There was an excellent gathering of parents and friends at the annual prize-giving, Empire Day parade and service at the Prince of Wales School, Nairobi.

In the course of a challenging speech, the Director of Education, Mr. Lacey, appealed to the spirit of adventure and advised the boys "Don't be afraid of life and its responsibilities... Don't go into positions which your parents want you to, but do what you can do and do it."

He emphasized the importance of shouldering the "white man's burden" throughout the Empire.

The parade, as usual, opened at the proceedings. A very smart guard of honor composed of pupils who are members of the O.T.C. under Mr. Clouston, led the school contingent, where it was inspected, together with the school, by Mr. Lacey, Director of Education, and Captain Terrell, who commands the O.T.C. To the accompaniment of music from the band, the guard marched smartly past.

The short Empire Day service proceeded as usual. Mr. Lacey, in addition to the Headmaster (Mr. Astley) members of the School Committee and others, were the Acting Chief Secretary (Mr. Harangi), the Warden of Mombasa, and H. W. M. M. The service consisted of a hymn, the prayer, the reading of the motto, prayer and the blessing by the Bishop. The Bishop was read by the head boy of the School.

Headmaster's Address In the course of his address the Headmaster referred to excellent results which, he stated, gave an opportunity in a young Colony of recognition by an external standard. 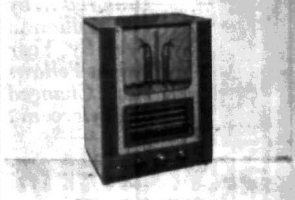

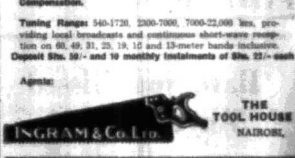

(Continued from page 8).

their rights under Magna Charta, and that for practice and effect the Colonial Office have invested with despotic powers to impose discretionary taxes on settlers who have no control and no representation in the Council.

British Settlements Act

Counsel after referring to further case law authorities, quoted the following sections of the British Settlements Act, 1887—

"It shall be lawful for the Secretary of State in Council from time to time to establish all such laws and institutions and constitute such courts and officers, and make such provisions and regulations, for the proceedings in the said courts and for the necessary execution of any law which may appear to Her Majesty in Council to be necessary for the peace, order, and good government of Her Majesty's subjects and others within any British settlement.

"It shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen from time to time by any instrument, passed under the great seal of the United Kingdom, or by any instrument under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual referred to in such instrument as made or to be made, as respects any British settlement, to delegate to any three or more persons, being British subjects, all or any of the powers conferred by this Act on Her Majesty in Council, and such persons, acting in such manner, shall have the same powers, limitations, and authorities as if they were Her Majesty in Council. Provided that, notwithstanding any such delegation, the Queen in Council may exercise all or any of the powers under this Act. Provided always, that every such instrument or instrument as aforesaid shall be laid before the House of Commons as soon as convenient after its passing, and shall remain an enactment (whether it does or does not) until it is so laid.

"The persons named in this case (said Mr. Shagrir) would suggest that the powers, order, and good government" would be exercised by the British settlers here the rights and liberties that are conferred on them.

Paragraph 4 of this Act deals with delegation it is hardly thought that the Council for the Districts of the Colony that there is here any power conferred on the Royal Prerogative. The words, "peace, order, and good government," appear in various of the Orders in Council, and it may fairly be suggested that these words are borrowed from the British Settlements Act quoted above. The Plaintiff in this case, in order to succeed, must expressly satisfy the Court and ask the Court to do so that the words, "peace, order, and good government," are in substance the meaning of the words in the Constitution of the Colony with power to inflict arbitrary taxation, and that the operative effect of these words is to deprive the settlers of their constitutional rights as enjoyed under the British Constitution.

Counsel suggested the following hypothetical question as being asked by a member in the House of Commons: "It is a fact correct and true to say that the Imperial Parliament by the British Settlements Act 1887, or other any other Act, has deprived English overseas of their rights that they enjoy under Magna Charta and other statutes and acts affecting the British Constitution, so as to practice to inflict arbitrary taxation on any settler and, in actuality, unlimited powers of taxation of the subject's property?" It is submitted that this is a correct question.

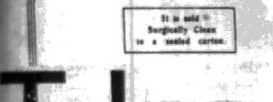

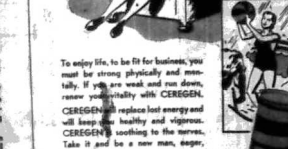

"PEACE, ORDER AND GOOD GOVERNMENT"

Does This Mean Right To Impose Taxes Arbitrarily?

A summary of the Crown's argument in an important tax case, the Income Tax Commissioner vs. the Earl of Erroll which raises vital constitutional issues regarding the Government's powers to impose taxation, is given below.

Down Counsel said the crux of the case was whether the words in Section 2 of the British Settlements Act of 1887, "such laws as may be necessary for the peace, order, and good government..." included the power to impose taxation.

A Pleader counsel for the Crown stated that the provisions contained in the Act were intended to give the King the same powers as were conferred on the King by the British Settlements Act of 1801.

"For the purposes of this act, the words 'peace, order and good government' mean any part of His Majesty's Government of the United Kingdom and the expression 'British subject' means any British subject as defined in the Statute in that behalf made."

"Parliament has not authorized the Crown to exercise its power to impose taxation in a foreign country, and it is not the duty of the Crown to exercise that power in a foreign country."

"The Act is a British settlement for the purposes of the British Settlements Act 1887. The distinction between provisions applied by reason or contract and those applied by settlement is made."

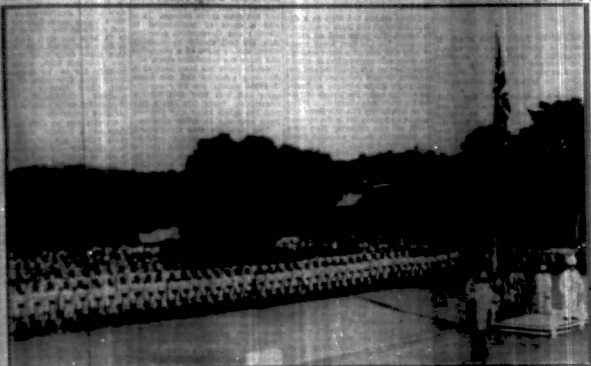

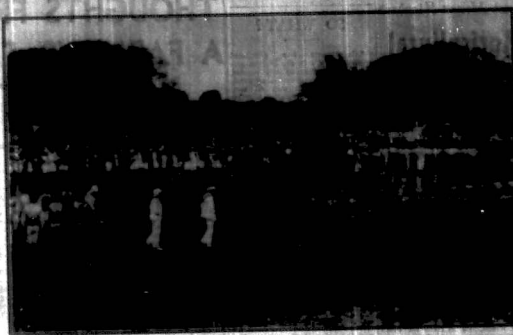

The position of Yugo-Slavia was also referred to at the annual conference of the British Legion by an ex-officer representative from that country.

"Our geographical situation," he said, "demands that we shall always be in the advance guard of civilisation in Europe and also that we should keep back the hordes of savages who long to destroy that civilisation. God grant us aid."
