ences another winter, with a diminishing food supply, we shall not see the ground prepared for revolt. The Germans have been rather cunning in differentiation. Denmark for instance has escaped lightly and in a roomy way so have Holland and Belgium and it is only in those countries where the Germans are attempting to set industry through organizing governments that we have seen the full reaction of hatred. This has been the case in Czechoslovakia also. We are seeing the full development of the German method in occupied France. It has always been typical of the German at war that he has failed either to study the psychological reactions of oppressed people to military domination or in any way make an attempt to succeed in winning their cooperation by a departure from his traditional reliance on brutality. The war of 1914-18 familiarized the German with phrases "the scrap of paper," "the mangled fist," "the iron heel" and others of the kind meant to obscure the German character nationally and individually and to this extent history is being repeated in the present.

The characteristic which is partly responsible, not only for this war, but for half a dozen wars which the Germans started represents perhaps the most difficult problem of the world to face. It is already apparent in Europe, Africa and in America, taking the long view of peace and its responsibilities, are beginning to consider the German character taken by the civilized nations acting together to attempt by education or other means not only to eradicate this terrible weakness in the German character but to change the whole attitude of future generations of Germans.

For the moment these outbreaks of inhumanity can only tend to strengthen the determination of civilized people to bring about a condition in which as far as can be guaranteed the German people will not wish our lifetimes be able again to exercise their barbaric instincts through the domination of their neighbors.

Though it was premature a year ago to indulge in wistful speculation about the possibilities of revolt in Europe it is improbable that it will be premature to do so a year hence. There are signs everywhere that all over the continent Europe there is a growing hatred of the Germans which is changing from a passive to active sentiment. Nothing is more pathetic than the attitude of the leaders of the French people, Serbian and Poles in their appeals to persuade the nation that co-operation with Germany is a policy which should be welcomed and employed as a means to peace. Had the Germans shown wisdom in their treatment of France a year ago they might have been able to exploit the war weariness and reaction in that country to advantage.

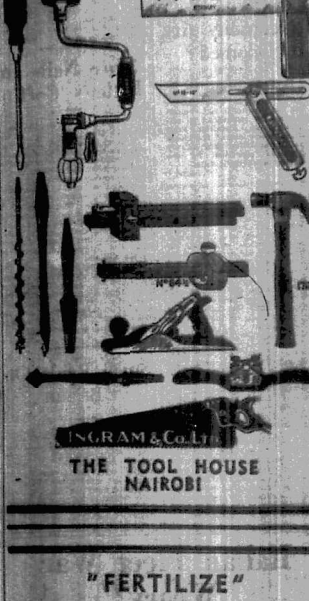

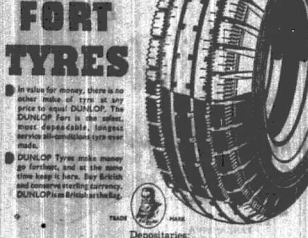

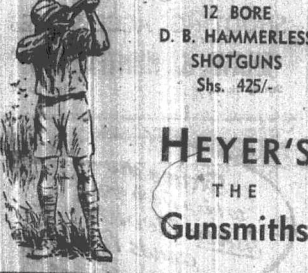

An evil spirit seemed to haunt public bodies in this country in their appreciation of public relations to their proposals. The Government suffers from it. So apparently does the Nairobi Town Council. They do not seem to grasp the simple fact that if proposals are explained to the people before they become policy, on the assumption that the people who have to pay may possibly have a point of view worthy of consideration, it is usually they who will apply the policy and, very often, as a result of public discussion it becomes a wiser and sounder proposal than when it first

emerged. In a country like Kenya, where people are prone to criticize and become easily indignant, but where they will do anything in reason if they feel that their point of view has been considered, and their opinion given regard as an element of importance, it is very easy indeed for public bodies to go astray. One enthusiasm can do so, so can obstinacy. It is the assumption of wisdom and unchecked authority which arises from lack of contact with the taxpayers, and that is the danger. They are all appointed by groups of voters in certain areas or Wards of Nairobi and if they were faithful to the democratic principle of their selection they would go back to their constituencies from time to time to find out what they are thinking about. Nairobi Town Councils fail to do so. We cannot remember a Ward meeting on any public subject. Perhaps the voters are to some extent to blame; but not altogether. Whoever it is, full-time and part-time, it is the fact that in Municipal affairs we are creating a kind of Olympian aloofness on the part of our City Councils from the body of ratepayers. They are sent to the Council, and there they get on with the job—very much indeed as a matter of fact—but there is something so important in retaining contact with the people that however well managed a Municipality may be the Town Councils should quite regularly descend to street level and put their heads on any public subject. Take, for instance, this question of the proposed Hospital Rate. We have been discussing something of this kind for twenty years. In 1920 the sum of £200 was raised by public subscription to add a ward to the hospital, but instead the sum was spent on the Memorial Hall and the General Hospital. Ten years later there was a public meeting in Nairobi to consider again the problem of the heavy maintenance charges and among the suggestions made were the establishing of a Hospital Board on which the Government and the public would be associated, and an insurance scheme which, for a premium of 20/- a year, aimed at reducing the cost of hospital charges to the individual to 5/- a day.

Now we have a few weeks notice of a resolution to apply the powers given under an enabling bill two years old to impose a compulsory rate of 30/- a year on European adults with the object of achieving a deduction of ten shillings a day from their hospital or nursing home bill should they become ill. That seems to us to be a rather unwise method of introducing so important a principle. The public are not offered no explanations at all. Forty Nairobi Rotarians, and their Rotarian wives, together with their families, were invited to the House of Representatives in Nairobi, gave an address on the subject of the aims of the Rotary Club. 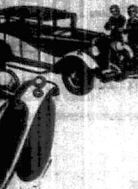

emerged. In a country like Kenya, where people are prone to criticism and become easily indignant, but where they will do anything in reason if they feel that their point of view has been considered, it is not surprising that the public opinion was sought and regarded as of importance, it is very very easy for public bodies to go astray. Enthusiasm can do it, so can the lack of common sense, the assumption of wisdom and unchecked authority which arises from the lack of contact with the people who appointed them.

Though they do not realize it the Town Councillors of Nairobi are in danger of losing touch with the ratepayers, and that is a bad thing for civic dignity and civic politics. They are all appointed by groups of voters in certain areas or Wards of Nairobi and if they were faithful to the democratic principle of their selection they would go back to the voters from time to time to find out what they are thinking about - Nairobi Town Councillors fail to do so. We can remember a Ward meeting on any public question. Perhaps the voters are to some extent to blame, but not altogether. However, we should and we suggest the Councillors - the fact is that in Municipal affairs we are creating a kind of oligarchy, a kind of aristocracy, which elected them and they are sent to the Council, and there they go on the job, very well indeed as a matter of fact - but there is something so important in retaining contact with the people that however well managed a Council may be the Town Councillors should quite regularly descend to street level and put their fingers on the pulse of the Citizen by asking his opinion about how his money should be spent.

Take, for instance, this question of the proposed Hospital Rate. We have been discussing something of this kind for twenty years, and in the sum of £6,500 was raised by public subscription to add a ward to the hospital, but instead the present was spent on the Memorial Hall and the Cenotaph. Ten years later, was a public meeting in Nairobi to consider again the question of the heavy financial burden of sickness and among the suggestions made were the establishing of a Hospital Board on which the Government and the public would be associated, and an insurance scheme which, for a premium of 20/- per annum, at reducing the cost of hospital charges to the individual to 5/- a day.

Now we have a few weeks notice of a resolution to apply the powers given under an enabling bill two years old to impose a compulsory rate of 28/- per annum on European adults with the object of relieving a deduction of ten shillings a day from their hospital or nursing home bill should they become ill. That seems to us to be a rather unwise method of introducing so important a principle. The public are not consulted at all. They have a lot of questions to ask and they would be better pleased to have the Government say to them, "We have decided that. Some people have later for some reason decided to stop their contributions, for instance, if the members of the Government Service are to be exempt from the compulsory rate, and if so, why? People would like to know whether children are to be exempted in the school, and if so, others inquire what is to be done about the surrounding suburban areas just over the boundary and whether if one subscribes to this scheme for a period of years and then goes to live say in Limuru, one is automatically deprived of all benefit under the scheme." And what is the financial basis? Years ago the Government was believed to be willing to base the compulsory rate on the fact that a flat rate of one pound a day would be charged for hospital facilities. It is the same principle which was to be paid by the Government to the ratepayer, but the difference between ten shillings and the total daily charge of say 28/-. And have the public any guarantee that hospital charges

will not be increased - or alternatively that they will be decreased in some way through the guarantee of at least part-payment of accounts that this proposed Municipal Rate obviously provides? It is not clear how far so far as to suggest that in a town such as Nairobi we ought to be able to work out an insurance scheme which would give us practically free hospital treatment, and that, of course, is the trend of present-day thought. Then what about the African community? Is there to be a scheme for them, or do they not want one? And are the African members of Council expected to vote today on a purely sectional proposal?

Thirty shillings a year, on top of present-day domestic budgets and the probability of still further increases, war taxation, is a considerable sum of money for some people, especially when their charge will be doubled and probably trebled in most households. They would be much happier if they were told what it is all about and why we cannot achieve more from this inconsiderable community, growing yearly, than a reduction of ten shillings a day in the far too high rates charged for hospital care. They are anxious to see the burden of the cost of sickness reduced and it is possible that if the Councillors were to be severely shown who elected them and they were asked and asked for views they might go back determined to try to do better. So let us hope they will not compromise their freedom by making a decision today.

### Post Card Labour Returns

The question of the prompt and regular completion and submission of labour returns is a matter discussed at a recent meeting of the Nairobi District Association and the resolution was passed, a copy of which has been sent to the Government by way of the Secretary.

That this Association suggests that more active action be taken by the Government to ensure that employers fulfil their obligations by instituting against, or the imposition of, a fine on employers failing to send in their post-card returns is a matter which it is believed that the Magistrate is trying to bring to the attention of the Government and the public, with the serious effect on the completion of the labour situation generally on the part of the individual employer, is being seriously considered.

# GERMANS WILL NOT ESCAPE BY CHANGING LEADERS Tremendous Issues of Russian War

VERTAS in his weekly commentary cable from London says: On October 9 the Nazi Press Chief Dietrich Klotze, in his Hitler's Headquarters, solemnly announced that he had been authorized to say that the military resistance of the Russians had been definitely destroyed. # PLAGUE IN NAIROBI

## Record Number Of Cases This Month

October has been the worst month so far for plague since the epidemic broke out in the Nairobi Municipal area. The number of cases notified for this month is 54 out of a total of 109 since the epidemic started. The Senior Medical Officer of Health states, however, that there are indications that the peak of the epidemic may be passed, and, in fact, the number of cases notified in the last week or so showed a clearly falling. The majority of cases were from Parsons, and cases from there were also showing a tendency to decline. The Senior Medical Officer of Health considered that the number of rats which he was aware had been current, especially concerning large numbers of cases that were reported to have occurred among various Military contingents and in camps. His inspection showed that there was a foundation of rats for those numbers, that at the most they were in a position to be attacked. Nairobi, and very few have remained unattacked. Nairobi. Apart from Parsons and a few cases in River and Ngara Bush Areas, there has been no plague in any spot near the P.W.D. in the Nairobi Municipal area.

It had been very active in this area and its surroundings in order to try to anticipate and deal with any extension of plague. The rats had been found in the most numerous but in very small numbers. Cases had not occurred there since there were no rats. The staff had had the benefit of close collaboration with the Military, who also were carrying out valuable preventive work, an active Veterinary Department.

Inspection. Incarceration was proceeding and had reached a figure of about 200. This does not include another 20,000 performed by the Government. Consideration of the rats had been done and it was proposed to employ the greatest number of rats possible. The staff was concentrating on general preventive measures, including the destruction of rats and the use of disinfectants. It was noted that the general state of cleanliness in the town was showing marked improvement. These measures, however, are not sufficient to apply with the great shortage of housing for Nairobi contingent. The problem, that as an insecticide was being extensively used in the Native Locations, and as a measure of prevention had been taken up by the Military by the Nairobi administration.

It could be recommended very strongly to the military authorities, for example, for use in Native quarters, where it should be renewed every three or four days. The preventive measures had been under consideration. Voluntary incarceration was proceeding. In conclusion, the Senior Medical Officer of Health stated that his Department was carrying out all possible immediate measures, and that without guarantee he was hopeful of some decline in the outbreak.

# Plot Holders Problem

At Tuesday's meeting of Nairobi Municipal Council, Colonel Campbell asked the Council to refer the matter of rates on Government acquisition of plots back to the Finance Committee. At an earlier meeting of the Finance Committee a letter was written from the Commissioner of Lands and Settlements, stating that it was unable to accept the Council's proposal, that a contribution in lieu of rates in respect of the plots was to be made. The Council had agreed that the purchase was to be made by reason of Defence Corporation (Buildings) Regulations 1940, and that it was unable also to support the suggestion that the annual ground rents payable to Government be the remainder. The Commissioner pointed out that the Government had offered to buy the plots in respect of the prospective purchaser, that they were aware of the fact that the Government was building materials, and that attention should be drawn to this point in the sale notice in which it was stated that the Government was to buy the plots. The Council was required for the erection of a building consisting of 250 in total. **MILITARY AND PRIORITY CALLS**

The fact that the civilian population of Kenya is to have the benefit of the "priority" calls given by the New Year, at latest, has already been reported. This was disclosed by Mr. J. H. Hudson, the Postmaster General, during a statement he made to the session, under the auspices of the Association of Chambers of Commerce and Industry of Eastern Africa. At the same time Mr. Hudson gave details of the question of telephones.

The session passed the following resolution:

"**ASSOCIATED CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE.** In view of the very unsatisfactory state of affairs existing between the E.A. territories and the United Kingdom, this Association of Chambers of Commerce and Industry of Eastern Africa notes with satisfaction that the East African Governments are taking steps to introduce the facilities for the general public at the earliest opportunity.

"This Association of Chambers of Commerce and Industry of Eastern Africa is of the opinion that, having regard to the extreme difficulty of, and delay in obtaining trunk call connections, and by virtue of the fact that commercial calls are frequently of an urgent nature in the light of military requirements, the supply of military telegrams should be given priority in the best interests of the war effort that the East African Governments should approach the military authorities with a request that they should ensure that only military calls of an urgent nature, initiated by responsible persons, shall seek and receive priority.

Ready to Criticize

Answering a number of criticisms that had been made concerning trunk telephone facilities and the requisitioning of certain lines by the military, the Postmaster General said that he saw in every instance of the military requisitioning any of the lines that were held until they were left East Africa. At present the military demand was as great as at the beginning of the war and civilian requirements must suffer in the interests of the military.

No material could be obtained from Britain as civilian telephone requirements were not regarded as essential war needs. The possibility of obtaining material from the United States had been considered. Mr. G. S. Butler stated if Government could not be approached to limit the military priority calls by those absolutely necessary, he stressed the low increment in the cost of unsolicited military calls—very greeting to gift friends of the military—by subordinate rank-taking priority over urgent commercial calls connected with shipping, etc. He thought that requisitioning might be made of a strong G.R.O. issued regarding such priorities.

Col. Griffith (Nairobi) also touched upon this question and cited a recent case when, owing to the inability to get a trunk call through from Nairobi, a consignment of potatoes for the troops in Egypt had not been shipped.
