Tommy Docherty, the Chelsea wing-half and coach, became the object of the West Ham crowd's wrath after one of two head-butts which he was booked practically every time he touched the ball, and orange peel was thrown at him as he left the field at the end of the game. The match finished with a 2-1 win for West Ham who have now won five of their last six games.

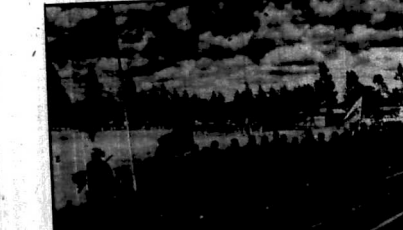

U.N. CONFERS IN PLANE CRASH

Sole survivor tells of explosions

The still smouldering wreckage of the plane in which the United Nations Secretary-General, Mr. Dag Hammarskjöld died, was found yesterday by a search party near Ndola.

Last night, the sole survivor said that there had been a series of explosions aboard shortly after the secretary-general had altered his mind about landing at Ndola and told the pilot to change course for another destination.

In New York, the U.N. Security Council met for an urgent secret session last night to consider the situation created by the secretary-general's death.

Earlier, his chairman, Dr. Nathan Barban of Liberia, said the immediate problem was how to carry on the U.N.'s day-to-day business without its chief executive. He suggested that the General Assembly, due to open today, should be adjourned for three or four days.

The finding of the wreckage ended hours of mystery about Mr. Hammarskjöld's fate after he had erroneously been reported to be already conferring with Mr. Tolson on Sunday night.

Mr. Hammarskjöld was on his way to Ndola for cease-fire talks with President Tolson of Zambia.

The plane carried nine passengers and a crew of five, and the secretary-general's body was among the eleven recovered from the wreckage. One critically injured survivor was found by the searchers. He was taken to hospital in Ndola.

A northern Rhodesian Government spokesman said that a fighter, a DOK, appeared to have hit the ground south of Ndola, about 100 miles from the crash site.

With Mr. Hammarskjöld was his chief adviser on African affairs, Mr. Francis A. Schuchman.
