STREETS NOT PERMANENT CAR PARKS
 Council Should Have Power To Alter By-Laws

The view that the Nairobi Municipal Council should have power to alter by-laws in certain circumstances without reference to Government was expressed at Friday's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce. A resolution proposed by Mr. A. C. Tannahill was moved. It read: "It is the opinion of this Chamber that the Nairobi Municipal Council should have power to make alterations in the By-laws affecting streets closed and matters affecting traffic control, without referring the matter specifically to Government."

Speaking to Radio Mr. Tannahill pointed out that occasions arise when alterations in the By-laws were required quickly. The Nairobi Chamber of Commerce had been busy from making such alterations through a Local Government Committee. It is emphatically desired that the Nairobi Municipal Council should have power to make alterations in the By-laws affecting streets closed and matters affecting traffic control, without referring the matter specifically to Government.

It was thought in many cases the Council was better able to make the necessary decision and it seemed unnecessary to waste an immense amount of time by referring the subject to a committee which probably has little or nothing of the subject. The speaker dealt with the possibility of partial parking in Government Road and Harding Street, Nairobi, and suggested that it was an "offensive" suggestion.

Mr. J. D. Don gave his opinion. Mr. J. H. Sawyer, however, said that while he would have supported the motion last week he now could not do so as having been asked by the Municipal Council had done regarding the parking problem. He stated that the matter should be brought direct to Government and taken up through the normal channels.

Other views were expressed on the subject including the suggestion that the matter should be brought direct to Government and taken up through the normal channels.

The Town Clerk had stated quite definitely that while the Attorney-General held the view he had expressed that any alteration of By-laws by Council was ultra vires there was no useful purpose to be served in raising the matter further.

After some had been some slight "cross-talk" regarding the wording of one part of the resolution, Mr. G. C. Griffiths moved the motion which he said as well to give the new parking a trial before leaving it in criticism. The "speakers" referred to were not there to help the public and if the latter followed such advice they would park the dogs without as had been alleged, delay, or damage to their cars.

Shoulds for Moving Traffic
 This eminently tolerant viewpoint was also stressed by Mr. G. A. Trowel who pointed out that the Nairobi Municipal Council had spent a lot of money on the widening of streets in the centre but unfortunately, he held the view that streets were intended for motor traffic and not for a permanent parking ground.

He thought the new scheme should be given a run before being subjected to a spate of criticism. He added that the Council had imposed the new by-laws (they had actually wanted to close certain streets) as a result of long and careful consideration. There had been complaints from many shopkeepers in these two streets that their business was being interfered with by cars parked outside their premises all day long (so that shoppers went elsewhere).

He again stressed the fact that the streets were for moving traffic and that there were public parking grounds. Some people thought the new parking scheme looked silly, but it had been considered carefully from various viewpoints and was by no means as foolish as it might appear. This speaker, too, suggested waiting and watching before criticising it.

After some further slight discussion the motion as reported above was put to the meeting and passed.

Oil Drums Should Be Returned Without Delay
Wireless Kenya Station

The urgent necessity for the immediate return of empty petrol drums to the Oil Companies has been emphasized at Friday's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce.

The Secretary, Mr. A. H. Gilman, read an appeal from the President (absent from this meeting) which the Chamber as a whole heartily endorsed.

The appeal called attention to the fact that there was a large number of petrol drums and oil drums in circulation, but the great majority of these to the Oil Companies had resulted in a very serious shortage relative to the greatly increased demand arising out of military requirements.

It was emphasized that the military effort must in no way be prejudiced by the delay in returning these drums to the Oil Companies and all members of the Chamber were asked to impress on all users the necessity for complying with the request—contained in an official communication issued recently. Every effort should be made to render available the largest possible quantity of drums so that the country's military and civil requirements should not be impeded.

The statement concluded by asking all other Chambers of Commerce and Executive Committees to use their best endeavours along the lines indicated.

Customs Rebate For Military Institutions

The question of the rebate of Customs and Excise duties to the Navy, Army and Air Force Institutes, and to the United Defence Forces Cadets' Institute, was again dealt with by the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce at their Friday meeting.

In this connection the Secretary, Mr. A. H. Gilman, read a statement by the President (Mr. A. L. Levers) in which it was explained that the subject matter of this item, of the agenda had received the very best of consideration at a special meeting of the Management Committee which was held as a result of an invitation made by Government to the Chamber to express its views regarding a proposal to grant a rebate to the United Defence Forces Cadets' Institute, and also N.A.A.F.I. in respect of all goods ordinarily used in such Cadets' or Institute premises.

The Management Committee meeting, to which reference has been made, headed by the presence of the Acting Financial Secretary and British Representative of the Imperial and Union Defence Forces. A Resolution:

At the conclusion of this meeting the following resolution was addressed to Government:-

This Chamber endorses the proposal that troops from overseas should be supplied with their requirements duty free and at the lowest price. It also agrees that British Forces which stationed in camps or in the field should not be subjected to any irrelevant distinction, however that Local British Forces stationed in certain specified areas should be regarded as being at home, moreover, their rates of pay were fixed at normal duty paid prices and are in many cases being made up to normal duty paid prices by employers. It therefore, urges that recognition should be given by Government or by the Military Authorities wherever Local British Forces and their families are, in consideration of duty free privileges being granted to N.A.A.F.I. and other Military canteens, deferred from dealing with such canteens in certain territories to be specified from time to time if such Nairobi should be one.

ASPECTS OF WAR IN KENYA

Talk By Attorney General

Friday's broadcast talk from the National Station of Cable and Wireless Ltd. — in the series of weekly talks on various aspects of the war — was given by Mr. W. Harrigan, the Attorney General. The talk dealt with a number of what might be termed domestic aspects of the war and explained many points upon which some misapprehension has arisen in the public mind.

The property of enemy aliens was the first matter dealt with and in this connection Mr. Harrigan cleared up the erroneous impression that as soon as war is declared with any nation all property belonging to enemy nationals is confiscated in the Crown.

This was quite incorrect. Such property was vested in the Crown for the duration of the war. A proceeding necessary for the administration of that property while the owner was incarcerated.

Mr. Harrigan added: "Where the estate is a paying proposition and a manager can be found to look after it, such a manager is appointed, who is supervised by the official Custodian. WAR DAMAGE TO PRIVATE PROPERTY

Government's Intentions Made Clear

The question of Government's liability for compensation to private property owners, for damage caused by machine tools was again raised at Friday's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce when a statement from Government was read to the meeting and met with approval.

IRISH SCHOOLMISTRESS BOUND OVER

MISS Cecil Butler, an Irish schoolmistress, was arrested at St. George's School, Turu, where she was employed as a teacher on Tuesday, July 16, and was brought before the Resident Magistrate the following day charged with "uttering information likely to prejudice public tranquillity contrary to Defence Regulations, 1939."

The specific charge was that she had uttered information to the effect that on the 15th July, 1945, she had been informed by the British Government that the British Government would not go on with the war, and that the British Government would be glad to see the British Government withdraw from the continent of Europe.

The first witness called was Miss Mary Hill, a school teacher on the staff of St. George's School, where she had been employed for nearly a year, who said that she had heard Miss Butler utter the words in question on the 15th July, 1945. When cross-examined Miss Butler said that she had heard Miss Hill utter the words in question on the 15th July, 1945. German Fines
The resident magistrate, Miss Violet Rommie also on the staff at St. George's School, stated that she heard the remarks in question made by Miss Butler to Miss Fennell, the principal of the school. Continuing the witness said: "The remark in question was a very serious one in my mind and was certainly not proper."

Police Evidence
Assistant Inspector Wright of Molo then gave evidence. One which he said that as result of information given to him by Miss Fennell he went to the school accompanied by Deputy Magistrate and arrested the schoolmistress. The witness said that she was rather surprised at the arrest, as she had no reason to believe that she was a prejudicial person.

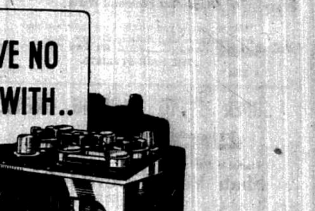

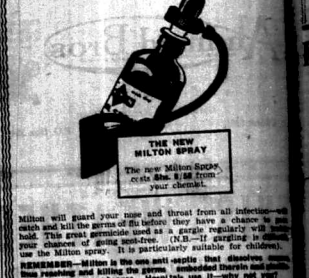

FUEL AND MUNITIONS RESEARCH
To Be Carried Out In E. Africa

ARRANGEMENTS are being made to set up, on an inter-territorial basis as far as circumstances permit, special technical committees for:
 (1) Fuel substitutes research.
 (2) Munitions research.
 It is hoped that a joint body representative of all the Government's territories may be established in the near future to deal with some of the technical questions, and if that proves possible these committees would work under that body. Maintenance that will be asked to report to the Governor's Conference.
 By research is meant not long range scientific research but investigations into what can be done now and where.
 Power Alcohol
 As regards fuel research, it is known that one sugar factory in Uganda is able to manufacture annually about 200,000 gallons of excellent power alcohol, and from experiments conducted by the Government of Uganda, this cotton seed fuel is a very good diesel engine fuel. It is also common knowledge that produce gas plants have given good results in appropriate conditions. But none of these things are being generally used, although drastic petrol restrictions are necessary, and there are likely to be further shortages of oil in the future. Moreover there are other sugar factories which might be able to put up the necessary plant to manufacture power alcohol under a properly coordinated scheme.
 Munitions
 In the case of munitions and military equipment the Government territories are involved but geographical distribution of the territories concerned is necessary for separate investigations to be organized in the northern and southern groups, in this

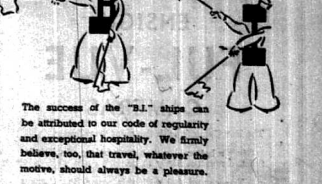

Need For Kenya To Save Scrap Material

THE need for economy in all theatres of war and for the increasing use of scrap material and waste material, is well recognized. Kenya can probably play a big part in this connection.

All the Kenya rubber factories are foundries capable of dealing with such waste products as paper, rags and metal scrap of all kinds which have to be exported to the nearest countries—South Africa and India—where facilities exist for dealing economically with them.

Shipping space for scrap and waste material of all kinds is not available at the moment, such space being required for more essential commodities.

The quantities of scrap collected, too, may be insufficient to justify export. As the war continues, however, the need for raw materials will increase.

Dumps, more especially of scrap metal, are being established at all Railway stations and halts—where they could be sorted into various categories, ready for collection when the time comes. In districts where Railway facilities do not exist, but through which military transport passes at regular intervals, dumps of scrap metal from farms might be kept on regular intervals, and from Kenyas be collected by transport returning empty to Nairobi.

There seems every possibility that scrap metal from Kenya will justify the expense of transport. By utilizing their scrap metal as free gifts, farmers and others could make a considerable contribution to the war effort.

Waste paper is being collected in some districts, but it seems that the most useful containers for this bulky material are made of locally available material. It is suggested that by the use of such things as hay and straw bales, by means of which waste paper and rags could be compressed into well-stuffed bales, this difficulty might be overcome.

In the case of paper and rag bales, it may prove so other countries, other than being worn, would be required.

Importance of Economy

After the success against the Italians on our Northern borders has begun it is likely that considerable quantities of military supplies will be sent to the front. The quantities of scrap metal and other materials thus made available should more than justify a regular export trade.

The great importance attached to the elimination of waste in Britain is well indicated by a recent article in these pages which under the heading of "Army War on Waste: Economy Hints for the Troops" stated—

"The materials of low economies may be effected in the Army were given as an order published at Chatham yesterday."

It was pointed out that every man must take the same care of his uniform as he would of clothes he had bought for himself in civil life. He was to avoid wearing anything that was worn-out clothing is to be thrown away and every unit to have its own rag bag, while commanding officers must ensure that the method of mending and laundering is adequate.

Big increase in Kenya

A WAR MEASURE

A very considerable increase in the amount of the Poll Tax in Kenya for the period of the new 1946 will be introduced by the War Taxation (Kenya) Act, 1946, which was passed by the Legislative Council on July 13, 1946, and is expected to come into force on January 1, 1947. The increase in the Poll Tax is being made in order to meet the increased cost of living in the country since the outbreak of the war when it was necessary for the Government to increase the price of many essential commodities and to increase the cost of many services.

The new rates of income tax are as follows: (a) RESIDENT INDIVIDUALS: For a single man or woman, the tax is 10% on the first £100 of income, and 20% on the remainder. For a married man or woman, the tax is 10% on the first £200 of income, and 20% on the remainder. (b) NON-RESIDENT INDIVIDUALS: For a single man or woman, the tax is 10% on the first £50 of income, and 20% on the remainder. For a married man or woman, the tax is 10% on the first £100 of income, and 20% on the remainder.

The additional tax payable by persons on their income under the new provisions is comparatively small, but single persons and those on a small income will be affected to a substantial extent.

Drate Revisions

The Government has also revised the rates of income tax payable by persons on their income under the new provisions. The rate of tax payable by a single man or woman on the first £100 of income will be reduced from 10% to 5%. The rate of tax payable by a single man or woman on the remainder of their income will be reduced from 20% to 15%. The rate of tax payable by a married man or woman on the first £200 of income will be reduced from 10% to 5%. The rate of tax payable by a married man or woman on the remainder of their income will be reduced from 20% to 15%.

Income Tax

A maximum of Shg. 28,810/- per annum, an increase of Shg. 15,756/-.

These examples are inclusive of the annual Poll Tax and in each case the increase is over and above the former tax plus the four per cent introduced earlier. In 1945-46, a married man without children, on an income of £200, paid a Poll Tax of £20.00 and a tax of £5.00, respectively. Under the new provisions, he will pay a Poll Tax of £25.00 and a tax of £5.00, respectively. The total income tax payable by a single man on an income of £200.00 will be Shg. 130/- per annum under the new Tax, which is an increase of Shg. 10/- over the old rate.

The Second £10,000

A second instalment of £10,000 from the Kenya Central Fund was forwarded to the Governor of the Exchequer on July 24, 1946.

ASPECTS OF WAR IN KENYA

Talk By Attorney General

The Attorney General's speech at the Nairobi Station of Cable and Wireless on July 24, 1946, is a study in itself on various aspects of the war in Kenya.
