Hanoi's man in Paris offers private talks

The chief North Vietnamese delegate to an Vietnam peace talks in Paris, Xuan Thuy, said on Tuesday night that he would be willing to hold new private talks with the head of the American delegation if the Americans had anything new to announce.

But Mr. Thuy said any new U.S. North Vietnamese contact must touch upon all questions which are part of the important and proposed by the National Liberation Front and the Provisional Revolutionary Government of South Vietnam.

The most recent Hanoi-Washington contact was in mid-August. Mr. Thuy said any new contact would have to deal principally with the subject of the withdrawal of all American forces from Vietnam, and that of the formation of a provisional coalition government for South Vietnam.

He said the P.R.G. had always been informed of the content of the U.S.-North Vietnamese contacts, made public by President Nixon in his November 3 Vietnam policy speech.

During statements by the chief U.S. delegate, Mr. Henry Cabot Lodge, Mr. Thuy said some of the private contacts between Hanoi and Washington in the past had been held on North Vietnamese initiative, while many others had been held at the initiative of the Americans.

He told journalists that the statements he made recently to Mr. Harrison Salisbury of the New York Times, which were partially repeated in that newspaper.

He emphasized that, in his meeting with Mr. Salisbury, he replied to the question of whether the withdrawal of troops would lead to mass evacuations or reprisals. This was a request for the United States not to withdraw rapidly and completely from the G.L.S. from South Vietnam.

After the re-establishment of peace and the withdrawal of the U.S. North Vietnamese forces, the establishment of good relations would have been met, and the conditions between us and the United States on the basis of the five principles of co-existence.

Fighting based around Special Forces camps along the South Vietnamese-Cambodian border and in six of the 11 provinces surrounding Saigon on Tuesday, a U.S. military spokesman said in Saigon yesterday.

In addition, large-scale "enemy" troop movements were reported in the Quang region, prompting observers to wonder whether Hanoi had given their forces the word to get into position for a new offensive.

Nevertheless, overnight harassment bombardments remained at a low level. Only four targets were hit on Tuesday night.

Hanoi's man in Paris offers private talks

The chief North Vietnamese delegate to the Vietnam peace talks, Mr. Xuan Thuy, said on Tuesday night that he would be willing to hold private talks with the head of the American delegation if the Americans had anything new to announce.

But Mr. Thuy said any new U.S.-North Vietnamese contact must touch upon all questions which are part of the ten-point solution to the Vietnam problem and proposed by the National Liberation Front and the Provisional Revolutionary Government of South Vietnam.

The most recent Hanoi-Washington contact was in mid-August. Mr. Thuy said any new contact would have to deal principally with the subject of the withdrawal of all American forces from Vietnam, and that of the formation of a provisional coalition government for South Vietnam. The Hanoi delegate was speaking at a Press conference.

He said the P.R.G. had always been informed of the content of the U.S.-North Vietnamese contacts made public by President Nixon in his November 17 Vietnam policy speech.

Denying statements by the chief U.S. delegate, Mr. Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., that the Hanoi initiative, while many others had been held at the initiative of the Americans, journalists about the statements he made recently to Mr. Harrison Salisbury of the New

Sixteen large-scale troop movements were spotted north-east of Saigon, and helicopter and artillery interdicted in Phuoc Long Province. — Reuters

TOBACCO MAY MAKE THIS DISTRICT RICH

Dependence on one type of crop for cash or food economy has now been realized to be an invitation to possible calamity at a time of crop failure.

Tanzania has recognized this and is now seriously carrying out crop diversification programmes in a number of places and introducing multiphase crop economy in all the regions.

In Ruwama Region for some time now cashewnut has been the main cash crop. At one time cotton was largely grown but advice was given against its development in the southern border regions as it was feared that the close proximity of the cotton belt to that of Mozambique would make Tanzania vulnerable to the Red Mite controversy, prevalent there.

Tunduru district is one of the richest cashewnut-growing areas in the southern regions and its production is yearly on the increase. However, for the above reasons, it has been found necessary to introduce a new cash crop to supplement the nuts. The selected crop is flue-cured tobacco.

In the past two years the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Cooperatives has been carrying out thorough research into all the possibilities of new crop production in the district. The first experiment was carried out in the 1967-68 crop season.

In that season some peasants were encouraged to grow tobacco on a sensitive plot. The crop netted £111 in spite of initial failures. In fact the output was lower than it should have been, but at the Mtwara tobacco market Tunduru tobacco was highly graded and secured a very good price.

The peasants were heartened in the following seasons, 70 acres were planted.

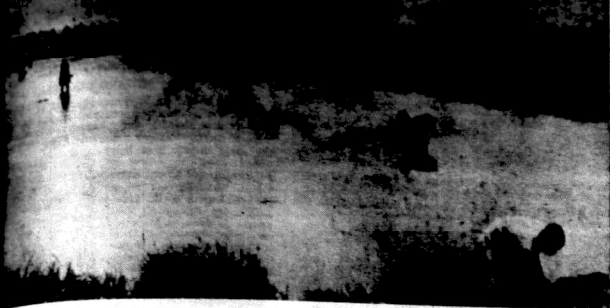

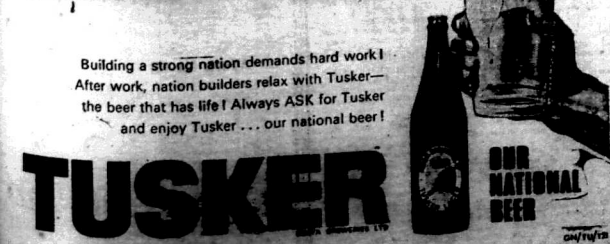

Skill with pen wins its reward

CHILDREN'S HANDWRITING COMPETITION

Prize-winners in the East African Children's Handwriting Competition were told on Wednesday that their skill with the pen was only a sign of their ability to succeed in life. The Chief Education Officer, Mr. Mwendwa, deputising for the Minister for Education, Dr. Mwangi, said that your handwriting is not an indication of your intelligence or of other kinds of success.

For the third successive year the Lusitania Preparatory School had the finest record in the competition but the gathering was told that the 1969 success would be its last. The school is closing down at the end of the current term.

Introducing the guest of honour, the Editor of the East African Standard said that Mr. Mwendwa came of a family which had rendered

distinguished service to Kenya in many fields. He had been Kenya's Chief Education Officer since Uhuru and his interest in children was not confined merely to their education and good handwriting. He was chairman of the Outward Bound Trust of Kenya, which encouraged a sense of purpose and adventure in the young people of the nation.

The Editor added: "I should like to say how pleased the East African Standard has been to run the Children's Handwriting Competition once again, in association with the Platinum Pen Co. It has been a great success over more and entries were received from schools in every corner of East Africa. The standard of entries seems to get higher each year and every child who has won a prize richly deserves it."

He welcomed Mr. Peter Griffin, export manager of the company which makes Platinum pens, who had travelled from Britain especially to be present. He also expressed appreciation of the fine work done for the competition by Mr. Keith Paswell of Phillips, Harrison and Crofted Ltd., the East African agents for Platinum pens, and the way he had co-operated with the newspaper in presenting it.

Delivering his Minister's speech, Mr. Mwendwa said: "This handwriting competition is now a regular event in our educational calendar, and once again I should like to congratulate the four African Standard and Phillips, Harrison and Crofted Ltd. on their successful organisation of it. It seems to be a good way of both selling more pens and getting better handwriting — a happy combination of business and educational interests.

"Some of you may feel that good writing is not a skill of any great importance, and that we are making rather a fuss in trying to insist on it in our schools. After all, with all due respect, many doctors manage to make a good living without being able to write a legible sentence.

"But handwriting is indeed important, even though some of our messages nowadays go by telephone, or via the dictaphone, and the typewriter. A personal letter needs to be handwritten, and it is only a firm of politicians to make sure that it can easily be read.

"In Government Ministries we often have to ask secretaries to type long reports and many pages of reports which our officers have first written out in their own writing.

"If the reports are easily readable the job does not take long and the secretary can enjoy typing them. But a poorly-written manuscript wastes time, is tiring for the secretary to work on, and can even lead to unfortunate mistakes and misinformation in the typed version.

"These are some of the practical consequences of good or bad handwriting. They matter, of course, but they are not the only reasons for learning to write well. A page of good writing is a pleasant thing to look at — a creative achieve-

ment in its own right, as I think you will agree after looking at some of the entries displayed here today.

"Any child can get tremendous satisfaction by making something beautiful, and while looking at Moreover, those people who turn themselves, by hard practice, into good writers are so often people who turn out to be good at other things as well.

"Let me point out that this competition is a genuinely international effort. It is open to pupils in all three of the East African countries, and I am delighted to see that all three of them figure in the list of prize-winners.

"My Ministry is happy to co-operate in doing the preliminary judging and reducing the thousands of entries to a short list of less than a hundred.

"The final adjudication is then carried out by a neutral expert in London, an internationally known handwriting authority who can treat the entries wholly on their merits."

Amid laughter, the speaker added: "The only thing I am sorry about is that my own inspectors, who examine these works of art each year, never seem to profit from the exercise and continue to write as badly as ever.

"Presenting the prize-winners with their awards, he offered them warm congratulations and best wishes for the future.

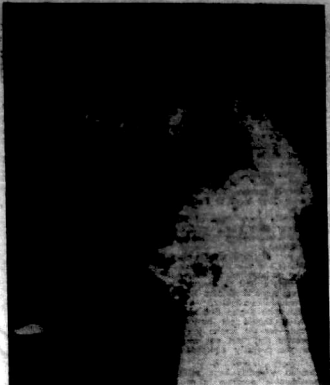

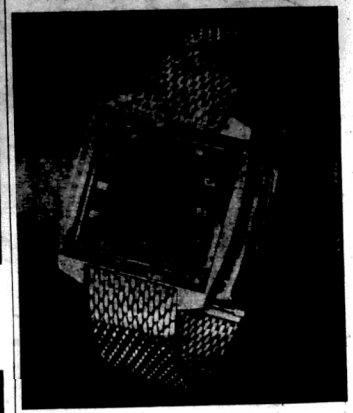

To celebrate the Second Anniversary of the East African Community, the "East African Standard" today includes a four-page supplement which has interviews with important people in the E.A.C. and a description of its functions and achievements. Assembly meeting in Dar es Salaam. The three Presidents approved the changes in the composition of the Communications Council, increasing the membership to 12. The number of disputes had proved too small to justify the council's continuous existence. In the eyes of richer developed countries the Community is an example of the maturity of three nations that can join in shared growth and services while retaining their own national pride. Economically and financially the rewards for the people of East Africa are greater too. By pooling resources the borrowing power of the three countries together is much greater than that of any one of them on its own. More money can be attracted because the services which are to be added are broader based and have greater backing. It is this idea of joining together that impresses financial institutions. Another highlight of the past year was the signing in Arusha of the trade agreement between East Africa and the six European Common Market countries. The agreement gives the three East African countries an almost duty-free market into Europe in a May, immediately after the East African trade agreement for lower duties — between

STRUCTURE OF THE COMMUNITY

The three Heads of State, President Nyerere, President Obote and President Kenyatta, form the East African Authority, on which the Treaty for East African Co-operation bestows the responsibility of being the principal executive body. The Authority has general direction and control of the performance of the executive functions of the Community. It is assisted in the performance of these functions by the Committee of East African Ministers, composed of three Ministers nominated one each by the Partner States, and appointed by each Partner State, a Chairman appointed by the Authority and a fifth Member picked by the four together, has final word on Common Market disputes. Over the past two years experience has shown that the functions of the Tribunal could be effectively discharged by a part-time Tribunal, since there would not be enough work for a full-time one. This is a measure of the degree of agreement at Council level, i.e. between the Partner States. The Authority is in sitting in May this year accordingly directed that the Tribunal be appointed on part-time basis. The East African Legislative Assembly, composed of 35 Members, including its Chairman, legislates on a wide range of matters of common interest to East Africa, as provided for under the Treaty. Offices of the Council to the Community, whose functions are to offer legal advice, are also situated at the Central Secretariat. The Information Division, which made out information on the Community to the local and overseas Press, radio and television networks as well as featuring material for publications, is also housed at the Arusha.

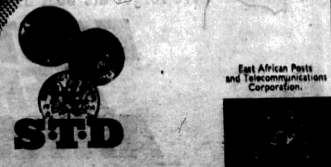

Transfer tax no hindrance States' trade

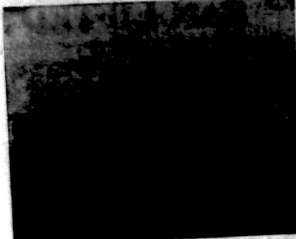

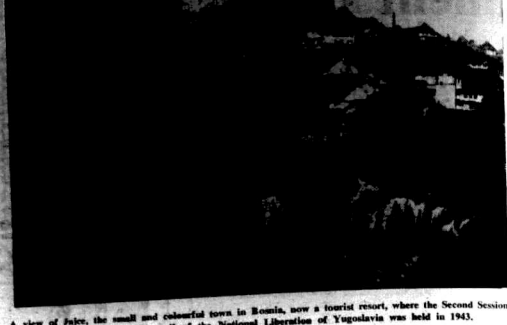

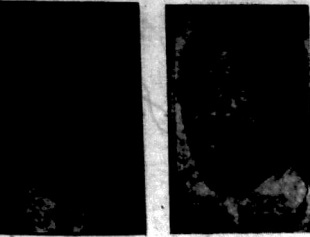

AID TO REFUGEES

Africa to get biggest share

Africa emerges as the chief beneficiary of the United Nations refugee aid programme for 1970, which was approved recently by an Executive Committee meeting of the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (U.N.H.C.R.) in Geneva.

Of the \$5,770,000 to be spent on refugee aid in the coming year — compared with \$5,000,000 in 1969 — a total of \$3,000,000 will be devoted to saving Africa's refugees. In addition, the U.N.H.C.R. has approved two so-called 'facilitative' special programmes for Africa, which would cost over \$340,000, and which can only be realised if special donations are forthcoming.

Europe will receive \$335,000 for refugee aid in 1970. Asia \$575,800 and Latin America \$296,000 dollars. This leaves \$1,390,000, which will be used for a settlement fund and for the administrative costs of the High Commission.

The U.N.H.C.R. was established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1950 and came into existence on January 1, 1951. The High Commissioner is elected by the General Assembly, and the present holder of the post is Prince Sadruddin Aga Khan of Iran.

The work of the U.N.H.C.R. is of a humanitarian and non-political nature. The Commission's main tasks are to provide international protection for refugees, and to

solve their problems either through voluntary repatriation or, if this is impossible, through schemes integrating the refugee communities into new national communities.

Once refugees are able to support themselves they receive further assistance within the framework of regional or zonal agricultural development plans carried out under the aegis of the United Nations Development Programme.

Since the early 1960s, the most serious refugee problems confronting the U.N.H.C.R. have been those in Africa. Of the estimated 850,000 refugees on this continent, over 500,000 have been settled through the direct or indirect assistance of the U.N.H.C.R.

The U.N.H.C.R. received its first big request for help from Africa in 1961 when 300,000 Angolans fled to the Congo at the beginning of Angola's liberation struggle. This movement was followed almost immediately by an influx of refugees from the Republic of Rwanda into the Kivu Province of the Congo as well as into Burundi and Uganda.

The two most common causes of these mass migrations are unrest in areas still under colonial administration and tension in newly independent countries which are

still grappling with the problem of integrating diverse tribes into a single nation. However, experience has shown that refugee communities can bring added prosperity to their adopted countries with the help of the host community and international organisations such as the U.N.H.C.R.

Refugees are 'first given food, clothing and shelter, as well as essential medical attention. Next they are given work to do, such as clearing land and planting crops, or where suitable, the raising of domestic animals.

Refugees frequently benefit the countries in which they settle by bringing with them their native skills. Thus, Mozambique refugees with their long-standing skills in metal-work have set up smithies in rural Zambia and Tanzania, while Angolans have established their own carpentry shops in their new settlements.

Of the \$3,000,000 to be spent in 1970 on Africa, \$950,000 will go to Uganda to provide six settlements there for refugees from Rwanda, and to finance the building of a waterworks. A further \$400,000 dollars will be spent on the building of an agricultural centre for Rwandan refugees in the Gambella region of Ethiopia.

Tanzania will receive \$458,000 for the settlement of refugees from Mozambique, while \$250,000 will be used to settle Ethiopian refugees in Sudan.

Sanctions create 'boost for Rhodesia'

Economic sanctions have given the Rhodesian industry a shot in the arm and the rate of industrial growth shows no sign of slackening, says Mr. J. C. Grayling, executive officer of the Association of Rhodesian Industries, said in Johannesburg.

'Industrialists, far from going down the drain, are swimming strongly with the tide, and enjoying the swim,' Mr. Grayling told the annual general meeting of the

South African Lumber Millers. He pointed out that due to the sanctions Rhodesian industry had set about to make locally a number of products now obtainable from abroad.

In 1968 for the first time in our history, he said, industry was responsible for the largest single distribution of our gross domestic product to our gross domestic product for the first eight

months of 1969, that the industrial contribution to Rhodesia's gross domestic product this year will increase by something between 12 and 14 per cent.
