Question going to present Assembly

BRITAIN has agreed to ask the present session of the United Nations General Assembly to end her trusteeship agreement with Tanganyika.

Referring to this welcome news, the Chief Minister of Tanganyika, Mr. Nyerere, said in Dar es Salaam that the termination would take effect on a date to be decided by the two Governments.

The Chief Minister told the Legislative Council that he had been told by the Colonial Secretary that the principle underlying the pact for the new Tanganyika Government was entirely acceptable to the British Government.

Referring to "this welcome news", Mr. Nyerere said it was a demonstration for all the world to see that nothing new stood in their way of the time to properly the work that was required to be done. "To all intents and purposes, we are free already," he said. "All that remains hard work."

MONDAY MEETING ON RENT RISES

A Ukrainian speaks out

They also seized M. Kasongo, who is regarded in the West as having started the Congo's civil war.

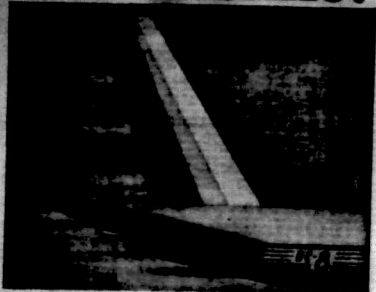

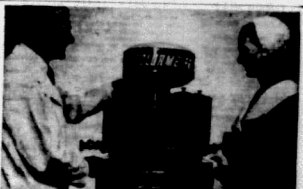

NAIROBI DROPS RENT INCREASES

Deficit to be met by saving not subsidies

FOUR-HOUR MEETING

RENT increases are not to be imposed on some 6,200 African tenants of Nairobi City Council, the council's Finance Committee decided last night.

The council rejected unanimously a policy of subsidised rents and decided that the deficit in the African Housing Account—which the increases were intended to meet—should be met instead by economies.

The full resolution—passed after the committee had held closed doors for nearly four hours—was: "This meeting intends to maintain African housing rents at their present level for one year beginning on December 1, and agrees that this should be met by economies and not subsidies."

Roads may suffer

Council officials were not allowed to present their part of the discussion. It was understood later that officials were asked to submit figures to a later committee meeting on housing expenditure from the African Housing Account.

It is probable that some of the plans shelved by the African estates—such as road improvement drainage—will have to be curtailed.

One of the likely sufferers will be a programme of road widening which would have been financed from the mainstay fund.

Notices to quit

There is an accumulated reserve in this fund of £68,000 which is likely to be cut to meet the present situation.

The deficit on the African Housing Account at the end of last year was £19,708, and it is expected to be nearly £30,000 by the end of this year.

The increases—which have met with a lot of opposition—were served on 37,000 tenants with a view to being served on most of the tenants involved by the end of the year.
