### THE AFRICAN LABOURER

No subject, the war apart, is more interesting and more widely read in Africa today than the African. As a problem he will continue to grow, and when we consider him today we should be as careful as we can not give the war too exaggerated a place in the background. **INCREASED COST OF LIVING**

Not More Than 18 per cent In Towns

The Hon. R. Keim, member in Kenya Legislative Council, stated:—

(1) His Government received the statement compiled by Mr. D. G. Murray, Chief Commissioner of the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industries of the East African States, regarding prices of necessities in the months of August, September, October, November, December, 1939 and August, 1940, and showing an average increase in prices of 18 per cent and cost of living of 18 per cent.

(2) If the reply is in the affirmative, does Government agree with those figures, viz. that the cost of local products, foodstuffs, etc. has gone up by 18.15% that the cost of imported goods, such as tea, tobacco, etc. has gone up by 18.0%; and that the cost of living has risen by 17.94%?

(3) If Government does not agree with these figures and conclusions, what Government agree with what percentage has the cost of living risen in 1940? Answer: (September 1939).

The Financial Secretary replied:—

(1) The answer is in the affirmative.

(2) The figure in question have not been obtained in detail but the Government is unable to agree that the figures given by the Hon. Member refer to the cost of things in the terms is generally understood.

(3) On this subject the cost of living in town since August, 1939, in the case of Europeans has not exceeded 10 per cent.



**TYRE CONTROL NEXT MONTH**

A control over the distribution of tyre control cards and the introduction of a new type of tyre will be introduced in Kenya with effect from December 1st. Box 718, Nairobi, which, in collaboration with the Local Tyre Importers' Association, arrangements will be made to meet certain requirements in order of priority from fresh consignments of tyre as they arrive in the country. It will be understood that the issue of a certificate does not in itself imply that a tyre will be imported as soon as it is required, but it does ensure that a tyre will be imported when it is required. **MORE RIGID CONTROL OF LUXURIES URGED**

**Nairobi Member Also Proposes Longer Working Week**

THE debate on the Budget was resumed at yesterday's sitting of Kenya Legislative Council when a multitude of subjects were brought up by various members and some forceful expressions of opinion were heard.

The Hon. J. B. Parry presented certain evidence regarding collection of revenue and taxes at Mombasa which he said represented too much of the "pound of flesh" and asked that Government should appoint a committee to inquire into the matter. He expressed anxiety as to the effect on natives and said that he had not yet reached a stage in this country where an increase in taxation on natives could be justified.

He was, however, very much in agreement with the suggestion of compulsory education for European and Indian children which had been made the previous day and said that in the interests of the future generation they should take that step.

**Unlimited Spending**  
The Hon. Member for Nairobi South (Col. Z. E. Madani) said he did not think the spending power of the people of Kenya had been diminished by the increase in taxation which was imposed last year and he expressed his admiration for the handsome response which the public had made to the various war charities. He pointed out, however, that the increase in the income tax estimates—from £1,848,000 in 1945 to £2,400,000 in 1946—was only agreed to by a small number of the members of the Government's scheme to control and reduce spending on unnecessary articles and luxuries. If this were not about to take steps beyond the actual imposition of taxes to implement their determination. He wanted a stricter and more rigid control of imports so as to take temptation out of the way of the man or woman who indulged in unnecessary and luxuries. The adoption of more a measure would not only save shipping space but would also keep in the pockets of individuals concerned, funds which might be put to a much better purpose. It might be contended that such a measure might put extra trading in

of the war.

The suggestion was greeted with cheers from several parts of the House.

**Blacklistening With Government**  
The next speaker, the Hon. W. G. D. H. Nene (Mombasa) after brief reference to the East African campaign, which, a year ago they were considering very anxiously, and which now, as the result of brilliant leadership had resulted in the favour of the fleet of Italy having been dispersed, discussed the subject of "blacklistening" and "blacklisting."

He said that Council now had to consider in what way they could really assist the war effort. They had, he declared, to get down to real, proper production.

During the last year, he continued, there had been given classification and lack of confidence in the Government. With regard to the proposed increase in taxation the main in the street was afraid that increased taxation would be trifled away. Nobody was going to object to increased taxation provided the money were well-spent. He also stated that the Hon. Gen. Lord Nene's dispatch agent, "putting the blame" on certain individuals in a serious speech, and incidentally said why the dispatch was not circulated. He had read it in the East African Standard, but like other members did not know whether this was the complete document or only an excerpt.

On the question of native taxation, he was in favour of an imposition of a shilling per head, non males, and observed that in this way the natives would pay for their own education. Natives were addicted to tax evasion; in fact in Mombasa there was what he termed a Tax Evasion Society.

**Secretariat System Obsolete**  
The Hon. Member then discussed at some length the functions and working of Government many officials of which, he said, were tied down too much to their desks and did not travel around. He said that he was not enough "official" representation on His Excellency's Executive Council.

The European and commercial communities, he said, considered that they had a right to a greater say in the conduct of Government policy, and he suggested that the Executive Council should be strengthened by the addition of two more "unofficial" members. He did not think they would ever get a satisfactory solution to the problem of government in Kenya until they had obtained a constitutional alteration. The Colony had now outgrown the Secretariat system. Quite a lot of the misunderstanding in the Colony today was due to the fact that the public were servants of the public in charge of public funds, and therefore very much more familiar in the spending of the public form of ministerial appointments should be introduced whereby, if a Minister's loss of confidence of the people or mis-spent money be

could be dismissed. He suggested that a Constitution somewhat of the kind that the Hon. Member had proposed be of considerable benefit to the Colony so as to give it a chance to develop a constitution on a wider basis.

Union with Tanganyika and Uganda, he felt, must come after they were satisfied that East Africa would play a very big part in post-war reconstruction and rehabilitation.

**The Police**  
Turning to police matters, the Hon. Member said he wanted to see a taken view, inserted in the estimate so that the Commissioner of Police, who had not submitted his recommendations would know that he had not a substantial sum of money earmarked for his department. He did not want the public to be "robbed off." People argued that the Civil Service terms were the same for the police as for other departments, which was not so as the police had more onerous work and greater responsibility, and with the "justification and disappointment at present felt in the force they were fortunate in not having had very serious trouble."

He felt they were sitting on a volcano, and they had got to see to it that the Colony had a satisfied and adequate police force.

**Information Office**  
When the Information Office was started — or enlarged last year, he understood that the office was to be used by Government to prepare public opinion for measures that Government was considering and intended to introduce, but he did not think that purpose had been applied. Rather had the office been used as a medium of apology for actions or omissions on the part of Government, and he mentioned two of them, the M and B 600 standard and the Bellator report.

**Military Wastage of Petrol**  
He also raised the point of the apparent waste of petrol by the Military in Nairobi, which he said had been observed, that the people of Kenya were only paying 25 per cent more than they were paying in peace time and that the taxpayer at home was paying the rest, and while that was perfectly true, the fact that some of them were also taxpayers at home and it was their duty here to protect the taxpayer at home and see that his money was not frittered away.

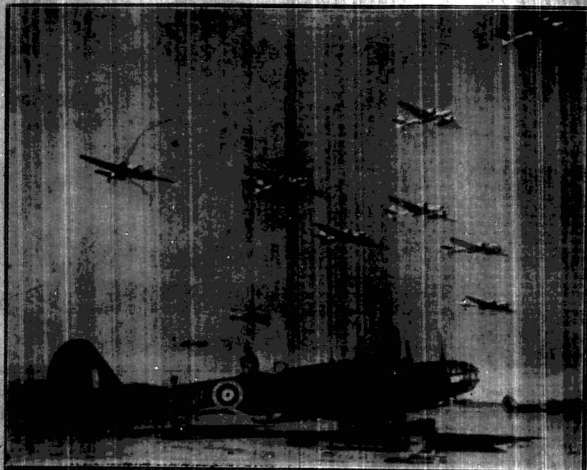

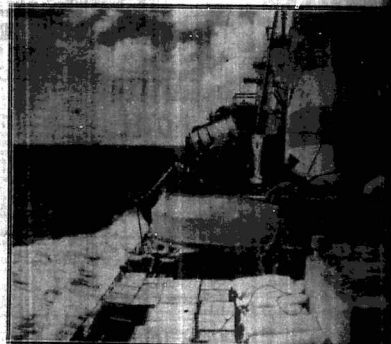
