

ELECTED MEMBERS REACH KEY AGREEMENT

Understanding for unity on big issues

INDEPENDENT ACTION ON OTHER MATTERS

WITH one exception, Kenya's European Elected Members yesterday ratified a new "understanding" intended to maintain unity on at least important issues while allowing independent action on other matters.

The agreement was reached after a long session which was presided over by the Members' Association to which all Members would subscribe.

The exception is Col. R. S. Grogan (Nairobi West) who has stated that he will not join the association although he will contribute towards meeting the Nairobi terms. This means that the agreement, endorsed by 13 of the 14 Elected Members, including a three who are now Government Ministers—Mr. M. Blundell, Mr. W. H. Havellock and Mr. L. R. M. Welwood—and four Members who dissatisfied themselves from the Elected Members' Organisation—Lady Chavira, Mrs. M. Cooke, Mrs. J. Pursey Slade and Group Capt. L. R. Briggs.

Disputes recent differences, mainly stemming from the implementation of the Lyttelton Plan. Members have reached common ground between them.

All Members, including Col. Grogan, were asked to contribute to the understanding in maintaining the continuity of the association. The understanding is intended to be a permanent one and will be a guide to the future.

Caution urged on Balkan defence pact

TOBACCO FARMERS DISMAYED BY PRICES AT SALISBURY SALES

From Our Own Correspondent.

AL is gloom in the Fort Jameson area of Northern Rhodesia where tobacco growers, in the Northern Eastern province are hard hit by the tobacco prices which their crop has earned on the auction sales in Salisbury, for Southern Rhodesia.

For many years the Fort Jameson growers have sold their tobacco at a separate or ancillary sale.

This practice was considered to be responsible for the low prices obtained because it was thought that the larger tobacco buyers would not show the same interest in Fort Jameson tobacco as they do in tobacco from Salisbury.

'Fair market value'

On the basis of this understanding the Fort Jameson growers decided to bid in Salisbury and to stop holding a separate auction sale in Salisbury.

The results so far have shown that the tobacco sold at Salisbury is not as well received as they had hoped.

Mr. J. B. Kilgill, the Fort Jameson member in the Northern Rhodesian Legislative Council, described the position this week at a special conference of tobacco growers at Fort Jameson.

"If there is no improvement in the prices offered for our tobacco at Salisbury at least half the growers in the Eastern Province will go out of business and I shall probably lead the procession," he said. "If the buyers in Salisbury are prepared to give a fair market price for tobacco, they can take it in any one."

Better quality

The general situation in the more stable markets where the Fort is a seller has also been affected. A far better tobacco is being sold in the past.

Despite that, the prices offered here are lower than in recent years and also this is the point that hurts most — far lower than the prices offered for Northern Rhodesian tobacco on the same auction sales.

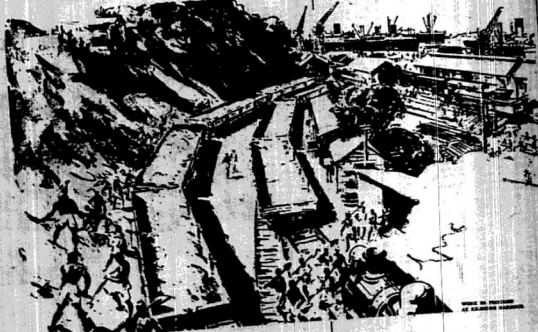

Trade handled by the ports of East Africa has increased in value from £30 million to £240 million in the last ten years. Imports are now more than double the pre-war average.

To serve this ever-growing volume of trade new harbours are being constructed, new berths built and port facilities improved.

At Kilindini, giant earth-moving machines are cutting back the surrounding cliffs to make space for new storage sheds. Millions of tons of earth and stone are being used to build a new lighterage wharf and a new causeway connecting the island with the mainland, where two future major extensions to the port will be sited. Two new deepwater berths are under construction and will be in operation next year. Plans for two more have already been drawn up.

All these new developments will increase by 50% the cargo-handling capacity of the port of Mombasa.

INTER-RACIAL SCHOOLS: 'WAIT AND SEE' ADVICE Folly to force the pace

ADVICE to wait and see was given to inter-racial education facilities worked out before taking any steps to force the pace was given in Kenya Legislative Council yesterday by the Minister of Education, Mr. J. M. Storr.

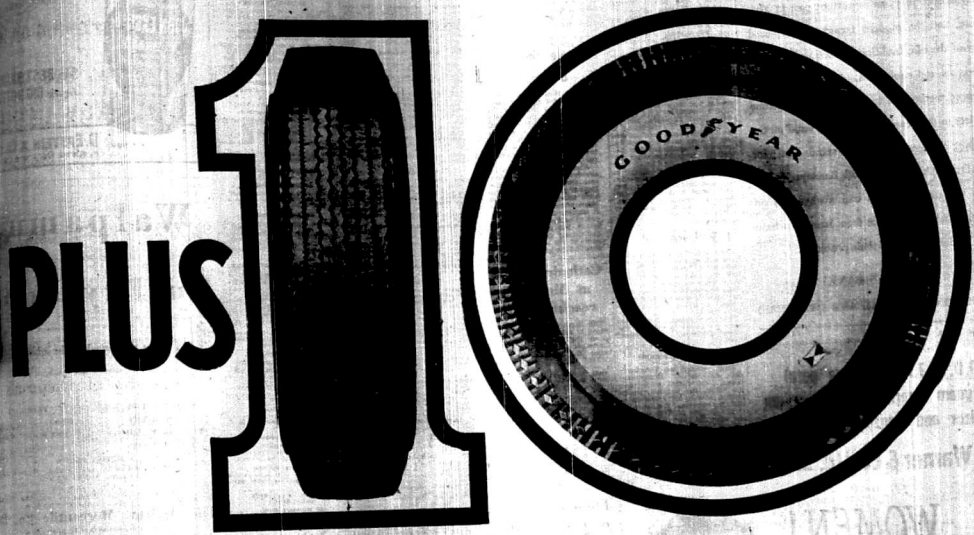

DIFFICULTIES of loyal Kikuyu chiefs and headmen were described by Chief Robinson and nine Loyalists during a fortnight's tour in Kiambu in the presence of Mr. Mboya and other African local government officials.

SHARP FALL IN TEXTILE TRADE

'Black Pact' blamed: East African imports down

By Mr. Kenneth Brockway, the Head of 14 British cotton companies, is urging the Government to amend the trade provisions of the Anglo-Japanese Payments Agreement—the so-called "Black Pact"—in the interests of Lancashire and the Colonies. "Otherwise," he says, "it can foresee disaster."

Mr. Brockway said that no cotton goods had been sold to Uganda in the first four months of this year, "because of the boycott on British goods."

He claims that the position is just as in Kenya, because of the "Black Pact." Mr. Brockway quotes figures in Kenya how British cloth and textile exports have been hit by the "Black Pact" in 1952. Britain sold £6,000,000 worth of cotton and rayon to Kenya, in 1952, £2,000,000 in 1953, and nothing in 1954. The Japanese had stepped in and secured an agreement by means of the "Black Pact."

Taxes halting development in Colonies

British taxation is preventing the setting up of companies to develop mineral resources and industry, the Royal Commission on Taxation of Profits and Income was told in London. Mr. A. C. Davies, giving evidence before the British Government Accounting Association said that 20,000 new companies had not been set up in Britain since 1934.

There are really three really different tax systems in the United Kingdom, Davies said. It is most unlikely that any further companies will be registered here, he added. The Association held the view that "every penny and dividend should be taxed only in the country of origin."

If the companies could not recommend tax changes, most companies would leave Britain, the Association suggested, "to enable revenue, and a percentage depreciation allowance."

Shots fired at editor's car

Two shots were fired at a car driven by Mr. Mervyn Hill, editor of the Kenya Weekly News, on the Nakuru-Moi road, near Hill, who was unhurt, near Nakuru in a similar incident some months ago.

"At about the same time and at about the same place, Mr. Hill heard a shot and dashed. A second shot missed over his shoulder and through the rear window of the car, but he was driving. An armed African police constable accompanied him on the return journey."

Sentences not affected by 'influence'

M. LYTTLETON denied

M. LYTTLETON denied in the House of Commons that influence had been brought to bear to secure the release of certain Africans sentenced to death in Kenya. He told Mr. Fenner Brockway (Labour) that 566 Africans had been sentenced to death in the Colony in the 12 months which ended on April 30. In 269 cases the sentences had been commuted.

Mr. Brockway said there was grave doubt over the sentences. "But there are not cases where influence had brought about the release of certain men, while others—in exactly similar circumstances—had been sentenced to death?"

Mr. Lyttleton replied: "I do not accept in any way the last part of the question. Of course, the prerogative of mercy has been used and certain appeals have been allowed, but I am not saying to you that anything is to do with influence."

Shepa Tensing for Swiss course

Tensing Norzay, the Sherpa who with the Edmund Hillary reached the top of Everest a year ago, has left Bombay for Vienna to take a course at the Swiss Alpine Club. He will be in immediate attendance there before becoming chief instructor of the Alpine Institute of Mountaineering and Research to be set up in London later this year. (Hester)

INCENTIVES FOR AFRICANS TO FIGHT MAU MAU

Mr. Lyttleton, in the House of Commons of new incentives being offered to Africans to fight the Mau Mau.

Mr. Lyttleton said: "Of course we will do anything and offer what I would agree that if we lead a military life at the start of jobs, I have mentioned are essential if we are to return to normal conditions."

Arrests total 424 in East Bengal

The number of arrests in East Bengal since the formation of the Provincial Government has risen to 424 yesterday.

An East Bengal Government communiqué said the situation in the Province continued to remain quiet.

The Pakistan Prime Minister, Mr. Mohammed Ali, quoted the Ministry of War, Fakhri Hossain, as saying that in the final analysis this would be the only way to win over the better element.

CONFERENCE TO URGE MORE INTENSIVE USE OF MANPOWER

DEMANDS for a more intensive use of manpower in the light against Mau Mau will be made at the two-day conference of European organisations which opens in the Memorial Hall, Nairobi, on Monday morning.

One of a series of resolutions passed at the meeting of the Men in general and administrative staffs of the Mau Mau forces should be progressively intensified. The use of full use should be made of untrained persons, specially qualified persons with special qualifications, and of women.

It is intended that the agenda should be modified to emphasise matters, without detracting from the details of general policy, arrangements under the terms of the conference later in the year.

COMMONS REJECTS DEPORTATION BILL

Defeat for Mr. Fenner Brockway

MR. FENNER BROCKWAY was refused leave to introduce a Private Members' Bill in the House of Commons to provide for the deportation of British subjects being deported without trial or restricted in British colonies, protectorates and trusteeship territories without a preceding trial.

Mr. Brockway referred to the case of Mr. Joseph Kiwanuka, Vice-President of the National Congress in Uganda, who had been transported to the Northern Territory of Uganda, and was detained "without any trial or without any public trial."

Other resolutions deal with the protection of schools, the detention of African women, and detention of African women.

Own responsibility

Mr. Brockway said it was his belief that in British subjects in British territories in the same way, the whole of the Press would have protested against the "repulsive" nature of the principles of British citizenship.

He said that it would be wrong to try to expatriate or restrict the rights of British subjects in British territories without a preceding trial except in circumstances of war or violent strife.

A Conservative, Mr. Hilton Foster, opposed the introduction of the Bill. The Minister of the Interior, Mr. Mervyn Hill, said that the Bill was not in the interests of the colonies and that it would be a mistake to introduce it.

Officer's firm denial

No knowledge of alleged burning

MR. MICHAEL J. SAWYER, British Consul in Nairobi, has given a firm denial to a report that he had been called on to investigate the alleged burning of a house in Nairobi, Kenya, on the night of May 29. 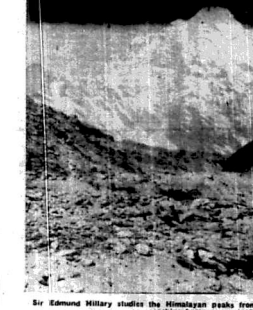

Tropical Development And Its Problems

THERE is no race or people in that has contributed more to the world's progress than the white man. However, it may be a completely different one from our own—but ours is so large and keeps us so busy that we are apt to overlook what others can do for us. This lack of imagination on our part sometimes does us more harm than good. I know of some of our present troubles which I think they can arise from this. The trouble is often forgotten by those who do not think that they can do anything but what we have done. It is not gone away in our relationship with the people.

Now there is today a great deal of talk about economic development and because we are in the West have a great deal of technical skill and know-how, we are often tempted to believe that we can draw on our own resources and make them into economic development in which the people of these countries, owing to their culture and their history, generally speaking lack the necessary technical skills and the means of industrial organization, which are needed for human survival.

Exploit resources WITH increasing world population, every country must exploit its natural resources in order to survive, and if the people have to lack the knowledge to do so, someone else must do it. It is, someone else must produce the risk capital, the engineers or agricultural experts, and train the manpower.

Separate but... I think about when planning economic development for your workers. Again, you must have to take into account the housing of families in some places and young and even children who will have separate but...
