Another example of the progress and efficiency of the Uganda Police Training School Kampala was given recently when a boxing competition was staged, not only for the benefit of the Officers' families of the school but also for a number of the interested public who attended. This was the October monthly competition and was held in the fine drill hall—now and hereafter with cement floor and tiled roof.

The first prize was pitched in the centre of the hall, of regulation size and fitted with the usual professional chairs for the contest, etc.—in fact a very good representation of a ring set at the professional receiving instructions at the School and they give frequent visits to their favorites.

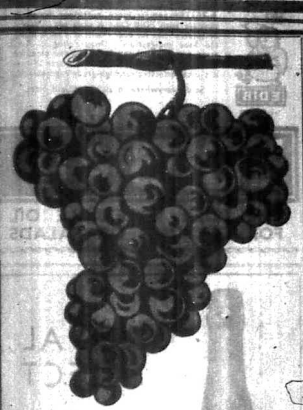

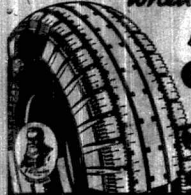

# The "Black Hole" Of Mombasa

Some personal details of the men who made a spectacular escape from Mombasa, after a long detention in the British force in the Middle East, are now available.

The three men, two Rhodesians—Bombardier Hasler and Gunner Cook—and a young English soldier, Trooper Oulton, of Surrey, were taken to the German ship in Libya on May 15 and finally reported to British H.Q. in the Western Desert on October 12.

On November 21 there were detained with the Military Medal at Cairo by the G.O.C. Middle East and subsequently consigned to General Archibald.

Guided by the sun (having lost their compass) they made their way across Crete, subsisting on wild cardinals and Italian bully beef, which they had saved from their baggage stores. Bombardier Hasler's father is the Secretary of the Salisbury Board of Executors, and before the war he was on the staff of the engineering department of the Post Office. He was in the British drive to Libya and saw service from the Barrani to Benghazi. Gunner Cook is a member of the Government Statisticians, Salisbury, before the war. His father lives at Uttoxeter.

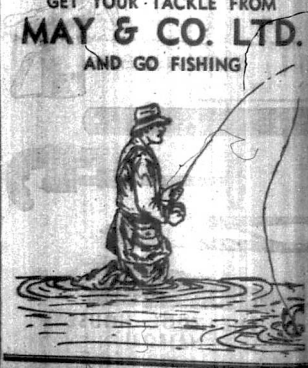

### LAMU IS SO BRACING!

You Can't Buy A Drink, So Bring It With You

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT)  
A short time ago you appeared in the Morning Times an extract from a letter written by the Lamu D.C. for the benefit of all and sundry who were contemplating paying a visit here. It pointed out that there is no public bar or inn at Lamu and that there is no public motor-boat ferry service from the mainland to the town; that there is neither hotel, nor club, nor lounge here; and that you can't buy a drink in the town.

Well, what of it! It is all very true, but don't imagine from the above that I am going back on the town and that, when I add that I have myself on many occasions drawn attention to such local matters, I am being unkind to the town. Nothing of the sort. The reason why I emphasize these points in the past has been that I felt it to be only fair to inform those who had been asked to prepare to take things as they found them.

### Not Put Off

And has this put them off from coming? Not at all. Actually, with one exception, the motorists from those that have existed for many years past. The fact that there is at present no liquor licence is the reason being that the road of the local liquor licence is not of great proportion. As there are now two shops specialising in the sale of beer, one of them is a very good one.

The roads are certainly not all-weather, but how many of the more remote roads in Kenya are? Again, it is not so many years ago that there were no motor roads at all reaching Lamu. Therefore, it is not much better off than we were in those days. Again, there are more public stations along the road than there used to be. Another improvement.

### Favourable Comparison

No matter how many the letters may be there are no big waves in the harbour to make it difficult to disembark from boats. One may sail in any day of the year round, usually, good sailing breeze being most of the time. Fishing, too, is good, and some famous catches have been made. That remains the main fish both plentiful and cheap in Lamu. The price for the best sort is not inflated at over 1/6 per lb. and is always obtainable. These facts make Lamu compare very favourably with some other coastal resorts.

What if all this were to be so that so far as road communications are concerned there is actually more house built than that the safety of the bathing and fishing, set an enviable example in the rest of the coast and that the cost of living is notably low. On the other hand you can't buy a drink in Lamu, well, no matter. Bring it with you.

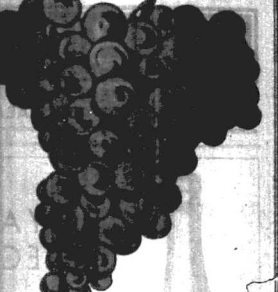

**Pyrethrum In Kenya**

The pyrethrum industry in Kenya was discussed by Major Knappert at the weekly meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce and Industry, held last Friday. After summarizing the cultivation and uses of pyrethrum he gave a very interesting account of the possibilities of its industrial possibilities in Kenya. He said that such a well-organized pyrethrum industry as Kenya has not yet developed. He pointed out that the extension of existing markets, a new market for the product, and the demand ahead of production were aimed at instead of restriction.

The Pyrethrum Board believed that the necessary foundation for the industry was a large number of growers, most of them small, and that they should be given the necessary technical assistance. On such a foundation the industry will establish itself as a permanent part of the agricultural economy of the Colony.

The Agricultural Department, which has been working for some time, has been willing to give the necessary advice to prospective planters, but he would like to stress the great importance of a plentiful and well-trained labour supply, as it takes from 60 to 100 boys per 100 acres, picking, weeding, etc. He also stressed the importance of constant investigation into the causes of the disease and the drainage experiments in progress this year regarding the yield of flowers per acre, for now that it is essential to study local conditions closely. You will, I think, realize the importance of the investigation when I tell you that the variation in yield runs from 200 to 1,000 tons per acre per year, and the variation in altitudes run from 6,000 ft. to 6,000 ft.

Blurt to carry 31 men, or an un-attended fighter aircraft, a giant Italian aeroplane—Savoia-Marchetti 86—was observed on Djibouti aerodrome on October 5 by a pilot of the South Air Force.

Describing how it was seen, the pilot said: "I was sent to intercept this aircraft, but I missed it by about a quarter of an hour. I returned to my base, had a cup of tea, took a flight and located the aircraft on Djibouti aerodrome, where it must have landed about ten minutes previously."

"Flying high above the aerodrome, the pilot circled several times before he swooped down. I came through a valley and then got down to about 100 feet and the aircraft was in full view," he continued. "The aircraft did not catch fire or circle round the base, came in again and at the time, when I fired the Savoia caught fire and burst into flames and eventually the plane was burnt out."

Low Level Attack. "I was on the low on the second run on the Savoia that I had to climb a little to over it, but I had determined to get it that time as I didn't want to have to come over again—the 'week-end' was too hot."

The pilot said that he was through "sheer luck" that he avoided the machine gun fire. "I touched and turned and went away on a zig-zag course at full speed until I was out of range. I forget all about getting flying and fell like a mud-brick."

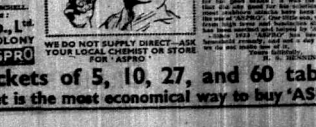

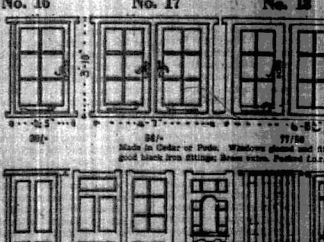

**ITALY IN AFRICA**  
**The Tragedy Of**  
**Ethiopia**

The nationals of all countries  
 who have interests in Africa  
 must, of necessity, be more than  
 ordinarily interested in the  
 policies, the progress, the success  
 and the failures of their  
 neighbours. Taking the broad  
 view of Africa, the colonising  
 countries, and the European  
 nations are the concern of all  
 the others who have territorial  
 interests and consequential  
 responsibilities in Africa.  
 In the Continent perhaps that  
 point of view has not been very  
 fully accepted in the past—yet  
 it has an agreed point of  
 common interest before the war  
 of 1914-1918—but it is almost a  
 certainty that it will influence  
 profoundly the relations between  
 Europe and Africa when the  
 present war gives way to the  
 relations of the New Order.  
 We have all been aware of the  
 major differences between, say,  
 the policies of the British Empire  
 and those of the French Empire  
 in relation to the political  
 status of the subject, and we  
 are aware, too, of trends of  
 thought in Belgium, Germany  
 and Portugal which are not  
 common to our British con-  
 ception. Even within the  
 Empire, the relations between  
 the constituent federations  
 of constitutional federations  
 ranging from Dominion status  
 to direct cleavage in policy  
 and in practice. But despite these  
 differences there are few people  
 who will disagree with the view,  
 especially those who live in  
 Africa, that the responsibilities  
 of what is the Colonial Empire  
 are shared by the British and  
 Native Ruler, and that the  
 Native Ruler, in his proper  
 discharge, in the interests  
 of the Africa of the future,  
 should be guided by the same  
 principles which should be at  
 the basis of the policy of every  
 European nation which has  
 any interest in the continent.  
 It is the object of this article  
 to try to bring to the attention  
 of the public the various  
 aspects of the Boncompagni  
 Report from the mad and tragic  
 story of Italy in Ethiopia, and  
 to try to show how the Italian  
 failure was inevitable. This  
 is a pitiable revelation of  
 Italy's incompetence, of the  
 failure of the Italian people  
 in their African setting, and of  
 the importance in the future  
 of the continent of Africa of  
 ensuring that European powers  
 who are engaged in the civilising  
 Africa shall not depart  
 from the first principles of  
 tolerance and vision in  
 Empire building which have  
 been tried and tested through  
 many generations.

able to compare and provide an  
 impression from their own view-  
 points of British colonialism in  
 Africa. There are at least three  
 elements of the failure, and  
 suspected the measure of the  
 tragedy that would have over-  
 taken both Italy and Ethiopia.  
 Now General Boncompagni's Report,  
 written for Fascist consumption,

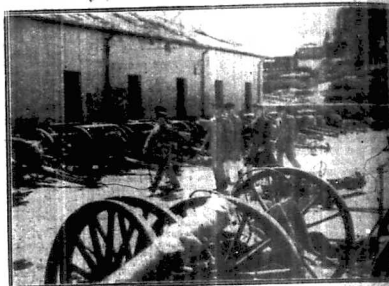

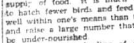

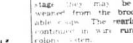
