Continues in Russia Reserves Called From Crimea to Stem The Retreat ENEMY TANKS FROZEN UP NEAR MOSCOW

December 4. The Russian front the remnants of the defeated German army have taken back as far as Taganrog, 45 miles west of Rostov. These Moscow radio reports stated that there was continued fighting south of Taganrog, other reports stated that the main body of the German forces were driven 45 miles beyond that point. The latest newspaper provided the following news: 'The army itself is gradually arising from the ruins of the German operation and the industrial centre is being restored and progress is being made at the railway station. Citizens are helping in an immense task and at one point the manufacture of electricity has been started last night in a special broadcast from the Russian front that the enemy had put up retreat, pointing out that the 'Marzocchi' broadcast went on that already 40,000 soldiers had been freed during the German retreat. The enemy is also being driven with burnt-out tanks and trucks. All attempts to halt the Russian advance by launching counter-attacks have failed and the Soviet tanks are smashing through the German lines. The broadcast continued: 'Our main advance is preventing the German from organizing a counter-attack of their troops. Russian units are being moved to the German rear.'

WESTERN DESERT PREPARING FOR THE NEXT ROUND

December 4. THERE is now a lull in the fighting in Libya. As the war in the Western Desert enters the third week both sides are retraining their tanks and reorganizing their troops for more bitter fighting in the near future. Messages from Cairo say that the present lull is due partly to the weather, which is described as "atrocious," and partly to the natural exhaustion after the recent heavy fighting, but although no big battles are taking place, our raiding parties and clearing up operations have been carried on as usual and it is hoped that our main attack on the armoured patrols is operating against enemy communications in the Arcadia area, west of Tobruk. In a local success gained on the 1st of the west and had been captured 20 miles north of the captured railhead point of El Duda. He said these things were going well and we are quietly preparing for the next round. Several members urged the importance of thoroughly efficient planning and organization to ensure that the conscription of men and women should 'justify itself by results. Mr. John Anderson, Lord President of the Council, said he was up to Government to see that the measures in which men and women were becoming good and better equipped and he pointed out that the vast unutilized plant that some member said for war was not so easy to operate as a suggestion. He added that there was already a very full and complete State control of raw materials and all property was not worth considering. He said that the war Bill was intended to repair deficiencies. The debate is to continue at the next meeting of the House. (Reuters.)

Pessimistic Outlook For Peace In The Pacific

December 4. THE United States Secretary of State, Mr. Cordell Hull, spoke strongly yesterday on the Far Eastern crisis and charged Japan with establishing military despotism in conquered countries. He remarks were interpreted in Washington as presenting a pessimistic view of the negotiations between Japan and the United States. Mr. Cordell Hull was speaking at his press conference and reviewed the basic differences between the policies of the two nations and asserted that Japan was dependent on force, conquest and the oppression of conquered countries. Mr. Cordell Hull made it known that so reply had been received to the Note sent to Japan and it is stated in Washington that there is not yet a reply to the President's question as to why Japan was greatly increasing her forces in Indo-China. James Weir said: 'That Japan is worried is evident from radio and press comment in Tokyo. One newspaper says that the movements of the British Navy in the Far East must be closely watched, especially now that Singapore—the Gibraltar of the East—will probably be used by British and the United States jointly. A German controlled newspaper comments that Japan cannot overlook the effect on Thailand and French Indo-China. Speaking in Tokyo today the Japanese Foreign Minister, General Togo, declared that East Asia is now confronted with an unprecedented crisis. The British and American and other countries, he said, still refuse to understand Japan's interests in the Far East and their handling of a new order in East Asia. Details of the latest diplomatic developments were given in Japan's Press. Conceded by the Japanese Prime Minister: People Not Told It is significant that no Japanese newspaper disclosed the nature of the questions about Indo-China, put on the President's behalf to the Japanese envoys in Washington. On the other hand, the newspapers gave great prominence to British and American preparations for the arrival of the Eastern Fleet. How to take care of your tyres

IN THIS MECHANISED WAR tyres are a valuable part of our national assets and must be saved. Take care of your tyres and help to cut down the import of raw materials used in new tyres. Here are a few hints on how to preserve your tyres, thereby obtaining greater mileage and longer life.

Test tyre pressures

No. 1. The most vital factor in the maintenance of the correct air pressure in the inner tube. Check this at least once a week. Handle contractors doing regular long distance work should do it once each day, examine the valve cap and core, and see they are airtight.

Remove fints

No. 2. Minor injuries will develop into major ones if neglected. Remove fints, small nails or pieces of iron which have time to injure the core body of the tyre. Small cuts should be filled with vulcanising which is self-vulcanising.

Overloading or under-inflation

No. 3. Overloading does little for the tyre in the end. It cuts the life of your tyres by as much as 50 per cent. Under-inflation is also very detrimental to a tyre.

Mechanical condition of your vehicle

No. 4. Worn king pins, bending brake shafts, out of alignment and badly-fitting or worn tyres will rob you of thousands of tyre miles. Notice how your tyres wear. If there is unevenness, feathering or lopsidedness, check the above mechanical points.

Longer tyre life

No. 5. Furious and careless driving will wear out your tyre trends quickly and your castings. Burning against kerbs, and running over potholes and other obstructions - unnecessary speed will damage your castings before you have had the mileage out of them.

Service your tyres

No. 6. As you would your vehicle. See that your tyres are taken care of with tyres should be as near equal in diameter as possible. Do not let one worn tyre do the work of two. If you do, you will ruin them both.

Don't run your tyres to death

No. 7. It is most uneconomic to run tyres to destruction. An more important still it is contrary to the National interest to destroy tyres which are valuable national assets.

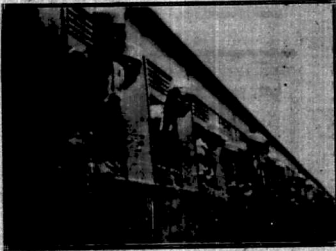

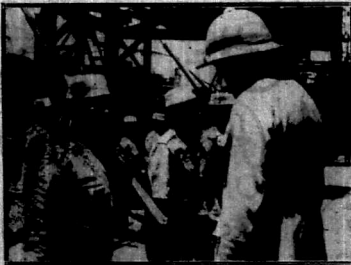

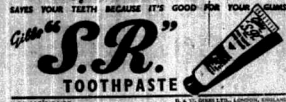

The British Crown At War

The British Monarchy has endured for ten centuries. All that time its ancient ceremonies have been preserved, its fundamental meaning has been held in view, its continuity maintained through changing but related dynasties.

But with the passage of the centuries and the ever-growing number of people whom the British monarchy have been called to rule, the ancient monarchy has acquired a new significance. In the past the monarch was not only a symbol of the nation, but also a part of the nation. Today when the British Commonwealth is at war, His Majesty King George VI secures himself to the dangers that his people share. He appears wherever his people are. It is because Britain has found such kings that of all the ancient monarchies this is the only one that has maintained the title and its substance.

The British people understand what it has meant and mean that their life more clearly than they have ever known. In this article the famous English historian, Sir Charles Petrie, explains the significance of the monarchy and shows how in King George VI the British people have found the embodiment of its highest ideals.

WHEN the German aircraft bombed Buckingham Palace they did more to strengthen the link between King George VI and his people than could have been effected by years of patient effort by the Sovereign himself. Every man and woman in the country and the Empire realized in a flash that this was the man who was there themselves, and were exposed to exactly the same dangers. From that moment the significance of the monarchy between the throne and the people has never been added. It would have to go back two hundred years, to the day when in 1743 the second King George led his grandfather into action on the Field of Dettingen. That the present King and his father were so manhood without any particular prospect of being called to the throne did not matter. Three years after their accession, should have ruled over a country fighting for its very life.

King George V was not very well over. But none who had known his son in 1918. In both cases opportunity has proved the man. Twice out of a very severe ordeal.

The throne is now the only link between the Dominions and Great Britain, and its importance could hardly be exaggerated by the constitutionalists who believe there is more to it than that Queen Victoria's own mission, which was personally to the countless millions who had never seen her. 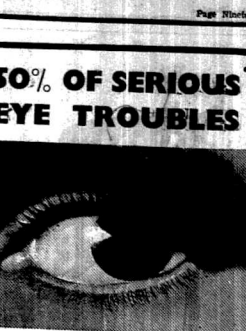

Employing Italian Prisoners

In the course of the Government reply to the debate on the Kenya Budget it was clearly conveyed that in the opinion of the Government the employment of the existing considerable surplus balances of the Colony is seriously restricted by the problems of man-power and material. That may be regarded, in a sense, as a statement of the obvious. But the outlook is not quite so discouraging, either for agriculture or industry.

The war has brought to Kenya a supply of man-power—the Italian prisoners of war. They are confined today in what is termed the "cage," meaning of course the special camps where they have been concentrated and are guarded. There is no need to dwell on the deplorable and demoralizing influence of imprisonment of any kind, and the social problem presented by the prisoner of war is apparent to anybody who thinks about it and not least to the prisoner himself. Many of the Italian prisoners were residents of layabouts and semi-lazy draw in the first instance from Italy and the Italian Empire. They come from the town and the country. There are present artisans and mechanics by the thousand, small business men, clerks, representatives of every walk in Italy's crowded agricul-

tural and industrial life. By international law they cannot be compelled to work on tasks directly related to a war effort against their own country, but there are many jobs which they can perform which do not infringe that condition. Their presence in Kenya and neighbouring East African Territories has added greatly to the burden of production and it is legitimate to suggest that they should help to grow their own food.

Property employed of the Italian prisoners and civilians should make an important contribution to the economic life of East Africa. Many of them are anxious to get work to do. Of course there are difficulties. The most obvious is that they cannot be given charges of land and labour. And with so many settlers away, it is less easy to fit them into the ordinary life of the agricultural community, for after all they are prisoners of war. But much can be done. Here is the story told to the East African Standard of one well-known Kenya settler who has given employment to two Italian prisoners and now wants more. He happens to be favourably situated. His farm is large, it is concerned mainly with stock, and it is a considerable distance from a native reserve or administrative centre. But this is what he has to say: "I have found the experiment of employing two prisoners to be most successful and I am going to try to get another two next week. They are men in the thirties. One is a wheelwright and blacksmith and the other is a mechanic and fitter. I have had no trouble with them. I do not know much of their language and so it is very difficult to talk to them; that is I think the greatest difficulty—but they have been very civil, and so far as I can judge in six weeks they have been fairly useful. I think they could be used much more. "I took a certain amount of trouble to tell the natives with which they were working what the position is. I explained that they were prisoners of war but said that we were short of men in Kenya and were making prisoners of war work to provide the food. I said they would have no trouble with the Italians but they could keep

PREMIER'S CALL TO GREATER EFFORT

December 3. The crisis of equipment is largely over and an ever-broadening flow of new supplies is now assured. The crisis of man-power is also over. Mr. Chamberlain in the House of Commons on Tuesday said: "We have to equip the nation for a further degree of sacrifice and exertion. The year 1941 has seen the major problem of creating a production capacity and fitting equipment largely solved on the high road to solution. Eye on them and let me know if they are misbehaved. "The cost is five pence a month and a bit more for a room. I have put them up a room made of stiel poles and plastered mud and a stone floor. They have a bit of garden in front and they have already put in vegetables and flowers. They seem perfectly happy. Their movements are restricted of course and if they want to go for a walk on a Sunday afternoon they ask permission. What they like to do is to take their health a little better than when they arrived."

These two prisoners work in their ordinary trades. The farmer told the East African Standard that he was increasing his production by getting two more Italian prisoners to work on his farm which is working order which he had difficulty in getting repaired before. The Italians have made a good job of their work. "I think," he said, "that a group farm manager who has to spend valuable time keeping ploughs and implements in order when they should be going round the farm could have many valuable hours if he had men like mine to do that sort of work." It is not difficult to get prisoners of war once the applicant is approved by the Chairman of the Settlement and Production Board as a good and reliable employer. A form of parole, restricted to the place of employment, is permissible and no further restrictions are required. For agricultural work application should be made in the first instance through the local Man-Power Committees and if they approve, it goes direct to the Chairman of the Settlement and Production Board who, if he approves it then deals direct with the Military authorities and a simple form of contract is completed before the Officer Commanding the camp from which the worker is drawn.

There are two classes of prisoner of war. One costs five pence a month, the other, who is classed as second grade, costs only fifty shillings. In addition to rations (which is a matter of international agreement) the prisoner is entitled to thirty-five cigarettes a week, or one and a half ounces of tobacco, and a box of matches. Accommodation must be reasonably hygienic and rainproof. Grade 1 prisoners are highly skilled farmers or mechanics; grade 2 includes such men as farm labourers or tractor drivers. Wages amount to 12 cents an hour for the first grade and six cents for the second grade. It is not to be paid in cash by the employer; the amount is entered daily in a wages book and the employer is expected at the prisoner's request to supply him with any reasonable commodities to the extent of his credit. The daily wage of five pence is the military subsistence. Thus the employer's liability so far as money payment is concerned is limited to the fixed sum of either five pence or fifty shillings monthly according to the type of labour he employs. Questions of medical aid, bonds, and the rights and privileges of both parties are clearly set out in the contract.

More Taxation In Uganda

The Uganda Government has issued a memorandum on new taxation which will be introduced in 1942.

In common with other East African Colonies the Government of Uganda has under consideration a number of measures designed to achieve the threefold object of increasing the proceeds of revenue, restricting consumption of luxuries, and making the most of the resources of the country.

The measures proposed include a comparatively high standard of the most necessary commodities with the contribution of the Government to the cost of the measures. A supplementary tax on the import of certain goods and the introduction of a tax on the import of certain goods.

It is proposed to collect additional revenue from (a) Income Tax (b) Excise Duty (c) Customs and (d) Sales Tax.

The introduction of the necessary legislation by the Legislative Council, immediate effect has been given to the Customs and Excise Duties by an Order under the Customs and Excise Duties (Emergency Provisions) Ordinance (No. 23 of 1941) which has been passed by the Government of Uganda. The new law will be in force from the date when it is promulgated.

BRITISH LAW IN FORMER ITALIAN COLONIES

What The O.E.T.A. Police Have To Tackle

This is the first of a series of articles on Police responsibilities in East Africa. It throws light on the peculiar problems which have to be tackled in East Africa and which are not readily met by the ordinary man in the street.

The problem of re-establishing immediately after its military occupation is obviously no small one, and the fact that there have been no vegetable incidents of any serious dimensions throughout the whole of the former Italian East African Empire of the especially difficult nature of the problem which has to be faced. The speed with which the conquest was made intensified these difficulties and the problem of obtaining a sufficient number of qualified men to train and train the necessary Police Force has been one of the main difficulties in the prosecution of the war in general further complicated the position.

Nevertheless, it may now be said that this first dangerous phase has been safely passed and it is now a matter of fact to be faced by the factory to be able to recruit that the few reasonably staffed and have been started well in their way for achieving that standard of police work which is to be expected by schemes under British rule.

This initial difficulty, however, it has to be said, is not the most serious, perhaps even graver, one of which has been a brief description is given below.

Ethiopia

The British have secured an ordered government of the land of the primitive Danakil, a Hamitic people who inhabit the Plains and Harar Province and of whom little is known, has securely been governed all the time. The word, which is Arabic, can best be translated as "the bandit class" and the Italians, having secured that excellent method of administering the British Authorities would be to arm the Wagret and accordingly issued them with 15,000 rifles prior to their departure.

An even greater problem may arise from the traditional relationship between the Amhara and the Tigray. Historically the former are the conquerors of the latter and the amicable attitude which the Amhara generally adopt towards the people when they have regard for the many years as a subject race may give rise to administrative difficulties that may well be overcome without serious risks of local disorder.

Greetings To King Of Italy

Strong disciplinary action by B.C.C. authorities is expected against the officials responsible for the broadcasting of a birthday greeting to the King of Italy, says a Sagami-Bender message from London.

The Government are understood to have been giving attention to the broadcast and it is expected that questions will be asked of the Ministry of Information in Parliament.

The incident occurred in the "feature programme" called "anti-Italian propaganda" and it can be stated on the authority of the Parliamentary correspondent of The Times that the Government naturally disapprove themselves from the B.C.C.'s action and regard it as surprising and regrettable in its character.

The principal authorities of the B.C.C. are understood to have been consulted about the propriety of the sending of the broadcast to a country which was at the time the Government's view, and disciplinary measures seem likely to be imposed.

The Ministry of Information is responsible for all home news broadcasts and all broadcasting outside the country except broadcasts to enemy and neutral countries. And it is now the intention to extend Government responsibility to other B.C.C. broadcasts, but the birthday greeting incident will probably lead to some tightening of the B.C.C. organization to prevent indiscretions causing embarrassment to the Government.

Fire Bombs May Call Up Watchers

(FROM A CORRESPONDENT)

Automatic alarms which ring a bell the moment a fire bomb gets into a building may be a new ally in the British hundreds of thousands of fire-watchers this winter.

The British Ministry of Home Security invited the Institution of Electrical Engineers to consider the problem. They chose one of which detects incendiary bombs by operating electrical circuits ruptured by impact.

The device has a special electrical circuit with a special electrical conductor as one of its parts. Should a fire bomb get into the building it breaks this conductor and sets off a bell.

The advantage of the idea is that the alarm rings a bell the moment the bomb hits the building and therefore the fire has had time to start a fire.

Other methods are also described, such as the use of light detecting photo cells to operate the alarm by the effect of the bright light from the bomb.

These systems have been standardized and specifications issued by the British Standards Institution.

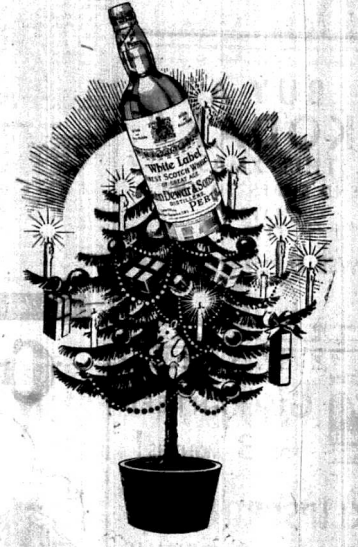

Ingredients
4 oz. Flour, pinch of Salt, 3 level teaspoonsful Royal Baking Powder, great grid of half a Lemon, 2 oz. Butter or Margarine, 3 oz. Sugar, 2 oz. Currants, a few drops of Lemon Essence, Milk to mix (approximately 1 gill).

Method
Grease and flour a small cake tin. Sieve the flour, salt and Royal Baking Powder into a basin. Grate the rind of half a lemon and add to the flour. Rub the butter or margarine in with the tips of the fingers until no lumps remain. Add the sugar and currants. Mix fairly stiffly with cold milk. (The quantity of milk required depends on the moistness of the flour.)

Add a few drops of lemon essence before the mixing is completed. Pour into the prepared tin and bake in a moderate oven 35° F. for 1½ to 1½ hours.

Japan At War With Britain And U.S.A.

(Continued from page 1.)

States Solicitor General and all suspicious aliens are to be detained. The movement of Japanese ships and aircraft is restricted and a ban has been placed on the transactions of Japanese aliens.

All American ships in the Pacific have been ordered to home ports, and leave for stations has been cancelled in New York. Sailors going on leave were stopped at the Grand Central Terminal.

Troops have established a blockade round Terminal Island where several thousand Japanese are quarantined.

The Panama Canal zone has been placed on a war footing in readiness for possible attack. At many points all civilian aircraft have been ordered not to leave ground.

The Mayor of San Francisco has declared a state of emergency and demanded the cessation of all strikes.

President Roosevelt is to address a joint session of Congress tomorrow.

Mr. Patterson, Under Secretary for War, has asked the American nation to place munitions production on a 24 hours basis.

Congress Angry

Indignation and anger were reported in Washington to have followed the first reaction of the members of Congress to the Japanese attack. Shortly after the first news, large groups began to assemble outside the President's residence and executive buildings were besieged by Mr. Stephens, then the President's secretary. The first papers to appear with the sensational news were the Daily Mirror and the Daily News. The latter, which has been strong isolationist, observed that when Americans were attacked there was nothing to do but retaliate.

The public appear to be taking the news calmly. After a hurried recall of all the nation's military personnel, citizens gathered in small but silent groups to watch the bulletin, buying the extra editions of the newspapers and listening to the radio.

The President conferred for some hours with his military and naval chiefs.

In New York, Mayor LaGuardia, head of the civil defence services, instructed regional directors to take civil precautions. Measures were being taken everywhere to prevent sabotage.

Among other defence measures already taken are the following: President Roosevelt conferred on the alien problems with the United States

where and secret reports of Japanese aggression were rumbled to the ears of the British Government. Australian servicemen are at their firing stations in the Pacific and are being sent to Australia on a total war footing. The Japanese added Mr. Churchill to the list of allies and he went into the Cabinet Room, pointed out to Japan, before her formal declaration of war, had named the United States and British allies. He said the Australian Cabinet had taken immediate action, according to plan, to do everything necessary for the defence of Australia, Canada and United States interests.

Canada

Mr. Mackenzie King, the Canadian Prime Minister, announced that Canada is at war with Japan and that Canadian armed forces had been ordered to engage the enemy wherever he may be found.

Mr. Mackenzie King added it was perhaps the most significant moment of the war, perhaps of the whole world. The navy has apprehended the Japanese submarine fishing fleet of the Pacific coast because it was "guilty of engaging in espionage."

The Japanese colony in British Columbia, where at present are over 40 per cent of the Japanese in Canada, were apparently as much surprised by Japan's attack as the one else. Many of the older Japanese refused to believe it.

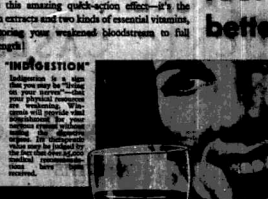
