MR. EDEN'S STATEMENT IN HOUSE OF COMMONS

German Warship Movements

NAVAL STRENGTH IN SPANISH WATERS NOT OUT OF PROPORTION TO OTHER COUNTRIES

British warships patrolling the Spanish Coast have not confirmed reports of the landing of thousands of Italian troops at Malaga.

This statement was made in the House of Commons on Thursday by the Foreign Secretary, who also stated that there was no Admiralty support for the rumour of German warship movements towards the Mediterranean.

Mr. Duff Cooper, First Lord of the Admiralty, stated yesterday that the German naval strength in Spanish waters was one armoured ship, two cruisers, six destroyers and four submarines.

The First Lord also detailed the strength of other navies off the coasts of Spain, showing that German forces were not disproportionate.

Baques Fortify Santander

(Basque and British Official Wires)

The British and French Governments are considering proposals to the Navarrese Government's approval, to close up the gap off the east of Spain, due to the withdrawal of Italy and Germany from the coastal area.

He thought there was plenty of advertisement people in this country ready to take risks if they knew they were taking part in a good scheme.

It was agreed to send communications to all the Dominion and Colonial Governments setting out the aims and objects of the Empire Migration Conference, to be held in October, and suggesting methods of co-operation.

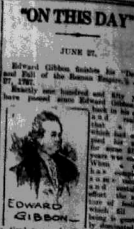

Colonial Native Policy

PEERS APPRECIATE KENYA SETTLER'S CONTRIBUTION TO DEBATE

A plea for greater use of "the personal touch" of colonists and administrators living in the various territories, as made by the Earl of Erroll when he made his maiden speech in the House of Lords on a debate dealing with Empire Native Policy.

The debate was opened by Lord Noel-Buxton who proposed a resolution that the time had arrived for the Imperial Conference to formulate a Native Policy in broad outline for all races of the Empire, based upon the principle of trusteeship.

Lord Erroll, who was afterwards the recipient of warm congratulations on his part from peers of all parties in the House, spoke of the full realization of the British ties among which he had a grave responsibility to the Nation among whom he had made his home.

Relations between black and white in East Africa were marked by very great bonds of affection, he said, and the vast majority of white colonists had far greater sympathies for the Empire than "the mere exploitation of a few unfortunate Natives."

NERVES SEVERED

Remarkable Operation as Last Chance

London (By A.P.M.B.)
A surgeon's attempt to save the life of an eleven-year-old girl suffering from a very rare disease was successful as a last resort. The girl, Patricia Alexander, daughter of a politician, of Farnham Road, Hammersmith, had a blood disease of this kind, which was causing an operation for the removal of the spleen, on which she was operated on at St. George's Hospital.

Mr. William Henry Guttery, a surgeon at St. George's Hospital, said that he had performed the operation successfully. On the outcome of the operation the pressure had risen to 170, and she was very ill. The doctor said that the only way to save the child was to sever the nerves which control the blood pressure and to do this he had to cut into her side. He had to cut away the nerves which control the blood pressure, and the blood pressure rose to 180. Some weeks ago the child had died.

Reporting to the Council (Mr. A. Douglas, Chairman), Mr. Guttery said that similar operations had been performed with success in the United States and in the West-Indies. He said that he thought the child would have lived.

Dr. F. J. Crook, pathologist, said that the girl was suffering from a disease known as malignant hypertension, which was very rare in young children. In his opinion she had died from the fall in the blood pressure and the effect of the operation.

The Council resolved a verdict of accidental death, remarking that the operation was performed as a last chance.

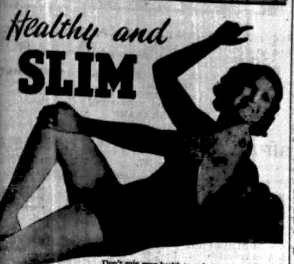

THE SUGAR INDUSTRY THE PROBLEM OF KIBOS

To the Editor, "E. A. Standard."
 Sir.—In your daily issue of June 25 I read that the report you for East Africa has been fixed at 27,000 tons.

As suggested by Messrs. the Colonial Office "recommendations that as far as possible appoint consideration to be given to the position of small cane farmers."
 It will be interesting to know in the beginning of this year when Hon. the Director of Agriculture visited Kenya and met Kibos Indian farmers. He greatly sympathized with their plight and difficulties. They only grow sugar cane and cannot afford to take care for which they have to receive a remunerative price, at the beginning of the year the price of sugar was cents 102 per pound or £110 per ton. To-day owing to wet weather and other factors the price is about 75 cents to £80 per ton, or a loss of 25 to 30%.

A few of the farmers have had agreements with the Mixed Sugar Factory and can sell their sugar cane at this, 5/70 per ton but the majority of the farmers, over about 8,000 to 9,000 acres of very fertile sugar cane and from them the Mixed Sugar Factory do not buy at any price.

I will interest you readers to know that Kibos and Kibos has 57-1/2 to 84 1/2 per ton, and there is a ready market for it, and even now in Kibos area fetches 115/- to 120/- per ton but here it is 85/- to 90/- per ton. 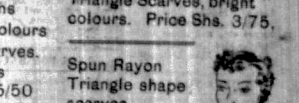
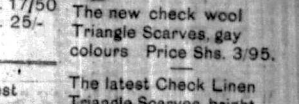

TELEPHONE CHARGES
Chamber of Commerce Hour P.M.C.'s Case

The question of reduced telephone charges was again before the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce at the monthly meeting, held on Friday, last, in view of communications pointed out by the Postmaster General when he attended a recent meeting of the Management Committee, it was decided to press the matter.

The suggestion had been put forward that the charge be reduced to 10 cents for the first 100 words and 10 cents 10 per cent. for every 100 words thereafter.

In explaining the position to the Chamber, the President, Mr. G. A. Tyson, said that in urging the Postmaster General to restrict to commercial telephones the recent reduction, it was the desire of the Chamber (with additional facilities for publishing books of value to the public) to have the Management Committee had based their arguments on the completion that there were very few persons who did not use the minimum number of calls necessary under the present commercial charge of Shs. 200/- per month. It had, in fact, been a surprise to them to learn that at least 50 per cent used less than the minimum number of calls mentioned.

The Postmaster General had pointed out that, if in these circumstances, he reduced the basic charge on commercial telephones to 10 cents, it would mean a loss of revenue would result unless at the same time it were possible to increase the number of subscribers. The present capacity of the Kenya Telephone Exchange, however, did not permit of any large increase in the number of subscribers. Recommendations had been made to increase the capacity of the Nairobi, Eldoret, Kampala, Jinja, Dar es Salaam and Mombasa exchanges in 1928.

In the circumstances, explained Mr. Tyson, the Management Committee felt that it was not reasonable to press for the suggested reduction of charges.

COLD, WET NIGHT SPENT UP A TREE HIDING FROM BIG GAME

The Rift Valley air accident has had a happy ending. On Monday the grateful fares were entertained for the lives of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Whitmarsh, particularly when it became known late in the afternoon that their machine had been found wrecked in the bush near Nanyuki.

They are, however, both alive having had remarkable escapes.

Mr. Whitmarsh's Story
A dramatic development occurred in the early yesterday morning when a first-class passenger on the way to the coast of the accident, a Kenyan was rescued from his predicament. Apparently in a panic, he was shouting that he was dead.

Relief Expedition
When the news was received on Monday night that the machine had been found wrecked in the bush near Nanyuki, a relief expedition was organized. The expedition was organized by Mr. and Mrs. Whitmarsh, a party of four, including Mr. and Mrs. Whitmarsh, the Registrar of Aircraft, Mr. Jones, Agricultural Superintendent, Nairobi, a doctor, a veterinarian, a nurse, and a driver. Their task was to cross the Kikuyu hills in the darkness hoping to find the wreckage of the plane. They were accompanied by some assistance as they were aware of the fact that Mr. Whitmarsh had made contact with other people.

The details known to the friends of the victims of the accident up to a late hour yesterday were fragmentary and in an exhausted condition in the story which could not be told until the return of the relief expedition.

Wailed 50 Miles
It appears, however, that Mr. Whitmarsh walked 50 miles across the valley and in an exhausted condition reached the camp which had been established near the wreckage of the plane. Britain and the United States. M. Bonnet indicated that Mr. Neville Chamberlain and Mr. Moraghebaw would shortly be making a statement.

It is understood that the Government had asked the assent of London and Washington to allow the franc to drop to 125 to the pound.

It is understood that M. Bonnet told the Finance Committee that the gold coffers amounted to 2,500,000,000 francs from June 23, 1926, and to 5,350,000,000 francs from June 1 to June 22. The deficit on the ordinary budget would be from 6,000,000,000 to 10,000,000,000 francs and on the extraordinary budget, 8,240,000,000 francs.

Minister's Proposals

M. Bonnet is believed to have announced that the early money at the disposal of the Government was only 20,000,000 francs and the Government had despatched an advance of 400,000,000 francs to meet current expenditures.

The remaining 10 francs proposed to the Finance Committee were, finally, to make an increase of ten millions of francs on the limits of advances by the Bank of France in the States recently, the readjustment of taxes, and thereby, allowing the franc to find its own level.

It is stated that M. Bonnet had decided to refuse all new expenditure, and to feel almost sure was entirely possible to also temporary curtailment of Government securities.

Upperhouse Debate

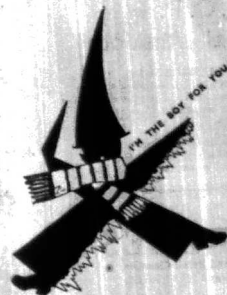

After an Aeroplane had Crashed

Three Days' Wandering in the Bush

A PERILOUS JOURNEY

A bundle of flowers for Mrs. Osa Johnson, whom Mr. and Mrs. Phillip Whitmarsh intended to present as a token of appreciation to the occupants of the aeroplane in which Mr. and Mrs. Whitmarsh crashed on Friday afternoon northwest of Suva in the Mt. Valley.

This wedding anniversary the Whitmarshs intended to celebrate the champagne just after they had picked themselves, safe, out of the wreckage of their aeroplane, and they spent the night partying up to dawn, early dawn about on the ground to keep themselves warm.

The whole exciting story was told to the "East African Standard" by Mr. Whitmarsh, who had been in the Mt. Valley home of Mr. A. J. Klein, as soon as they returned from the Mt. Valley.

Mr. Whitmarsh has had 13 years' flying experience and in East Africa where he travelled most extensively on foot, by car and in the air, he has had four forced landings. These experiences probably saved the lives of himself and his wife, for, he said, he always now arrives on all his flights no matter how short, two regular sandwiches, water, soap and a compass.

On Friday the last weather report he received looked talking of forecasted variable winds and clouds up to 10,000 feet over the Mt. Valley. He described how he was prevented by down draughts from climbing out of the clouds in the Valley, and was forced to fly between clouds at ground level. He intended to fly to Karamu via Nairobi, this skirting the Mt. on the south, and, without blind flying instruments, could only rely on compass course when not above a "nose cut". The mist was a little lighter and he could see some 50 yards ahead, at that range, a mountain ridge on right in front of the machine, which was then climbing slowly.

"I knew my way for it," said Mr. Whitmarsh, who related how he extricated the engine and pulled the aeroplane's nose up so that it "popped" on the 70-degree slope of the mountain. One wing was still afloat upwards for about 20 feet without turning over.

The middle of the occupants was hurt, although the machine was completely a piece of wreckage.

one of the instruments struck and cut Mr. Whitmarsh's cheek, and that was the extent of the personal injury, and the occupants were able to extricate themselves and clear the machine of all that might be of value to them in their attempts to find assistance.

"It was no use carrying the champagne," said Mr. Whitmarsh, "as we popped it off and drank it."

Trick Begins The mist was still thick, but he calculated that a course due north would bring them to Nairobi, and so they set off. Spars of the mountain peaks on which they had crashed prevented them from travelling in their wicker and they had to strike more to the north. The rough going, over rocks and scrub, soon took toll of Mrs. Whitmarsh's light shoes and nightfall found them among plenty of gnats and with no better sleeping place than a tree.

"We nearly froze," said Mr. Whitmarsh, "and game or no game we had to get down every night and jump about in the cold circulation gear. And then it started to rain."

About midday the next day they saw the only human being they saw for the three days of their wanderings. He was an old Masai, who could speak no Swahili and could not help.

Meeting With Rhino The best intelligence was provided by rhino, still continuing their attempts to reach Nairobi, Mr. and Mrs. Whitmarsh found themselves among a herd of rhino, which were effectively barring the way. They were compelled to turn to another direction, soon coming down to the plain where they found a herd of Masai oxen.

"We had up there," said Mr. Whitmarsh, "and I tried to load a lorry. We had finished our sandwiches on the first day. The game was very wary, and when I did at last get a buck it was far from the mountains. I could not carry it back. Also, at two o'clock the next morning it was raining hard—I shot a Kudu and got 100 yards from the main stags."

Substance "That dawn when I had shot it, we were still in a fix. We had no milk, and all I had was a milk file. I couldn't make any impression with that and so I went back to the mountains and found the remains of an old deer. With a piece of tin from the deck I made something like a knife and went back to the lorry."

I plucked a couple of holes in the lorry and through them, hair and all, we stuck some lard which gave us a little strength. Then I fired a line of bullets down the belly and with the tin knife, we were able to open the carcass. Only one meal did the lorry provide, for while Mr. and Mrs. Whitmarsh were drinking and eating at a stream a little way off, hyenas and leopards opportunistly accosted the carcass. Mr. Whitmarsh added

that he was keeping the tin as a valuable souvenir, and that Monday morning, the third day of their wanderings, he flew, out from a hilltop, Mr. Whitmarsh was able to make out landmarks that he knew—Mount Kenya and Longonot; They needed some such encouragement, for Mrs. Whitmarsh's feet were in a very bad state, as she had had completely given out and she was walking listlessly.

About mid-day they saw another native, and to their amazement and delight he said he was "Hwana Kina's boy" and the camp was just a short distance away. "I looked like New York City from up here," said Mr. Whitmarsh with some-Shaka glare, nose, scar and Oshay.
