Rugby, May 29.

30,000 TONS OF SUGAR MAY BE THROWN AWAY UNLESS EAST AFRICAN PRODUCERS CAN GET TOGETHER

Kenya Government Lead

MEETING TO BE HELD IN NAIROBI AT THE END OF MAY

The Government of Kenya, aware of the problem that may face the sugar industry of East Africa as a result of international agreement in London is working hard to encourage producers to form an East African Sugar Association.

There are signs of disagreement among the producers themselves in regard to export and exploitation of local markets but the position is that unless the producers can find a solution there is likely to be a surplus of 30,000 tons of sugar which has either to be eaten locally or thrown away.

The Government has also been busy putting up the case for a continuation of the principle of preference for Kenya produce in the Secretary of State who is the colonial representative on the Imperial Conference. Uganda and Tanganyika supported the Kenya view and the three governments acted together.

Preference for E.A. Produce

Through Lord Francis Scott, Sir Ernest, he held the Joint African Board in London that saw no correspondence between the Kenyan Government and the Home Government regarding the Imperial Conference - and the Kenyan Government was asked to withdraw from the East African Standard. It is also stated that the Kenya government is inactive in ensuring that native interests will not be neglected at the Imperial Conference. However, when the Ottawa Agreement was under consideration.

On February 23 of this year the agreement between the United Kingdom and Canada arrived at Addis Ababa and was replaced by a new agreement under which Kenya is given the same treatment as Canada enjoyed. During 1936 and this year the Kenyan Government has put a great deal of effort into getting the preferences already enjoyed by Kenya and for obtaining new preferences. It is also stated that when the remaining Ottawa Agreements are considered at the Imperial Conference, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, who represents the Colonial Offices at the Conference, will be fully acquainted with the Kenya requirements.

The support of Uganda and Tanganyika was enlisted so that a united request was forwarded to the Secretary of State for the Colonies. The result of this request was that the preference mentioned was Empire-wide for which a preference for Empire-wide competition with Argentina was requested. Pyrethrum, wheat butter, pig iron, cotton seed, oil cake, palm oil and other products were also specified.

It is understood that when the African Chamber of Commerce of East Africa asked the Kenyan Government in its letter to the Secretary of State for the Colonies to take into account the retention of the preference for Kenya in the Imperial Conference, the retention of Empire preference on products of East Africa was agreed between East Africa and South America and the result of this was that Kenya became a permanent member of the Commonwealth.

One of the Nairobi Rotary Club's most popular speakers, Mr. P. F. Walker, gave an interesting address on "Maya" at the weekly meeting of the club at the Nairobi Hotel yesterday.

Transport Problems

Referring to communication Mr. Walker said that the transport problem had been raised as a result of the competition between rail, road and river traffic.

He said that the difficulty of convening a co-operation of transport authorities to hold locally a conference similar to that held recently in London to discuss the future of traffic in Makya had had to be met by increased general taxation, which was not a good idea.

It was suggested that the sum of \$10,000 that must be absorbed by increased taxation could be avoided.

If full protection is undertaken this year, the difficulty, as can be seen, will be to get the expected quota, although this is considerably above last year's estimate.

The Bishop of Mombasa was one of those present at the Prince of Wales School ceremony and spoke on the spirit of service based upon religion which was the true responsibility of Empire.

Church Services

Mombasa's Bishop, Dr. A. T. Wood, gave a powerful Nazi and Hitler speech in an attempt to show that the peaceful existence and the presence of a Nazi agent who had been captured and marched from Uganda during the sports club dinner, where the Royal Salute was given after receiving a R.A.R. Guard of Honour for the children and after words from the National Anthem. He said that the Bishop had intended to speak on the afternoon programme, consisting of sports for adults and children, and the Mombasa Golf Club Course.

AT NAIROBI

Prince of Wales School Speech Day
