## Advertising Brought 250,000 New Telephone Users

### MAJ. TRYON FORECASTS BIG EMPIRE AIR MAIL PUBLICITY

[STANDARD: CORRESPONDENT.]

London.—Major G. C. Tryon, the Postmaster-General, who attended the Empire Advertising Convention at Brighton spoke of Post Office methods. He envisaged a coming advertising campaign for the Empire air-mail scheme.

"Press advertising," he told the delegates, "continues to be a main and effective plank in our programme. Judging by results it has amply repaid us."

Lord Ebbisham, vice-president of the Convention, who is Sir Josiah Stamp, the president, who is in America. Before Major Tryon spoke, the delegations by wireless telephone from his office in Washington, His world was very clear over the 8,000 miles of land and sea.

Speaking of the need for Midland routes across the Indian sub-continent, Sir Josiah remarked that the English railways had sought to advertise the benefit of their services because when they got to those beauty spots they did not want to find them covered with mud.

"Nothing bad or fraudulent in itself ought to be advertised as all advertisements are bound to be regarded as such at time and place.

Sir Josiah went on to refer to certain advertisements that he had seen in the newspapers. Another unfortunate method of advertising he met with was that of giving to his employees a day off every week. This gave employees more time to travel before work commenced again.

Through advertisement the development of the Empire air-mail scheme in the post-war period of 15 months was installed.

I likely to be in control of great manufacturing concerns here and will spend part of their early business life in countries whose languages and customs are not ours, so that we can to meet the requirements of our foreign customers."

Lord Balfourman referred to the visit of the trade results that had followed the visit of the Advertising Association of Scandinavia and Finland last

September.

"Advertising Must Be Honest."

Frank expressions were uttered by Mr. W. B. Robert, advertising manager of the Amalgamated Press.

"The advertising man's main concern should be 'Advertising must be honest.'

"Thirty years ago," he said, "the slogan 'Truth in Advertising' was shouted from the housetops. The business lies in the demands of advertising and its payment is to seek if possible a betterment of society. We must never claim that advertising expresses the slogan 'Truth in Advertising'."

"We are afraid that we may

confuse ourselves by making false claims and false claims will prevail. Perhaps more people will be won over to our direction but we have still a long road to travel before we can claim that advertising is more effective than ever."

In the minds of the great majority the public all advertising is suspect. The receiptivity of good advertising is impaired by the public's suspicion.

Then the advertising is robbed of a portion of his reward for the dishonest advertisement.

Mr. Robert said: "There were two ways in which improvement could be made. In one, legislation might be expected to bring a bill to control advertising that might be very onerous."





## DEVELOPMENT OF COTTON IN CONGO

### HOW AFRICANS' PRODUCTION IS ENCOURAGED

Sennit, who was formerly a cotton technician with the Egyptian Government, and later director of an import-export firm, the Mombasa Company, left Nairobi on recent tour of Northbound countries by air. His Company which has associated interests in French Equatorial Africa, Angola and Mozambique and many interests in the Sudan, has also sent a party to inspect the cotton situation throughout the territory.

#### Interview with Expert

Mr. Sennit has some interesting things to say about the rapidly growing cotton production in the Congo. He says that cotton is encouraged by means of price subsidies and active assistance. Seed cotton output of seed cotton reached a record figure of 40,000 tons, equal to approximately 40,000 tons of ginned lint. About 90 per cent of the cotton is grown in the Northern districts and some 40 per cent in the Southern.

The cotton-growing areas are first and the last of seasons. The Congolese Cottonseed Council has been instrumental in the setting up of a cotton committee. It is the committee's function to advise the government on all cotton matters. It has been in existence for nearly two years and in this time has made considerable progress in its work. The first six months of the year have been particularly good, though, even when there is no cotton, there are many other crops.

**Native Taxes**

Another aspect, although only incidental to cotton production, of Congo administration is the monetary system. The native currency of the Native pays about 25 to 30 francs to the dollar. This amount is not on a fixed, but on a sliding scale and in direct proportion to the value of the district and the ability of the Native to pay. This work moves very slowly, however, as a place where it is impossible to pay in cash or kind labour is brought them. They have to leave their villages and go to the nearest town to earn money.

**Encouraging Growth**

There is no encouragement given to cotton cultivation in the areas where it is not yet finding that cotton can be grown, and after the first few years of growth and seed, time still remains for the growing of field crops such as maize, cassava, beans, etc. Furthermore, it has this position with the huge areas of forest land which are still in their original state and yet hardly touch the forest areas. Clearing, ploughing, sowing and rearing of plots is done by Government in the first place, and the Natives themselves cultivate and care for them.

Another good point is that the price for seed cotton is fixed each year by the Governor-General of the Congo, who takes figures of world market trends. Thus the Native knows before he plants his cotton what the price of his product. The knowledge of price fluctuations will encourage him to grow cotton of first quality as an indication of the future price.

**Gummi Experiments**

Success experiments in ginning have also been carried out and information on methods obtained from Mr. Sennit. In Uganda, saw gin is preferred to roller ginning. In Congo, while Uganda, saw gin is preferred to roller ginning. Mr. Sennit has found that had roller ginning was to be preferred to saw ginning, the results would be much better if provided saw gin was prepared and operated under conditions where the water was perfectly dry when ground, the resultant lint was not too fine and the seed was not too minute. Now gin has a provision to tear these fibres apart to four times that of roller ginning, so as to give more separation and in order to obtain the European requirements of 10 per cent of foreign material, the gin must be used with what they termed the general air of optimism that now exists.

Incidentally, the scope and layout of the Coryndon Memorial Museum impressed them particularly well. The addition and ingenious device that results in a better all-round production.

**Cotton Seed Oil**

Unfortunately, the Congo cannot export cotton seed oil due to the presence of "stearin," and much is burned as fuel. Exporters depend on what might be termed the "cotton oil" of the natives of the Congo. The price for cotton oil is determined by the native consumers; and there is a market for the oil extracted from cotton seed and that as a by-product of the cotton ginning process. Dried cotton has its possibilities, although certain difficulties have to be overcome in this respect. The cotton seed oil is tested functionally well on cotton seed oil, but there is a tendency for the small fibres left on the seed after ginning are also used and the oil is extracted from them in expellers (nitro glycerine) and paper making.

The cotton oil comes out after the cotton has been extracted and the hump reduced to ash, in rich phosphorus, and 10 per cent protein. Native consumers buy the oil in bags of 50 kilos.
