



## SPECIAL CABINET ON ZAMBIA

### Statement on Zambian force expected

Cabinet Ministers refused to comment yesterday, after an emergency meeting, whether a final decision had been made to send a Zambian hydro-electric scheme on to Zambia to protect the Zambia-Rhodesia frontier.

Government spokesmen insisted that no uniting had been remarked for dispatch to Zambia, but kind no announcement would be made until any force had arrived.

The British Prime Minister, Mr. Wilson, was expected to make a statement on some possible on Zambia's request for British troops. He was said to be keeping in close touch with President Kaunda on the subject.

A final decision on whether to send a military force to Zambia, called by Mr. Wilson for this meeting.

### Terms not disclosed

Yesterday's Cabinet session was called at short notice after a three-hour and a half meeting with Ministers and Malcolm MacDonald, Britain's special envoy in East and Central Africa, who delivered President Kaunda's letter to Mr. Macdonald last night.

Government spokesmen refused to disclose whether a deal had been struck.

The terms of President Kaunda's appeal were not disclosed, but it was said that it did not specify whether the Zambian leader asked for British troops to protect the hydro-electric scheme itself, which is on the Rhodesian side of the frontier.

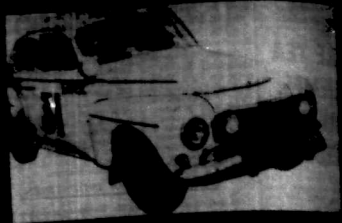

## Mr. Wilson awaits acceptance of terms

As such a squadron of British Royal Air Force jet fighters to be based in East Africa was suspended last night until President Kameua finally accepted the offer, it was disclosed in official quarters in London. # Three firms provided capital for Thika mill

THREE Japanese firms have a share in the Kenya Terry Mills at Thika. They are Toyo Rayon Co., Mitsui and Co. and the Chiyohara.

The Toyo Rayon Co. Ltd. (Tory for short) was established in 1926 by Mitsui and Co. as manufacturers of rayon yarn. Tory gradually expanded its business and by 1948 had established itself as one of the largest textile industries in the country.

In 1941 the company succeeded in developing nylon through its own technological efforts and after the Second World War signed a license agreement with E. I. du Pont de Nemours and Co. of the United States and began manufacturing nylon for the first time in Japan in 1951.

Since 1950 the company has marketed a series of excellent new synthetic fibres — the popular Rayon, Tory and the synthetic fibre, Terylene, and the polypropylene fibre, Tylon. Annual production of Tory's rayon yarn has risen from 10,000 tons in 1954 to 100,000 tons in 1964.

In order to streamline its business for further expansion, Tory drastically cutback the 1965. This action was taken in connection with a number of ambitious programmes of developing synthetic fibres and of developing plants for the production of synthetic fibres.

The company also followed a diversified chemical industrial development programme, changing into the petrochemical industry which enabled the supply of raw materials for fibre production.

Tory has a capital of almost \$200,000,000. Its sales in 1963 totalled more than \$130,000,000 and it is today recognized as the foremost chemical fibre manufacturer in Japan. It ranks as the sixth largest business organization in the world outside the United States.

The company's products are exported in all parts of the world. Tory endeavours to expand its overseas business through selling products and through technical co-operation with other existing chemical factories in developing countries.

Tory operates seven factories, 14 laboratories and 20 subsidiary companies in Japan. It has 10,000 representatives in 10 countries and employs approximately 30,000 people.

### Half share

FIFTY per cent of the shareholding in Kenya Terry Mills is held by Mitsui and Co. Ltd., one of the largest organizations of its kind in the world. It handles everything from foreign business and from cars to cement, with an income of 77 million yen, or 100 million dollars, a year.

Mitsui is a member of many services and deals to thousands of businessmen in hundreds of countries.

One of its greatest assets is the number of specialists employed in each field.

Recent overseas projects in-

clude a chemical fertilizer through the loan of 10,000 tons of urea, and various other electric and transport projects in Peru, and various other projects in Mexico and a large contract agreement with American corporations. Other activities include manufacturing, shipping, insurance and other fields.

### Long history

THE third partner in the Thika venture is Chiyohara, which holds 25 per cent of the shareholding.

Chiyohara's history goes back more than 100 years when a company was formed in Osaka in 1861. In 1921 the company started handling rayon yarn and from that time the business which at the present day handles all types of rayon and synthetic fibres both in Japan and abroad.

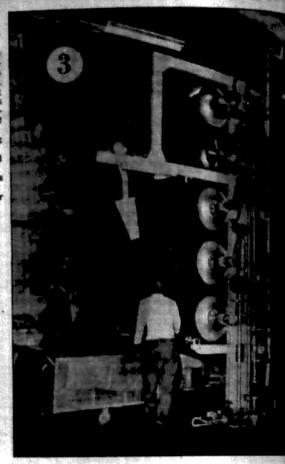
The company was reorganized in 1932, expanded and started overseas trade with China, Korea and India after the Second World War extended their activities to other parts of the world. In addition to the operations in textiles, Chiyohara has successfully diversified its activities to cover machinery, chemicals and other products.

In 1963 Chiyohara had a monthly turnover of 100 million yen (\$18,000,000) and a staff of 10,000.

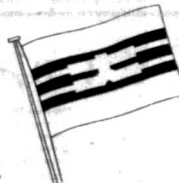
As well as fulfilling a need for locally processed nylon fabric, the Kenya Terry Mills at Thika are also providing employment for local labour. At present, 150 workers are employed at the plant.

The company, the first of its type in East Africa, is concerned with the processing of imported terylene nylon from Japan into material for women's clothing. To carry out the work, Kenyans are being trained at the plant in the various aspects of production. These pictures show Kenyans employed in the different stages of production.

4. The finished product is packed for shipment.

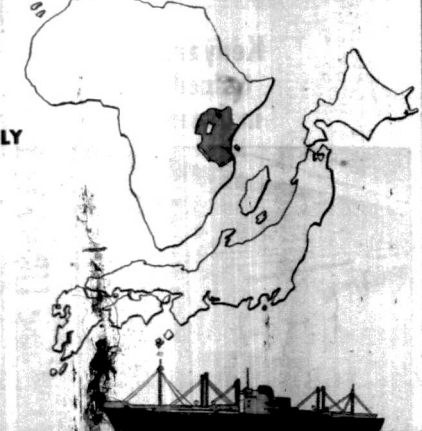

# Japanese synthetic fibre industry is the second largest in world

JAPAN's status as a world leader in textile and electronics manufacturing will soon be well known. The label "Made in Japan" is no longer a cheap, shabby goods, but a mark of an industrial nation like no other in the world. The country's history has shown its capacity to prosper in more dynamic fashion.

But one industry in Japan has quietly come out of nowhere to become the second largest in the world. That industry in 1964 turned out 242,389,289.651 kilograms of synthetic fibre. Only the United States was able to top that figure.

The synthetic fibre industry in Japan has grown so quickly that statisticians have a difficult time keeping the figures up to date. Industry leaders credit their remarkable growth to several basic factors: (1) Successful adaptation of foreign technology; (2) The energy of the Japanese people; (3) Research. Beneath these three factors lies an intriguing story which has yet to write its final chapter.

The synthetic fibre industry, unlike steel and shipbuilding, is relatively new. The advanced fibres of today were unknown 25 years ago when rayon was the staple product. Today, according to the Japan Chemical Fibre Association, synthetic fibres account for 48.5 per cent of the total chemical fibre output in Japan. A decade ago the figure rose only 3 per cent.

The latest jump has come because of the synthetic fibre industry's new research and development program. This, of course, meant that the industry was forced to improve its production control, automation and new techniques.

### NEW 'SEEDS'

Research was vital at this stage and the industry provided stimulus in new laboratories and research equipment. Today, with a \$2,000,000 basic research laboratory near Tokyo which develops the better part of the fibre to be used in the manufacture of new synthetic fibres, rayon and acetate.

The industry has now reached the point where it is in a position to add underdeveloped nations to the manufacture of their own synthetic fibre industries. Today, research centres in Japan are now opening throughout the world. Such centres include those in Taiwan, Korea, Thailand, Singapore and Ceylon, with several more in the negotiation stage.

## HUGE SUMS FOR RESEARCH EQUIPMENT AND LABORATORIES

Research and development in the synthetic fibre industry has been going on since 1908 and five decades have been required in the production of the fibre. Particularly because of its light weight, tenacity and abrasion ability to spinning.

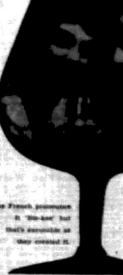

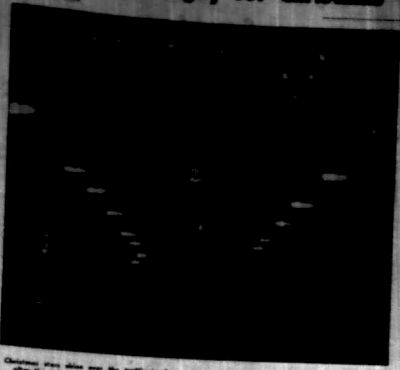

Although many emerging electronic items are being showcased, the bulk of the exhibition is all a further step towards the use of electronics to demystify the advanced electronic equipment and engineering. The exhibition committee said: "We want to present a picture of the latest engineering and show what progress is being made in the world."

The Kenya Police stand placed its emphasis on the use of which electronics have in the protection of road vehicles.

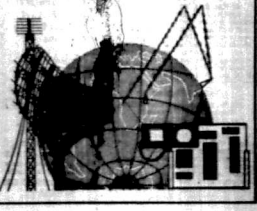

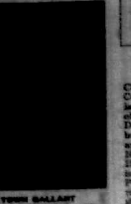

## O.A.U. BRITAIN I-DAY UPHAMATUM Quell rebellion or we end relations

Organisation for African Unity (O.A.U.) Foreign Ministers decided today that Britain had lost sight that if Britain does not crush the Rhodesian régime before December 15 all O.A.U. members would break off diplomatic relations with Britain, an official spokesman said.

As British planes arrived yesterday in Lusaka, for the air defence of Zambia, the Commonwealth Secretary, Mr. Rottley, said there that Britain had rejected President Kaunda's request for troops to be sent to the Rhodesian side of the frontier but was willing to put them into Zambia, break off relations with Britain if she did not prepare the way for a majority government in the state declaration taken at a six-hour secret session of the O.A.U. Council of Ministers.

**No servicing for planes**

The council had decided that all O.A.U. members would immediately completely blockade Rhodesia, so long as it remained under the minority Government.

All economic relations, including commercial agreements and financial aid, with Rhodesia would be suspended immediately, and the Rhodesian Government would be refused all Sterling Area facilities.

It was also decided that overflights would be refused to aircraft going to or from Rhodesia and all servicing facilities would be refused them.

All British Airways air-to-air warfare flights will be suspended. Mr. Rottley said that the British Government would not be asked to provide air defence of the Rhodesian side of the frontier. ## Venue for 1966 international championships

**NEXT** year's East African hockey championships will be held in Nairobi on August 6, 7 and 8 or December 16, 17 and 18, it was announced yesterday by the East African Hockey Union which met in Kampala. The first junior international tournament between the four territories will be held in conjunction with the championships. The first set of dates has been suggested as an alternative because Zanzibar will be holding the second British tour of East Africa in December.

The conference, attended by delegates from Kenya, Uganda and Zanzibar, reached several important decisions. Tanganyika, who failed to turn up for this year's championships which ended yesterday, were not represented.

A suggestion that the East African championship be extended to include West and Central African countries was considered. The Kenya delegate, who was elected president of the E.A.H.U. yesterday, Mr. Sukhdar Singh, said that the idea — a "bright one" — was not practicable at the moment.

He said that the extended championship would be run on a annual basis, with the qualifying countries meeting in the final month. Each country could take it in turn to act as the venue. The final rounds could be played in a country agreeable to all the participating teams.

The meeting decided to hold the 1966 international match at the end of this month but to postpone the match until the end of the month.

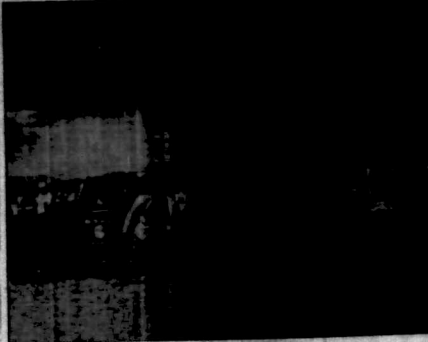
