OMINOUS OUTLOOK IN NORTH CHINA

FIGHTING WITHIN PEIPING CITY GATES

Japanese Troops Withdraw

AFTER 20 KILLED AND OTHERS ISOLATED IN TEMPLE

The outlook in North China is even more ominous and the latest cable messages show heavy fighting in and around Peiping, communications with which have been interrupted and all telegraph lines save that to Tientsin cut.

A clash resulting in the death of twenty Japanese troops took place after heavy fighting with hand grenades by Chinese troops.

The remnants took refuge within a temple and were later taken to Peiping barracks.

After the withdrawal of the Japanese and the failure of their efforts to take the railway station outside the walls, Japanese residents were instructed to evacuate their homes and take refuge in the Embassy, an action that implies strong counter-measures against the city and the Chinese troops holding it.

Ordered to Evacuate Homes

Telephone communication with Peiping was suddenly interrupted at midnight today leading to the fact that fighting had broken out there.

Lorries Blown By

Twenty Japanese lorries are reported to have been killed inside the Western Gate of the city, when three lorries were blown up with hand grenades.

Chinese "police" was killed and another wounded.

Fight at City Gate

Japanese troops had previously demanded entrance by way of the gate and ten lorries had been destroyed during fighting.

The Chinese reported that the Japanese expressed their willingness to withdraw from the city, but that the Japanese refused to do so.

REFUSAL TO LIMIT SIZE OF NAVAL GUNS

POSSIBLE BRITISH REPLY TO JAPANESE POLICY

Fourteen or Sixteen Inch?

QUESTION OF RANGE AND GETTING IN THE FIRST BLOW

Japan's refusal to limit naval guns to a maximum calibre of fourteen inches may cause a reconsideration of British building plans.

Whether the reply to any Japanese proposal exceeding the limitation proposed in the London Naval Treaty will be a bigger, faster, or more heavily armed warship is, however, considered to be a matter for experts to decide.

TRADE UNIONS BILL DEBATED IN COUNCIL

GENERAL AGREEMENT ON NEEDS FOR THE MEASURE

Reference to the strikes in Nairobi a month or two ago by the Acting Attorney General when moving the second reading in Legislative Council on Monday of a Bill to provide for the registration and control of Trade Unions.

He stated that from evidence brought to light by the strikes it was apparent that there had been an attempt to organize labour in Kenya under the guise of trade unions on a class basis.

The Acting Attorney General added that he felt sure of the support of members of the Council. It was recalled that trade unions were the natural consequence of social and industrial progress and in response to public opinion Government had indicated its general policy.

The Bill recognized that trade unions are not proper laws, and would make others illegal, the former taking part in the latter being left to operate. This would be regarded as the greatest benefit of the Bill provided for the remaining labouring workers and employees so that each could have representatives, and so that in the future the ease of departure the speaker hoped for, was a very simple matter to do together and settle the disputes.

Mr. A. N. Mwangi, Acting Indian Education Member, said that it should not be made possible with regard to another sector of the Bill, the thought being that the time might come when two or three teachers strike and the Bill would be likely to be the interest of the Government to make it impossible to take another course.
