Deputation Suggestion TO DISCUSS AGRICULTURAL DEBT WITH SECRETARY OF STATE

Lord Francis gave the policy of the Elected Members, and suggested that Major Grogan (M.P. for the Coast) should go to London to represent the Kenya settlers' views on the proposed Bond Issue Scheme. Lord Francis said he would continue to support the Government, but that he himself should also go to London with Major Grogan.

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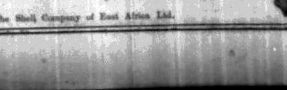
