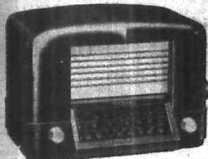

Lessons of a Setback

There is no doubt in the minds of the British public that though it was perhaps important, and not unwarranted, to put the best face on the withdrawal from Central Norway at the time the announcement was made, it is absolutely necessary now to learn the lessons of the regrettable incident, unpleasant and disturbing though these lessons may be. The fact cannot and need not be disclosed that the withdrawal was a blow from the results of which it will take the Allies some time to recover both on the home British front and abroad. But it is neither the British nor the French way to be afraid of facing the facts and having instead them, the courage required to make the readjustments necessary to prevent the possibility of a recurrence in the future in our public life. Not the least remarkable thing in the conditions of these days of grim tests and trials is that determination which is being shown by the British race that all over the Empire we should be looking forward to a public examination of the facts and the tribunal of the nation, the Mother of Parliaments, conscious that not only our own but our enemies are undisturbed and indeed welcome spectators of that proceeding.

That is the Democratic way and we are right to be proud of the freedom we have won and which we can still enjoy and enjoy in a world ridden by the forces of armed aggression. There are plenty of precedents for it. During the early stages of the war when it became clear that the conduct of operations was not in the right hands and was not satisfying the demands of the situation, the British parliamentary system and public opinion enabled us to

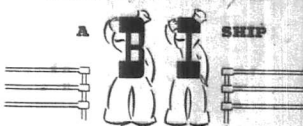

Contrary to earlier expectations the Labour Party decided to force a division on the Government's handling of the Norwegian campaign.

In accepting the challenge the Prime Minister said that this created an even graver situation and he reminded the House of his earlier warning that the country was faced by a relentless enemy who must be fought with united determination.

HOLLAND TAKES FURTHER STEPS

Ready For An Emergency

Signs of increased nervousness in Holland are reflected by the latest steps taken by the Dutch Government to meet any emergency.

These include cancellation of leave in the defence services and for those engaged in defence industries and the appointment of the Netherlands Minister in Washington to act as plenipotentiary for all Dutch officials abroad in the event of war.

The instructions to the Minister to act as plenipotentiary had to have arrived on Saturday. A Netherlands official is quoted as saying that the Netherlands Government had not been attacked.—(Reuters).

League Report On Refugees

An interim report by the League of Nations High Commissioner on refugees. It declares that the liberal policy of the British Government towards the victims of that aggression is being continued. That is very few cases in which the convention is being observed. That has been shown by the refugees.

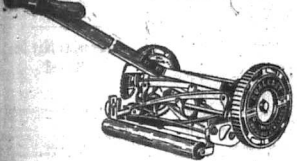

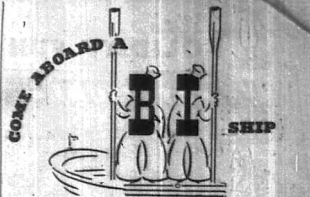

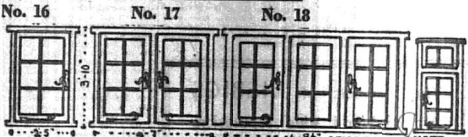

Financial Position in Kenya
RATES INCREASE TO BE AVOIDED IF POSSIBLE
1939 Surplus £208,422 But 1940 Revenue Shortfall Likely Says General Manager

In spite of considerable rates reductions and rebates Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours has a surplus of £208,422 in 1939, states the General Manager in his annual report. Steady growth in local movement of traffic, as distinct from export and import traffic, indicated an expansion and broadening of the country's industries.

The railway services, states Sir Godfrey Rhodes, have never before been in a better position to carry out all demands made on them. Already a great deal had been done and the staff was ready to place its entire energies at the disposal of the state and the Empire.

Expenditure, he feels, will increase as a result of the war but it is hoped to avoid raising rates and fares, at least for some time to come. This will depend chiefly on the maintenance of the business of the country, though the rates equalisation fund will be used to postpone increases as long as possible.

In his annual report on the administration of the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours for the year ending December 31, 1939, Sir Godfrey Rhodes, describes the financial position of the railways. The year under review has appeared a good year. In spite of considerable rates reductions and rebates, a surplus of £208,422 has been earned.
