THE TANGANYIKA EXHIBITION.

Propaganda by the London Office.

FIRMS INTERESTED.

Following are the names of firms which have recently in the East African section of the London Chamber of Commerce to the objects and status of the Tanganyika Exhibition, I sought from the London Office some details of what has been done officially in London to bring the exhibition to the notice of business circles in London. Major Data gave me the following statement:

"At the request of the Committee of the Exhibition the Office has at various dates circulated publicly matter very extensively, starting with circulars and following this up with folders and posters. These have been sent to all the principal Chambers of Commerce, all the Companies known to be interested in East African business, selected traders from the British Industries Fair Catalogue and also manufacturers of agricultural and dairy machinery."

The first circulation resulted in nine firms writing in from various parts of the country for information with regard to the exhibition, which was given to them. The circulation of the agricultural and dairy machinery manufacturers brought in seven replies, four of whom notified me either taking the matter up with their South African or East African agents, or the one may be with a view to participating in the Exhibition.

The circulation of the British Industries Fair Catalogue of whom merely thanked the Office for sending them particulars and did not state whether they were interested, or not, but eight stated they were interested and asked for the names of firms already represented out there, with whom they would negotiate in order that their goods might be displayed. This information, of course, was supplied to them. I understood Sir Hinchey brought in 22 replies, the majority of the publicity given to the Exhibition by this Office his firm has received about 20 enquiries from firms desiring similar facilities.

About Prices. In addition to this, of course, at the request of the Committee on the other side I took up the question of prices, with a certain number of selected firms, whom I

know to be directly interested in the territory and as a result of my approaching them Messrs. John Haig and Co., Ltd. informed me that they were communicating with the Secretaries of the Exhibition on the subject. The British American Tobacco Co. Ltd. stated they would gladly avail themselves of the opportunity of contributing to the Fund. The Standard Bank of South Africa informed me that it would be glad to contribute to the funds of the Exhibition, and the British Indian and Union Cattle Lines notified me that they were subsidising their Office in Dar-es-Salaam to subscribe £25 each to take the slaps of money or a cup, as the Committee prefer.

CRAIGWELL HOUSE

Now that the King has left Craigwell House it is possible to occupy it. Sir Arthur du Crocq Dawson then visited Craigwell House and telegraphed to Sir Arthur du Crocq the appreciation of the "people concerned." Owing to the King's illness His Majesty could not be consulted and Sir Frederick Ponsonby wrote to suggest a tenancy agreement between himself and Sir Arthur in order that "while Sir Arthur had volunarily and freely placed Craigwell in the disposal of His Majesty for so long as he should require to use it, his unconditional offer could not be accepted without reference to His Majesty who was too ill to be consulted. Therefore a tenancy agreement was consummated at the request of Sir Frederick Ponsonby."

Figures showing the work done by medical men during the war were given by Lord Mansfield, President of the Royal College of Surgeons at the White Hall when delegates to the International Congress of Military Medicine met in City of London Corporation, Lord Mansfield said the British total of nearly 2,000,000 wounded in the war and of that number the medical services returned to duty more than 1,500,000. They had 2,500,000 such in the hospitals and of these returned to duty 1,320,000.

Foch Revelations. WAR SHOULD HAVE ENDED IN 1917.

Remarkable statements by the Commander-in-Chief of the Allied Armies in the war, the late Marshal Foch, are being related by Mr. Raymond Reedy, in a book, which the Paris Correspondent of the "Daily Mail" says is to be published shortly recording his most interesting conversations with the great soldier. The Marshal held in his conversations that the war ought to have been ended in 1917 by the victory of the European Allies. Russia was then still fighting Rumania had entered the war, and France, Great Britain, Belgium and Italy could have imposed their will upon the enemy. Marshal Foch attributed the failure to arrive at this result to two main causes. The first was the fact that owing to French political recriminations inspired by Radical-Socialist committees the Marshal Joffre was deprived of his post of Commander-in-Chief, thus paralyzing for many months the initiative of the Allied armies.

Strange Apathy.

Marshal Foch's second cause was the strange apathy that seemed to overtake the Allies after the battle of the Somme in 1916. At a moment—the late Allied Commander-in-Chief pointed out—when Germany was confronted with the most critical situation, which must have been known to the Allied Governments, there was a period of inaction, which allowed the Germans to recuperate. The Marshal said to Mr. Reedy— "An interval elapsed between the end of the battle of the Somme and the beginning of our April offensive. This enabled the enemy to rearrange their order of battle and take energetic steps to cope with their lack of reserves. A general offensive at the beginning of 1917 would have forestalled the withdrawal to the famous Hindenburg line."

"Kept in the Dark."

Extremely important declarations were also made by Marshal Foch concerning the peace negotiations. He said— "I can say without exaggeration that I was kept in the dark about the peace negotiations. The military and definite frontiers of Germany should be the Rhine, which could be held by the Allies with weak forces. The Rhineland should be an independent buffer-State between France and Germany. But as England and the rest of the world were not in the picture, which has shown its vitality

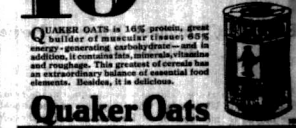

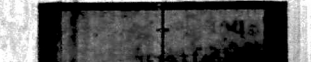

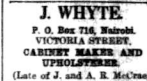

MOTOR SERVICES BILL MYSTERY.

Who First Mooted the Proposal?

A PARLIAMENTS QUERY.

The attendance at the Parliaments Sports Club on Wednesday evening when Colonel W. K. Tucker, the Acting Member for the Legislative Council for Nairobi North, addressed a meeting of his constituents on the subject of the Motor Services Bill, was small but the greatest interest was displayed.

Mr. S. Jacobs was in the Chair and in introducing Colonel Tucker expressed the belief that if more meetings of that kind were held it would be better for the country. He was sure that on the Motor Services Bill Colonel Tucker would appreciate the criticism and advice from those present.

Colonel Tucker said that this was one of those problems which, while not necessarily involving great profit or loss either to the individual or the State, was calculated to excite controversy and concern because of the face of them they created suspicion of interference with the liberty of the subject and of the creation of monopolies, two factors that were often essential to the best interests of a community but whose adoption should always be preceded by a consensus of favourable public opinion. Done in that way the minimum of prejudice and the maximum of prudent examination of the facts were secured.

"We have recently had the advantage of an election in this constituency," continued Colonel Tucker "and during the campaign we heard a lot about the need for business men. CO-ORDINATION OF ALL TRANSPORT.

Proposal That Railways and Harbours Ministry Should Include Roads.

A few days ago the views of the Johannesburg Chamber of Commerce on the subject of rail versus road competition were published in the "Standard". Before will be found a representation on the same subject submitted by the Durban Chamber of Commerce.

The Durban Chamber of Commerce has issued for the information of its members a "draft statement" for submission to the Government. 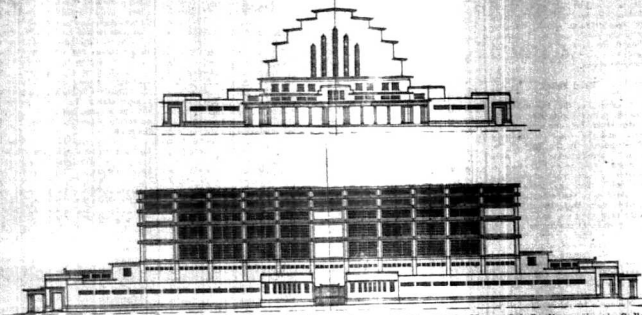

A new Municipal Market is being provided for Nairobi on a site approximately opposite Messrs. Sidler's premises in Sidler Street. The boundaries of the site, which is 66,400 square feet, are Sidler Street, Stewart Street, Bazaar Street and Seventh Avenue. The coordination suggested above should be such as will support each class of traffic to that form of transportation which can provide the best service. Competition is the agency by which this desired co-ordination will be brought about.

Road Policy.
The specific points of the Commission's report draw attention to the relation between road transport and the cost of highway development. In the light of the recent developments of road vehicles, road policy becomes a matter of fundamental importance. In order that the main roads should receive the attention and consideration that their importance now requires, and in order that permanent machinery may be created to finance the construction of main roads as a necessary part in the regular capital expenditure of the country, it is suggested that the present Ministry of Works and Railways be widened to include the care and control of the main roads. It is understood that all such roads now to be free for the use of all, with equal facilities, applicable to all users of the roads alike, may be necessary in the public interest.

PLANT PROTECTION BY AEROPLANE.
Poison Disseminated Over Cotton Fields.
FOR TO MOSQUITOES.
During cotton fields from the use of various poisonous clouds to kill the bollworm has now definitely been established. In the past, the use of insecticides in the form of sprays, as in the case of the "New York Literary Digest," was the only method of dealing with some species in the investigation of plant diseases and to kill the cotton mosquito on the stems, where they breed. Mr. Winters writes:

"Scattering clouds of poisonous dust, the aeroplane is being used as a form of insecticide for agricultural crops against insect pests and other pests that bother mankind. Down in the cotton fields the aeroplane has followed a subject to air attack; the cotton picker is receiving danger of outbreak from mosquitoes, out in the Middle West the spores of wheat rust are being caught in aeroplane traps and at Quantico, Virginia the bodyguards of the Marine Corps are being sprayed from airplanes on to mosquito-infested areas."

It was seven years ago that the aeroplane was first used for the purpose of spraying insecticides over a field. The United States Army in cooperation with the Department of Agriculture, had conducted a sweeping survey of the country to determine the extent of insect pests that were doing the most damage to the crops. The aeroplane was used to spray the fields with the insecticide. The results were very successful. The amount of insecticide used was reduced to one-tenth of what it had been. TELEVISION'S AID IN EDUCATION. Lectures By Experts For the Million.

FUTURE POSSIBILITIES
The remarkable possibilities of television have been its various aspects and that it is now in its infancy is due to the propagation of sensational stories when the set was in the light of spreading banks, writes a special correspondent of the "Observer."
Within a comparatively short time the public is likely to have an opportunity of judging how far it has now advanced from the purely experimental stage, for it is not devoid that the B.B.C. is to give television a chance of proving itself.

One of the greatest difficulties that television has had to overcome is the intensity of illumination that was required on the "subject." Within the last few months that difficulty has been considerably reduced, so that

something more than a single land can be projected. Another difficulty, peculiar to the wireless transmission of living pictures, has been that the necessary modulation of the current wave was very considerably more than that required for music transmission and would greatly interfere with the accuracy of definition on adjacent channels. This has also been overcome, we are glad to find, by the use of the "super-heterodyne" system. This it should be overcome was of the utmost importance to the art, since it is only through the medium of wireless that the public can enjoy television in the home.

Dr. Mihaly's Method.
While Mr. Baird and others have been concentrating on short and correlated pictures, Dr. Mihaly, a Hungarian, has been working on the transmission of cinematograph films in any distance by the use of light waves.

The cinema film stands still for a fraction of a second before the projector, and Dr. Mihaly has taken advantage of this. He has opened up "still" picture transmission. Through this it is not true television, since the scene is not transmitted while it is actually happening, there is only a small step to be bridged between the possibility of transmitting a film and the possibility of transmitting a scene, as portrayed by the lens of the cinematograph camera. Manchester's American "talking film" director, gifted with vast imagination, has made a large number of records of eminent scientists lecturing and demonstrating by means of experiments. Longley, Bruce, Ernest Wilson, amongst others, and many others, have been so filmed. The films are of the type in which the sound record is made at the edge of the picture frame. This means that, with the aid of Dr. Mihaly's projector and suitable receiving apparatus for both pictures and sound, fairly easy to adapt from existing apparatus, these lectures could be made available at educational institutions all over the country. The cost of the method would be less than that of a cinematograph installation, with its necessary protection of the audience from the dangers of fire; but it can be still further improved by the aid of direct television, and there would seem to be no reason why

television should not give a much better sort of this kind within ten or twelve or 18 months.

The Mink Difficulty.

University authorities, particularly those of the richer institutions, are very reticent in the talking film as a means of recording lectures and experiments by means of thought in all instances of science and art where demonstration is a necessary part of a lecture. Books and technical illustrations are naturally enough an aid to the full development of television lectures of the kind, but Dr. Mihaly is opposed to their mode. Progressive reformers and educational reformers are enthusiastic as to the benefits that will accrue from a television set of the present kind. The popularity of the wireless lecture, Dr. W. Ward Davies is not solely due to the fact that his procedure "tapes notes," a considerable part of their interest follows from his constant and vivid demonstrations. Similarly, many students now are "wired" to the subject would be made a living force in both juvenile and adult education.

Unfortunately the taking of talking films is a highly complicated and costly process. It is doubtful if a really comprehensive series of lectures could be made without an enormous outlay. On the other hand the B.B.C. already engages lecturers to give the highest standards in their own department as a part of a television lecture scheme.

When television has proved itself by means of the experimental records made, it will be a difficult thing to resist it with such resources as lead themselves to demonstration and to give to education a new and most important impetus. Country Road and Weather Report.

The Hon. Secretary of the R.E.A.A. writes—

My report, this week is completely different from those I have issued during the last three or four weeks, as we now find that the rains have ceased off the Coast, but up country they have been experiencing storms and heavy rains have fallen practically everywhere. Soughie tops the list with 4.90 followed by Niwro with 3.87, Nakuru 2.84, Keru 2.75, Rumuruti 2.68, Bonga 2.55, Kericho 2.47, Kitale 2.41, Kiamba 2.11 and Nairobi 2.07. Nairobi had a little over 1½" and Eldoret, Liuma and Mochu had about 1¼". The rest of the country was under 1" the driest parts being on the occasion at the Coast where rain appears to have ceased.

The following is the state of country roads as per telegraphic information received yesterday afternoon—

Mombasa—Very bad to Athi River, dry but rough in parts to Voi. Two bridges down, highway to truck out and road laid in Samuru, Samuru-Kwale—badly out—bad—dry, but badly out up—can be navigated with careful driving.

LOCUSTS IN KENYA.

Overcoming the Menace.

The following report on the locust position up to July 4, has been issued by the Department of Agriculture:

Flying Swarms.

Small swarms are reported moving from South to North West in the Voi District, Athi River, and to the North from Kericho to Lumwa, and from Kaji, Small swarms are noted in the Cherangani.

HOPPER ARMS.

Kericho Province.

Very effective work is reported from Njageyo and Maragwet. From Njageyo it is reported that a few acres have been cleaned but large swarms of flying locusts are expected to come from North East Kericho.

From Tusurua both North and South the information is reported to be so extensive that it is very doubtful whether control may be secured.

From Sak the report is encouraging. There are over 60 millions and seven thousand natives daily at work in the Province, but it is expected that great numbers of hoppers will mature.

Mandi Bervue.

More effective work is now being done in the Kajiado-Magadi area on the Railway which is littered with dead for many miles. Use of two train units using 24 mortars, in addition to units which are stationed at points along the line from whence the bulk may be entered.

The situation in the Kericho valley is much relieved.

Umsaba.

Vo Fresh hatching and new swarms are being found daily. Owing to the irregular hatching, work is continuing for longer than was contemplated. Small flying swarms have entered, and some undated hopper bands have come to maturity, in the district. The infested area is now restricted to the region between Voi and Taita and the Athi River.

Ludjia Plateau.

Work is continuing on the hopper bands in the area, the organization is on a small scale.

Gilgil.

The infestation is under control.



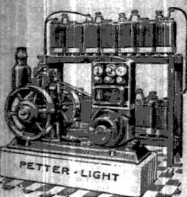

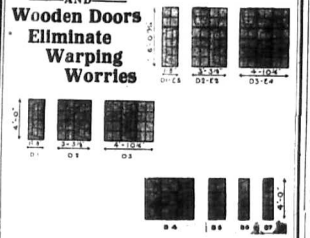

CARNATIONS.

The following extracts from Mr. C. Menzies Alford's book "Carnations" with cultural notes added to suit the out of door conditions in this Colony.

Propagation.

(Continued.)
Layering. This method is rarely adopted in extension nurseries for any reason except the old English types and Mainstays, but if often favoured in private establishments. The great value of layering is that a growth layering builds up constitution and vigour, so making a robust plant. The young growths from 4 to 5 inches long should be selected. These will require stopping as soon as the layer is rooted. Remove all the leaves of the growth except that portion above the layer which will remain above the soil. Loosen the soil round the base of the plant and place the light soil or grit from 1 to 2 inches thick upon the surface. With a sharp knife commence to cut the longest three joints below where the leaves were cut, leaving the knife to split the stem for 1 inch or so, or this can be allowed by thrusting

the point of the knife through the layer and cutting downwards to make the long and trimming of the cut directly under the joint; then fasten down with an ordinary layering pin, taking care that the cuttings are not broken or broken. A layer takes from three weeks to a month to root. As soon as this has taken place the layers should be severed from the parent plant. This operation should not be postponed. It is better for the layer, when it has become moderately rooted to be replanted than for it to be left until it has a large ball of earth and root.

Kenya application. It was found to be very difficult to layer in any state in this garden in Nairobi. The objections to layering were (a) The difficulty in getting shoots suitable for layering near enough to the ground. When they broke off (b) Mounding up the striking medium sufficiently high to enable the shoot to be covered, used too much medium and also tried out very quickly. (c) The difficulty of keeping the layer properly shaded. (d) The extra work entailed to keep the plants and layers watered when sprout

over many different beds in the garden. The results were good, but no better than first class rooted cuttings.

Seed. Sow the seed in shallow boxes or pans. Use a fine, light sandy soil of pure loam and sand in proportion to some seed sowing in the pot or boxes, as the seed may be 1/2 inch of the top, and see that the soil is reasonably firm. Sow the seed thinly and cover it with loam more than one-sixth of an inch thick. Through a fine sieve allow sufficient water to reach the bottom of the pan. Cover with a sheet of glass. The soil will take from a week to ten days to germinate. As soon as the seedlings commence to appear, remove the paper but leave the glass for another day or so. Place the pans in a lighter place to assist the young plants to grow stiff and sturdy. All seedlings are difficult to handle, and young carnations are no exception to this rule, and require great care in the early stages. If they are densely sown and come up too thickly, or are improperly watered or dried, they die off.

As soon as the true white of leaves is seen, direct developed seedlings should be potted out, but not to be taken out too early, however, if plants are sown in the garden, a small quantity of wood ash, sulphur, or lime should be added to the soil. Place each seedling in its pot with a very fine layer of soil and keep shaded and moist for three days, and afterwards give the same treatment as that followed for the ordinary growing young plants being planted out of doors.

Kenya Application. Very little can be said to the above. It was found much more satisfactory to sterilise the soil in the same before using the seed, than to allow the quantity of small seeds that are always found in the soil of this district, to germinate in the boxes, and then try and weed them out. If exposed to strong sun, the seedlings wither; if too heavily shaded they grow weakly in the early life of a seedling it should never be allowed to become dry. J. G.

DOES GOD REALLY EXIST?

A Cambridge Professor's Sermons.

OBSTACLE OF CREEDS.

A reply to people who ask: Does God really exist? was made by Professor A. S. Edgington, Francis Professor of Astronomy at Cambridge, in his Sermons, Lectures to the Society of Friends in London, states the "Daily Express". Theological or anti-theological argument to prove or disprove the existence of a deity," he said, "seems to me to occupy itself largely with asking among the difficulties caused by my making a fetish of this word. It is so irrelevant to the assurance for which we hunger. Crucial Point: "I attach no great importance to the scientific type of argument

between atheism and deism. The crucial point for us is not a conviction of the existence of a supreme God, but the conviction of the revelation of a supreme God."

"I confine myself to the revelation implied in the in-dwelling of the Divine spirit in the mind of man. "In a probably true that the recent changes of scientific thought remove some of the obstacles to a reconciliation between religion and science, but this must be carefully distinguished from any proposal to base religion on a scientific discovery. I am wholly opposed to any such attempt."

We have learnt that the explanation of the external world by the methods of physical science leads not to a concrete reality but to a shadow world of symbols beneath which those methods are unadapted for penetrating. Feeling that there must be more behind, we return to our starting point in human consciousness—the one centre where more might become known. There we find other sciences, other revelations,

true or false, than those considered by the scientific method. Are these not too of significance? We can only answer according to our conviction, for here reason fails us altogether. Consciousness is different, and young carnations are no exception to this rule, and require great care in the early stages. Science has an important part to play in our everyday existence, and there is far too much neglect of science but its function is to supplement, not to supplant, the familiar outlook. IMPORTED EGGS.

Results of Recent Trial.

As I mentioned in my notes the other week, I brought thirty eggs with me from South Africa. These eggs, traveling in a foot box with an extra slip of wood added under the lid to provide extra ventilation, I carried all the way during the journey. The journey was not hot until we reached Mombasa, after which it was not much hotter than the weather in Nairobi during the hot part of the day, the first going most of the time. The eggs were actually spoiled all the time.

On arrival, I had some difficulty in getting broody hens and it was four days before the eggs were set. I set ten eggs under a hen on June 5, the other twenty being put into the incubator. Three days later having produced two more broodies I shifted the eggs from the incubator to under the hens. The eggs were tested at the sixth day, there were fifteen quite clear and some of them looked very hopeful. However I left them remaining fifteen eggs under the hens with the exception of two which were nearly black and distinctly bad, and which were removed two days later. On the twenty-first day there was not a sign of the chicks hatching, but on taking off the hens on the twenty-second day I found ten quite healthy little Rhode Island chicks.

On examining the rest of the eggs they were all found to be added. The hens set splendidly all the time. The one chick is going along quite well and the mother hen is taking great care of it.

A Strange Occurrence.

On the 16th of last month I set a number of eggs in my incubator, including Silkies, Australorps and B. I. Reds. These eggs are due to hatch on July 7, but on the morning of July 2, on opening the drawer I discovered a Silkie chick hatched. The chick is fully formed, and is now in its third day of existence. There was no possibility of the egg having been partially incubated as I clear the nests three or four times daily. I have had chicks hatch out on the 19th day but never five days earlier. I would be interested to hear if any of my readers have met with a similar happening to this, a case where the chick is hatched fully formed and with no question of partial incubation before setting.

THE UNITY OF MANKIND.

Rhodes's Ideal and His Effort.

INTIMATE RECOLLECTIONS.

By Sir E. Grigg on Growing Importance of Africa.

Speaking at the annual Rhodes dinner held for the first time in Rhodes House, Oxford, Mr. L. M. S. Amery, representing the majority of Rhodes, emphasized that the last thing that Rhodes wished was to tempt adventurous-minded youths across the sea to amulate the thoughts of the Old country.

Mr. Amery recalled dining with Rhodes at Kimberley when Kimberley was relieved, Rhodes had surrendered and Lady Smith had been relieved, yet Rhodes insisted upon the conversation being decided to the future of South Africa, the need of federation and the influence of South Africa on the rest of Africa. Rhodes's conception of Imperial relations was a commonplace of today, and was embodied in its full extent in the resolution of the Imperial Conference of 1916.

His Forward View.

When Rhodes talked of climbing Imperial factors in South Africa and of South African nationalist people were never sure whether he was a rebel in disguise and a secret opponent of the Empire. In the same way Rhodes's conception of Anglo-American relations was a queer sentiment, but Rhodes was more than justified. A forward view was required today

**FABRICATING OF THE CRUISE
OIL OAM.**

The gradual evolution of the modern system of chassis lubrication is really a reflection on human nature. Because of man's essential idleness, all sorts and kinds of ingenious little mechanisms have had to be evolved and fitted to cars in order to do his work for him. True on the whole, the original form of chassis lubrication was very simple. Where a minor bearing for, say, a counter-shaft, a "babe" rod, or a part of the steering gear existed, someone drilled a hole through the nearest metal into the tank and fastened a tube. No more than half an hour's work, so a man was sufficient for the chassis to receive its proper need of lubrication. But—this was the beginning part—the owner of the car had to spend a great deal of time "travelling" to the tank underneath it, poking the long spout of an oil can into small and inconveniently placed holes. It was not long before such contrivances had been received the fine coating of dust stuck together by congealed oil, whenever the manufacturer next used a small lubricator with a fill and an advanced one step.

Automatic Lubrication.
Automatic chassis lubrication is directly evolved from the grease gun; it dates from the day, in fact, when some genius thought that if the gun were made ready to fill and were fixed to a part of the chassis, grease or oil would flow from it into the bearings. Of course, the engine became the grease grumbler of the owner of the car, so he then pointed out that the fixed gun was all very well in its way, but it soon emptied itself, and then he was obliged to undertake the messy job of refilling it. That led to another clever idea, the "vacuum" system. It reduces the friction involved in chassis lubrication to mere pressure on a button. What happens is that the driver presses a button which connects the top of a special cylinder with the inlet pipe of the engine and the depression in the inlet pipe operates a plunger in the cylinder. In its turn the movement of the plunger sucks oil from the base chamber of the engine and the oil thus extracted from the base chamber is circulated, a warm current therefore flows freely from all small pipes attached to the auxiliary cylinder.

Since oil can only be used less than he disliked the comparatively tedious method of attempting to fill grease cups which steadily refused to be filled.

THE NEW GOVERNMENT'S FOREIGN POLICY.
(Continued from page 1.)

The Chinese Foreign Minister has forwarded memorandums and proposals which would require careful consideration. As to the Szechuan difficulty, the Chinese had suggested that the indemnity funds should be applied to the rehabilitation of railways and that any material accruing therefrom should be used as an endowment for educational purposes. Proposals submitted by Sir Miles Lampson were now the subject of consideration between the parties. With regard to the extra-territorial rights, none of the Governments concerned had yet replied to the note addressed to them on the subject by the Chinese Government.

Referring to the question of signing the optional clause and entering on normal relations with Russia, it was necessary to place this matter before the Dominion Government. He added, considerably to the London and Beijing Pact had always to be taken into consideration in any move with regard to a method by which they were going to establish peace with the world.

With regard to the evacuation of the Rhineland, they were anxious that the evacuation should take place in the earliest possible moment.—British Official Wireless Service.

The Rhineland.

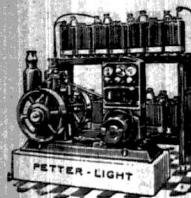

These facts are common knowledge to everybody with the exception of apparently the people appointed to the Tariffs and Duties Committee. I do not know what their duties are but they ought to have before them all the particulars and data.

I am informed rightly or wrongly that the Tariff Commission have recently been asked to consider the protective duties at their present rates.

I maintain that there is a need in the country for sugar factories sufficient to supply the needs of the country. That they should be run profitably without protection, and that it might be possible to make sugar cheaply here as in any other part of the world, is a disputed matter.

Therefore in answer to remark No. 1 the removal of protection will not reduce the average under-charge but that which gradually increases as the needs of the country increase.
