

NORTHERN TANGANYIKA CRIME DOWN BY 20 PER CENT THIS YEAR

CRIME is still decreasing in Tanganyika's Northern Province, reports the Regional Assistant Commissioner of Police, Mr. J. Maoum. There was a 20 per cent drop in Penal Code offences during the first quarter of this year on the number recorded in the last three months of 1953.

There is a proportionate decrease in traffic deaths during the period, but the number of cases jumped greatly however, reflecting increasing attention on the Highway Traffic Code, which came into force in the quarter. In the first three months, 200 convictions were made in connection with the Motor Vehicle Act, 1949, and 100 for the Traffic Code. Mr. Maoum said that the decrease in crime was due to the fact that the police force was larger and more efficient than in 1953.

UGANDA READY TO WELCOME THE QUEEN

Royal Salute at Entebbe Airport

FLÁGS FLY FROM DAILY DECORATED BUILDINGS

UGANDA is ready to give a Royal welcome to the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh when they arrive by plane today to Entebbe for their three-day visit to the Protectorate. Flags and bunting are flying in Kampala, Entebbe and Jinja and in many other centres.

The Royal visitors are due to land at Entebbe Airport at 10 o'clock, having flown from Aden. They will be met by the Governor, Sir Andrew Cohen, the Secretary of State in Charge, East Africa, General Sir George Clarke, a Royal Salute of 21 guns will be fired on their arrival.

For the three days which the Queen and the Duke will spend in Uganda they have a full programme of engagements at Entebbe and Jinja. They will also visit the Queen Elizabeth National Park and the Queen will open the Owen Falls Hydro-Electric Station.

On Friday night they will fly from Entebbe for Tobruk where, on board the Royal yacht Britannia, they will join their children, Prince Charles and Princess Anne, for the voyage home at the end of their triumphant Commonwealth tour.

Before she left the Gorths at Aden, the Queen honoured many of the officers and crew who have taken her on the 19,000-mile journey from Jamaica since November. She knighted the Master, Capt. David Aitchison, and in the presence of the K.C.V.O., Mr. Aitchison, presented him with the order to "knight the mainbrace".

When the Queen and the Duke went ashore at Aden yesterday, they drove in an open car through streets lined with cheering Arabs in colourful robes. Standing in front of a statue of Queen Victoria, the Queen took salute in a spectacular military parade which included armoured cars, tanks, armoured cars, and a camel troop of Protectorate levies, the Somali Scouts and the Bedouin Legion.

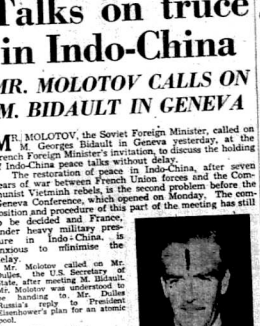

SHIPPING experts from 20 countries have wired their Governments for instructions on whether Communist China should be invited to attend their talks in London on oil pollution of the sea.

2,000 more go to Langata Camp

ATTENTION LABOUR AFRICA

The United Nations Economic Commission has drawn attention to the view of a system of forced labour of significant importance in South Africa. A resolution sponsored by the United States and the United Kingdom was adopted by the Commission last week. It calls for the abolition of forced labour in all countries.

The Commission's report states that the use of forced labour is a violation of the principles of the United Nations Charter. It calls for the immediate cessation of such practices and for the establishment of a system of voluntary labour.

DEVELOPMENT OF SISAL INDUSTRY HIT BY PRICE FALL Drought affects output

PROLONGED drought affected the 1953 East African sisal output and is likely to reduce output in the 1954 output, while the reduction in price is substantially reducing final development. These comments are contained in the annual report of the executive committee of the Tanganyika Sisal Growers' Association, which was approved at the annual meeting of the association at Tanga.

It is interesting to note that the income reported from Tanganyika sisal exports has risen between 1951 and 1953 and declined between 1953 and 1954, on an average of 80 per cent per acre. The income of the sisal industry in Tanganyika in 1953 was £2,000,000 compared with a contribution of £1,000,000 in the 1954. Total output of 1954 is expected to be £1,000,000.

During the year 1953 the price on a U.K. set basis varied between 10s. 6d. and 12s. 6d. for No. 1 grade sisal. The price received for sisal in the U.K. was £18 at the beginning of the year, and £20 at the end of the year.

At the 27th meeting of the Customs return in Tanganyika, the total value of sisal exports for the year 1953 was £2,000,000, compared with £1,000,000 in 1952.

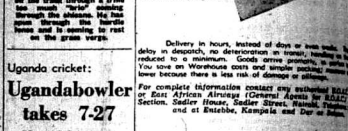

Kenya's gold industry

future gloomy PRODUCTION OF MINERALS DOUBLED IN TEN YEARS

NO DEPOSITS NEEDED TO HALT DECLINE

Prospects of Kenya's gold industry are no longer and, unless minerals discovered are discovered, is expected that the industry will decline over the next few years. Gold is getting harder to find and discovery is more expensive to exploit.

More than 20 years ago, after the discovery of the Malakani Goldfield in 1933, Kenya was the first African country to produce gold. A world trade depression in connection with an agricultural recession in Kenya caused the end of the more advanced.

In a few months the number of prospectors and holders of prospecting licences had fallen to the bare bones.

Companies followed the same path and within a few years the gold industry in Kenya had become a well-remembered name in the history of the country.

The production of minerals in Kenya during the past ten years has doubled, and in 1953 the value of mineral production reached the figure of £1,591,270 which is well over 1,000,000 more than the 1942 figure.

This is due to an increase on the ground and mineral resources which is being made by the Chief Geologist of Kenya, Mr. William Puffer.

The chief economic minerals of Kenya are soda products, salt, mullite produced from kyanite, carbon dioxide and diatomite, but numerous other minerals are available.

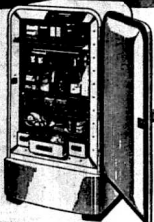

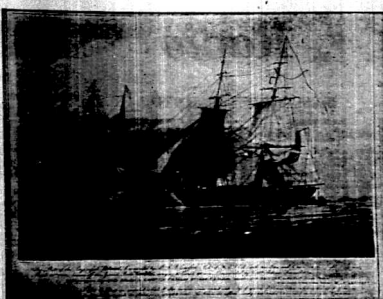

detailed study and classification. A small selection of the Museum's collection, covering but a range of items from the prehistoric to the present, has been arranged in the premises of the University College's Department of Archaeology at Legon.

It is only a provisional exhibition; soon a permanent building is to be put up at Legon with funds provided by the University College, in which the public will be able to see a much larger collection with the general theme of "Man in Africa."

Later, it is hoped to supplement the national character galleries in other parts of the country which will concentrate on local antiquities.

Another puzzle has been provided by a large number of shaped quartz stones, each of which was deliberately pierced through the centre. One theory is that these stones formed a type of currency, although the suggestion can only be regarded as a guess.

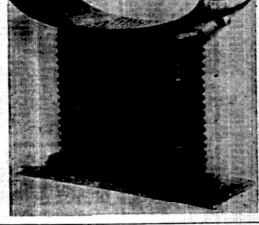

FIFTY YEARS ROLLS

FIFTY years ago this May, two men met in Manchester. From this meeting came a household name and a 20th-century synonym for excellence—Rolls-Royce.

Henry Royce, an electrical engineer, came up the hard way, helping to support the family of ten years of age. He worked, studied and saved—alternately and together—until he accumulated the money and a genius for improving existing machinery which it applied him. His urge to improve led to motor cars.

Three cars

With little knowledge of cars and none of their manufacture, he set about making three factories needed for motor cars. He worked with him, making adapting, experimenting, and testing. Much of the precision work Royce handled himself.

On April 1, 1904, the first car was ready. A pull up on the starting handle and it started. An independent electric motor with a car at that time. This early starting was made due to the electrical system which Royce devised.

The Hon. Charles Stewart Rolls, selected at Eton and Cambridge, was the third son of Lord Langdale. The family had a large estate in Lancashire, a town house in London and a country house in Devon-England. It was Charles Rolls he took a degree in Mechanics and Applied Science and became one of the most knowledgeable and daring of pioneer motorists at the turn of the century.

In France

His motor car was built in 1904, when he was 17. His father took him abroad to France, England, where a few "noiseless curries" traveling along the highways at four miles per hour revealed a masterpiece of engineering and art. Rolls heard of a "Rolls" in France, who had built a car with a 12-h.p. motor without restrictive speed limits and the hostility of police and magistrates.

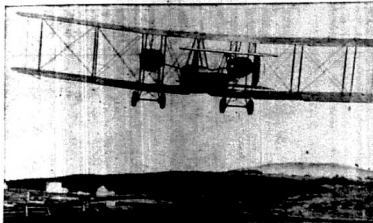
