Price of Radium.

IS CHINA GRAMME JUSTIFIED?

In the price of \$10,000 charged for a gramme of radium (quoted) Prof. Lindemann, who is Professor of Experimental Philosophy at Oxford and one of the leading physicists of the country, has expressed his belief in the "Daily Telegraph" that he would not be surprised to demand an explanation.

Radium experts in Britain do not support the complaint of Lindemann, secretary of the British Radium Campaign, made the following statement in reply to inquiries by a representative of the "Observer":

"I am satisfied that the Radio Beige of Belgium, namely, that of the Haut Katanga Company which markets radium, is actuated by a desire to supply radium at a reasonable profit.

"The British Radium Campaign has among many others, received many kindnesses from the Radio Beige, which for many years past has frequently lent quantities of radium for research purposes, without making any charge whatever.

"The Committee of Civil Research, who were authorized by the Government to investigate the world supplies have given figures in their report showing that the profit at £11.00 per gramme is roughly 30 per cent."

INAUGURATION OF THE BENGUELLA RAILWAY.

Ceremony Attended by Prince Arthur.

A BIG EVENT.

The train inaugurating the opening of the Benguella railway stepped into Louis at 11 o'clock on Monday, June 10 and was greeted by a salute. It was on Monday evening the Portuguese Colonial Minister, Senhor Baboano Arthur, was decorated by Prince Arthur of Consoal with the Grand Cross of the British Empire and the High Commissioner for Angola with the knighthood of the same Order.

After the arrival of the train, and preliminary greetings, the Portuguese Minister for the Colonies declared the railway open.

This was followed by a banquet at which there was a distinguished gathering. Senhor Baboano held the history of the railway in a long speech and expressed pleasure at the attendance of Prince Arthur. Prince Arthur replied expressing gratitude for the warmth of his reception.

The Benguella railway, extends from Lobito Bay, in the northern portion of the Province, to the Belgian Congo border, almost as far as from Capetown to Johannesburg.

The new railway, which is to be continued to Katanga for the use of the copper industry, will bring a vast country of agricultural and mineral potentialities within reach of the sea and will be a vital factor in the steadily expanding trade of Lobito Bay, one of the more important of the many inlets of the long, fast coastline and now being equipped to cope with a large volume of traffic. Naturally the importance by the Portuguese Government as making the happy completion of a great step in the country's progress.

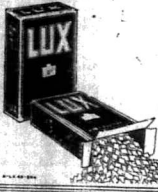

MAINTENANCE OF THE MAGNETO.

Efficiency Makes All the Difference.

POINTS IN CLEANING AND ADJUSTING.

The amount of attention paid to a motor depends to a large extent upon the individual and his mechanical ability. If the car is comparatively new, little, perhaps, need be done to make it ready for a 500-mile journey, but even so, a complete greasing of the chassis should be undertaken. What naturally the engine, gearbox and rear axle should be filled with oil to the proper level. If the type used in good condition they may require only minor attention, but certainly all embedded sludge should be probed out and the holes which they leave filled with a good stopping compound.

These preparations are a perfectly normal character and of the type almost always undertaken by a conscientious owner before setting out for a long run. If, however, the car is to be enjoyed without the driver having always at the back of his mind some little worry in connection with the running of the car, every small job for which time permits should be done beforehand.

Detailed Attention.
Where older cars are concerned, more extensive preparations may be necessary; it is in fact a very good plan completely to dismantle the magneto and carburetor for thorough cleaning and adjustment. In addition, unless the job has been done comparatively recently, the engine should be decarbonized, the valves ground in, and the tappets adjusted.
The last-named jobs are those which the majority of owners

drawers can readily undertake for themselves in a few days of leisureable cylinder heads, but many amateur mechanics fight shy of dismantling a carburetor, while when it comes to a magneto they are apt to view the instrument almost in a horrified manner.

Whilst it is by no means suggested that the man who has only recently taken over his motor car should straightaway dismantle the magneto, there are at the same time many owners fully competent to do the work provided that they know how to do it. Therefore, in magazines that describe the magneto almost completely just to see how it is done.

The Preliminaries.

The first job is, of course, to remove the magneto from the engine, but before this is done the timing position must be marked so that the magneto can be refitted without the need for actual resetting from the piston position of the crank angle. Vernier coupling is fitted a line scribbled on the flywheel so that the angles are clearly marked will be sufficient. It is not essential that the marks should be on the rubber centre piece, because when the other two marks are exactly opposite each other the rubber will fit only in one position.

If it is necessary, however, to remove the distributor cover and note carefully the position of the rotor, or the jump start arm, as the case may be. The reason for this is that the brush makes a half, the armature speed, therefore, although the marked coupling may be reassembled correctly, it may happen that the brush will be 180 degrees out, that is, exactly opposite its proper position. The magneto may be held on the engine by studs screwed in to base, or by a metal strap in other cases. No difficulty, but it will be necessary at the same time to disconnect the condenser and lead and to remove the high-tension leads from the plugs. However, a special instrument will be

necessary so that the leads are not mixed up when they are refitted. A simple and perfectly efficient plan is to file notches on the brush terminal tabs, or even in the brush lead insulation.

Starting with the front plug, a single notch is filed into the terminal tab, and a lead from the front will have two notches filed in it, and so on to the terminal tab, although actually if the first three are marked there is no real need to do the fourth, as obviously it can go back only on one plug. Although the leads are then marked unambiguously on the four, the marks will not, of course, indicate the firing order of the engine. This will be obvious if the leads are traced to the distributor and, when it will be found that they come in an order which is generally 1, 2, 4, 3. This, however, will not make the slightest difference so far as the present job is concerned.

The only remaining operation before the magneto is ready to be fitted from the engine is to disconnect the switch wire leading to the contact-breaker cover, unless the earthing brush within it can be examined and cleaned without disconnecting. The wire may be secured by a terminal or by a locking screw, in any case the method of its disconnection will be obvious at a glance, and the magneto can then be carried to the bench.

The first job will be to clean the outside of the instrument thoroughly, so that all oil and dirt is removed. This is essential if the risk of dirt getting inside the armature tunnel is to be avoided. The non-rim can then be removed by pulling it straight off. If it tends to jam it must be freed gently with a screwdriver blade but on no account must force be used, otherwise the ring may be distorted. When it is clear the contact breaker will be accessible, and should be attended, accordingly removed if by removal of the central binding.


The invariably has a right-hand thread, but no other instrument than the special magneto spanner

should be used to unscrew it. The tendency for the armature to turn whilst the screw is being undone can be easily avoided by holding the coupling at the other end. When the screw is clear of the threads it can be drawn out a little way, and then moved gently side to side so as to free the contact breaker from the seating in the part of the armature, but if this method does not prove effective, two screwdrivers inserted behind it on opposite sides will have the effect of bringing it clear.

Behind it will be seen a flat surface—probably be-griffened with carbon dust worn off the earthing brush which is let into the back of the contact breaker. The circular track of the brush and the surrounding area must be cleaned carefully, and ordinary brass polish will be found very suitable for the job. The brush itself should next be examined; it will be found to be projecting partly from the back of the contact breaker, but held more or less in position by means of a light spring. It can be pulled out as much as is necessary to clean it, but unless the face is badly pitted there should be no need to trim it with a file; all that is necessary is to see that it is working freely and that there is no oil present.

If the points of the contact breaker are in good condition, there will be no reason for removing them, but if they show signs of pitting they should be taken out for closer examination. To do this the short length of clock spring on the bell-crank rocker arm must be in this position because the small screw which holds it in place is certain to be very tight. Furthermore, it is rather short and, when once loosened, it is apt to come clear of the threads in the bell-crank unpropitiously, with the result that the clock spring straightens out suddenly and shoots the screw across the garage, where it will be almost impossible to find it. On the majority of magnetos a short stiffening spring is fitted behind the main bell-crank spring. This also will be lost if the main spring is allowed to fly.

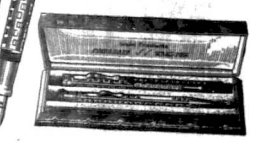

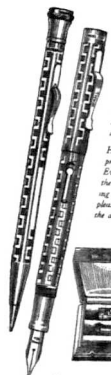

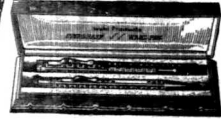

gally taken, and increased in weight by well over three times, while the fish left on the coastal grounds only doubled in weight. This was not an isolated result, but was maintained with marked consistency through repeated investigations over a period of eight weeks.

Thus there remains no possible doubt that transplantation can be successfully managed, but there is, unfortunately, no reason to think, Mr. Maurice says, that it can be made an economic proposition. Transplantation is still in the infancy stage, and though there is some small indication that it will soon be ripe for commercial exploitation.

Practical Results.
But it must not be supposed from this that marine biology is of purely academic value. From the beginning it has been a science with several practical applications. Its birth dates from the expedition of the Challenger in 1873; ten years later Fisheries Biologists at North Kensington provided a fresh stimulus. And it was not until the time that the practice of trawling for fish was first begun.

When, to make the revolution complete, the trawlers went over to mesh, it was very generally feared that there would be over-fishing and the fisheries would before long be exhausted. Worse still, it was argued that the trawling along the bottom of the sea destroyed the sperm of the fish and thus ruined the fishing industry at its very root.

Here were two very practical problems for the new science to answer. The first difficulty solved was the question of how to limit the fishermen to go further afield and the danger of over-fishing the fish stocks was thereby diminished. But the second problem demanded the attention of the marine biologist. Research soon showed that since some of the food fish except the herring lay their eggs in the bed of the ocean (while even the herring eggs are laid on stony ground which is usually covered by the trawling) the danger was purely imaginary.

A similar problem was faced much more recently when the sudden development of trawling as a herring fishery in the North Sea resulted in outcry among the old drift-net fishermen that the trawler took immature fish.

A widespread research was undertaken; naturalists and assistants talked on commercial vessels to measure and make an age analysis of the catch.

It was found that, after all, the fish caught by the trawler, though small, was not immature. Once again a danger of panic legislation was averted.

NAIROBI RACES.
"Searchlight" Reviews
To-Day's Meeting.
GOOD FIELDS AND KEEN
RUNNING PROMISED.

To-day's meeting marks a new era in horse racing in Nairobi. Something ago it was decided to venture a one-day gathering as in the nature of an experiment. The eight events to be decided this afternoon as the outcome, and with the promise of good fields, some excellent racing should be enjoyed.

Just as to-day's meeting marks a new era in horse racing in the Colony so does it inaugurate a new feature to the "E.A. Standard". In future the different race meetings in the Colony will be reviewed by "Searchlight," and below appears the first of these articles.

In attempting to tip winners in this country one is met with the following difficulties which do not arise in England.

1. Indifference starts due probably to the absence of a game and the practice of semi-idling starts. Many races are lost on account of delayed starts.
2. The official records do not state which horse is the fastest.
3. No training notes at all.
4. Two or more horses from the same training stable, at the same race.
5. Horses entered for two races.

However I will endeavour to proceed in spite of the above.

Flat Race—Open Galloway Plate 5th. China Maid is entered for another race. **MERLIN** should win, with **CHINA MAID** second. The difficulty will be to obtain a jockey for China Maid who may win for the 5.30 race in which it carries top-weight.

Second Race—Y. O. Country Road Stakes. It is always difficult to forecast the result of a two-year-old race as most of those engaged have little previous racing experience.

Of those entered **Myocotis**, **Peace Partout** and **Moderately** have previously been placed. The first two appear to have **Moderately** well held. **Myocotis** on King's Messenger to 1 length at the Nairobi New Year Meeting and has not been on since. **Peace Partout** twice ran second to Neptune. I think **MYOCOTIS** will win, but if absent **PEACE PARTOUT**.

MAINTENANCE OF THE MAGNETO.

Efficiency Makes All the Difference.

POINTS IN CLEANING AND ADJUSTING.

(Continued.)

A pivoted spring-loaded arm is used, as a rule, to locate the bell crank on its pivot pin; the arm can be pushed to one side and the bell crank eased off the pin. Quite possibly it will be a little tight, in which case, after its removal, the brownish deposit on the pin can be cleaned off with kerosene-soaked emery cloth, and the pivot hole in the bell crank also cleaned out by wrapping a piece of the emery cloth round a match stick and, as it were, slipping out the hole. If the magneto is of an early type, having a small-diameter pin with a red fibre bush in the bell crank, great care must be taken to keep oil away from both the pin and the bush, the effect of oil is to swell the fibre and thus cause it to bind; the pivot is intended by run dry.

If the contact points are made of platinum and are badly pitted so that their surface is distinctly irregular, the block of the service should be supported on a metal block which the surface of the projecting from the end of the platinum is hammered gently to bring it flat, the final asset being a fine sand and smoothing out of the pits being done by means of a special contact-breaker file which can be bought at any necessary shop.

The safest way to true the points, however, is to wait until the contact breaker has been reassembled and then to separate the points by pressure on the heel piece inside the bell crank. The blade of the file is then inserted between the points and pressure on the heel piece removed. The spring then tends to bring the points together so that they press upon the file blade which can be worked gently backwards and forwards until a true surface is obtained. The exact adjustment of the points to the correct gap cannot be made until the cam ring is refitted, but this job should be deferred until the

rest of the magneto has been cleaned.

At the driving end of the magneto will be found an aluminium or, in some cases, a Babbite cover above the structure, held in place as a rule by two screws. These can be undone and the cover removed, and it will be found that underneath it is the collector brush which conveys the current from the slip ring to the distributor. The brush holder is of right-angle for the magnet, and held in place by screws. On some magnetos a thin piece of brass having a new edge filed on one side is clamped between the brush holder and the structure turned casing. This piece of metal forms part of the safety spark gap, and care must be taken to put it back in exactly the position which it occupied before removal.

The Slip Ring.

Withdrawal of the brush holder will show that in the lower end of it is a spring-pressed carbon brush which bears on the slip ring. Quite possibly the insulation adjacent to the brush will be covered with carbon dust. This should be wiped off and a rag, moistened with petrol, passed down the hole normally occupied by the brush holder. The rag can be pushed down with a screwdriver until it comes into contact with the slip ring. The structure should then be rotated by turning the coupling ring in through the aperture of the ring is brought into contact with the rag and thoroughly cleaned.

The other end of the main bearing, when in position, bears against another small carbon brush projecting from the end of the distributor spindle; a small disc of brass being used to make the contact. The brass and the brush must be cleaned and the surrounding surfaces freed from carbon dust. There should be no need to draw out the structure from the frame, and in fact it is not advisable for an amateur with no previous experience to attempt the work to undertake the job. Assembly can, therefore, be commenced, the collector brush with spark gap lug being first screwed into position and the cover plate replaced.

The contact breaker can then be refitted care being taken that it is given a longer gap than that allowed by the magneto spring as a test to tighten up the binding screw. Occasionally, when the tapered nut of the contact breaker is inserted

into the hole in the end of the structure, it is necessary to make sure that the small projecting key fits into the keyway. On some magnetos an ordinary brush, bearing on the structure, is screwed into the body of the instrument; it should be removed and cleaned in petrol.

If the distributor is of the jump-spark type the only attention necessary will be to wipe the interior with a duster, but if the poles of the four segments show signs of pitting there is no harm in scraping them gently with a knife. Possibly, however, the distributor will be of the normal wipe-type, in which case the instrument must be examined to see that it is free in its holder and that its surface is clean and of a contour which conforms with the bore of the distributor. The four inserted brass segments, or all probably will be dirty. They can be cleaned effectively with brass polish and the cover will then be ready for replacement.

Final Adjustments.

The only job left to be done now before the instrument is refitted to the engine is the checking of the gap of the contact breaker. The structure being turned until first one cam and then the other operates the points. In each position the gap should be checked to ensure of the same on the slip spring. If the gap is incorrect the bearing nut on the adjustable contact point, and turning the screw until the correct gap is provided when the bearing nut must be tightened.

It may happen that when correctly adjusted the points do not meet together truly so that only one edge of one as it were touch. In that case the contact must be unmounted and moved across backwards and forwards. The times to correct the irregularity of the contact if it is necessary to adjust the gap by arranging the pin inside so that the terminals are within a quarter of an inch or so of some part of the magneto frame, by hand. A check should be made on each terminal to form that it indicates that the magneto is in working order. The instrument can quite safely be held by the side of the method of removal already described.

If the contact points are made of platinum and are badly pitted so that their surface is distinctly irregular, the back of the screw which is supported on a metal block whilst the surface of the platinum is hammered gently, bringing it flat, the final excess being smoothed out by the use of a special contact-breaker file which can be bought at any necessary shop.

The safest way to true the points, however, is to wait until the contact breaker has been reassembled and then to separate the points by pressure on the heel piece of the bell crank. The blades of the file are then inserted between the points and the pressure on the heel piece is removed. The spring then tends to bring the points together so that they press upon the file blades, which can be worked gently back and forth until a true surface is obtained. The same adjustment of the points to the correct gap cannot be made until the cam ring is refitted, but this job should be deferred until the

rest of the magneto has been cleaned.

As the driving end of the magneto will be found an accumulator or, in some cases, an accumulator above the armature, held in place as a rule by two screws. A small disc of brass being used to make the contact. The brass and the brush must be cleaned and the surrounding surfaces freed from carbon dust. There should be no need to draw out the armature from the housing and in fact a nut is available for the purpose of adjusting the pressure on the contact. As previous experience of the magneto work to undertake the job. As the assembly can, therefore, be done with the magneto in position and the cover plate replaced.

The contact breaker can then be refitted and being taken that no greater wear appears than allowed by the magneto spinner used to tighten up the binding screw. Occasionally, when the tapered hole of the contact breaker is marked

into the hole in the end of the armature, it is necessary to make sure that the small projecting file fits into the keyway. On some magneto an sparking brush, bearing on the armature, is screwed into the body of the instrument; it should be removed and cleaned in place.

The only job left to be done now before the instrument is refitted to the engine is the checking of the gap of the contact breaker, the armature being turned until the one cam and then the other engages the points. In each position the gap should be checked in terms of the space on the plug vane. If the gap is incorrect it must be made right by adjusting the backing nut on the adjustable contact point, and turning the points until the correct gap is provided when the locking nut must be tightened.

It may happen that when correctly adjusted the points do not close together, and so that the whole of each, as it were, does not meet. In this case the contact must be corrected and moved gently backwards and forwards a few times to correct the irregularities after which it may be necessary to adjust the gap. By arranging the plug back so that the terminals are within a quarter of an inch of the plug, the armature fairly readily by hand, a spark should jump from each terminal in turn; this will indicate that the magneto is now quite ready. The instrument in working state, held by hand whilst this test is being made, can be described.

Refitting the magneto to the engine is simply a reversal of the method of removal already described.

A SERIOUS SHORTAGE OF NATIVE FOODSTUFFS.

Restricted Margin of Colony's Maize Stock.

EMBARGO ON SOUTH NYERI PRODUCE.

Profiteers Warn of Possible Loss Through Price Fluctuations.

There is a serious shortage of native foodstuffs in some parts of the country and it is likely to become more acute during the next few weeks until the growing maize harvest.

An acute shortage is also reported in the Kiui District. Because of the scarcity the Food Control Board has placed an embargo on all movement of maize from South Nyeri to down-line stations.

A warning is issued to growers and merchants who are holding up stocks that they are running the risk of losing through a drop in the controlled price when the native harvest is harvested.

The available free margin of maize in the country is very low being less than 25,000 bags.

EARLY KAYRONO HARVEST.

At a meeting of the Food Control Board held on Thursday afternoon a statement was presented which disclosed that the existing stocks of maize and other foodstuffs are estimated to amount to a total of 10,000 bags. Of this total 10,000 bags are already sold or under pledge of sale, leaving only 1,000 bags available for the needs of the population for the remainder of the season.

A very serious shortage exists in the Kiui District. It is reported that the stocks held by shopkeepers in that area are estimated to amount to only a few hundred bags while the market is capable of producing only 200 to 500 bags weekly. Average stocks are being reduced by three weeks and progressively less thereafter.

This involves the depletion of supplies required for the feeding of farmers' labour in North Nyeri and Nairobi districts where it is estimated that a total of 300,000 bushels will be required monthly for the next three months. Arrangements are being made by the Board for the requirements to be met by its own stocks.

AS EMBARGO.

An embargo has now been placed on all exports of maize from South Nyeri to down-line stations. It will have the effect of creating a shortage in the Kiui, Kiungu and Kiunga areas unless immediate steps are taken.

SEVERE ASSAULT AT RUIRU.

Indians Attacked by Native.

The Indian, who is reported in the "East African Standard," yesterday was brought to the District Civil Hospital in Nairobi late in Wednesday night suffering from severe injuries to the legs and it is said to be in a serious condition, although he has sufficiently recovered to make a statement to the Police. It is believed that an operation was performed on him yesterday.

The injured man is named Nyari Juhari and is the brother-in-law of a native named Nyari Juhari. Prevention of Malaria.

BILL TO DEAL WITH PRIVATE LAND.

A special session of the Kenya Official Gazette published on June 27 gave the text of a Bill to be introduced into the Legislative Council for the prevention of malaria in the Colony and for the introduction of the Bill into the Legislative Council at the next session. The Bill gives effect to the recommendations of the Select Committee on the Draft Estimate for 1930 and is designed to confer power in the interests of public health to prevent the owner or possessor of land from having on his land places where water is allowed to stand and should introduce legislation on the lines of the legislation now in force in the Malay States providing that proper and adequate steps shall be taken by the owner or possessor to remove the potential breeding places from the land to the satisfaction of the local authority. The recommendations also state that the owner or possessor of land should be obliged to deal with places used for the purpose of the local authority should be empowered to deal with them at the owner's or possessor's expense, and any compensation payable for interference with vested rights should be determined by the court. The Bill also provides for the payment of the owner and should be left to the discretion of the Government. CARNATIONS

The following extracts from Mr. M. G. Alford's book "Carnations with colour" would be well to suit the out-of-door conditions in the District.

Propagation

The determination of varieties of carnations in amateur's gardens is obvious to all intelligent cultivators. This is due to many causes, but careless propagating is the chief one. It is useless to propagate exhausted and worn-out stock.

A poor cutting may be taken from a good plant, or, on the other hand, an apparently good cutting may be taken from a plant weak in constitution or sickly or over-fertilized.

In selecting the cuttings which are to make the plants for next year's stock, try not only to procure the best qualities of the variety but aim at improving them. The more taking of a lot of cuttings profusionally from the plants and finishing a large quantity to root does not constitute skilful propagation. There is no doubt that the cutting reproduces in all details the plant from which it was taken. I believe in selecting, as far as possible, a uniform average size in cuttings, avoiding the abnormally large as well as the small cuttings, because from an even, uniform set of cuttings uniformity of plants results.

I find I cannot write too strongly nor emphasize too emphatically, the vital importance of selecting only the very best and strongest cuttings. The difference in the bloom produced from good and bad cuttings of the same variety is as distinct as the Polar. It is fully to think that you can get practice weak cuttings, and cure your plants of any defects which are a permanent cure of any defect in a plant's make-up is most difficult.

Outings.

A cutting removed from a plant which is dry at the root rarely takes root. The old growers used to prefer the base cuttings, but those which are produced from the main stem of an old plant just above the ground, but experience has taught me that these are in no way so prolific as those produced

higher upon the flowering growth. loam sand and ashes, merrum and loam, but in all the best loam and soil cuttings are raised. It was very disappointing. It was thought that the medium was too good, and that the drainage was not as good as when planted in the loam. The following method gave the best results.

Select a large shady tree, dig small beds of about one foot broad and one long, convenient, under the shade of the branches so that no time during the day does the sun shine direct on to the beds. Then mix with the earth in the beds about an equal quantity of sand, the bed should be firm down with the foot of a spade. Water the beds until thoroughly soaked.

The following is a simple and quickest way to plant cuttings. Make a small divider about quarter inch diameter with a stop half an inch from the end, and press into the soil more than half an inch. With this instrument make holes about two inches apart in lines about the cutting plant. Then place the cuttings one by one in the holes, pressing the earth very firmly round each cutting before proceeding to the next. It is not advisable to push

the end of the cutting into the soil as the end is apt to get broken. After planting shade heavily for a week and then gradually reduce the shade till at the end of three weeks all the shade has been removed. It is most important to protect the cuttings from the sides as well as above, as the dry hot winds evaporate the moisture from the leaves and stems. The cuttings after three weeks should look as fresh as the day they were planted. It is very easy to water cuttings too much in this country especially when heavily shaded. After planting the cuttings water them with a fine rose, do not dose them with a coarse rose on the one, as you will wash them out of the ground. Water every other day sufficiently to keep the soil damp until the end of the morning and at night.

Roosting Mediums. Many different materials can be used as a medium in which to strike carnation cuttings. Sifted soil, sand, or pulverized cinders mixed with sand may be used. Soil and sand, composed of three parts sphagnum moss and sand, green wood ashes and sand, loam and sand are quite common.

I prefer the latter for summer propagation in the open. I am a strong believer in shoring clean sand from an old decaying mat and of more texture than which to root cuttings. It will probably occur to the reader that if a cutting is rooted in sand, as soon as it comes to make root it has nothing to feed on.

A cutting which is rooted in sand and loam makes four or five separate roots to start, whereas one rooted in pure sand makes seven to ten, the middle one that the latter will make the better plant, and that is exactly the case.

Kenya Application. With reference to the application of the above to the amateur cultivators in Kenya Colony, it has been found that the more strictly followed the directions for selecting and taking cuttings, the better results will be obtained. Roosting mediums of all kinds have been tried, the one to give the best result so far, is ordinary red loam taken from the top soil in any garden in Nairobi, mixed with an equal quantity of clean river sand. Cuttings were tried in boxes of clean sand and

THE POLITY HEALTH.

A SUCCESSFUL FARM.

Important Factors.

The other day I was asked to state what I considered the most important factors in running a successful poultry farm. To my mind the three most important factors for success are cleanliness and shade. There are many other things to be observed, but experience has taught me that without these three success is impossible. Without cleanliness our birds are at the mercy of so many scourges both from disease and vermin. You have only to get a deserted nest of a wild bird, and the disease of red mite in the nestling birds. Kenya Poultry Disease was originally caused to become a scourge by the dirty state in which the natives kept their birds.

It would take a long time, and a lot of writing, to describe all the diseases of poultry caused originally by dirt and uncleanliness, but it will be sufficient to state that time out of ten of the ten flocks with poultry were primarily struck by lack of cleanliness.

As to shade, no birds will thrive unless they can have plenty of shade. It does not matter whether the sun is very hot or not, the birds do not like it, unless they are under shade. Take the average sunny day, and between eleven and three there is plenty of shade you will not see any of the birds about, except under the trees.

Fresh air is the third important factor of success. The more fresh air the birds get, the more they will thrive, but they will thrive. It does not matter much what the houses are made from, as long as there is plenty of fresh air. The most satisfactory type of house is one built with open slats, but it must be protected from the weather; if the roof does not come down low enough to keep the rain from beating in, then the weather-side will have to be protected in some way.

After these three things there is to be considered correct feeding, including good fresh feeding grain, a plentiful supply of green feed, and full grub boxes; freedom from overcrowding; separation of

History of Music.

AN INFORMATIVE LECTURE BY MISS BATES.

"Great masterpieces of music and how they came to be made" was the title chosen by Miss Kathleen Bates, A.R.C.M., for her lecture given in the Y.M.C.A. on Wednesday evening last.

The three highest forms of music, she explained, were oratorios, opera and symphony. At the beginning there was only church music and folk music; the two great factors in the progress of music were religion and the national life of the people. The folk music was purely traditional and there was no means of writing it so that it had to be passed from lip to lip and was obliterated or altered as desired.

The necessity for music in the Church service was realized and although the Council of Trent in 1563 abolished music entirely from the Church, Cardinal Borromeo reasserted its uplifting power and persuaded the Church authorities to set examples of really devout music. The work was given to Palestrina, a member of the Pope's Chapel, and he produced three masses which were performed and these were regarded to be of the most devout and beautiful nature. Through this fine music of the Church was saved. In 1600 a series of Bible talks were noted to the accompaniment of music in the choir of the Church and from these the oratorio was born and took its name. The first great oratorio writer was Handel who appeared 100 years later. The nature of his music was outlined and a sketch was given of his work. The work of the leading oratorio writers was traced through Bach, Haydn and Mendelssohn to Sir Edward Elgar in the present time. It was a curious fact that oratorio which had always been closely associated with the English people should now be brought to a fitting ending by Sir Edward Elgar.

Secular Music.

Turning to opera Miss Bates said that after sacred music the people wanted secular music. This was first given to them at the commencement to a play between the opera Italy led the way in this but gave prominence to the brilliance of solo. It was Purcell, the greatest musician England ever had, who mixed all the traditions of Italy but combined with them a really dramatic representation.

Instrumental Work.

Owing to pressure of time Miss Bates was only able to give a brief survey of the use of instrumental work through the medium of the orchestra. She quoted Mr. Percy Scholes who said that the orchestra had four families, the strings, the wood blowers, the brass blowers and the harpers. She suggested that the melody and atmosphere emanated from the strings and the harpers and the effects from the harpers. The great symphonies were composed of the strings which the form of music developed. The history of the orchestra, its melody and form was absolutely overwhelming. His solo to music in the same way as the Cathedral of Rome stood to architecture and the Venus de Milo to sculpture.

Throughout the lecture Miss Bates used a number of gramophone records, which together with two new gramophones had been lent by Messrs. the B.E.A. Music Store and Messrs. Jacobs for the purpose of illustrating her various points giving examples to clarify her remarks.

In conclusion she said that if she had made her listeners take a wider interest in the world of music and if she had worked their interest on made them look forward to enjoying many of the great masterpieces she was amply rewarded.

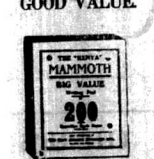

Ice-cream Cheese. Mince a quarter of a pound of raspberries, brown with marmalade or tomato catsup and stir until it is of a consistency to spread easily. Spread between slices of white-bread and sprinkle with paprika.
