for new literates by the poet, Rabindranath Tagore, ordered more from Europe, and she evolved primers on adult and children's subjects. The books were not accepted nursery tales. So she gave him lessons on agriculture, religion and movies.

Mrs. Fisher designed tiny trunk libraries which reached the villages on the backs of bicycles.

The teachers received short courses of two to four weeks. More than 10,000 have left Literacy House to reach 3,000,000 adult illiterates.

Mrs. Fisher soon realized that literacy must be made fun. The primers were taught letter writing and accounts-keeping. The young teachers were delighted to discover that they could pour their hearts into letters to their wives.

Practically, doing sums enabled them to do their jobs. Mrs. Fisher waded a winning way through puppet shows she poured scorn and ridicule over the money-lender as well as the farmer who raised loans to give his daughter a fancy wedding.

"I want to throw the money-

The books will become a part of the literacy curricula. As she says: "This way I'll remember Mahatma Gandhi, who inspired Literacy House."

Kenya ahead in family planning

Kenya is one of seven developing nations in Africa and the Middle East that are making "test strides" in the family planning field, despite setbacks and criticism according to the Population Council of New York, in a report published in the British medical journal, The Lancet.

The other six countries which have adopted progressive family planning programmes in the past five years are Pakistan, Tunisia, Turkey, Egypt, Morocco and Iran.

In Iran, 50,000 women are already using the Pill to regulate the size of their families and numbers are likely to increase shortly when free birth control pills will be available at health clinics and hospitals.

In India and other Asian countries, Mrs. Fisher received the Magsaysay award in 1964. Earlier she received the Watumuli Memorial Award. And this year she has been named for the Nehru Literacy Award.

At nearly 90 Mrs. Fisher is still going strong. She plans to write two books in the Centenary year - one on Gandhi and the other on Rev. Martin Luther King, apostles of non-violence.

# The fascinating wildlife found underfoot

People tend to become so interested in Africa's rich store of large game that they completely overlook the wealth of wildlife which is found under their very noses — or even on their shoes.

These are the duties — hundreds of thousands of different species, ranging from the ridiculously ugly to the incredibly beautiful and often as deeply fascinating as the big game of the national parks.

Three recent books, all published by the Oxford University Press, throw the spotlight on the dust, both broad and low.

First, *Introduction to Insect Studies in Africa* by F. C. L. Pinney (18s. paperback, 30s. hardback), which is just what it says — an introduction.

It gives the student, or the amateur "bug-hunter", a jumping-off point from where to start on a more detailed study of any particular field that takes his fancy. Or, if you are generally interested in knowledge of the insect world with

the need for him to get to the bottom of a particular insect problem, it is written in the sort of language that the person who knows nothing will be able to understand. It also contains useful sections for the biologist on how to set about this pursuit.

Despite the wealth of insect life in Africa there are practically no books of a general nature on the subject which might attract or interest the newcomer. Mr. Pinney's book, therefore, serves a particular need, and serves it well.

Among those who are well aware of the activities of the insect world, are farmers and gardeners whose views are not always favourable.

For them there is *Crop Pests of East Africa* by J. M. S. de Pury (30s.) who spent some years in Kenya teaching biology to agricultural students.

This is a more detailed study of crop insects, again written to be understood. Apart from the usual chapters on the various pests, Mr. de Pury is at pains to try to explain them in the present perspective

and relate their activities to other aspects of crop production. Infestations by insect pests do not occur just because — they are often the result of bad husbandry. This book explains convincingly how to guard against unwelcome visitors.

Also, in line with modern beliefs, Miss de Pury points out that answers to pests is by no means always to try to exterminate them with insecticides. Indeed, the farmer who does so may be laying up even more insect trouble for himself in the future.

She is an advocate of biological and cultural control methods but rightly points out the need for considerable research to be carried out into these before their true effectiveness and the best methods of application can be assessed.

Finally there is *The Field Book of Insects (35s.)*, a lavishly illustrated descriptive work on British insects, detailing about 800 species. Though of little relevance to East Africa it will be of interest to those who are returning to Britain and who pursue their bug-hunting there.

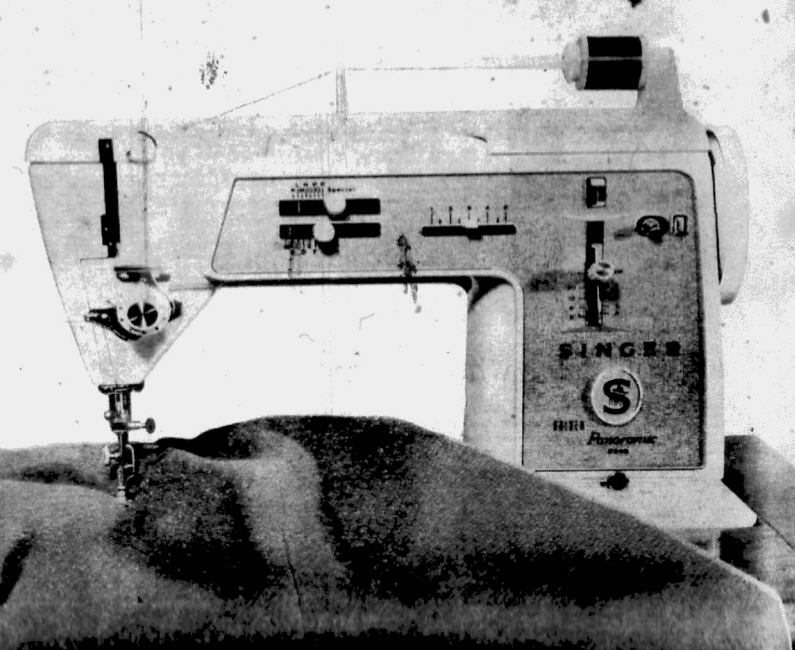

An American meddling in Africa—but

The Select Committee appointed to inquire into the progress of Africanisation in Kenya did its work expeditiously and with many useful pointers and suggestions are contained in its report.

The idea that America should send a sort of African Counselor to the continent's problems has been put forward by the U.S. Senate Subcommittee on Africa, Senator McClellan.

Senator McClellan does not foresee any change in the trend of the U.S. assistance to regional Africa. He said in an interview: "My only hope would be that it would continue on a much larger scale."

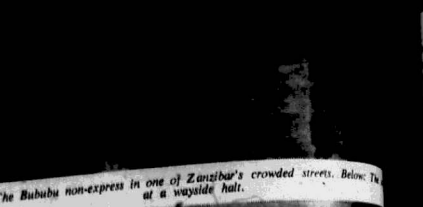

# Nairobi Park Jackal kills python

A python was found in the Nairobi Park being attacked by a jackal which bit through its neck and killed it. A ranger examined the area, finding numerous jackal tracks all around and teeth marks in the python's neck.

Whether the jackal found the python dying and basted its end or whether there had been a fight between the python and the jackal is not known.

The incident recalls an attack made on a jackal a year or so ago by a large python when the python endeavoured to swallow the jackal head.

The jackal was suffocated, but the python dislocated its jaw and tore its mouth. However, after a few weeks' careful nursing at the snake park the python recovered.

The cheetah in Nairobi Park that was reported missing appears to have returned in its brother. The four cubs were distressed last week when one of the pair of adult males made another sortie on the group, this time disappearing with the cub.

There was wailing and howling, not only from the cubs, but also from the other male who did not know where the pair had gone. Careful watch was kept and in due course the mother turned up and rejoined her cubs. It is apparent, however, that the time is rapidly approaching when the four youngsters will be left to fend for themselves.

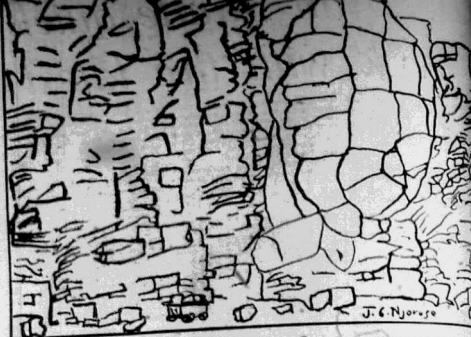

With so much talk of wildlife, many puttings and letters on the subject, it would have been expected that some most interesting and useful information is not so. Even if it is frequent ignorance, there is frequently complete indifference. Africa has little interest in the animals unless he happens to have a share in them, is considered from time to time by game when a game is hunted, and is not without a degree of justification.

It is pointless explaining how much good the tourist industry is doing for the country and indirectly benefiting him. 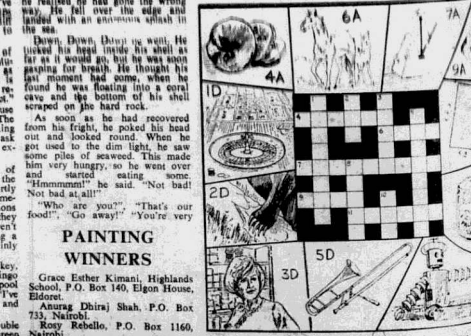

Frankie Vaughan has even found fans asleep in his garage! Garages are, in fact, a favourite target, especially if the fans believe that the car is important to them, to their idol.

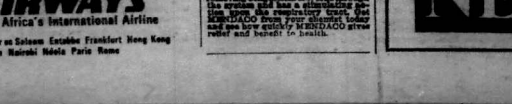

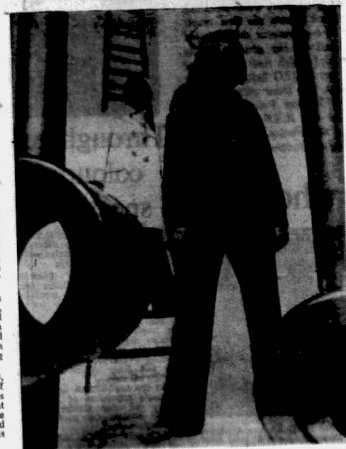

He told them that their property, the brain being the biggest of all, was there to help them in their praise to God.

"It is because of the urge that the Muslim Council of Tanzania, Dar es Salaam, was formed. The council was formed to call in line with the Prophetic message, the Quranic injunctions, to work for their own sustenance.

He urged them to gather their courage and be determined, because he was sure that with determination they would make everything a success.

Sheikh Charambo warned them against those Muslims whom he classified as "hypocrites"—those who cheat God and their fellow Muslims"—and said their signs were "subterfuges, separations and underground movements".

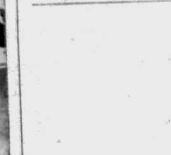

## Embu projects hit by POICE NOT £33,000 tax deficit

**Embu County Council states in its annual report for 1968 that at the beginning of last year the council's budget showed a deficit of £33,277, which was attributed to non-payment of G.T.P. and other revenues.**

The report, which says that the council's expenditure on its financial obligations during the year exceeded its income by £33,277, states that the council's revenue for the year was £121,900, which was £33,277 less than the £155,177 required to meet its financial obligations.

The council had been hit by a drop in the price of its main source of revenue, the sale of its land, which had been expected to bring in £100,000.

The council's expenditure was mainly on the salaries and wages of its staff, which had risen by 15 per cent over the year.

The council's chairman, Mr. J. Kimani, said that the council's financial position was not as serious as it seemed and that the council would be able to meet its obligations without any special measures.

Mr. Kimani also stated that the council's revenue would be improved next year by the sale of more land and by the collection of more taxes.

## Work permit case for March 25

**The hearing of a case in which the manager of O. Lockwood & Co. is charged with employing foreign workers without a licence was postponed to March 25.**

The case is the first to be heard under the new law, which came into force on January 1, 1968.

The manager of O. Lockwood & Co., Mr. O. Lockwood, is charged with employing 10 foreign workers without a licence issued by the Ministry of Labour.

The workers are from the United Kingdom and are employed as fitters and welders.

The manager's defence is that the workers were employed on a temporary basis and that they were not intended to stay in Kenya for more than 12 months.

The case is being heard by the District Magistrate at Nairobi.

### MONEY WILL GO TO HOSPITAL

aim of this year's event is to raise the funds for the Memorial Hospital.

It is remembered that on November 10, 1967, the late President Kenyatta launched an appeal for the Memorial Hospital.

The late President Kenyatta said that it was important that a memorial hospital should be built for those soldiers who had died in the defence of their lives.

The Memorial Hospital would not only be a memorial to the fallen soldiers but would also be a place where they could be buried. It is also a place where the living members of the forces could be treated and where their families could be accommodated.

The late President Kenyatta said that the appeal was for the Memorial Hospital and that the funds raised would be used for the construction of the hospital.

This was more than half the amount required for the hospital.

The Chairman of the Foundation, Sir Malin Sorbie, authorised the Ministry of Defence to draw on the amount as soon as the fund had been constituted.

Business houses, big and small, have to date contributed various sums and it is gratifying to note that already a total sum of more than £123,000 has been collected.

The contributions did not come from businessmen alone. Throughout the country members of the public have collected large sums for the Memorial Hospital.

Perhaps the most grateful of all Kenyans to the Security Forces have been the people of the Eastern and North-Eastern Provinces. They are the people who, for the most part of the past four years, have lived with members of the Kenya Armed Forces and the Police during the recent border problems.

The two provinces alone have donated a total sum of over £7,328 17s.

On one occasion when the Minister for Defence, Dr. Njoroge Mungai, visited the North-Eastern Province, he was handed £4,000 which had been collected by the Provincial Commissioner's staff.

It was after much thought and consideration that the Government decided to build a Memorial Hospital for the Forces. Needless to say the Forces had done and are still doing invaluable work for the Kenya nation.

In recent months, articles have appeared in newspapers relating to some of the work the Forces have carried out. These have included the rescue work in Nyanga during floods and earth tremors as well as unseasonable of sugar cane in the Chemelil area and of wheat in the Mau Narok area.

The Forces have also built bridges and roads in the National Parks. They found time to do all this despite the fact that they had other jobs to do.

At this moment, several detachments of the Kenya Army are stationed in the Eastern and North-Eastern Provinces carrying out valuable development work which will benefit the local population.

Since shifra activities finished, the forces have turned to helping raise the standard of living of the people in these two areas.

Several water holes in the Wajir district are already functioning. The same engineers have completed rebuilding a bridge at Dedebal in Garissa which had been cut by floods. At Masalani in the same district, the engineers have built schools and dispensaries.

The sick men now being attended to in more clinical places and the children can learn how to read and write. Cattle owners have always looked up to the Army to assist their cattle from the remote parts of the country to the holding grounds from where officials of the Kenya Meat Commission can buy them.

These escorts are necessary because of cattle rustlers from the different tribes.

The list goes on and on. The work of the Armed Forces is well known to every one and their record at agricultural and other shows speaks for itself.

It is hoped that the members of the public will respond positively during the Forces Week and contribute the remaining funds for this hospital and also take the opportunity to acquaint themselves with the life and work of the Forces.

The Week begins with a Calabery Football Match between Kenya Cabinet Ministers and the Diplomatic Corps at the City Stadium on March 1, at 4 p.m.

At 4.25 p.m. the maced bands of the Armed Forces and the Kenya Police will entertain spectators during the half-time interval. At the same time the 1st Parachute Com-

pany of the Kenya Army will give a display of parachute jumping over the football ground.

This will be easily visible from the football ground.

At 5.05 p.m. President Kenyatta will present the Kenya Forces Week Trophy to the captain of the winning team and replicas to participants.

On the afternoon of the second day, March 2, there will be the Aero Club of East Africa Rally at Wilson Aerodrome. At 5.30 p.m. there will be a display by the Kenya Air Force and five minutes later the 1st Parachute Company of the Kenya Army will drop from Air Force Caribou aircraft.

This will be followed by a supply drop by Beaver aircraft of the Kenya Air Force. On the same day at Mombasa there will be a River display by the Kenya Navy at which the salute will be taken by the Coast Provincial Commissioner, Mr. J. M. Mathego. At 6.30 p.m. ships of the Kenya Navy will be illuminated.

On Monday, March 3, members of the Kenya Police will donate blood at all garrison towns. It is anticipated that several hundred points of blood will be donated on this day.

Tuesday, March 4, will see the President at Gilgil Garrison where he will inspect a Guard of Honour at 11.30 a.m. followed by the 7th Battalion, Kenya Rifles with the Police Band will provide dinner to the band of the Armed Forces in attendance.

Then the President will tour the camp, viewing building progress. At 12.15 p.m. he will review the Support Battalion of the Kenya Army and half an hour later he will address all ranks of Kenya Rifles and Support Battalion in Kenyatta Barracks.

President Kenyatta will have an

informal luncheon at the Officers' Mess of the Support Battalion. At 2.00 p.m. he will view a parachute drop at Gilgil before returning to Nairobi. If the parachute drop is not possible due to high wind, President Kenyatta will inspect a Caribou aircraft loaded with troops of the parachute company on the ground.

On Thursday, March 6, the Minister for Defence, Dr. Mungai, will be host at an official luncheon given in honour of the President at Eastleigh, at the Kenya Air Force Officers' Mess.

In Mombasa there will be the Armed Forces band concert at Treasury Square at 11.45 a.m. and at 3.30 p.m. a charity football match between the Kenya Navy and the Kenya Air Force will take place. Olympic Medallists will appear on the ground at half time.

There will be an open day at Jamhuri Park on Saturday, March 8, in which the Kenya Navy and the Armed Forces will take part. The President is due to arrive at 10.30 a.m.

He will inspect a Guard of Honour mounted by the Kenya Police before undertaking a mobile tour of the different stands. The Vice-President, Mr. O. arap Moi will be host at a luncheon in honour of the President.

In the afternoon the President will view arena events. In the evening there will be a grand ball at the Charter Hall in Nairobi where the Police Band will provide dinner to the band of the Armed Forces during the day there will be the Vesper Trophy Golf Tournament. # of a Kenya soldier

A regular soldier, that is an infantryman, wakes up at the sound of reveille which is normally at 6 a.m.

If he is the shaving type he shaves and generally freshens up before going to have breakfast. Then he prepares for the first parade during which he is inspected.

Cleanliness and smartness count. Boots have to be shining, brass buttons polished and, of course, uniform properly pressed.

At the parade ground the soldier is detailed on the day's duties. He reports to work at 7.45 a.m. and, as always in the Armed Forces as a whole, the soldier is never late.

Duties in the Army are as varied as those of any administration. The soldier may be a mechanic, painter, tailor, carpenter, accounts clerk, driver, shoemaker . . . any trade you name.

Personnel in the Armed Forces are exceptionally well trained. Should a serviceman be selected to be a mechanic, his initial training will be undertaken in Kenya in one of the workshops in the Transport Battalion, after which he will be put on a section dealing with nothing but motor mechanics.

Those who prove to be outstanding, proceed overseas for further training.

At no time do the Armed Forces take their vehicles for repair in outside garages. Should a vehicle be involved in an accident — and these are rare — it is stripped to pieces and repaired wholly, should it be economical.

Otherwise it is written off and sold in an auction. But minor repairs are carried out by the Forces personnel and the vehicles look new after the repairs.

In the army there is the Signals Squadron which is fully manned 24 hours a day. All major and minor maintenance of radio equipment is carried out at their base.

Without this squadron most army exercises would be futile since the commanding officer of a company cannot communicate with the soldiers in the first line.

At 10 a.m. the soldier has a tea break which lasts about half an hour. Then he goes back to work till lunch-time.

After resuming work at 2 p.m. the soldier works till 4.30 p.m. when he leaves and goes to the barracks. He may relax before going on to games.

In the Kenya Army such games as football, hockey, volleyball, tennis and boxing are all played. Athletics is also participated in with keen interest.

After working hours the soldier may visit the canteen and over a drink may play chess or draughts. Some evenings film shows are held at the canteen and normally every soldier attends these.

Occasionally, educational classes are held by the unit Education Officer and many a soldier has been known to improve and advance their educational standards. A soldier's military training continues all the time.

A technical airman normally will report to duty at about 7 a.m. without first having any breakfast. He will get all the aircraft assigned to him ready for the first details at 7.45 a.m.

To get the aircraft ready entails a complete before-flight check. This means he has to check the engine, air frame, radio and electrical components. Having done this he signs all the necessary documents.

After that the rest of the ground crew arrive and relieve him. He goes for breakfast and reports back to the line.

He works in the handling flight (first line) — as it is commonly known in the Air Force) and then goes to lunch at 12.30 p.m. He then stands down.

Should there be extra

work the airman would resume at 1.30 until all the work is finished irrespective of the time. Should an aircraft be needed for take-off at 6 a.m. the airman has got to be at his place of work an hour before.

A seaman's day is varied and cannot be compared with that of the Army or Air Force, since it very much depends on where the ship is, and its particular employment at the time.

When the ship is at sea a proportion of the ship's company is always on duty, steering the ship and keeping a lookout, as well as attending to all the ship's needs.

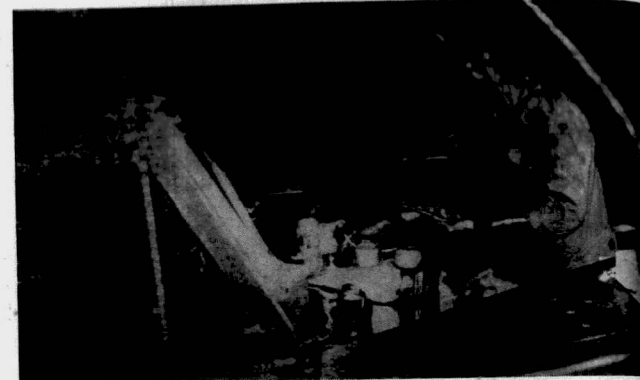
Seamen take turns at being on watch for four-hour periods and even when off watch frequently have to carry on with the normal ship's chores.

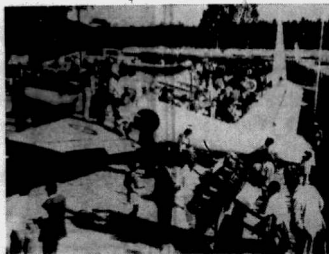

# The many sides of a policeman's lot

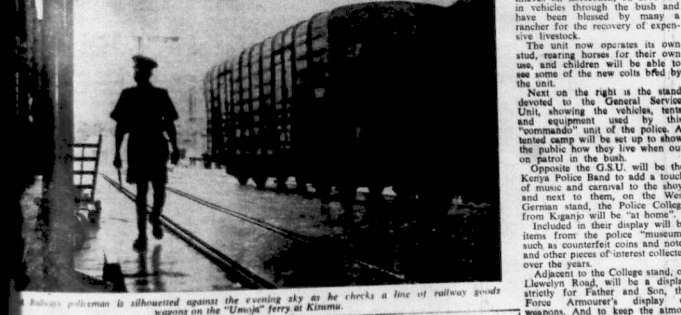

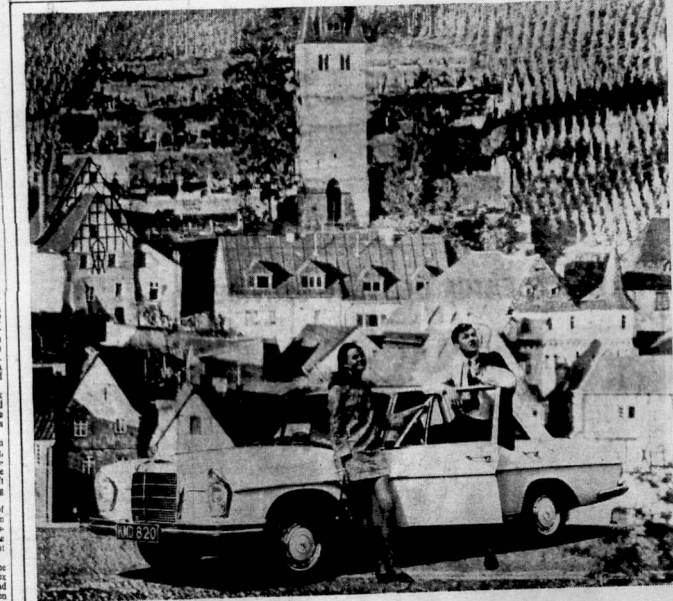

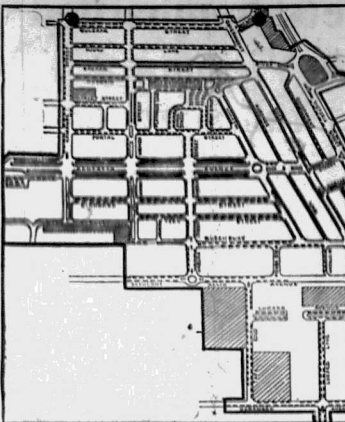

# 50 targets bombed in South Vietnam as Paris talks go on

North Vietnamese and Vietcong gunners bombed more than 50 targets in South Vietnam on Wednesday night and early yesterday only a few hours before the opening of the sixth round of peace talks in Paris.

The Vietcong general offensive, which entered its fifth day yesterday, showed no sign of dying down. More than 3,000 shells and rockets slammed into South Vietnamese and American targets in overnight attacks.

The U.S. replied by stepping up air strikes against "enemy" positions from the Cambodian border to the sea.

Baigun was struck for the fourth successive day. The capital has not been hit since the first day of the offensive when the Vietcong pumped in eight rockets.

Intelligence reports indicated that the capital was still surrounded by Vietcong forces.

Elite South Vietnamese Marines and Ranger Forces, backed by U.S. planes and artillery, beat back two or three Vietcong battalions which approached the third tactical region

headquarters at Bien-Hoa, 20 miles north-east of Saigon.

The "sumo" forces, estimated at more than 1,000 men, withdrew after a day of fierce fighting, leaving 150 bodies behind them.

First indications were that the large Vietcong force represented elements of the Fifth Vietcong Division, which came down from the northwest to attack Saigon from the east.

The Vietcong managed to reach almost to the runways of the vast airbase at Bien-Hoa before being driven back.

Eight B-52 bombers stepped up their routine pounding of Vietcong and North Vietnamese troop concentrations around the capital. Eight raids around the city were carried out against "enemy" forces heading down towards Saigon.

North Vietnam has rejected American objections against the Vietcong offensive, saying it "fully supports" the National Liberation Front's fight against the U.S. forces so long as they remain on Vietnamese soil.

Foreign Ministry statement strongly denied that North Vietnam had accepted conditions for the total bombing halt of November 1.

## Czech crisis may erupt

A "latent political crisis" still grips Czechoslovakia and could erupt into the open "at every error of leadership or an any illegitimate act by an extremist force," Premier Oldrich Cernik said in Prague.

He told leaders of Communist and national enterprises that the party had no reason to alter the November plan for a general election, but a political danger still comes from the "Right."

"There are those who even seek to deny the last positive result from the post-war period," he said, but they inspired and directed from the West," the Premier said. "No opposition from the Left or Right, can hope to succeed."

## Sore throats may delay ten-day Apollo Space flight

The blast-off of Apollo-9, scheduled for today, may be postponed until Monday or Wednesday.

The U.S. manned space program director, Dr. George Mueller, said that the astronauts were "suffering from throat infections."

"Because of heavy and complex demands, they must be in a very good physical condition" before they were sent into Earth orbit.

A final decision on the postponement was expected last yesterday.

Technicians working on the giant Saturn rocket, which will launch the Apollo spacecraft into orbit on a ten-day flight, have discovered a minor snag, but informed sources said that it would not stave a postponement of the Cape Kennedy flight.

The three astronauts would be completely cured for four days and it would be extremely rare to send them into space if they were better.

Mr. Muller said "we do not desire to send them into space if they are ill."

## Rescuers find 64 bodies after 'quake

Rescue workers still digging through the rubble of earthquake-shattered towns and villages in the Cobles have recovered 64 bodies so far.

Full details of the damage were not expected to be available from the remote coastal region struck by the earthquake on Sunday and there are fears that the death toll might climb higher, according to last August more than 200 people died in a similar disaster in the area.

Sunday's quake was believed to be the strongest recorded in the area. It triggered off massive tidal waves and destroyed three towns, including the capital of Maldiva, on an exposed corner of the western side of Colobus Island.

Andra news agency said that 20 of the bodies had been found in Maldiva, which has a population of about 20,000.

The small village of Palatong was completely destroyed and more than 100 people were reported injured there.

Two other small towns along the western coast - Semoa and Somba - were also badly hit. Several buildings, including schools, were wrecked.

The radio station at the Southern Colobus capital of Macao was destroyed. Search teams were continuing their rescue work.

Macassar itself was shaken by three earth tremors on Sunday but no damage was reported there.

Macassar Radio said the South Maldiva Governor, Mr. Achmed Colobus, had declared the earthquake a national disaster and appealed for food supplies and medicines.

Thousands of people fled their homes along the coastal regions before the tidal wave struck, according to the radio.

Continued normalisation of relations with other Warsaw Pact countries remains valid. He called on the nation's enterprises and the people to support the Government in their difficult tasks.

"The months and years to come will not be easy, but we promise that whatever measures must be taken will be taken with the sole aim of developing Socialism," the Premier vowed.

He went on to outline a legislative Bill on State enterprises now pending and some 20 more parliamentary proposals on economic matters.

## Rival Mao groups clash in Tibet

Several people were killed and injured in fighting between two rival groups of supporters of Mao-Tse Tung in Lhasa during January, according to reports brought to New Delhi yesterday by Nepalese traders from Tibet.

One Mao faction is known as the "Red Alliance" and the other as the "Red Rebel Headquarters."

At Tseching, in South Tibet, some anti-Mao Chinese and Tibetans raided an ammunition depot and carried off weapons, the reports said.

An Indian witness charged as an accomplice of 12 Africans on trial in Pretoria for an alleged plot to overthrow the Government, said a minor sensation yesterday when he claimed that security police had tortured him "for fun."

The witness first refused to give evidence after saying he had been subjected to a "regime of terror" during 421 days of solitary confinement.

"I am a South African and I have been completely treated by South Africans," he said.

The witness claimed to take the oath after the court adjourned for a brief period.

He then said he had attended "Communist classes" and had helped in 1964 and said he had helped to print a pamphlet entitled Freedom Fighters.

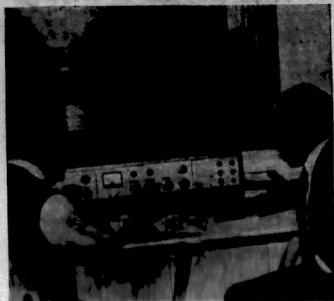

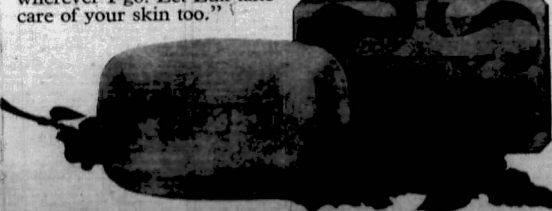

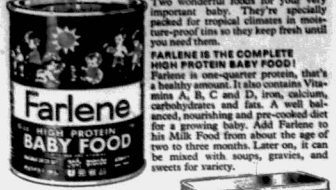

## FRIDAY DIARY

### What would you do if you were in an expedition of people crossing Africa in two cars and half the party became ill and had to be flown home?

The simple answer would be to sell one of the cars. But two young Belgians, Messrs. Haldane and Mouton, found the only solution was — to burn one.

The story of this apparently strange decision was told to me by Mr. Archie Lewis, a mechanic from Zurich, who with his wife, Mrs. Mouton, Mr. Werner Bauer, is now touring Ambohi before trying to dispose of their second vehicle.

The couple left Switzerland with their two two-ton Citroen Safari estate cars and after driving through Spain, France, Algeria, Congo, the Sahara to Niger and Nigeria. There three of the party became ill with malaria and had to be flown home.

In Nigeria the stricken joined forces with a Scots couple, Mr. and Mrs. Derek Haldane, who are travelling round the world in a Land-Rover, and the two parties parted ways there. However, it became evident that it was not possible for them to continue with their two vehicles so they tried to sell one.

## Introducing the Lotus Europe

The latest thinking on the location of the engine in a sports car favours a position behind the driver's and passenger's seats, but well ahead of the rear wheels. A car which has its steering and drive shafts in this manner is referred to as "mid-engine".

Re-arranged seats like Porsche and Lotus have the power unit mounted over the rear wheels.

To my knowledge, the only mid-engine sports car in Kenya is the Lotus Europa, a highly desirable car, which was introduced recently by Yvonne and Bob Higgins. This closed two-seater has a most unusual appearance. The nose is low and streamlined following the contours of the road. The roof of the doors the rear represents a complete departure from the Lotus Europa, the most striking feature is the very narrow front end. The rear section which covers the engine and the rear wheel is situated in the front of the car in a compartment which is separated from the rest of the car by a partition. This is secured in position by a bolt which is fixed to the engine which weighs 75 lb. at 6,000 r.p.m.

An automatic transmission manufactured by Borg Warner is available as an optional extra. Using one basic body shell, Ford are offering 26 different models of cars with various engines, interiors and colour schemes.

Suspension design follows the established Ford pattern of torsion bars on the front and a single-pipe rear axle with longitudinal semi-elliptic leaf springs. Twin trailing arms ensure the positive location of the rear axle. Disc brakes are fitted on the front and drums at the rear.

The B.S.A. engine has been produced in the United Kingdom since 1950. It is a four-cylinder, four-stroke engine with a bore of 4.7 inches and a stroke of 4.7 inches. The engine is a very light and compact unit and is easy to maintain. It is a very reliable engine and is a very good choice for a sports car.

The Lotus Europa is powered by a Renault-16 engine and the gearbox is also a Renault-16. The body is made of fibre glass and is very light. The chassis is a beam-type chassis which fits into the car from the front and is bolted to the front suspension. As can be expected from the racing background of the Lotus concern, the Lotus Europa is a very fast car. It has a top speed of 120 m.p.h. and can accelerate from 0 to 60 m.p.h. in 13 seconds. 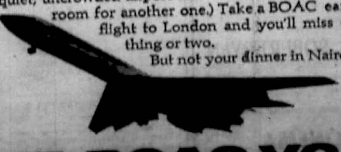

Bridging the gap in the schools system

One of the key institutions which is helping to bridge the gap between the highly educated minority and the rest of the people is the Institute of Adult Studies at University College, Nairobi.

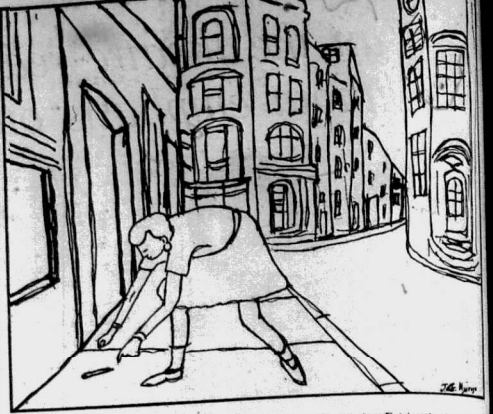
The Ministry of Education recognises as one of its levels. "We have got the extra-mural division with four main centres, Nairobi, Mombasa, Kisumu, and they operate through a number of sub-centres in the vast majority of them are really evening classes and we try to encourage big industries and large corporations to have day-release classes.

"We are at the moment working with our development plan interim 1970/73 and we think that the real speciality of the institute will be adult education. That work will imply professional training in adult education, research in adult education and the institute will also act as a service agency for other institutions and organisations who would like some guidance on ways, methods and techniques in the teaching of adults.

"The institute started five years ago, in the middle fifties, when we were still in the process of setting up the extra-mural work. It was conducted in that way with extramural students in Kenya. "I think it was in '61 that it became independent. It was also in '61 that the College of Social Studies at Kisumu was established.

Established Extra-mural and from '63 the University and the work at Kisumu was transferred under the institute. "The amount the students would pay depended on the level of the subject, but it was very often 20/- a week or more and there were some Swahili courses where mainly non-Kenyans were taking a number of them. There was a booklet which covered this. "There is one course of 54 meetings which costs 7/2s. There is a Swahili beginners' course.

"Our plans for future development are to go ahead with adult education, training research and the service agency would be the first step. From there we would go on to have some formal adult education. This will always be in demand in a country where quite a number of people had no real opportunities when they were younger. "The institute does not operate below the level of K.A.S.E. "Our mission," said Mr. Bjerre, "is to work at more advanced levels than we are doing now. One of the tasks is to assist those who will do adult literacy work. "A free booklet detailing all courses available through the Institute of Adult Studies is obtainable at any office of the institute.

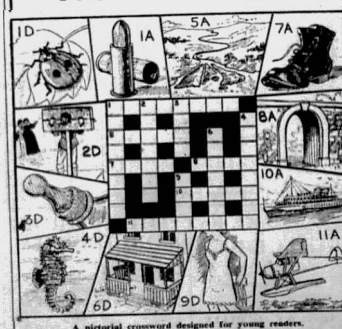

# Uplands factory brings home the bacon

to orders. The pig's carcass goes through 17 initial operations before being refrigerated and cut out.

Curing with brine is a highly skilled operation. I was told, as we watched the injection of salt liquid into the carcasses.

This curing method is used for all bacon whether or not it is subsequently smoked. During the smoking process carcasses in the smoke stoves turn mahogany coloured and are then sent to another department where they are sliced and vacuum-packed.

For the housewife it is as well to know that each of the 1,000 bacon packs that each worker processes in a day there is a small reference label. If there are any complaints the factory can trace it back to the day the bacon was packed and the factory worker who handled the packing. All other products are similarly coded.

In one of the many refrigerated stores at the factory I was shown a barrel full of banks of a thread-like substance which at first glance did not remotely look like the fine tubing in which sausage meat is encased.

This has to be washed out before sausage meat is forced through a nozzle and down through 15 yards of casing. Sausage meat is prepared according to the factory's own recipe and although it is varied occasionally according to the tastes which are being catered for, regularly throughout Kenya, the original recipe seems to suit the public. Large vats of it were being mixed and there was a tangy smell of sausage in the air.

The sausages are twisted by hand. "There is a machine for this, but you have to have an up-to-date left-handed man to operate it," I was told. More than 10,000 of the sausages are packed in a day and raised to retail buyers in Nairobi.

Many housewives, I'm sure, must have been guilty at some time or other of accepting a packet of sausages with indefinite life, but in an ordinary refrigerator of about 40 deg. F. sausage should only be kept for two or three days.

Bacteria develop very quickly in perishable commodities and when a packet of sausage is taken out of the shop it may have to stay in the car for a couple of

hours before it is put in a fridge. It is possible that in displaying products in the shop communication may have started before the product reaches the customer.

Though regulations cannot be enforced they do serve as a guide in protecting the interest of the customer and it is usually because clear which retailers are neglecting them when complaints are investigated.

## SIDLIGHTS ON THE PILL

Planned pregnancies improve the chances of "strengthening family life and improving the quality of parental care" according to a team of physicians from the University of California School of Public Health. The doctors also maintain that child-spacing provides greater possibilities of reducing maternal, foetal, infant and childhood mortality and that the longer the periods between pregnancies, the lower the incidence of premature births.

Supporting evidence that family planning reduces premature births comes from New York's Health Commissioner, who reports an overall drop of 7 per cent in premature births between 1965 and 1967, with the poorest sections of the city's population reflecting the highest rate of decline.

The slums of Lima in Peru are a far cry from New York with its well-organised family planning centres. In one parish in Lima, where 12,000 people live huddled together in one-room shacks on a barren hillside, women raise ten or more children to indistinguishable quality.

The illegitimacy rate is 60 per cent and most girls, whether single or married, have two children before they are 20. By their mid-thirties many women have ten children by several fathers.

## CHEAP AND TASTY RECIPES

About this time of year I usually decide to go on an economy drive with the household budget, and find myself searching for recipes that are not only cheap but tasty.

It's amazing just how many dishes come under both those headings, and have now become firm favourites with my family all the year round. I have chosen some of my favourite recipes for you to try, and I think you will be pleasantly surprised by how little they cost to prepare.

### CHILLI CON CARNE

**Ingredients:**  
1lb minced beef  
1 tin chopped onion  
1 tin cream of tomato soup  
1 tin baked beans (medium salt)  
1 teaspoon paprika powder  
1 teaspoon red chilli powder  
2oz margarine  
Salt to taste.

**Method:**  
Melt the margarine in a large saucepan and brown the minced beef.  
Add the onion, soup, beans and salt and cook thoroughly together.  
Simmer for 30 minutes.  
Have your green salad set for serving.

### NAVY-BRAND BEEF CASEROLE

**Ingredients:**  
1 large tin corned beef  
1 tin tomato sauce and chopped onion  
1 tin tomato soup  
1 tin tomato catsup  
Salt and pepper  
2oz margarine  
2oz grated cheese

**Method:**  
Put the meat, soup, sauce and milk in a large bowl and add the tomato sauce, catsup and salt and pepper.  
Transfer to a casserole dish.  
Melt the 2oz margarine and pour over the corned beef mixture.

Cover with the remaining potatoes, and pour the remaining sauce over. Bake for 15 minutes in a hot oven and serve with the rest of the margarine on top.

### SPICY CHEESE CORNROL

**Ingredients:**  
1lb. Cheddar cheese (cut in cubes)  
2lb. potatoes (washed and peeled)  
1lb. boiled ham (cut into pieces)  
1 large onion (chopped)  
1lb. fresh peas (cooked)  
1 tomato (sliced)  
1 teaspoon paprika (chopped)  
1 teaspoon mustard powder  
1 teaspoon salt  
2oz margarine

**Method:**  
Melt the margarine in a frying pan and fry the sliced potatoes until golden brown on one side. Transfer to a baking dish and add the onion, peas, ham, mustard and salt and pepper on top of the potato. Mix thoroughly.  
Place the thinly sliced tomato on top and the onion. Sprinkle with the sliced cheese and bake in a moderate oven for 30 minutes until golden.

Bake for 15 minutes in a hot oven and serve with the rest of the margarine on top.

### SANDWICH MEAT LOAF

**Ingredients:**  
1lb. minced beef  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 onion (chopped fine)  
1 cup tomato sauce  
1 tablespoon flour  
2 tablespoons sugar  
1 teaspoon Worcester sauce  
1 teaspoon paprika powder  
1 cup tomato ketchup

**Method:**  
Mix together the beef, salt, paprika, onion and sauce and press firmly into a loaf in a hot oven. Bake for 45 minutes in a hot oven. In the meantime mix together the flour, sugar, Worcester sauce and tomato sauce.  
Thicken, stirring constantly.  
Put the meat in half crown. Place half of the tomato dish and pour half the meat mixture into a sandwich.

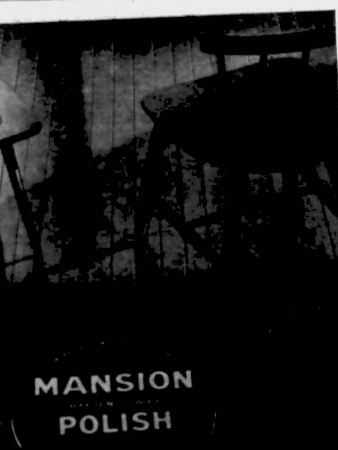

# Mr. Lubembe's valuable reference work

THE INSIDE OF LABOUR MOVEMENT IN KENYA  
by Clement Lubembe (Equatorial Publishers)

Despite its ungrammatical title Mr. Lubembe has written a valuable book. Future historians of Kenya will find it not only an authoritative work on the nation's trade union history, it also provides new insights on the year of political struggle.

Mr. Lubembe lost his position as Cotsu secretary-general in 1957 after being defeated by Mr. Dennis Akumu and his 'Kenya Group'. His eclipse as a Cotsu leader does not affect the validity of his book written from a background of years of experience within the trade union hierarchy.

As Mr. Seed Cocker comments in a foreword, Mr. Lubembe has written 'in his own peculiar style without trying to be bombastic or polemic'. He makes no attempt to hide his prejudices, and this gives the reader the feeling that if he is frankness - though it makes some of his renderings of Kenya's early history eyebrow-raising in their righteous indignation over settler abuses and racial discrimination.

One clear impression emerges: Mr. Lubembe is not a man who believes that the trade union movement in Kenya has been a failure. He writes with a deep disappointment at his feeling of loss of role as he has been displaced.

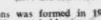
He calls on Africans who hold positions of influence in the Cotsu to realize that 'if it were not probably due to the role played by the workers' demand for emergency, Kenya would not be what it is today'.

Each chapter deals with the impact of European colonialism leading to the fight to regain allodial land and then for political rights.

Some of the assertions are open to challenge. The author asserts, for example, that the Arab, for instance, is superior to Africans because of his independence, and that he cannot feel inferior to Africans although he is not generally better educated.

But on other social and economic points about the enforced change of African labour laws from a communal, clan system which gave protection to the workers, the Western-style money economy which disrupted their lives and led to the areas of

Unions was formed in 1952, with Mr. Kenatta's blessing.

With the declaration of the Emergency and the arrest of many political leaders, the trade union movement, although kept under severe scrutiny, was left to cope.

The Cotsu leader officials point out that the three men who were accused of Communist influence have after independence become very reactionary.

The book records that one reason for the opposition to the K.F.L. failed was that arrangements to secure funds from Ghana fell through because the money got into the wrong hands.

## SCHOOLBOY'S FIRST BOOK PUBLISHED

A Form IV schoolboy from Kenya's Central Province has just had his first book published.

The 'SCHOOLBOY'S FIRST BOOK' is a collection of traditional stories retold by Daniel Irungu, who was born at Gitigi, Nyeri, in 1950. Daniel is

also chairman of the China Young Farmers' Club and executive secretary of the China Cultural Club.

Mr. Lubembe notes that the decision of the American Federation of Labour to give nearly £20,000 to the K.F.L. to build its headquarters was a turning point in the history of the labour movement in Kenya.

Mr. Lubembe describes attempts to colonial officials to prevent the trade union from growing powerful and aiding the campaign of the new Federation of Registered Trade Unions.

Some of the mistakes is fascinating. The author discusses that in the struggle for ideological control of his own union he had to displace his own family drive as branch secretary. A group of the man's supporters became 'very hostile', Mr. Lubembe adds. 'They hired a car and chased me up the road. On arrival in Nairobi I decided to report the matter to my wife and she reported him to all my brothers-in-law including his parents, and they all supported my actions.'

Mr. Lubembe took over the K.F.L. in 1963. The previous general secretary, Mr. Peter Kibini, had been a leader of the defeated Kadu party and found his position untenable.

The new secretary had no easy passage, either in the K.F.L. or in the successor Cotsu, and he deals in some detail with the challenges to him from Mr. Dennis Akumu and others.

The Faber Nursery Song 'The Nursery Song' by Donald Mitchell and Carey Byron. Price 8s. Illustrated by Alan Howard.
