**Kenya's financial assets increased during the third quarter of 1970 by 25.5 percent.** This growth of the reserves, \$1,700,000, resulted from the transfer of unassigned capital by commercial banks in accordance with the requirements of the Banking Act.

The Act has given that the commercial banks in Kenya must bring into Kenya five per cent of their assets in the form of a deposit in assigned assets.

The review states that, at the end of the quarter, the foreign exchange reserves of the Central Bank stood at \$33,300,000. ## \$126,000 PLAN TO BOOST PRODUCTION

The Arusha Region Co-operative Unions is planning to build four and rice mills and three coffee factories and provide more work facilities in a \$126,000 five-year development plan.

The plan has been approved by the approval of the Minister for Agriculture.

It is aimed at strengthening and bringing together the various co-operatives which have more than 15,000 members. A loan of \$30,000 is being sought from the National Development Credit Agency to buy seeds and insecticides to help the farmers.

A spokesman for the union said over the weekend that the union had built 45 of these urgently-needed units at an average cost of 2750 each in the past year. Construction of the remainder will be started next year, depending on the experience gained and agricultural position in the region.

The National Development Corporation is to be approached to provide funds for these projects which he said were aimed at providing facilities for the farmers to grind their maize and rice. The mills will be established in agricultural centres throughout the region.

At present, the union has no mill, but individuals have set up their own in some areas.

The construction of three coffee factories at Nkuran, Soko and Soko each at an average cost of 27,500 is envisaged. This will bring to ten the number of coffee factories run by the union in the region.

The union will buy ten lorries to transport their crops to agricultural centres. Two buses to run together between Arusha and Mtwara will also be bought.

To help wheat farmers who sometimes experience difficulties during harvesting, it is intended to set up two combine harvesters which will be loaned to the co-operatives and the members who have their private farms.

Also included in the plan are arrangements for the take-over of a number of businesses by the union. The union is now handling the marketing of coffee, cotton, wheat and several agricultural crops in the region. Senior officials of the union have expressed their desire to take over the sale of cement, building materials, bicycles and other products.

## Move to aid economy

The Cameroon Government has drawn up a five-point plan to boost production and inject new life into an economy suffering from the effects of French Franc devaluation.

A communiqué issued after a ministerial meeting chaired by President Ahmadou Ahidjo, said ministers had voted price increases, while business circles had complained of price and other social controls since the August 1969 devaluation. Among measures approved to give the economy new thrust were:

A supplementary budget of public expenditure totalling 400 million C.F.A. Francs (520,000). More revenue for the producers of cocoa and cotton; lower electricity prices in Yaounde and Douala; the study of a five-per-cent minimum wage rise for manual and agricultural workers to take effect from January 1 and three per cent for private industrial workers.

**Nonpartisan Day for Kenya's general elections** will be held on Saturday and all 158 candidates who successfully contested the Primies two weeks ago were duly declared elected unopposed to Parliament.

Although it was impossible for any applicants to come forward to stand before the party in the field the law provides that the general election is carried out.

President Kenyatta was formally declared to have been elected President for a second term in the Presidential election, he had stripped the President of his powers. The announcement was made by the Supervisor of Elections, Mr. Norman Mung'ara, after he heard that the President had been officially declared M.P. for Gatundu.

Mr. Mung'ara explained that while the President was unopposed in the Presidential election, he had to fulfill the Constitutional provisions on qualifications which he must be an elected M.P. This was why the formal declaration on his election for a second term had been delayed.

The five Ministers defeated in the preliminary election have been appointed to the Ministry of Finance. These have been transferred from the Ministry of the Cabinet.

Changes in responsibilities are listed in a '3 p.' issue of the Kenya Gazette which is signed by the Minister for the Interior.

Responsibility for Economic Planning and Development, formerly held by Mr. Oduro-Jowi, is taken over by the Minister for Finance, Mr. Gikuru.

The other changes are: Tourist and Wildlife (Mr. Ayodo) to the Minister for Natural Resources; Health (Mr. Otiende) to the Minister for Social Services; Mr. Ngugi to the Local Government; Mr. Njagi to the Ministry of Education; Mr. Mwendwa.

When the Returning Officer for Nairobi, Mr. W. Martin, declared outside his office that all candidates had been returned unopposed, supporters danced and cheered. Some of the new Ministers were also congratulated by supporters while others joined the dancing.

Mr. Gikuru was the first to be officially declared elected. Mr. Martin conducted eight marriage ceremonies in his papers at 11:00 a.m. Although all candidates had been elected, it is not expected that all of them will have clear run before taking their Parliamentary seats.

The general declaration of the preliminary election has been complained of alleged irregularities in procedure and a number have announced they will bring suits to the petition and selection committee.

It is expected that the new session of Parliament will open early in February.

# 3000,000 suffer because of inability to have children

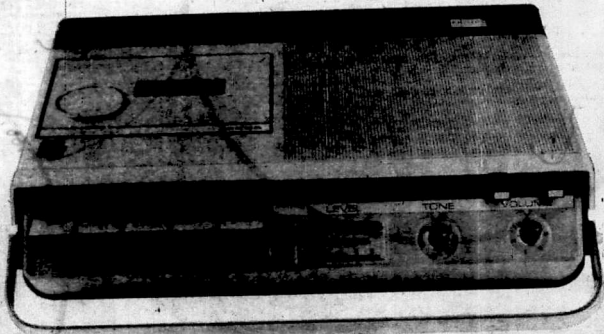

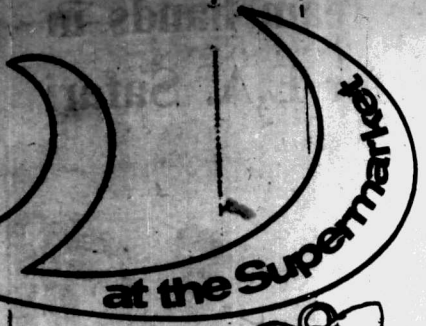

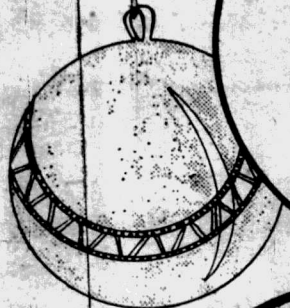

British and published a report last September. The committee is studying the workings of the system for the issue of entry certificates for immigrants to Britain, including the maintenance of appropriate statistics.

These certificates are issued through High Commissions in the areas of submission.

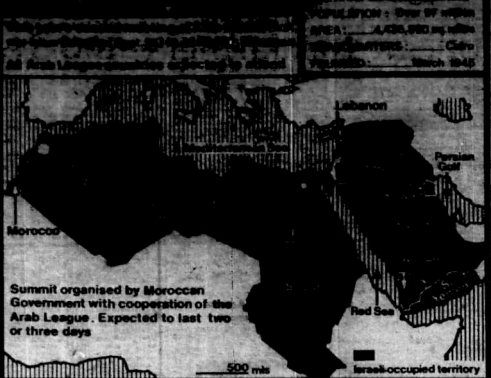

The applicant has to make what is sometimes a long journey to see the Entry Certificate Officer. The committee wants to assess the relative merits of the two systems.

In India the committee will travel by car through local areas of migration to Britain, talking to individuals on the spot — headmen, officers of health, priests, and so on — emphasizing that it is not only concerned with colour-discrimination.

Many people of all races interviewed on Nairobi streets yesterday expressed their entire satisfaction with the choice of the new Kenya Cabinet and said that the President could not have been fairer in choosing Ministers and their assistants.

"This Parliament should be more mature than the old one. It is unfortunate that a man of Mr. Mboya's calibre will be greatly missed. The standard of debates should be as mature and as reasonable as in Parliamentary forum of high standard in any part of the world."

A Kenya Charity Association schoolgirl, Miss Dinah Nabalayo, thought the President had again demonstrated his wisdom in the choice of the Cabinet. The mixture of old brains with new, vigorous ones was a timely move in the right direction, she said.

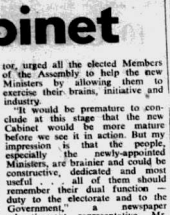
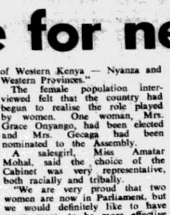
Mr. Moses Mwangi of Nairobi City Council said: "It is humbly impossible to satisfy everybody, but the President did his best and made the best choice."

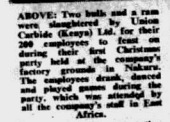

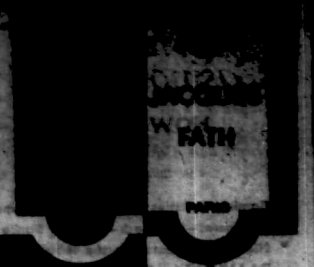

**40 CHILDREN DIED IN AIR DISASTER**

Some 40 Vietnamese children were reported yesterday to be among the 125 people killed in South Vietnam's worst aircraft disaster on Monday.

Flight Radio gave these casualty figures, quoting military police, and the American Armed Forces Radio gave a similar total, saying about 60 of the dead were on board the plane.

There was no confirmation from Air Vietnam, owners of the four-engine DC-4 that crashed the runway in the central coastal city of Cha Trang, crumpled over a bucked wire fence and ploughed into a market place and buildings.

These included a bar and a school, where the children were reported killed with their teacher.

A woman survivor from the crashed plane said there was an explosion when the aircraft was about 150 miles south of Cha Trang and she saw an air hostess giving first aid to the pilot and the co-pilot.

According to Air Vietnam, the pilot and hostess were still well, though injured.

South Vietnamese commandos announced yesterday they killed 51 guerrillas in fierce fighting in the Mekong Delta. Army headquarters reported in Saigon.

The South Vietnamese lost three

lions and 11 wounded. The elite Range troops were supported by artillery and air strikes in the South, about two miles from the Cambodian border.

It was the heaviest engagement in a day of generally light military activity during a pre-Christmas lull.

The populous Delta, declared a priority zone by both Saigon officials and the Vietcong, has become a key war theatre in recent months. American officials say it has been infiltrated by a full division of 12 North Vietnamese troops since the middle of the year.

**MANSON GIVEN TIME TO PLEAD**

The judge in the Sharon Tate murder case has allowed a "mystic" cult leader, Charles Manson, time in which to choose a defence lawyer and decide how to plead.

Monday was the first time Manson came face-to-face with his five cult followers, all accused of involvement in August's murder of the actress and a group of friends, since his arrest in October.

An Judge William Kenon granted Manson the delay, Manson said the news media had already accused and berated him.

**Black Panther faces police killing charges**

Negro group Spurgeon Winters, 19, was killed in the battle. Three other Panthers are still being sought by police.

Among other charges Bell was accused of killing two patrolmen, John Giliberto, 22, and Frank Rappaport, 36.

The "Weathermen" faction of the Left-wing Students for a Democratic Society (S.D.S.) announced they will stage a Christmas Eve protest march through Chicago's financial and business district to avenge the killing of two Black Panther leaders, Fred Hampton and Mark Clark, during a police raid on their apartment on December 4.

Miss Bernadette Dobari, a leader of the faction who was indicted by a grand jury on Friday of violence during street rioting by anti-Vietnam war militants in Chicago in October, said a press conference the marchers would try to make a "citizens' arrest" of the county state's attorney, Mr. Edward W. Hanrahan, on a charge of murder.

Mr. Hanrahan, whose police carried out the pre-dawn raid on the Hampton apartment in a search for illegal arms, has been the target of mounting protests against the killings.

Party members and other Negro leaders have accused him of deliberately mounting the raid to assassinate Hampton and Clark, charging that the police opened fire without provocation.

**DUTCH TO SEEK ARMS BAN**

Holland is to ask the U.N. Security Council to ban arms deliveries to Nigeria and Biafra, the Foreign Minister, Mr. Luns, told the Dutch Parliament on Monday.

He was pessimistic about the prospects of the move because some Security Council members, principally Britain and the Soviet Union as well as France, have a "veto", he said during a foreign affairs debate.

Biafra makes direct arms deliveries to Nigeria.

Mr. Luns stressed that the efforts of Zambia, which is a Security Council member and has recognized Biafra, had so far failed to have the war discontinued by the U.N.

The Minister without Portfolio, Mr. Bernhard Udink, said Holland would give about 100,000 to aid organizations helping the war's victims.

M.P.s were due to discuss Biafra in the continuation of the debate yesterday.

In some a group of youths, students, professors and workers will stage a Christmas Eve march for peace in Biafra tonight, it was announced.

**CHANCELLOR MOVES TO HEAL BREACH**

The West German Chancellor, Herr Brandt, will try to prepare the ground for preliminary negotiations with East Germany before publicly answering the East German Head of State, Herr Ulbricht, in his state-of-the-nation speech to the Bundestag on January 14.

In an interview published yesterday on the pre-dawn raid on the Hampton apartment with Zehner, Mr. Brandt said current talks with East Germany with Moscow, Warsaw and East Berlin could be considered "without illusion but without discouragement."

While the Warsaw Pact nations had signed their approach to West Germany, there were still slight differences in their attitudes.

The West German Government was ready to negotiate with East Germany on the basis of equal rights and non-discrimination, as long as territorial integrity was preserved, the state news re-

### Government gives £7,000 to help build maternity ward

The Government has given a grant of £7,000 towards the building of a self-help maternity ward at Embu Hospital, Embu, Eastern Province.

Mr. Mahabu said that the tender from the firm had been scrutinised by the Chogoria architects and surveyors and the firm's name had been sent to the headquarters of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa, who will sign the contract at a later date.

The director of the Kenya Red Cross, Embu branch, Mrs. L. M. Birch, has received parcels of Christmas gifts from the Swedish Red Cross society. The gifts, which include children's toys, socks, blankets and adult clothing, are being distributed to Chogoria, Kenya and Embu hospitals. # Christmas

Many items will be available at the annual Christmas Sale.

Contrary to the popular myth about chef, Mr. Thomas has a temperament as even as a ruler. And it is just as well, for when he cooks Christmas dinner at the Inter-Continental's Le Chateau rooftop restaurant tomorrow there will be no time to fuss and flurry or make last-minute decisions about sauces and desserts.

But then he has no need to. He has been cooking Christmas dinners for hundreds of people in similar hotels in Geneva, Bangkok for the past five years. And he knows all the ins and outs of Christmas fare.

Christmas in a big hotel, it seems, is a sumptuous affair. There is an *hors d'oeuvre* of smoked salmon, lobster, smoked eel, and a choice of soups ranging from consommé and oxtail soup to turtle soup and lobster bisque. This is followed by sole and fresh salmon before people carve into their bird, whatever it is.

According to Mr. Thevenaz, after the "starters" Christmas fare varies all over the world. In Europe, for instance, a golden duckling or a turkey is served up instead of the huge turkey that is traditional to the English and Americans.

Don't think that plum pudding alone will brandy appears on everyone's dinner table either. The American, it seems, proffer pumpkin pie. On the Continent, Christmas crackers dip into a luscious mandarin orange sherbet called Mandarin Givree or Parfait Grand Marnier, a very light liqueur ice cream made with lashings of egg whites.

All these dishes sound delicious, but whatever you have planned for your snap-up Christmas dinner, it is probably too late to change now. But here are a few last-minute recipes from Mr. Thevenaz that will add a touch of sophistication to whatever you will be eating.

**Giblet Dressing for Turkey:**  
Dip a loaf of white bread in milk. Then fry chopped onion, garlic, parsley, rosemary, thyme, basil and chicken livers in a little oil. Mix this and the bread with prunes or raisins and one small then put in a baking dish and poach in the oven. The loaf can be served either underneath or beside the turkey.

**Goose Stuffing:**  
Mix bread dipped in milk, garlic, parsley, shallots, goose liver,

parsley, garlic and egg together. Then stuff the stuffing inside the goose and roast the bird in the oven.

**Christmas Stuffing for Woodcock:**  
Grill the chestnuts in the oven then peel and crush them. Add to this pork meat, duckling liver, shallots, parsley, onion, salt, pepper and egg. Place the stuffing inside the duck and roast in the oven for 45 minutes.

500 grams flour, 200 grams butter, 1 tablespoon pork fat or lard, 2 egg yolks, 200 grams sugar, 5 grams salt, 1 grated lemon rind, 1 litre of milk and water mixed in equal portions. — dessertspoon Kirschwasser.

Mix the melted butter, eggs and lemon then add the flour, salt, the milk and water and the sugar and Kirschwasser. Beat the dough until it is light, then let rest for a few hours. Then grill in a waffle iron.

## What the doctor orders...

Enjoy yourself this Christmas, but take care, too. Otherwise you could find yourself in the doctor's surgery after — or even during — the holiday. In this special feature a family doctor talks about the hazards that Christmas can bring, and provides a plan for a safety-first celebration.

Insist that the family take a walk sometime on Christmas Day if the weather is at all suitable. The people most likely to need medical attention during the holiday are the young and the old. The increased excitement can have a disastrous effect on old people who have come from a quiet and perhaps solitary life to visit a household full of young people. Sometimes this can take the form of a collapse, and if this happens the patient must be put to bed in a quiet, warm room and the doctor immediately sent for.

There can be many causes for this — over-eating, over-excitement, over-tiredness — but it is important for the hosts to realise that a change of routine is disturbing to the elderly, and they should try to arrange that regular habits are not departed from too radically.

Old people living on their own usually have a very plain diet, and the sight of tempting festive fare which they have not had to prepare can lead to over-eating if someone isn't there to say "Don't do that, you've had enough, Grandma!"

Hearty over-eating or drinking may make little impression (except on the waistline!) on the thirties or forties, but it can be uncomfortable to the over-fifties, distressing to the over-sixties and lethal to the over-seventies.

After the meal elderly people will often want to help with the washing-up. Don't let them insist they have a rest instead. If elderly parents are staying with you, try not to let them get over-tired in lots of unaccustomed exercise, and see that there is some plain food available. Though they dearly love their grand-children, they can find them very exhausting if they often be foreman any day long.

All this needs great tact. No one likes to be regarded as senile or inferior — especially at Christmas!

At the other end of life, Christmas has its dangers too. Childhood suburbs of temper spoil the day for everyone, and can often be foreman and prevented.

No one should get so full of food that he turns "crochety". This goes for father, too, and if he can be persuaded to take the children out after dinner and they will be happier and the women can clear up in peace.

If little children are to stay up later than their normal hour, they should be prevailed upon to have a pee in the afternoon to make up.

Teenagers may not want to spend the whole day with their elders, and no one should get upset if they want to be off on their own.

Tiny children — as well as animals — may be frightened by the crackers. Make sure that the small objects found inside crackers are kept out of the way of the toddlers who will swallow them if given half a chance.

Talking of swallowing, if you have put small coins in the pudding, you did wrap them in grease-proof paper, didn't you? It is much more difficult to swallow them unawares if the paper has to go down too.

Rarely does a Christmas go by without my being called to treat someone burned or shocked. Let some *funnel* check your Christmas tree lights, and make sure that no bulbs are missing, exposing live sockets.

Follow this commonsense advice and you should have a happy and drama-free Christmas. And there is also a chance that doctors will have a holiday too.

### Rule of law changed

As the Tanzania First Vice-President rightly said yesterday, mainland Tanzania and the islands of Zanzibar and Pemba form a United Republic. Sheikh Karume added this meant an independent country, with every right to run its own affairs and change existing institutions to reflect changed conditions.

Usually, when trends or movements in Zanzibar are criticised, the counter argument takes the form of suggestions that the critics are pursuing a neo-colonialist line, seeking to break the United Republic asunder. Nothing is further from the purpose of this comment; on the contrary, the conception of unity between the mainland and the islands is firmly supported.

But unity presupposes similar policies and courses of action in the component parts of the Republic. What is happening to the rule of law? The two are drifting apart, with diverse procedures.

Some time ago, three judges visiting Zanzibar from the mainland, representing the High Court, were asked to leave. Subsequently, Sheikh Karume announced the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa would not exercise any legal functions on the islands. Yet this is the paramount judicial court for the islands. Not only does this curtailment of the judicial system isolate the islands from mainland practice, but it represents the acme of bureaucratic control, even over the liberties and individual rights of the subject. The old judicial system, according to Sheikh Karume, reflected the interests of the colonialists. Even if it did, instead of conforming to customary judicial systems based on the fundamental human freedoms protecting these freedoms on behalf of citizens and will have no other legal recourse on the islands than through nominated officials.

Neither is there any colonialist influence at work, but it is clear something has influenced a divergence between the legal system to be applied in the islands and that obtaining on the mainland. For the magistrates are being stripped of their authority in the islands, their courts taken over by branch chairmen of the ruling Afro-Shirazi Party and nominated police, as from January 1. Magistrates who lose their jobs are to be absorbed in the newly created Economic Council.

Revolutionary regimes throughout history have been notable for setting up People's Courts to mete out summary justice. Communist regimes arraign political defectors before party tribunals. This is not the system on the mainland, where the judiciary remains independent. Who can go to the aid of a citizen insisting he is innocent but is sentenced by party officials or police conducting their own courts?

### Christmas holiday warnings

Only one day left for Christmas shopping. Less than one day to notify the police if you are going away for the holiday. The appeal issued by Kenya's police is applicable everywhere. They have asked for, and are entitled to, co-operation from the public in preventing housebreaking during the Christmas period.

Before going away, leaving your house unoccupied, be sure to notify the nearest police station. If you visit the station, as you should, you can fill in a form giving details of how long you expect to be absent and the name and address of the person authorized to look after your premises.

Police patrols will then keep a check on your house from time to time. From another point of view it is essential to arrange a security guard or other authorised occupant and to notify the police — the requirements for householders' insurance cover to remain valid.

We wish you a Merry Christmas, certainly, but do not wish you to return home from the merry-making and find your house ransacked. If you go out for a few hours to make the rounds of friends, or join them at lunch or dinner, leave somebody in charge at home. Do not leave your property deserted.

One more warning: Keep death off the roads this Christmas. It is a sobering thought that you may find, probably more than one, will suffer tragically. If you must get tipsy, stay off the roads.

Today, Christmas Eve, the normally quiet town of Lourdes, nestled in the foothills of the Pyrenees, will be host to 60 special pilgrims — men and women who give up their holiday to prayer and devotion in the grotto of the Virgin Mary.

At this time of year, Lourdes is deserted and closed to visitors. It was opened only for the last of the two million pilgrims, some 45,000 of them, who are known as the "left wing of the town of miracles".

For the last ten years, however, it has opened only for Christmas to members of the All-Night Vigil, a group which always comes to Lourdes from Christmas Eve onwards.

The idea of going there in Christmas came from English and Irish Roman Catholics who have a special devotion to the Virgin Mary and who are willing to forego Christmas at home to pray for "Christ at home to pray to her".

The group, who pay £24 10s per head, are immediately their specially chartered aircraft has taken off from Gatwick Airport on Christmas Eve.

The flight is open to pray, and as soon as they arrive at Lourdes the pilgrims go straight to the grotto for prayers at the statue of the Virgin Mary before Midnight Mass.

Mass, which is conducted by two priests who are members of the All-Night Vigil, is a few hours' sleep and then return to the grotto for further devotions.

Mr. Delaney stresses: "The group does not consist of sick people who are looking for a cure at Lourdes. We handpick our members carefully and we tactfully discourage anyone whose devotion is one of proper to their physical illness."

After all, the programme is a very exacting one and only fit people in robust health. Pity is not enough when you spend up to eight hours in non-stop prayer.

Married couples with young children are not encouraged, either is a family affair and we prefer uninterested inquiries from husbands and wives without children," he was told.

The group consists of professional people with a fair sprinkling of lawyers, bank-managers and school teachers. "At the moment we have a purely English-speaking membership and no other countries are running a similar pilgrimage," Mr. Delaney says. "But we have had interested inquiries from Spain and France."

It should not be imagined, however, that the pilgrimage is wholly a solemn affair. "We have the traditional Christmas meal in the evening," Mr. Delaney told me.

"We usually lay all our group have given up the traditional Christmas at home and a good deal of sleep for an exhausting round of prayer. They have earned a little fun."

The Lourdes to which these pilgrims will come this Christmas is the place where on one bitter day in February 1858, an asthmatic, barely literate peasant girl named Bernadette Soubirous, who announced to her, "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Since the death of Bernadette in 1865, the number of pilgrims to Lourdes has increased each year and, by 1938, when the town was destroyed by a fire, it was estimated that 100,000 pilgrims came to Lourdes each year.

Two million pilgrims flock into the French town of Lourdes each year hoping for a miracle. But at Christmas the town is strangely deserted by pilgrims, except for 60 men and women who give up Christmas to pray for Christ at home.

The chairman of the association, Mr. O. R. Mwangi, said he was proud of the success of the district and wanted to join in an endeavour to promote the development of the district.

Israelis consider the ships the answer to the Soviet missile-launching craft with which the Egyptian Navy sank the Israeli destroyer, the Eilat, in 1967.

Seven other ships of a similar type were delivered to Israel before Gen de Gaulle's total embargo on arms for Israel last January blocked delivery of the five ships now in the Mediterranean.

In Washington the White House denied Press reports and rumours that the U.S. Sixth Fleet had been ordered to protect the five ships on their way through the Mediterranean to Israel.

The White House spokesman, Mr. Ronald Ziegler, said: "I don't believe that is the case. No, it's not the case."

Apart from this brief statement the White House has maintained total silence on the affair.

# Minister to see President about free education

Provincial education officers to ensure that only competent people were appointed as C.P.E. failure to do so would be a failure to ensure that the quality of education was maintained.

Mr. Towitz said that he had grown like a mushroom in all parts of the country and observed that the majority could not be asked to stop reading them as they were doing so with zeal.

Many such schools were set up with the expectation that they would be taken over by the Government immediately and there were some people who thought they would be taken over by next year.

Mr. Towitz said there were many problems facing harare schools and it was the duty of the officials in the Ministry to find a solution to the difficulties.

# Ethiopian students occupy embassy in Moscow

Standard Staff Reporter... A group of about 60 Ethiopian students protesting against alleged repression of colleagues at home occupied their Embassy in Moscow yesterday and smashed portraits of Emperor Haile Selassie.

About an hour a truck-load of uniformed police surrounded the Embassy and Western reporters were ordered to leave the area before they could witness the outcome of the incident.

It was the second time this year that the militant students have invaded their Embassy in this way. In March they stayed in the Embassy for about three hours but were not given any attention by Soviet police.

Yesterday the students marched into the Embassy, ripped out telephones, pulled down portraits of Emperor Haile Selassie, smashed them on the ground and jvys up Ethiopian newspapers.

Their ransacked drawers but caused no other damage. Diplomats in the Embassy were not injured and the Ambassador in his residence in the upper storey of a building.

A student spokesman told Western reporters that their action was coordinated with similar demonstrations in other countries against the alleged assassination of a student leader in Addis Ababa on Sunday night and the shooting of students in the University grounds.

When the police arrived, about four of them tried to enter the Embassy's front door but were stopped by the more numerous students. Later the police entered a courtyard at the back of the Embassy and soon afterwards one of them was seen on guard at the front door. There was no sign of the earlier part of the incident.

The students, who came from various universities in Moscow, sang mournful songs around draped sofas turned into mock-coffins in the Embassy courtyard.

A special communication has been charged with investigating the double killing which is at the origin of incidents resulting in three deaths.

# U.S. disarmament negotiators have said there are prospects for an arms control agreement with the Soviet Union if Moscow continues its business-like negotiations.

Mr. Gerard C. Smith, who led the American delegation at the strategic arms limitation talks (SALT) in Helsinki, told reporters after a meeting with President Nixon he believed Moscow had bargained seriously because it was highly interested in arms limitation negotiations.

Mr. Smith, who presented the U.S. delegation's report on the talks to Mr. Nixon, warned that difficulties still remained in reaching an agreement with Moscow to limit the deployment of offensive and defensive strategic weapons.

The two sides had concluded five weeks of talks in Helsinki and will resume meetings in Vienna on April 16.

Mr. Smith is also administrator of the U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, said Washington and Moscow agreed in Helsinki to an open-ended process which would continue until there would be no formal agenda.

Commenting hopefully on the future of the talks, Mr. Smith, however, said: "But I do not want to strike an over-optimistic note because we are still a long way from home."

During the coming week, the Nixon administration is to study the issues to be discussed at Vienna, Mr. Smith added.

**Whatever happened to Stalin's daughter?**

The head no longer turn when the woman with the soft smile enters the busy supermarket in Princeton, New Jersey. Even her neighbours have switched off the gossip, stopped their prying and have come to accept her as one of them.

Yet only three years ago Svetlana Stalin was hounded by the world's Press, all eager to catch a glimpse of the daughter of Russia's former dictator, who had dared turn her back on her country to seek asylum in the United States.

But though she is now accustomed to the American way of life, the problem of what to make of her future is no longer being resolved.

Financially she is secure — the royalties from her first book have seen to that. But on a less material level, Svetlana still has to live with a great deal of sorrow and separation from the only people she can call family. Now she faces the formidable task of settling down to a new life in a new country.

She has made a good start...

She has lived quietly in Princeton for well over a year, and has taken an active interest in charity work. She has also briefly sampled the social round. Her life today is still closely involved with religion.

She was baptised into the Russian Orthodox Church in 1962 — in one of the comparatively few churches still open in Russia. And it was about this time that she probably started to think seriously of leaving the Soviet Union.

For she has said that although she was brought up in the Communist style without religion, "when I became a grown-up person I found that it was impossible to exist without God in one's heart".

From her home in Princeton she makes a point each Sunday of going to a church service — though not necessarily the same one each week.

She has tried Hinduism, Christian Science and Roman Catholicism, and now feels free to move about in the world of religion, accepting what each one has to offer to fill the void of her years of atheism in Soviet Russia.

It was in December, 1966, that Svetlana left Moscow, travelling to New Delhi with the ashes of her late husband, Brijesh Singh.

Then, once in India, she announced she would "remain a while to compose herself". Three months later she gathered together her few belongings and went to the American Embassy where she told a startled official that she wanted political asylum.

After living all her life in the shadow of the Kremlin, Svetlana was flown to the country she had been taught all her life to regard

as the home of everything that was evil.

In a televised news conference shortly after her arrival she told the Press she planned to live quietly in the United States, and "write her memoirs". That book, *Twenty Letters To A Friend*, became the publishing sensation of 1967.

By mid-May more than 260,000 had been paid in advance royalties for serial rights and for book club editions. *Life* magazine alone had more than £200,000 for the right to serialise extracts from the forthcoming work that was still very much with her.

In the course of the article she spoke of the great grief and sorrow she felt at being condemned to permanent exile from her home land — and separation from her two children.

Her departure had been a bitter blow to Soviet prestige, carrying as it did the implication that even the family of the former dictator were so disgusted with the way Russia was going that they could no longer stay.

Svetlana announced she had burned her Russian passport and proposed to apply for United States citizenship. The statement provoked the retort from the Kremlin that Svetlana had "a history of nervous breakdowns and attacks of hysteria".

Probably nobody will ever fully appreciate just how much these remarks hurt her. For even today she is devoted to her homeland and bitterly regrets the circumstances which prevent her from ever returning there.

Most of all, she is sure that she can never again see her 24-year-old son and 15-year-old daughter.

Members of her small circle of close friends have revealed that Svetlana were bitterly shocked she was told of the announcement from Moscow that her son Josef had denounced her for defecting to America, and called on her to return and make apologies to the Russian people.

There can be no turning back. For Svetlana knows only too well what would be her fate if she returned to Russia.

Whatever the solution to the mystery of the five French-built ships which sailed out of Cherbourg for Haifa, there is certainly no piracy about the action. At this stage, nothing of the background to the incident is known with any certainty, except that these were ships designed by the French navy for the transport of Israeli troops. In all respects, they were beyond to Israel.

So there can be no question of bridgehead or piracy on the high seas. Who gave the order for the ships to be launched is irrelevant. It seems probable that at least some elements of the French authorities "in the know" about the plan to sail the ships out of the harbour were alerted. Obviously, how can the appropriate arrangements have been made?

There are anti-Israel feelings in the French Government pursuing the De Gaulle line. But there must have been official information in the plan to sail the ships unarmoured to a Norwegian firm. An affidavit has been made to discover where and how.

The ships have been wrongly described as "gunboats". They are missile launchers, the remaining four of 12 which were ordered by seven Israeli naval officers, who were completely untrained, they sailed to run the gauntlet of the Mediterranean, especially when they were within easy range of U.A.R. planes and naval units in the eastern reaches near Cyprus. Reports state they were escorted by armed merchantmen and submarines. Certainly they could depend on an air umbrella as they turned towards Haifa. A definite touch of sea-faring daylight may have excited the admiration of Israel and captured the world's imagination.

However intelligent and well-informed he may be, he is hardly likely to find a precedent on his own. He must go through the 99 volumes of "delegated legislation" of the past 30 years - all statutes which may be vital to the liberty of the individual.

# Lord Chancellor makes the law less of an ass

The most intensive reform of the law to be carried out in Britain in the last century is going on under the direction of the Lord Chancellor, Lord Gardner.

It is the fulfilment of a lifetime's ambition. The changes are long overdue. The very name of Lord Gardner has a passion for reforming it.

Since the Statute of Merton, a Henry II, 1235, Britain has accumulated more than 9,000 Acts of Parliament. A lawyer has to consult 43 hefty volumes to find the one relevant to his client's case.

Such research is a nightmare. For instance, if the matter concerns the law of getting married, the lawyer may have to thumb through 45 Acts of Parliament.

On divorce, the situation is still worse. There are more Acts to consult. Cynics may think the more complicated the law the more certain the lawyer of his bread and butter but on a rational basis it is not the law that is the cause of paramount importance - it is the individual's rights, for which the law is to be made.

Half the struggle is to find that law. How can any lawyer be expected to find the applicable law in the vast uncharted legal sea? However intelligent and well-informed he may be, he is hardly likely to find a precedent on his own.

He must go through the 99 volumes of "delegated legislation" of the past 30 years - all statutes which may be vital to the liberty of the individual.

A former Thomson's Falls farm, Kenyan, who has been called his name, Lamu, went to Lamu on a day trip, and so far, has stayed - two-and-a-half years.

From his wife Verna he runs the Poponi Hotel on eight miles of pristine, near perfect beach. The fishing village of Shellia at the harbour mouth sounds like an Italian God-frog. Eponi is a Swahili word meaning a breeze away from Lamu town. The pleasant walk along the palm-shaded water, a boat ride from the harbour coast - 10 to 15 if there are eight of you - is a treat.

The Korovchens, though, are still chattering about the two elderly American ladies on their way around the world who travelled to Kenya specifically to visit Lamu. They stayed at the Poponi Hotel and were in Lamu a good place in which to sleep. It has slumbered for some time.

When he became Lord Chancellor he set up two Law Commissions - one for England and Wales and another for Scotland in 1965. The one for England and Wales has five full-time members. Mr. Justice Scarman is chairman.

The Commission's job is to codify, repeal, revise and amend separate enactments and to eliminate anomalies. Lord Gardner does not envisage the codification of the whole of the English law, even the distant future. "Some laws are more suited for codification than others", he says.

What he wants done first is to discard what he calls junk. The next stage is to consolidate, to put all the law relating to the same subject together, where appropriate. Then codify, where appropriate.

The case law, contained in the "1900 precedents", is itself "pretty out of date", says the Lord Chancellor. For many years the ancient English doctrine of deciding cases according to the precedents has been replaced by reasons to do otherwise - must be brought up-to-date, to be in with the current scientific inventions.

Lord Gardner's ideas are spreading overseas. When he came to office only five Commonwealth countries had established similar to the British Law Commissions - Australia, Canada, Hongkong, India and Jamaica.

Now there are nine more: Bahamas, Bermuda, Guyana, Ceylon, Malaya, Malaysia, Maldives, Brunei and Pakistan. British and Pakistani members visited Ceylon to discuss problems common to both countries. A Law Commission there and Ghanaians have been in Britain to discuss problems of their country.

Lord Gardner has been called a "classic British" by the critics. He has a long and distinguished career in the law. He has always said: "Much injustice, he believes, stems from the 'black-letter' books." That is why he is tackling the job with such fervour.

These days Islam has come to be considered by non-Muslims as a sort of "national" religion. The Prophet Mohammed (may peace be upon him) is considered a national leader and the Quran has been merely given the status of a Holy Book of Muslims.

The reason for such an erroneous impression is that the non-Muslims have either intentionally or unintentionally adopted a communal and religious prejudice against Islamic teachings.

In the first place, the non-Muslims do not take the trouble to acquaint themselves with the contents of the Quran and if they make any effort at all, the dark veils of strangeness and unfamiliarity are drawn up in front of their eyes.

They think that instead of acquiring something of their own which could be of benefit to them, they are trying to take something alien to them.

But the facts are quite opposite to it. The Quran is the common heritage of the entire human race as water, air, light

and other material things are meant for everyone.

If a non-Muslim, not because of any sentimental beliefs, but only in fairness, and the search of truth studies the Quran impartially he will easily find it all-embracing, eternal and divine.

Since the original language of the Quran is not known to non-Muslims, it is the religious and moral duty of Muslims that they should translate the Quran into other languages and pave the way for Quranic understanding for their non-Muslim brethren.

Swahili is the *lingua franca* of Eastern Africa. The need for a Swahili translation of the Holy Quran was felt for a long time. It was necessary that this fundamental literature of Islam be made available in this language of the indigenous people of Eastern Africa. Therefore, it is gratifying to learn that an easy and popular translation by Sheikh Abdullah Saleh Al-Fary has now been published by the Islamic Federation.

May this effort be blessed by Allah. May this be the means of creating a conscious direction among believers, and may this unity of purpose be built upon correct and proper foundations.

Since the original language of the Quran is not known to non-Muslims, it is the religious and moral duty of Muslims that they should translate the Quran into other languages and pave the way for Quranic understanding for their non-Muslim brethren.

Swahili is the *lingua franca* of Eastern Africa. The need for a Swahili translation of the Holy Quran was felt for a long time. It was necessary that this fundamental literature of Islam be made available in this language of the indigenous people of Eastern Africa. Therefore, it is gratifying to learn that an easy and popular translation by Sheikh Abdullah Saleh Al-Farxy has now been published by the Islamic Foundation.

May this effort be blessed by Allah. May this be the means of creating a conscious direction among human beings and may this unity of purpose be based upon correct and proper foundations.
