FRENCH HOLD ON TO CAPTURED POSITIONS

WHAT EXPERTS THINK

May 24. The situation in Belgium and North West France is still regarded as very grave by military circles in London.

The Germans took possession of Boulogne last night but it is not clear how large are the German forces in Boulogne. The seizure of the town is the development of the drive north from Abbeville.

Practically all the British troops in Boulogne were withdrawn safely.

Contrary to rumors distributed from German sources, King Leopold is still with his army in Belgium and Lord Gort is with the British Expeditionary Force in Northern France.

May 24. It was stated in London today that the Royal Navy is helping the Allied armies in every possible way. It is the job of the Navy to keep their ports clear of mines. This morning's French official communique states that in the North the enemy is trying to capture positions. South of the coast the enemy has carried on with attacks but without making any appreciable advance, in spite of the means employed. A French report suggests that the situation has become more stabilized with the Allied equipment forming a definite line in the north and the French Army holding a strong position in the German thrust. The Germans are trying to break their way through their front line, but reports indicate that so far they have not made any appreciable progress. A French military spokesman indicated this afternoon that the French fighting in the West was in the region around Arras, Cambrai and Valenciennes. He said that fighting was particularly intense.

May 24. The headquarters of a German armoured division was bombed and night attacks and day operations continued with unabated intensity.

These are points from the latest report of the activities of the Royal Air Force issued by the Air Ministry. Some of the raids carried out took British machines as far into Germany as Leipzig.

For many hours British bombers swept over the Ruhr area. North East France and Belgium, making repeated attacks on troop concentrations and columns, bridges and airfields. On one occasion a column of tanks and lorries travelling at 60 miles an hour, were attacked and lost blazing by the road side.

A successful attack was also made on a group of between 15 and 20 tanks which were found close together just off a main road. Other bombers scored direct hits on important road junctions and on the north end of an important bridge.

A force of Blenheims dropped 100 large high explosive bombs on the headquarters of the German armoured division. Most of these fell within the target area. Five British fighters failed to return.

During the night a German town near the Dutch frontier was blown and Munich stations were visited. Four heavy bombers from the RAF scored direct hits on the town of Cologne, causing flying high bombs.

Meanwhile, strong forces of heavy and medium bombers, which had been sent to the Ruhr area, carried out a raid on the railway junction at Charleroi and hit bridges which had been reported to be in the hands of the Belgians. (Reuter.)

Uganda Locust Summary

Following is the Uganda locust summary for the first half of May:

Uganda

The following districts have been free from the pest during the period under review—Lango, Central, Budaka, Bugoga and Chaga. Bugoga, West Nile, Karamoja, Karamoja, Teso, Binyoro and Alkole have not yet been received. Anholi—Three flights are recorded moving in a northerly direction: one on the 2nd from Alkole, and one each on the 9th from Bwoba and Anholi to Lamogi. The latter was caused to 12 plots of Alkole.

Mubende—A very small swarm and a small band of hoppers were recorded in Bugoga. The other two counties are reported to be clear.

Masaka—Swarms of Locusts from Tanganyika Territory settled in southern Budaka Co. where Mubende hoppers are also present. There have been three reports of Nomadactra (1 fliter) from Koki and two of 1 species from Kibuku County. Damage to crops has been caused in the latter district.

Teso—Small young swarms (7 Locusts) are being destroyed rapidly by birds in Kiyaga Co. Identified swarms are circling in two areas of Masaka Co. In these areas hoppers are present; as well as small swarms (7 unidentified) which entered from Budaka Co. No damage has been caused in the latter district.

Kigezi—Flights were reported on the 4th in Nyawere's Comhola of Masaka. Swarms in two areas of this county were notified on the 7th. A telegram dated the 11th reports Locusts swarms in four gombolaha in the north of Kigezi. In each one each of Bukiya and Mborwa gombolaha local damage has been caused to crops.

The following reports refer to April:

West Nile—One flight of Nomadactra to the north of Arua moving north-west was the only record for the month.

Kigezi—Two swarms from Belgian East Africa settled on the 22nd and 30th, and continued north to the latter district passing through the latter district to the north of Kigezi Co. during the 21st to 27th.

Municipal Affairs

Minutes and recommendations of the various committees of Council of Nairobi were read and approved. The Municipal Council met on Tuesday afternoon for confirmation and approval. The matters to be considered included various recommendations by the Town Planning Committee and the Native Affairs Committee. These latter included a recommendation that the suggestion that a public health officer be appointed to Nairobi be approved in principle. The provision of an additional school for the Nairobi East End was also considered. Public Health matters, concerning the European, Asian and African communities, will be dealt with by including a comprehensive scheme to be submitted to the Municipal Council in the near future. It is noted that the Municipal Council has been suggested Government should consider two-thirds and the Municipal Council one-third.

The recommendation of the General Purpose Committee will come up for approval in connection with the application to open a coffee shop for approval. The committee decided to raise no objection to the establishment of a coffee stall, but it was decided that the Police had no objection to the proposal.

Various Finance Committee minutes will also come up for Council's consideration, one of the most important being the recommendation that Council should make an application for the sanction of Government to raise loans for Town Planning purposes not exceeding £10,000.

Relief Measures In S. Kavirondo

It is reported from South Kavirondo that in a small part of the district near the lake there arose a shortage of food, partly owing to lack of rain and partly owing to the rise in the level of the lake which prevented the potato tubers from being raised.

Before the natives could get hardship relief work in the form of dam construction was begun. The people who wish to come and do a task of work receive daily wages in the form of posho—their personal wages and children also help with enthusiasm. Already one dam has been completed and people have not felt hunger. There is also a good dam ready for supplying water.

As a result of good rains supplies of several potatoes will be improved and early planting of cereals will be possible with confidence. It is expected an early harvest. Good rains and better crops are expected to be produced. Cereals average condition is reported to be good. This year's agricultural production shows excellent promise.

The people have realized that the only way they can help to win the war is to provide as much food as possible.

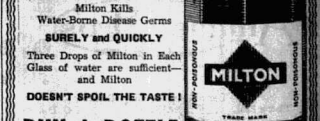

NATIONAL SERVICE IN S. RHODESIA

New Bill Calls All Men From 18 to 55 Years

The terms of the National Service (Armed Forces) Act, which has been adopted by the Southern Rhodesian Parliament, ensure that every man in the Colony, between the ages of 18 and 55, will serve the country in the best way possible.

An important provision in the Act is that persons called up for full-time military service, either before or after the commencement of the Act, must be re-allocated under the same conditions in which they worked before being called up. Employees who are called up to full-time military service will be taken into account, but are not to be held responsible for any arrears of pay or other obligations which they may have incurred before their call-up. The Act also provides that any man who is called up for full-time military service shall be deemed to have notified the authorities of all the men on their staff, including those called up for full-time military service since September 15, 1939.

All British males in the Colony between the ages of 18 and 55, who are liable to be called up and who are not members of the British Forces in Rhodesia, are to be called up for full-time military service, either before or after the commencement of the Act, must be re-allocated under the same conditions in which they worked before being called up. Employees who are called up to full-time military service will be taken into account, but are not to be held responsible for any arrears of pay or other obligations which they may have incurred before their call-up. The Act also provides that any man who is called up for full-time military service shall be deemed to have notified the authorities of all the men on their staff, including those called up for full-time military service since September 15, 1939.

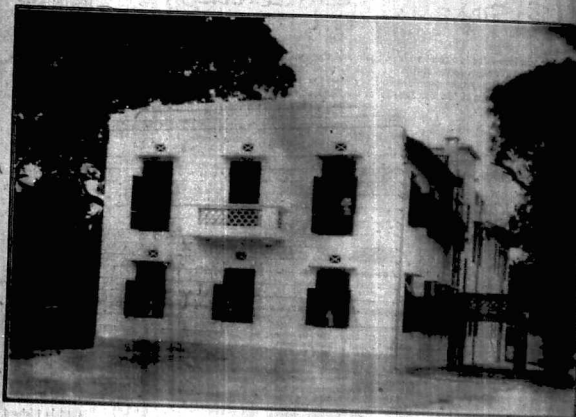

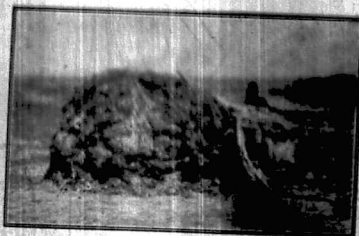

KING LEOPOLD CAPITULATES

But Belgium Fights On

GRAVE TURN IN MILITARY POSITION

DRAMATICALLY EARLY ON TUESDAY MORNING KING LEOPOLD OF THE BELGIANS IN HIS CAPACITY AS COMMANDER IN CHIEF OF HIS ARMY ORDERED HIS SOLDIERS TO CAPITULATE UNCONDITIONALLY.

This action, taken without reference to the governments of Britain and France, without the knowledge of the general commanding the Allied armies in Belgium and actually against the unanimous advice of his own ministers, has been promptly disavowed by the Belgian Government.

So far as the King's ministers are concerned Belgium will continue to fight beside the Allies and a new Belgian army is being trained in France.

However, the King's amazing decision has exposed the troops sent to the assistance of his country 18 days ago to a position of great danger and has opened the Belgian coast to the enemy.

On an earlier broadcast Mr. Pierlot said that the Belgian Cabinet had met yesterday at the Embassy in Paris. Speakers of both the Liberal and Chamberlains and other leaders were present. The Belgian Government was unanimous in affirming its will to continue the struggle at the side of the Allies until common victory was won.

POST-LEGISLATIVE REVISION OF INCOME TAX BILL TO BE REVISED BY SYSTEM

Income Tax Will Not Prejudice Position

THE importance of removing the post-legislative revision of the Income Tax Bill from the hands of the Executive is stressed in a statement issued by the Kenya Tax Authority.
