# New sulphonation plant will save Kenya £200,000 exchange a year

Today, Kenya's Minister for Commerce and Industry, Mr. Mwai Kibaki, will officially commission a £180,000 sulphonation plant at East Africa Industries' compact complex in Commercial Street, Nairobi, which will save the country about £200,000 a year in foreign exchange.

That, in bare bones, is the reason for this supplement. The 26-year-old company, jointly owned by Unilever, the Commonwealth Development Corporation and the Kenya Government through the Industrial and Commercial Development Corporation, has added another asset to its existing £2,500,000 to produce more efficiently its output of detergents.

Yet one of the fascinations of industry is that behind those bare bones is a story which holds interests for everyone interested in the wide technological world in which, for better or worse, we must live.

To boil it down even more, it's all concerned with the simple function — washing clothes. Or is it such a simple function?

Let us lift a corner of the curtain (freshly washed, of course) and take a quick look into the sunny world of detergents to see what all the froth is about.

We will learn none of the secrets of why Omo washes better than Brand X, for Brand X would also like to know that answer, and industrial secrets are more closely guarded than industrial diamonds. But we will learn of the revolution that has taken place in the not-so-gentle art of keeping your shirt white.

To understand the role of a sulphonation plant in the detergent industry requires going into the background of the industry itself and its growth over the years.

Basically a detergent is any  $\text{Al}$  to cleaning. For many years soap was the traditional method and for many purposes it is still the most popular. But when the textile industry began to blossom from the Industrial Revolution, it was found that when the new fabrics had to be washed soap formed a scum when used with "hard" water.

Some method had to be found to wash the textiles without the scum, since its presence meant that the good cleaning properties of the soap had been wasted by the reaction with the chemicals which had made the water "hard" in the first place. In other words the soap's cleaning properties had been used up by those chemicals.

Some non-soap material had to be found to replace it.

One of the early successes with this was the discovery of detergent or washing qualities in a substance known as Turkey Red Oil and realised that there was a large range of chemicals based on oil which had detergent powers.

However it was not until two World Wars had promoted its necessity that substitutes of economic value began to emerge. Particularly the second World War, with the acute shortage of natural fats, stimulated research on a vast scale.

Work was carried out in America, England and in Germany, and after the war the basic chemicals from

petroleum products were the answer.

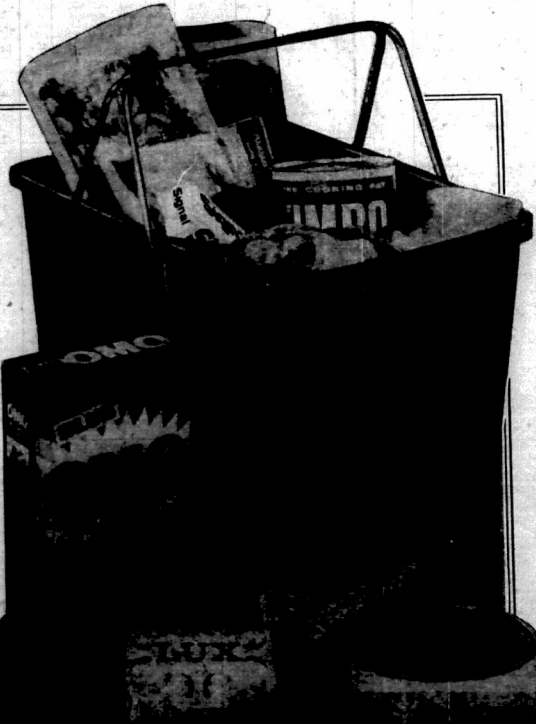

# Training points the way to the top

It is not surprising that a company such as East Africa Industries has a training scheme which starts at the office boy's stool and ends in the chairman's office.

With a manufacturing company which markets products on a mass scale, training starts out in the villages and ends in the world of the multi-million Unilever factories throughout the world.

It is a training policy which places emphasis on learning a job on the job wherever possible, but using more formal educational institutions to provide the necessary theoretical background against which the "in-service" training falls into place.

For example, in the commercial department, recruits are taken on at school certificate level, but the company aware of the fact that perhaps the best place to learn the strict requirements of this department is at an institution, sponsors the successful applicants at Strathmore College, Nairobi, where for two years they study the first part of the examinations of the Chartered Institute of Accountancy.

After this, students are taken into the company where they learn the practical applications. While they are working they continue their studies for their final examinations. At the moment there are four such students attending Strathmore.

In contrast, the training in the technical department is much more

practical, for the workers undergo an apprenticeship scheme during which they make one to two years.

During this "in-service" training they are given time off to attend the Polytechnic, where the fees are paid by the company. At the moment there are five men training under this scheme from and districts. They all are engaged in various technical external examinations.

When management trainees have reached a sufficiently high level, East Africa Industries sends them for a period of training with one of the many Unilever sister companies overseas.

A product of this school of training is the present district manager, Mr. Peter Memia, who has just returned from Nigeria where he spent his time familiarising himself with the Nigerian plant's sulphonation operation. He will be responsible for the Nairobi plant which opens today.

It is not Peter's first overseas. He has also undergone training in Britain.

In the sales department a prospective East African Industries top salesman may well start as a driver. From that, if he has the aptitude, he could become a van salesman, selling to retailers out in the countryside next step up from there would be to a sales representative who is responsible for selling to wholesalers.

Drivers are encouraged to work closely with the van salesman and

to learn from them, and every so often the company conducts sales seminars which they all attend and anyone showing aptitude may be up-graded.

If a van salesman responds to encouragement, he may be sent to attend such courses as the Text Sales Training Course for salesman

or attend the Management and Advisory Training Centre in Nairobi.

At management level even top executives may find themselves on "broadening" assignments with one of the Unilever sister companies throughout the world and may also find themselves at the Unilever

management training centre in Britain to broaden their knowledge.

The training side is slightly different. These trainees are usually made of graduates level because this is a more work which requires professional activity with work.

People who are engaged in this department work under the professional group management, who are responsible for their training.

The successful ones are sent overseas the country to pick up the wider aspects of their job and sometimes attend courses at Unilever training centres in Britain.

East Africa Industries also shares in this type of training, for recently a Malawian graduate, recruited in London, has been seconded to E.A.I. for three years, at the end of which, if all goes well, he is expected to take up a senior management position with a sister company in his home country.

This emphasis on training does not exclude senior managers and directors who also attend courses in Europe.

Mr. Moses Awori, the company secretary, said: "There is nothing to stop anyone from working his way up through the grades in which we encourage this ambition."

## How they put the stripes in

How do they put the pink stripe in signal flagging?

It is no secret, since the method is patented. What happens basically is that the pink hexachlorophosphate is put into the tube first and the white is then put in on top.

The tube is so constructed and the nature of the two liquids is such that when a special insert with holes round the edges is fixed into the top of the tube, and the tube supported, the red paste comes up round the sides, through the insert simultaneously with the white paste but restricted to the outside of the tube. It passes through the holes and then out through the nozzle the pink then white in the form of stripes.

## Building contract helped an ex-employee

The role played by East Africa Industries in "helping others to help themselves" is seen quite clearly in the background of the man who built the new sulphonation plant.

Mr. Moses Kamau, head of the firm of Kangari Building Contractors, had worked as a charge-hand of the E.A.I. artisan force for seven years before the urge for personal uburu and the chance

to build his future by building for others took him on to his own.

When a contractor was wanted for the new plant, they remembered Mr. Kamau and offered him the opportunity. More than that, they well knew that he had not sufficient capital to provide the material.

They reached an agreement by which they supplied the plans and materials, while Moses supplied the skill and the labour force. The result was a building of which both sides could be proud — finished ahead of schedule.

Mr. Kamau, the 42-year-old father of seven, learnt his trade many years ago when he worked for a contractor on the South Kisingao.

"There was one Italian man there who was a real master mason," Mr. Kamau recalls. "I worked with him for some years and he took me under his wing. I learnt to be a mason basically from him."

Then in 1951 he went to work on another building contracting job up-country and after two years, with the beginning of the Emergency, he returned to Nairobi and joined the East African Railways and Harbours as a mason.

In 1955 he worked for a year before trying his hand as a free-

lance mason working on a number of small contracts. In 1960, the slump in the building market made work impossible to find.

Mr. Kamau joined East Africa Industries.

Seven years later he resigned to start his own building company and since then has worked steadily. From November 1967, he built two flats at Upper East Africa Industries park.

"I feel that East Africa Industries have been very good to me," and "This plant has been an opportunity to prove that I can handle a big job when a time schedule and when in compliance of a set of standards. Now, I hope to get an opportunity to go on to big and better things."

With the Government's policy that contractors below a certain amount should go to African contractors wherever possible, Mr. Kamau applied for registration with the Ministry of Works. He has applied to the Industrial Development Corporation for help, and believes both categories are under consideration at the moment.

With a bit of luck he could well be on his way to a growing band of skilled masons building contractors who are making their feet in their own

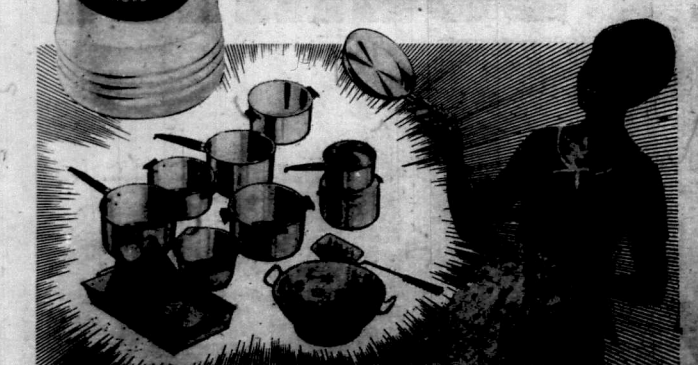

# Service to citizens and citizen traders

Like any responsible company East Africa Industries is conscious of the responsibilities to the community and it is for this reason that Mr. Daniel of Directors have had as their objective for some years past, not simply growth in their sales, but growth in the proportion of their sales to citizen traders.

This policy is paying off — E.A.I. is growing and providing more jobs for Kenyans and it is also becoming a business with citizen traders. The chairman, Mr. R. V. Berry, stated that: "Direct sales to citizens in 1968 show a 100 per cent increase over 1967, and 1968 itself showed a 100 per cent increase over the previous year."

Since the drive to develop citizen traders started some years ago, the company's association with the K.N.T.C. in the soap and detergent business, and the more recent introduction of the Trade Licensing Act, have naturally helped to accelerate the development.

E.A.I. have in their activities given 100 per cent support to the Government's desire to develop as many prosperous traders as possible rather than concentrate wealth in the hands of a small minority with attendant social and economic problems. It has also taken positive action in support of the Government's call for more attention to be devoted to developing the rural market.

New traders in particular need to be sure of a demand for the products they are buying with their limited capital. They often need and generally welcome professional advice on what products to stock and in what quantities, how to arrange their shelves and how to make displays. The E.A.I. sales team in Kenya of 60 men, all of whom are citizens, are fully briefed on how best to help their customers — and they have over 8,000

To start with, the trader knows that when he buys E.A.I. products he is buying products that are well advertised and that ensure him a rapid turnover with a fair profit. In the rural areas the company's home advisers are out every day lecturing to women's clubs and other bodies, showing housewives the benefits of using modern products, such as the advantages of detergents over bar soap for clothes washing, or the importance of dental hygiene. Thus the demand is built up and is stimulated further by the company's advertising and promotional campaigns.

To encourage the new traders E.A.I. has taken various steps. The company has reduced the number

of cases a trader has to buy in order to qualify for the wholesale price. Furthermore it has made it even easier for traders to qualify by reducing the size of the cases for many of its fastest selling lines, and by introducing new products and new sizes.

Both the East Kenya Regional Sales Manager, Mr. John Nyatome, and his counterpart in West Kenya, Mr. Ben Obolla, give a lot of the credit for developing the new citizen traders to their vast sales teams.

"One of the best salesmen, Mr. Joel Ligani, developed, during the last five months, over 40 new customers who can buy at the wholesale rate," said Mr. Obolla. Mr. Nyatome explained that the job of the sales team was essentially one of development, the development of a demand for new products in shops that hitherto have not stocked them, the devel-

opment of trading skills amongst the new businessmen, and the development of the habit of those customers to the shops where they can operate as wholesalers themselves.

It is pointed out that the wholesaler performed an important role in the distribution chain and that many wholesalers also acted as retailers. With improving living standards and a growing demand for products such as those marketed by E.A.I. Mr. Obolla stressed that there was a need for more wholesalers, and that there was enormous scope for the new citizen traders.

"As a company we are totally committed to the development of as many prosperous citizen traders as quickly as possible," said the Marketing Director. This point is continually stressed to everyone in the sales team from the most senior sales manager to the newest recruit.

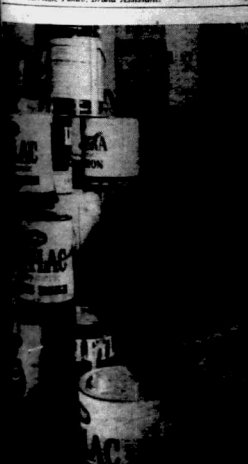

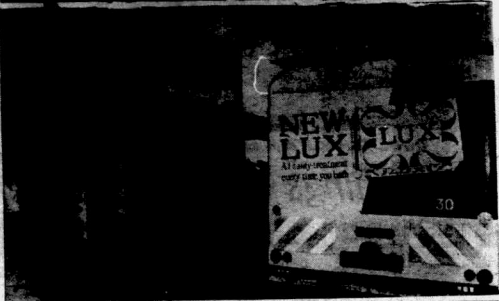

# East Africa's special needs

The names of nearly all the products East Africa Industries manufacture and markets are internationally known — Lux for example — and the quality is maintained at the standards set by Unilever.

"In E.A.I. we believe," said the chairman, Mr. R. V. Berry, "that the East African housewife is just as demanding in terms of product quality and value for money as her counterpart in any other country. She is not going to be satisfied with poor quality, with products that don't live up to the promises made about them in the advertising. Now it is the necessity of going to wait exactly the same product as her counterpart in any other country, Malaysia or even in Nigeria. The product must be tailored to meet East African needs."

"This aspect of marketing is one where experience and judgment play an extremely important role but of vital importance is market research. We may find we know what the housewife wants, for example we may feel that this particular perfume is the best one to incorporate in a washing powder, but we do not know, and this is where market research comes in."

East Africa Industries today has a large market research unit under a senior research executive seconded from an associated company, Research Bureau Ltd. in London.

"Our job," said Mr. McChesman, the Market Research Manager, "is to give marketing management the answers they need in order to operate more efficiently — answers like who is buying which product, how often, where, in which sizes, why is product 'A' chosen in preference to product 'B', what do housewives use particular products for, how do they use them."

"There are so many other aspects too — which advertisement will best tell the consumer about our product. E.A.I. is conscious of the importance of advertising in its operation."

"The object behind all our research activities is to give the consumer what she wants and in the most efficient way, and efficiency in marketing means that costs are kept down."

As in its other departments E.A.I. is devoting considerable attention to training citizens for responsible positions.

There is already one management trainee in the research unit and the company expects to recruit a second shortly. The Field Supervisors have all been trained within the company and they in turn are training the interviewers, of whom there may be up to 25 out calling on housewives at any one time.

Getting the answers to all the questions is only one part of the research job. Then there is processing and analysis of the results to be done, and finally the preparation of the report. Gradually

E.A.I.'s own research unit is taking on more of these tasks from its London-based associates. Marketing is becoming far more professional, far more scientific, experience and judgment are no longer the sole basis upon which decisions are made. Today it is a matter of experience coupled with skilled use of research as a marketing tool.

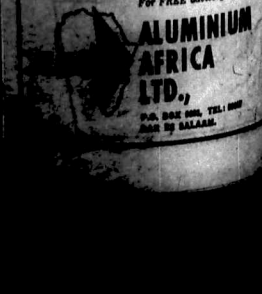

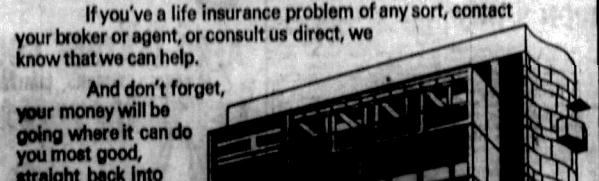

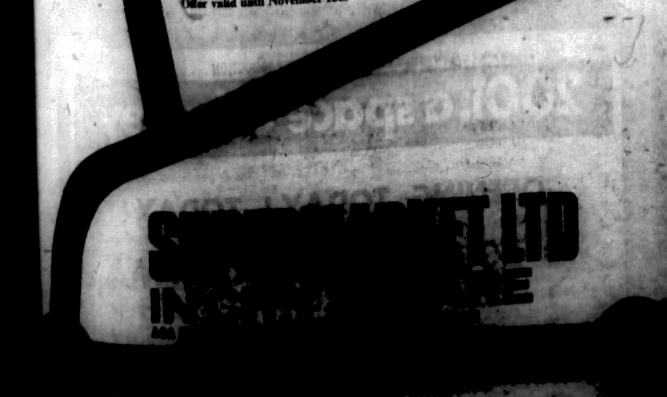

## How Uganda students see permissiveness

Girl students at Makerere University claim they are threatened with a "pregnancy epidemic" and demand protection against it. DAVID MUSKIE shows why the girls think they have a right to "defend themselves" and not be persecuted.

The Boxes — as women students at Makerere University College, in Kampala, are popularly called by men students — are angry. They are threatened with what they themselves call a "pregnancy epidemic". They complain that all the blame for the epidemic is heaped on them and they are angry because allegedly they are put under psychological torture by the authorities and because men students go scot-free without reprimand.

Recently two "very concerned Boxes" wrote an angry letter in the students' guild fortnightly newspaper, *The Makerere*.

Pregnancy, they said, was part of any sophisticated and normal society.

It was a by-product of modern life. More than 50 per cent of American and 40 per cent of French university students marry while in college mainly because of this problem.

The girls in Makerere do not think marriage is a solution. Nor would the university welcome it because accommodation for married students is limited.

Housing is not available even for mature entrants with families.

The girls want the college authorities to meet and work out how to tackle the problem.

The girls point out that they are the only ones who carry the burden of pregnancy but that this

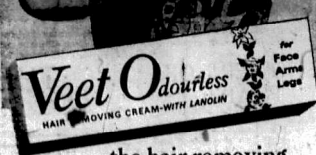

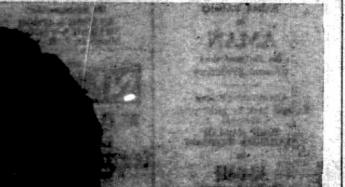

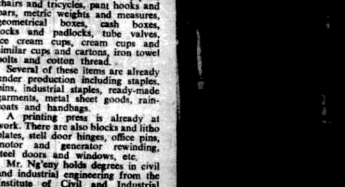

# Mark to serve jail sentence

## APPEAL DISMISSED

**Standard Staff Reporter**  
An appeal against conviction and a three-year jail sentence on a charge of corruption in office imposed by a Kenya High Court judge on the former chairman of the Rent Control Tribunal, Abdul Quader Malik, was dismissed in Nairobi yesterday by the President of the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa, Sir Charles Newbold, sitting with the vice-president Mr. Justice Duffin, and Mr. Justice Spry.

Before judgment was read, Sir Charles said that he was not the vice-president to deliver the judgment.

After dealing with points raised by A. R. Kapila, for the appellant, Mr. Justice Duffin said that he had no doubt that Malik had committed the offence of which he was charged, but that he was not satisfied that the evidence was sufficient to justify a conviction.

There was evidence to show that money was paid in accordance with what Malik had asked and that the appellant had committed the offence.

The judge said that corruption was bad at all times and more so when it was in a judicial office. The trial judge had taken into account all the facts which went with the case. There was enough evidence to show that the money was paid corruptly.

Earlier, Mr. Kapila said it was necessary to raise technical points as "strengthening my hand quite considerably," purported to have been said by Mr. Anjarwalla for the money from Mr. Anjarwalla. He said that the appellant was not a party to the case.

Mr. Kapila said "Nairobi in this case" was not using these words in particular context of the charge.

efforts to solve this country's humanitarian problem. The Prime Minister devoted much of his attention to domestic economic policy but his Nigerian speech was devoted to defeat the Labour Party, linking the war misery with Britain's arms supplies to the Federal Nigeria.

Mr. Wilson said: "It is not a matter of allowing the food under proper safeguards along the road. It is a matter of getting the Biafran ruler to agree to a daily flight of food and civilian relief. South Vietnamese military headquarters have had contact with a 16-man regional forces company based near Duc Trong in Tuyen Duc province following an attack by Vietcong and North Vietnamese, it was learned in Saigon yesterday.

A Government spokesman said that he was unable to confirm reports that another Government post, in Chau Doan province in a Mekong Delta, was "completely isolated."

A South Vietnamese military source said that radio communications with the base in Tuyen Duc, about 145 miles north-east of the capital, had been cut and the outcome of the battle was not known.

An American military spokesman said that enemy gunners had attacked about 10 targets, including mortar and mortar fire during the night.

## Tension between China and Russia easing

Minor details relating to protocol and to the living conditions of Chinese nationals in Moscow are pointing to a progressive improvement in Sino-Soviet relations recently.

Protocol usage and courtesy gestures are being revived between Soviet authorities and the Chinese Embassy after being totally discarded for many years.

For the first time in a year Soviet papers published two official Chinese texts which had been sent in a friendly mood. One was China's message of thanks for congratulations on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of the Chinese Revolution.

Two Chinese news agency correspondents attended the recent Press conference by the seven Soviet communists, along with two representatives of the Chinese Embassy.

And Chinese military attaches stood on the reviewing stand in Red Square for the October 7 parade, the Chinese crew for the Trans-Siberian train, reaching Moscow every Tuesday, is now comfortably housed in a Soviet railwayman's hotel instead of the Chinese Embassy.

## ROHAN TRIAL ADJOURNS IN JERUSALEM

The trial of Denis Michael Rohan for setting fire to the Al Aqsa Mosque adjourned yesterday to allow the prosecution and the defence time to prepare their final summing-up speeches.

The adjournment, for a few days, follows a report by an independent court-appointed psychiatrist that the young Australian was not responsible because of his mental illness for his action in trying to burn down Islam's third holiest shrine.

The Jerusalem District Psychiatrist, Dr. Aric Yaros, said that Rohan was a paranoid schizophrenic. He agreed with much of the psychiatric evidence produced by the defence that Rohan could not have resisted the impulse, to perform what he believed was an order from God.

If, as is most likely, the court follows the independent report, Rohan would be legally "not guilty" and would probably be ordered to a mental institution.

The prosecution has so far argued that Rohan, although perhaps mentally disturbed, was not prevented by his illness from resisting the impulse and is hence liable to a prison sentence.

# South African policy

Mr. Victor Owisu, embassador at a news conference in Accra that Ghana "has always been opposed to South Africa and will continue to be so as long as apartheid continues to be the official policy of that country."

# Lonrho gets control of Malawi factory

The British mining finance group Lonrho has acquired a controlling interest in the £1,800,000 David Whitehead British parent company at the end of last year, the sources said.

The Malawi Development Corporation holds 29 per cent of the shares and the remainder is held by Press Holdings Ltd., a financial organisation associated with President Banda's ruling Malawi Congress Party, they added.

Malawi cannot ignore the fact that Portugal controls access to the sea on which Malawi's economic life depends, the Transport and Communications Minister, Mr. John Msonhi, said in Blantyre, should not one lorryload of Malawi's exports or imports could travel to the Indian Ocean without the goodwill of neighbouring Mozambique, he warned.

Mr. Msonhi was speaking at an official dinner on Monday night in honour of the visiting Governor-General of Mozambique, Gen. Rebelo de Sousa.

He expressed "heartfelt gratitude" to the Portuguese Government for assistance both in the past and with the Nacala rail link, which is due to be completed in mid-1970.

"Malawi's economic prosperity and well-being lie in goodwill and co-operation with neighbours," Mr. Msonhi said.

Replying, Gen. de Sousa described the Nacala rail link as a striking example of co-operation between Portugal and Malawi. The Portuguese Government felt it was an honour to grant Malawi the right to free transportation, he said.

# SAYS LT. SMITH

In a newspaper message published in London yesterday, the Rhodesian Prime Minister, Mr. Smith, assured Britons that "in spite of what they may hear locally from their politicians or observers in Rhodesia we are growing stronger."

The message — run across six columns in the *Daily Express* on the fourth anniversary of Rhodesia's unilateral declaration of independence — said the country was at present experiencing her most buoyant conditions since the breakup of the Rhodesian Federation.

"The estimate so far as gross domestic product is concerned is that this year we will reach the very high figure of 10 per cent — the extent of 10 per cent — to any standards in the world," said Mr. Smith.

He urged that the British people be made aware that "many other countries of the free world are not only assisting us but are sharing in this expansion, with, of course, one exception — Great Britain, our oldest trading partner."

Mr. Smith's address predicted that it is unnecessary for me to repeat that as far as we people here in Rhodesia are concerned, our quarrel is not with the people of Britain but with the British Government.

In Salisbury itself Rhodesia moved quietly into the fifth year of its self-proclaimed independence with Mr. Smith predicting an eventual breakthrough in efforts to gain recognition from other countries.

None of the big celebrations of previous years was planned, and Mr. Smith and other Government leaders marked the fourth anniversary of the country's break from Britain by attending the traditional Independence Day garden party.

But there was confidence that Rhodesia had won its sanctions battle with Britain and that in a few months it would cast off its few remaining links with the British Crown.

In an interview published yesterday by the *Rhodesian Herald*, Mr. Smith made it clear that there was no going back — and that the rest of the world would have to acknowledge Rhodesia.

"We expect other people to acknowledge us as they find us under our new Constitution, just as they acknowledge other countries," he said.

He also said that although a reconciliation with London would make the road smoother in gaining recognition from other countries, it was not essential.

"I think that if Britain proves obstinate, and continues to go on being obstinate, that a breakthrough will come from another source," he said.

The introduction of the new Constitution early next year will sever the final links with Britain by making Rhodesia a Republic, replacing Queen Elizabeth with a President as Head of State, and bringing in complex franchise, to ensure continued White rule.

On the basis of it, Mr. Smith is expected to call a General Election in May.

# Let China in F.A.O. plea

Kenya's Minister for Agriculture, Mr. McKenzie has urged the participation of Russia and People's China in the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation (F.A.O.).

Stressing the need to close the gap between developed and developing countries, Mr. McKenzie asked: "How can we leave out a third of the world's population and some of her most powerful nations?"

He was addressing delegates from the F.A.O.'s 119-member nations at the first working session of the organisation's biennial conference in Rome.

The Soviet Union, although a U.N. member, is not an F.A.O. member. People's China is not in the U.N. or any of its associated bodies.

Mr. McKenzie said some of the developed countries were not contributing fully to the task of international development. This was evident in objections some of them raise to the F.A.O.'s rising budget requirements.

While much of the task of the developed countries themselves, they were dependent on the developed nations for most of their export prices and for material and capital, the Minister said.

He called for aid and advice which would permit developing countries to increase internal and regional trade in order to ease their dependence on external markets.

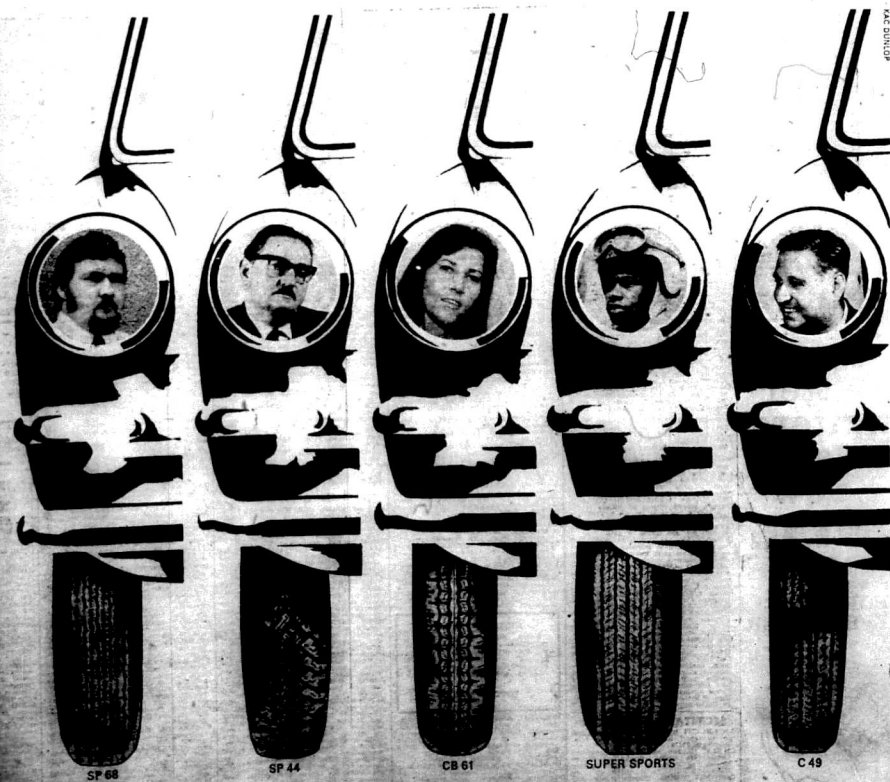

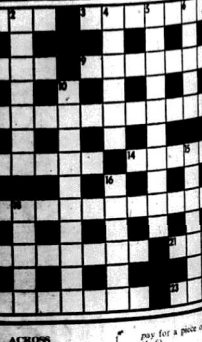

# Mammoth behind the scenes

Next year's Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh will attract the attention of the world and will undoubtedly be attended by thousands of people, but few of them will stop to consider the amount of work which has been going on behind the scenes by small groups of people from all walks of life who have given up much of their valuable spare time to the organisation of the event.

For them, preparing for the Games, which will be held in Edinburgh from July 16 to 25, next year, has meant 101 different tasks and organising parties to welcome the athletes to the city. The Commonwealth sports stadium is ready in time for the event.

The committee with perhaps the most onerous task of all is the Village Committee, which under the chairmanship of Mr. John MacPherson, has the job of ensuring that the athletes will be accommodated in the Pollock Halls of Residence, near the centre of the City.

Ensuring that the athletes feel at home is a job few men would prefer to tackle in their spare time but Mr. MacPherson, as deputy secretary of Edinburgh University, is obviously an able administrator. This, backed up by his own experience of organising conferences and conferences - with a total of some 250,000 up to 1960 - made him an ideal choice.

He and his committee have organised the running of the village on the lines of a military operation - with Mr. MacPherson taking the role of village commander since the athletes will begin arriving for the Games at the beginning of July.

Once the plans have been laid, the village will mean many changes in the Pollock Halls. Many of the single study bedrooms will be converted with two tier bunks being installed. Our first major problem was finding sleeping accommodation for the athletes and officials. The Halls of Residence are equipped to house only 1,800 students. Although 1,800 are expected to house only 1,800, it means a few changes in providing accommodation but the bank system will mean we can cope with that."

The second major problem was eating facilities. Apart from providing nourishing meals we had

to have eating accommodation for large numbers - especially on the days of the opening and closing ceremonies. On these days all the athletes and officials have to be at the Meadowbank stadium virtually at one time. We have overcome this problem by having two carefully timed sittings.

There might also be a problem of providing suitable diets for the athletes from different countries. He added: "Athletes from Asia might not be particularly fond of Western dishes and we will be catering for their wishes. It is our aim to make them feel at home. We are hoping to provide meals like curries for them as well as recognised dishes for many from other countries."

It is hoped the Army will help control access to the village and a special village being erected for the village president and staff from official cars, will be banned from the village precinct and have entertainment organised for the athletes will end at 10.30 p.m. to ensure a good night's sleep.

Soft drinks will be available all day and facilities are being provided to allow the athletes to make an athlete's morning cups or a bedtime beverage.

Mr. MacPherson is also hoping to have each athlete provided with a small airline bag of personal items such as tissues, toothpaste and needle and thread packs, gifts and other things on their arrival.

"Our aim is to give them useful little mementoes which we will be presented by industrial concerns in Scotland and which we hope will be useful to them," he said. "The cost of providing the athletes with accommodations and food has been estimated at £4.15 a day. The total cost of running the village for the duration of the games will be somewhere in the region of £12,000."

It is planned that each athlete should get about 3,000 calories each day in his diet.

He is hoping to provide traditional Scottish dishes like pease porridge, haggis, steak and potato. Aberdeen will mean an army of workers will have to be recruited locally. Some of the university's regular staff will be staying on during the vacation to help and we will be recruiting help from the recreational science colleges throughout Scotland."

Mr. MacPherson will be dealing with the athletes at the Village to ensure there are no complaints about the food. Clear complaints will be dealt with at a regular morning meeting with team managers.

Perhaps the biggest problem which will confront Mr. MacPherson and his committee will be converting the Halls of Residence into a village. Among the many jobs to be done is to provide a facility to house 2000 athletes and medical rooms.

"The University term ends only two weeks before the first group of athletes arrives. Our biggest headache will be changing everything in time. With little luck and a large army of helpers - I should make it."

He added: "Provided everything goes according to plan there should be no real problem throughout the games. Nevertheless, I will be glad when August next year comes."

"I can administer and organise the village from home but we need able people to put the plans into practice. We have made it our aim."

Things are beginning to take shape at the German nation's largest building site in Munich, where the Olympic Stadium for the 1972 Summer Games is being erected. After excavating a gigantic, oval ditch, conservation workers have started building the concrete base for the future main tribune.

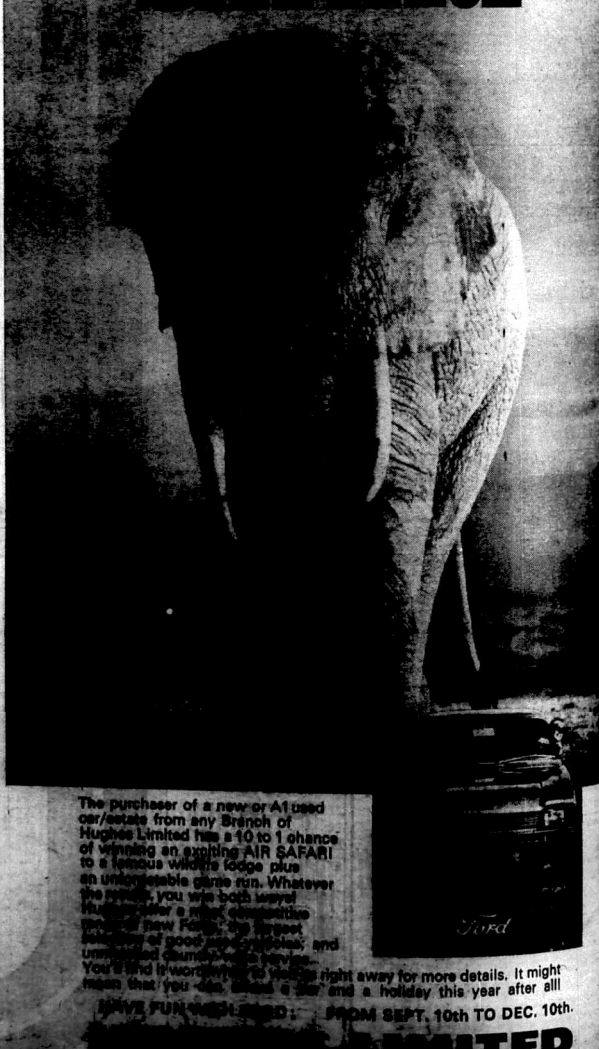

## Government still on alert, warns P.C.

The curfew imposed in Kisumu and Siaya Districts recently has been lifted. The curfew order, which was imposed after incidents at the opening of the Kisumu General Hospital by President Kenyatta on October 25, is lifted with effect from today.

Announcing this in Kisumu yesterday, the Nyansa Provincial Commissioner, Mr. I. K. Chelugot, said the order had been lifted after requests from people in Nyansa.

## Restraint rewarded

The Government had reviewed the situation and was satisfied that the curfew in both districts had, as a whole, exercised restraint and co-operated fully with the authorities during the time the order was in force.

The Mayor of Kisumu, Coun. Samson Odoyo, has welcomed the lifting of the order.

Thanking the Government for taking this step, he said it was a clear indication that the Government listened to the people's requests.

He was also pleased to see the Government in maintaining the curfew order in Siaya and Kisumu, but he said that the Government should be vigilant and start against any act of hooliganism and intimidation.

Mr. Chelugot said that such acts would not be tolerated and that the Government would be forced to act fully and swiftly against them.

The P.C. appealed to leaders and people in the province to co-operate with the Government in ensuring that the curfew order was not repeated.

He emphasized that all people should channel their energy and enthusiasm towards development and progress instead of listening to those who would lead them to chaos and disorder.

Speaking about the General Election, the P.C. said that the Government had announced that it would be held in a peaceful and orderly manner.

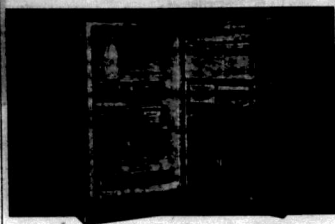

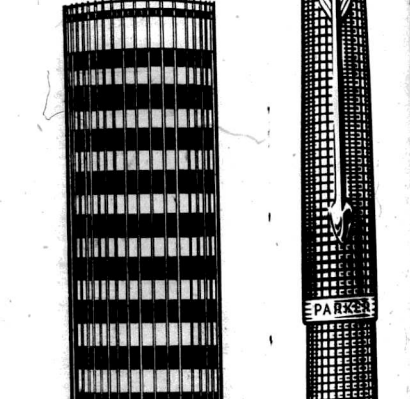

# Alm River here, hens work a 17-hour day

By JACK ENBOLL.

Assisted by a measure of artificial daylight, the hens at Alm River work 17 hours a day to lay eggs for the improvement of Kenya's poultry industry and for the export trade. None of these eggs, however, appears for sale to the housewife in the shops.

The chairman of the Kenya Poultry Development Co., Mr. Peter Salama, the chairman of the K.N.F.U. with Mr. Bill Hutton, General Manager of the A.D.C., its managing director. The general manager is Mr. R. W. Garner who is also well-known in Kenya as a racehorse trainer and the production manager is Mr. Fred Paulmar, an experienced poultry farmer from County Tyrone, Northern Ireland, whose broilers are well-known in Kenya farming circles. There are also two other experienced men who were trained in the modern poultry business at the West of Scotland Agricultural College.

The purpose of the Kenya Poultry Development Co. Ltd., a £70,000 enterprise owned jointly by the Agricultural Development Corporation, Vitamins (E.A.) Unga Ltd., and two British companies, Cobb, which specialises in broilers, and Double-A (Alexander and Angel), which concentrates on laying fowls — is to produce and sell day-old chicks.

The unit is sited on a 200-acre strip on the Kenya Meat Commission's Beacon Ranch at Alm River and contains 7,000 Cobb parent stock of different ages and 5,500 Double-A parent stock. These are imported at three-monthly intervals as day-old chicks from the parent farms in Britain. Double-A being in Gloucester and Cobb at Brinton, Essex.

"Inability" becomes depressed. At the fumigation chamber a red light over the door indicates that the eggs are being fumigated with formaldehyde and when this process is complete an extractor fan is turned on which clears the gas in 15 to 20 minutes. The eggs are then removed to the "nesters" where they are kept at 59.5 deg. F. for 18 days.

The capacity of the present bank of "nesters" at Alm River is 50,000 eggs, there being 15 racks in a machine with 180 eggs on each rack. These machines, as well as the final hatchery, were manufactured by a Canadian company whose factory is at the same height (3,200ft.) as Alm River, which may go some way to explain the good results being obtained by the Kenya concern. In the event of a major power breakdown there is a powerful standby generator adjacent to the hatchery.

One of the business in the hatchery, reached by an approach road from the main Mombasa highway and across a disinfected dip. On either side of the hatchery are breeder houses containing the laying fowls and their cockerels. The breeder houses are at 200-yard intervals and isolated by wire, each of them being under the control of one man who is forbidden to enter any of the other houses and who wears protective clothing. Each house is also equipped with a separate shower and toilet and all visitors have to pass through yet another bath of disinfectant at each house.

Eggs are collected from the breeder houses four times a day and delivered to the hatchery in washable plastic trays which are disinfected each time that they are used. Once in the hatchery the eggs are graded for size, the minimum size being two ounces for the broilers and 1½ for the laying birds. They are then kept for ten days at a constant temperature of 55 deg. F. before being moved into the fumigation chamber. It is estimated that after 10 days the

broilers because these are ready for killing in ten weeks. The sale of pullets on the other hand depends on the phasing of individual poultry units. He aims to increase parent stock to 70,000 hens and hopes to sell about 695,000 chicks in 1970-71, increasing this to 800,000 in 1971-72.

In the breeder houses there are 10 cockerels per 100 hens, the males being 150ft. by 40ft., which gives three square feet per bird. The birds run on wood shavings and concentration varies according to age and other factors.

In one house I was shown 1,500 Double-A parents which are fed on an ad lib. prairie and allowed to eat as much as they like. The four egg collections of the previous day from four layings had yielded a total of 1,038, production being encouraged by the 17 hours of light which is boosted by artificial illumination.

A number house contained 2,000 Double-A parents at six weeks old which are due to start laying in 21 days. The eggs, however, will not be used until they reach the right size. In general terms the later a pullet starts laying the larger the egg. Owing to their different colour the cocks being brown and the hens white, both sets in the Double-A strain are kept together from chicks. If the cocks were introduced at a later stage they would be attacked by the hens.

In one of the Cobb breeder houses where the cockerels of the same white colour had just been introduced, the fowls had been debarked to prevent cannibalism. Here food was being restricted to once they come to full production they will go on to unrestricted feeding. These birds were a week from laying.

All the poultry are vaccinated against Newcastle disease at eight days and against cholera at six weeks. Blood testing for pullorum is carried out between 16 and 20 weeks.

easy to manage in cages and other production systems and it produces a large brown egg with a strong shell. The company claims that hens housed averages of 240 per egg and feed consumption of only 1½ oz per bird per day and up to 50 per cent egg throughout the year are regularly achieved. And at the end there is a saleable carcass as a bonus.

Other firms in Kenya are bringing in different breeds, but the Cobb-Double-A project at Alm River has been described as a way of breeding up the Kenya poultry industry as well as providing better quality white meat for the housewife and better quality eggs.

Poultry farms taking delivery from Alm River range from the very small which will order, say, 25 chicks at a delivery, to the very large unit which will order in lots of 25,000 chicks. The trend in Kenya, as elsewhere, however, tends to favour the larger units.

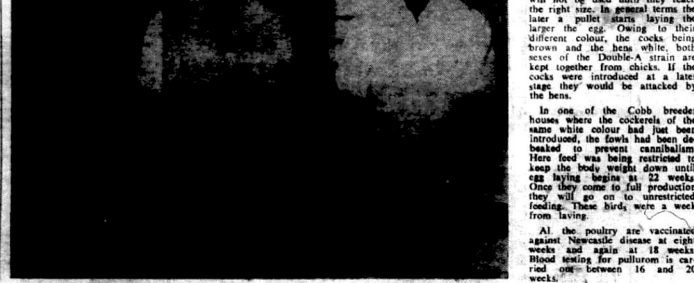



## Early warning system may beat army worm

A unique warning system to forecast outbreaks of army worm, which has caused devastation in East African cereal crops and grasslands since 1961, is to be tried out by the East African Agricultural and Forestry Research Organisation at Murgu, near Nairobi.

The research organisation has developed a system for forecasting seasonal outbreaks of army worm and will issue forecasts hoping to warn Government agricultural departments and other agricultural agencies in the partner States of outbreaks about two weeks beforehand.

The organisation, in its newsletter this month, emphasises that the forecasts will be tentative as gaps in the knowledge of the causes of seasonal changes in the distribution of the pest still exist despite intensive studies.

But being able to expect an outbreak will be a considerable step forward in the farmers' fight to combat the pest as army worm usually appears suddenly and most damage is caused in the first few days before effective control measures can take effect.

The forecasts will begin this month — the start of the 1969/70 season — with brief weekly forecasts of the probability

of outbreaks within the next week or two for particular areas.

The main purpose of the initial forecasts, say the organisation, will be to determine the importance and limitations of already available data. Experience in the first season should indicate if it is possible to develop a reliable and regular forecast service for the farmer.

A clear relationship between the seasonal geographical pattern of outbreaks of army worm and prevailing winds has emerged from the research programme which has made it possible to try and forecast outbreaks on similar lines to the International Desert Locust Information Service sponsored by the FAO.

It is a universal disease that causes untold human ill-health as well as tragic economic loss in cattle, sheep, goats, pigs and certain wild-life.

The vaccine S19 has played a major part in reducing incidence of the disease in North American and European countries and should form the pad from which other national campaigns can be launched. But brucellosis was also considered a problem that should be tackled on an international basis.

The presence of the disease in concentrations of livestock in areas from which the condition has already been eradicated.

Perhaps surprisingly, much common ground was also explored during the debate on the improvement of grassland in tropical and sub-tropical areas. Although a highly specialist subject, it was considered that contributions could be made by farmers and scientists from more temperate zones.

Deep-rooting plants, indigenous to one country, have been found helpful in improving leys under arid conditions on the other side of the world. More generally helpful has been the experience of engineers in temperate climates in developing irrigation and water conservation systems and with chemists, in perfecting techniques of minimal cultivation.

Knowledge, it was felt, should be made more readily available for the improvement of agriculture in the tropics.

At the root of a deeper understanding of all these problems, and of the skills necessary for their solution, lies agricultural education and extension services. Education, it was stated by many speakers, cannot be considered in a vacuum.

The solution lies partly in improving the basic education of large sections of society and in training men in the art of communication. But beyond that, as was stated at the 1966 conference, "the core of the problem is to bring the rapidly increasing proportion of the rural population into a modern productive economy. This is not only a question of production but of raising the income, status and self-respect to the satisfaction of the whole farming community".

Far too many economic, political, religious and other factors are involved for it to be possible to provide "blueprints" for the improvement of agricultural industries, but the Kericho objective apply to all emerging nations and the experience of more progressive agriculture should enable developing countries to bypass some evolutionary stages of advance.

We already have the technology to double world food production, and the development of some farms, such as those visited by delegates before the conference in Kenya, proves that in many areas of desperately poor productivity, there is nothing inherently wrong with soil or climate to inhibit greater production and cash cropping.

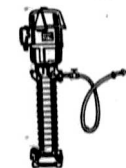
The faltering local farmers to keep pace with larger operators is partly a matter of incentive. No farmer, whatever his race, can be persuaded to produce more than the needs of his family unless he considers the carrots are big enough.

No formal resolution followed this wider implication of the conference debate. The occasion was a forum for discussion not a source of published conclusions. It one of the aims of the Royal Agricultural Society of the Commonwealth, which was established through the initiative of Prince Philip in 1957 to encourage and arrange the interchange of knowledge and experience in the practice and science of agriculture with a view to improving methods of both crop production and the breeding of livestock.

While there will be no official move by the R.A.S.C. as a result of its 1969 conference, therefore, it sparked off a determination to cooperate far more closely in the constant effort to overcome or reduce the problems that face all its member societies.

But as a direct result of the Nairobi discussions, history is likely to record a number of major advances in the agricultural economist and his well-versed farming communities throughout the Commonwealth.

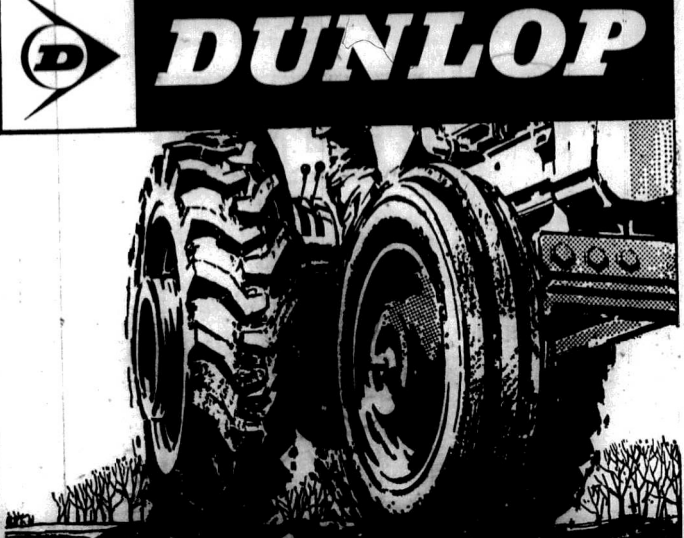

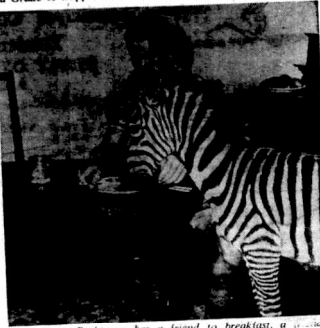

# Kenya's gentle trapper

tricted in the amount of stock he could hold. He was only issued with licenses to cover the number of animals for which he had orders. Previously he could catch and hold animals and have a selection of game ready for export as soon as orders came in.

This, said Mr. Seago, made the whole business more economical. The only restrictions were that trappers could not supply animals to circuses, menageries or pet shops. The same rules applied today but when a trapper received an order from a private zoological park the Capture Committee often wanted a testimonial covering the buyer.

This, not surprisingly, sometimes resulted in a sharp reply from the buyer concerned and he usually went off to South West Africa or Mozambique for his animals. These countries could supply animals cheaper and, with lower freight costs.

Mr. Seago agreed that inquiries had to be made but he felt that municipal zoos and wealthy owners of private parks should be accepted as suitable.

"All this has affected business and naturally has affected the attitude of the trappers," according to Mr. Seago. "You do not feel disposed to bring in more money into this venture or try to battle against outside competition when you are getting no encouragement from within."

Mr. Seago's reputation, however, continues to bring in business automatically. At the moment, for instance, he is looking after a lioness with her cub, "Tidey West African bongo" which "Tidey" before it is sent to the Mombasa Quarantine Station and on to America will bring several hundred pounds into Kenya.

The trapping team, led by one of Kenya's few qualified African game trappers, Mr. Mwani Kaundu, is currently catching bongo in the Aberdare for the National Zoological Park of America in Washington.

Mr. Kaundu is the leader of a team skilled in catching all sorts of animals. From the rugged rhino to the gentle giraffe. The animals are caught in traps by roping of at night using spotlights.

The smaller gazelle are, according to Mr. Seago, the most difficult animals to catch for they are nervous and very quick to get away. The group has never had to catch lion—there are usually an cub available for export when an order comes up.

The only time lions were not available was during the shooting of the film *The Lion*. Two had to be brought in from America. Mr. Seago has supplied animals for *Where No Buller's Fly, Cheetah in Africa* and *The Last Safari*.

Game trapping is not cruel when

we send a man along to accompany the animals to their destination. He can see to their every comfort, supplying their pens in hot weather or covering them when the windy.

Most zoos have given up the old idea of having as many animals as possible stuck away in individual cages. The emphasis today is on groupings, having, for example, plain game or species from high altitudes in pens together.

Many zoos are undertaking expansion programmes and Africa's game trappers are supplying their needs. How does Kenya benefit from the sale of animals? Apart from the obvious foreign exchange it gets, there are two benefits, according to Mr. Seago.

"First, the animal is exhibited with a label showing the country of origin and this obviously stimulates interest about Kenya among visitors.

"Secondly, the various zoos have in recent years formed associations which travel overseas and their routes are to a great extent influenced by the animals they see in their own zoo. They want to come and see the animals in their natural habitats and this naturally benefits the tourism business."

When Mr. John Seago's game advised him to find a new outdoor life he did as he was told and became a game trapper. Slightly-built and soft-spoken Mr. Seago, now 61, is happy to explode the myth that all his breed are tough, barrel-chested bush veterans who daily risk their lives to "bring 'em back alive".

"Catching animals requires brain work and planning. The skills there is no reason why it should be difficult or dangerous," he said at his office, Lower Kabete house this week.

Some might dispute this remark but few would deny that Mr. Seago has built up one of Africa's finest game trapping outfits over the past 20 years, an organisation that supplies animals to the world and which brings in a substantial amount of foreign exchange as a result.

"In those years he has trained a team capable of catching animals in the bush, skilfully and humanely and has achieved for his outfit a reputation as a supplier of good, healthy specimens for the zoological parks of Europe, America and India.

Mr. Seago is catering for an industry that has its roots back in the ancient civilisations. Man has always kept animals in captivity — from the ancient Chinese to the present time. Today's zoos, of course, have come a long way from

those of ancient times and many are now breeding grounds for some of the world's threatened species.

Mr. Seago entered the animal-catching business by accident.

"I came to Kenya in 1948 seeking a healthy climate after a severe attack of T.B. Being a fellow of the Zoological Society, it was suggested to me by Dr. Geoffrey Vavas, the director of the London Zoo, that it would add interest to my trip if I attended to the purchase and shipment of some zebras for them."

He bought the animals and, as he had always been associated with animals in Britain, his Kenya visit started a keen interest in wild game. He knew that he would not learn much just buying animals so he decided to start catching them himself.

Mr. Seago joined up with Mr. Gilbert Sauvage, one of the older, well-established trappers. Later he formed his own company and was joined by his godson, Mr. Tony Parkinson, who is now the more active partner in the trapping concern.

From these small beginnings he slowly improved his company to establish the reputable dollar-earning organisation that it is today. But Mr. Seago, together with most game trappers I have spoken to in recent months, is unhappy with the present regulations governing animal-catching and feels that Kenya is losing large sums of money each year because of them.

Trappers have already been hit by the closure of the Suez Canal,

which has raised freight costs and by the introduction of stricter health restrictions by importing countries. Denmark, for instance, is the only European country allowing the importation of zebras. The others fear, without foundation, that the animal carries African Horse Sickness and is a threat to existing bloodstock.

The difficulty in catching animals, however, is not restricted to the work in the bush. Part of the problem these days is in the paperwork the trappers are required to complete before permission to catch is granted by the Kenya Game Department.

Most of the regulations dated back to the colonial era and were not suited to the present day. Mr. Seago said that the trappers, who had always received co-operation from Game Department officers, had a tougher time getting licences than hunters who require them before their clients could be allowed to shoot any animals.

When a trapper wanted a licence he had to give full details of his order to the Capture Committee of the Game Department which decided on the suitability of the buyer.

Mr. Seago pointed out that if he obtained an order just after the committee had met he must wait at least another three weeks before he could act on it.

With today's costs it is difficult to carry out business in such a fashion. Many of the prospective buyers would not wait. They wanted animals and time to them was money. Therefore they went to other African countries where they could get their orders without delay.

The trapper today was also re-

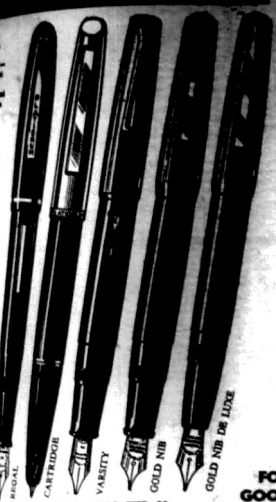

## TEA WEEK IN KENYA

### A campaign to make better drinkers

Kenya's Tea Week is probably the biggest and best programme ever launched by any industry in the country. It is sponsored by the Associated Tea Growers of East Africa, who are running a simultaneous Tea Week in Uganda. The promotion campaign follows a highly successful Tea Week in Kenya last year and a Focus on Tea in Uganda, held earlier this year in conjunction with the F.A.O. consultation on tea in Kampala.

Although tea production in Kenya last year reached an all-time record with crop weighing about 65,500,000 pounds of made tea and worth well over £10,000,000 in cash, everything is not blossoming in Kenya's tea gardens.

Prices for tea on world markets continue to show a downward trend, there is a threatened world surplus of tea, not to mention the effect of sterling devaluation. And yet the industry is still expanding its tea production expected to reach 75,000,000 pounds of made tea by 1961.

### drinkers

One way to help ensure the future of Kenya's tea industry is to try and increase local consumption — hence Tea Week.

The theme of Tea Week is "Any Time is Tea Time". The message will be carried on letters posted in the main towns in Kenya and Uganda and will feature prominently on promotion material throughout the week.

One of the main events of Tea Week is the Miss Tea Competition.

The finals take place at a Grand Tea Party at the New Stanley Hotel, Nairobi, on launching day, Friday, November 14, the winner receives a cheque for £100 and a wardrobe of dresses to see her through the week. The East Africa Bata Shoe Company are donating her shoes

to make sure she is well shod for all occasions.

Kenya's Miss Tea will preside at a number of functions during the week and on Monday she will fly to Mombasa with Uganda's Miss Tea to attend a special charity tea auction. A special consignment of tea, donated by A.T.G.E.A. members, will be auctioned and the proceeds divided between the two countries for distribution by Miss Tea to various charities.

Other competitions include a window display competition and a competition to estimate the number of packets of tea sealed inside a Ford Escort car — the prize being the car.

Passengers on East African Airways internal flights will be presented with sample packets of East Africa's finest tea to taste when they get home and motorists will receive car stickers to remind them that it's better to "Drink Tea and Drive Safely".

## KENYA TEA IN RELATION TO WORLD MARKETS

For us Kenya tea is primarily an export crop second only to coffee. We are therefore concerned to see the continued decline in the tea prices which have persisted for over 25 per cent in the international market contributing to over 25 per cent price fall per unit value. This decline in tea prices, as everyone knows, has resulted from an imbalance in the supplies of tea over demand due to over-production in the world and also due to competition from other soft drinks.

This situation has prompted exporters and importers to launch tea promotion campaigns in the main markets and our Tea Board contributes substantially the finance necessary to continue with these campaigns.

Our own tea consumption at present takes only slightly under 10 per cent of our tea production and compared to countries which are great drinkers of tea there is much room for improvement.

The consumption per head in Kenya is in the region of one pound per annum whereas in countries like United Kingdom consumption is nine times as much.

I am very pleased that the Associated Tea Growers of East Africa have for the second year arranged another Tea Week during which local consumption of tea will be promoted.

At the same time Kenya is taking part in the international meetings which have been taking place in the last four years to stabilise the price of tea in the International Market including the

attendees at the next meeting which will be held early in December in Rome under the auspices of the Food and Agricultural Organisation of the United Nations.

It will be remembered that all the main exporting countries met in July in Mauritius and agreed to withdraw some 50,000,000 pounds of black tea from the World Market in an attempt to balance the demand and supply position of tea so as to maintain the tea price in these markets at a high level.

Although the tea prices in the International Markets have fallen we should be proud of the fact that we have been able to obtain top prices for tea in these markets and this is due to high quality tea production in Kenya.

I would like to urge all tea growers to maintain high standards of tea picking and this will ensure our efforts.

It is my earnest hope that the Kenya Tea Week will be even more successful than last year.
