THOUSAND KIKUYU TO FIGHT MAU MAU Organised bands sweep Aguthi REBELLION IN REVERSE - VERY SIGNIFICANT

SEVEN thousand Kikuyu men, women and children in the Aguthi Location of the South Nyeri Reserve yesterday rose in relation against Mau Mau gangs who for more than two years have terrorised their action was issued by the Government last night.

Armed with sticks, pangas and other weapons, they reported in organised bands to their nearest Kikuyu Guard posts and declared that they had come to "seek out" Mau Mau in the Location.

While members of the Kenya Regiment serving in the area and police officers stood by in readiness to assist, the largest and most of the Kikuyu were soon in operation. Walking line abreast, the Kikuyu caught other Africans wearing Aguthi. As they surged forward, other Africans wearing their tracks.

No contacts were made with the gangsters. Reports suggest that they had been scared away by news of the Mau Mau uprising against Mau Mau.

Surrender of 'murder gangs' still accepted

MR. BLUNDELL'S VIEWS

A gang of murderous men offered to surrender on condition that their lives were spared, the only right course would be to accept the surrender, Mr. M. Blundell, Member for Central Kenya, told Kenya Legislative Council during the debate on the motion by Group Captain L. E. Briggs (Mount Kenya) "deploring the initiation of talks with Mau Mau."

After a two-hour discussion, the Council approved an amendment which requested that the campaign against the terrorists should be continued relentlessly until they were defeated, but recognizing that the possibility of surrenders must be dealt with in the light of the circumstances at the time. (The earlier part of the debate was reported yesterday.)

Law and order priority

Mr. C. B. Madan (Order Member for Central Kenya) said those who opposed the amendment should have suggested some means by which the priority job of a Government in any country was to maintain law and order, and it was wrong for any Government to be "peddled of false prestige."

He was surprised to hear earlier speakers in the debate against the negotiations merely because there was no provision for the Government. The Government should take advantage of any measure that promises itself and should even clutch at straw, if there was a possibility of the starting law. He thought that many would respect the Government for holding its principle not to hand "China" even after the negotiations "failed". He denied that there had been any betrayal of an important article.

'Have terrorists' numbers'

Mr. W. H. Awad, African Member for Central Kenya, said Mau Mau leaders had been published too much. They should be called "terrorist No. 1 of Nairobi," etc., and they would have known they were being "terrorist" and not "Generals" or "Ministers" and so on. He thought "China" meant the Government and 99 per cent of Africans were behind the Government in using "China". "Now we are crying over spill the blood" and he pointed to the decision the Government made in the interests of the country and not in the interests of the Mau Mau. He said that the Group Captain Briggs was on his mission, which was to prevent the Mau Mau from spreading its influence in the future. (Shaw Nyirani also spoke.)

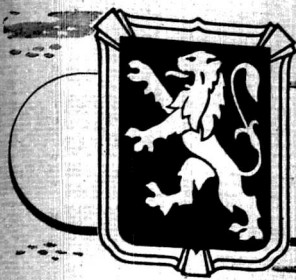

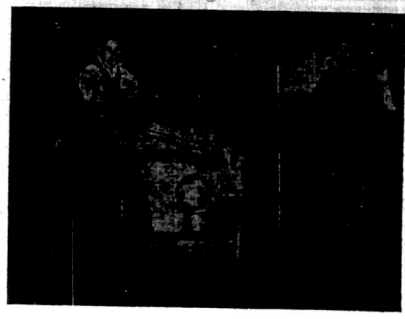
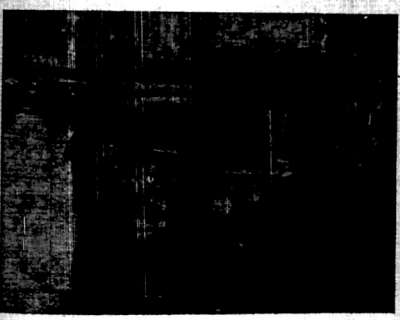

As Chairman of the Policy Committee, Mr. Ball was addressing the final session of the seventh general conference of the International Federation of Agricultural Producers, held for the first time in Nairobi. The organization represents 125,000 farm families in 37 countries.

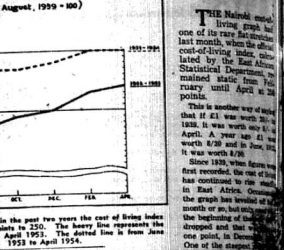

THE South African Treasury does not intend lowering the South African bank rate, Mr. Nicholas Havenga, the Finance Minister, stated in the House of Assembly in reply to a question.

The statement said: "The desire to step up trade with the U.K. and to attract general trade with Britain is one of the main objectives of the Argentine Government's foreign policy."

2,000 Guineas winner is third in a photo-finish

THE Queen, the Duke of Edinburgh, several other members of the Royal Family, Sir Winston Churchill and other Government members were at Epsom yesterday afternoon to see an American-bred colt, Never Say Die, win the 175th renewal of the Derby Stakes run on the first anniversary of the Queen's Coronation. The crowd was smaller than in previous years but saw a thrilling finish.

Never Say Die, a chestnut colt, 2 years old, bred by Mr. R. R. Colwell and trained by Lawrence Johnston, was the first of a rigorous young jockey, Lester Piggott, who rode him to a first classic success.

Never Say Die, a 23-1 shot, struck the front inside the distance and won by two lengths. He was chased home by the boy rider, Archie Wright (owned by Mr. J. Ferguson and ridden by Tony Costley).

A 'might-have-been'

In the opinion of many other racing experts, Never Say Die's victory would have been even more certain had he won in a photo-finish as Sir Percy Selwyn, who was riding for Darius G. Mercer, a neck behind him.

Archie Wright started at 25-1 for Never Say Die. The Northcote-trained runner was the favourite, both starting at 11, and the first to cross the Epsom finish line, with a margin of six lengths.

It was a chilly, dull day and the crowd was the smallest since the race was run on Wellesley road, near the station. The ground was good, slightly on the firm side.

Never Say Die was a popular favourite with many small punters who thought that the Derby colt had a better chance of winning than the American colt, who had just been leading after holding a prominent position at Tattenham Corner.
