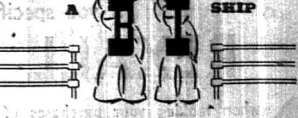



right. The company commander said that he had no doubt that he would have only one officer, an N.C.O. and a few men left. The German side, as the announcer said, was a mixture of the 1st and 2nd Divisions of the 1st Army. The latter were the best of the best. Prisoners who have escaped from the Russian front have told Russian correspondents that groups of Germans trying to surrender have been shot down by their own machine guns.

The German front, according to a Swedish newspaper, another Nazi army, numbering about 400,000 men, is in danger of encirclement by the Red Army. The same paper reports the capture of another part north-east of Vyazma on the railway to Moscow, but it is not a contradiction of this claim.

A correspondent to the Soviet army papers has been very active behind the German lines in the Russian sector. He says that one of these has told him that his detachment had recently killed over 1,000 Germans.

Another fact that correspondents state that fighting on the Southern front is getting fiercer and fiercer. The German lines are being broken. The Germans are falling back under the hammer blows of the Soviet troops.

The Moscow night correspondent on Friday commented on the Soviet army's new offensive in the Russian sector. He said that heavy losses had been inflicted on the German troops. The correspondent added that the Russians had destroyed 40 German planes in the last two days; that Wednesday and Thursday had lost 10 of these.
