Change-over since start of century

While people of tropical Africa are in the process of a transition from almost complete dependence on subsistence activities to participation in various forms of money-earning, according to a United Nations survey published in New York yesterday. The purpose of the study was to investigate "certain aspects of the indigenous economies" of the area.

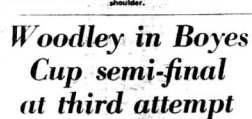
