CHURCHES AND EAST AFRICA BY £21,000

COMMUNITY centres and social organizations in Kenya and Uganda received about £21,000 in the year ended September 30 of the Inter-Church Aid and Welfare Service of the British Council in London.

The amount, in its annual report, is the largest since the record sum of over £12,000 was spent during the year throughout the East.

In Kenya, £10,000 went to help grant work of social welfare and community centres as well as the continued assistance of the Christian Council of the East African Churches. A £10,000 grant was given to a community centre and a subsidiary of a Y.M.C.A. worker.

Future work

The report says some £100,000 will be spent in 1954 on the construction of new centres, and it will be used to purchase non-profit-making centres of religious, educational, and social welfare.

It says the report says: "As some months more towards independence an urgent need to train African workers appears to be felt. It is hoped that the Government will be able to help in this regard by training African workers on such lines as health, hygiene, education, family life and community work."

"Political developments will also have a bearing on the situation and it is in this aspect that the indigenous churches are being helped to do a significant work in Africa."

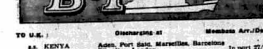

GARDENS PROVIDE BEAUTIFUL SETTING AS BUILDINGS RACE INTO CITY SKY

VISITORS driving along Princess Elizabeth Way see it, so do the Africans in the background and now and again all Nairobi residents notice the effort that has been made by the Parks Department to create a beautiful setting for the concrete structures that are racing each other into the sky.

The heart of the effort is City Park, which contains the planning department and the nurseries. The team of men who have the ideas, and supervise their execution, is headed by Mr. Peter Greenwith, Parks Superintendent, who has been working with the City Council for 18 years.

His second in command is Mr. B. L. Perkins, who is also president of the Kenya Orchid Society. Before coming to Kenya 11 years ago, he worked at the Royal Botanical Gardens at Kew, where he first met Mr. Greenwith.

The planner and general supervisor of development is Mr. E. V. H. Rolly, who has been working for the Parks Department for the past five years after gaining experience at Kew and the Brighton Corporation.

The officer in charge of City Park itself is Mr. C. S. Huggan, who has been there for ten years now.

Mr. Huggan is in charge of the chief development group in the nurseries and is Mr. F. A. Brown, who has been with the department for 8 1/2 years.

GOLDENSH POND

Except for the superintendent's office, which is near his house in the Park and was built in 1925, the nurseries were built in 1925. The reason for this is because there is a golden pond in the nurseries, which is known as the Golden Pond.

Mr. Rolly's office is distinguished by a secretary constructed mobile superstructure from the ceiling.

The workshops are connected to the main building and can accommodate 100 cars and can employ 100 men.

The nurseries are managed by Mr. Huggan. His own mansion and carpenter's workshop are situated near the nurseries.

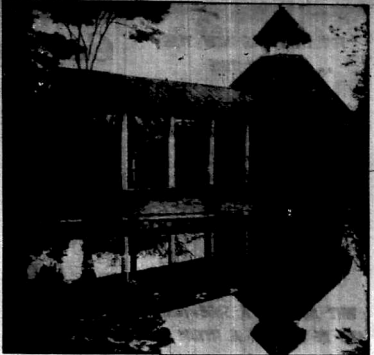

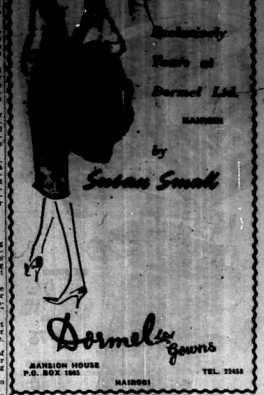

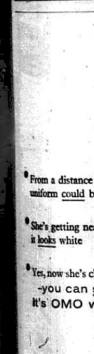

THE coffee tree is an exacting plant. It will not tolerate either very high temperatures or very low ones, preferring a mean annual temperature of about 70 deg. F. It will not flourish in an area where rainfall is less than 50 inches or more than 70 inches a year. Coffee grows best in soils of volcanic origin, which must be deep, rich and well aerated. And so that the coffee leaves can be pulled immediately after ripening there must be a plentiful and dependable water supply near at hand.

It is important, too, that it is not situated in an area growing rapidly which is subject to heavy frost. And so that the coffee leaves can be pulled immediately after ripening there must be a plentiful and dependable water supply near at hand.

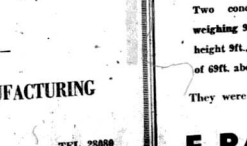

Project required architects with unusual exercise in civic design

IN A PICKERING OF NORBURN, BROWNING AND PICKERING, THE ARCHITECTS WPCO DESIGNED THE MILL BUILDINGS

It was only in our study of the architectural problem that it was evident that the mass of the buildings required for the site would constitute an exercise in civic design which would be very necessary for all the professional designers to work in the closest co-operation to achieve the result.

The basic overall development plan was for a stores block and a milling block to be built as a first stage at the north end of the site, to be followed in the future by further stores and milling blocks, incorporating the site of the

centres of the building at this level. At the stage of development, office accommodation, canteens and other ancillaries were provided within this building.

The mill management staff and all the present time centres are being constructed for the African labour superstructure. Temporary canteen structures are being incorporated into the dust extraction plant. All the ware block included in the mill design is to be constructed at the same time as the future stores.

WINDOWS SCREENED

At the principal elevation is to the South-west we decided to screen the windows externally with horizontal concrete covers to keep the interior of the store cool and also to protect the stacked coffee from sudden driving rain.

The windows occupy the whole of the spaces between structural members to allow maximum light and ventilation for varying arrangements of coffee which is stacked at a calculated angle against the supports.

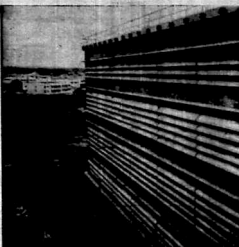
The South Mill Block which has started on practical completion of the stores block is also more complex. There is a platform and levels for the milling machinery.

GLAZED PANELS

Because of these varying levels it was impractical to screen the main elevations in the same way as the stores block and we decided upon completely glazed curtain walling panels, so the entire face of the structure, in removable

Sections to allow machinery to be taken in and out of the building during installation and in the event of future changes. The mechanical engineers report should have the minimum of destruction and, in conjunction with the structural engineers, we decided that the building could be most economically roofed in three bays each half acre, all free of internal columns. Each of these bays has four thin reinforced concrete hyperbolic paraboloid structural members with an interesting internal and external appearance.

The stores and mill blocks are connected to one another at top level by four concrete bridges and also by a precast concrete cover bridge.

The buildings are constructed of reinforced concrete and have wearing mainly fair-faced concrete and granolithic floor with steel protection to all salient angles.

'DOLLAR BATTLE' RESTRICTIONS RECALLED

Reports of one of the coffee auctions held regularly in New Haven, Hawaii.

SMOOTH FLOW

Encouraged by the board in its desire to provide an organized market, the Coffee Trade Association of Kenya came into being in 1954 and until 1957 the association was represented on the floor by two trade members.

After 1957, the latest standing committee of the two bodies comprised the former members for the discussion of common problems.

After the formation of a trade association no time was wasted by the board in establishing Kenya Coffee Auctions which were taking to everyone the marketing of coffee.

Rules and regulations were drawn up acceptably to the board and the association to provide for the smooth sale of planter coffee into the hands of licensed dealers.

Kenya Coffee Auctions Ltd. (a) to sell by public auction, (b) to sell by private sale, (c) to provide a liquidating agent, (d) And to provide market facilities.

To this day, 22 years later, the function of Kenya Coffee Auctions remains basically the same although the administration of the original plan has changed.

SUSPEND CONTROL

This change was brought about by the ready support afforded to the board's market plan by planters and the incentive with to consign coffee to London despite the recommendation of the majority of the board of the very selective London market.

After a period which was now history, the board decided to suspend control over the Coffee Auctions in the hope that it might improve operations until it would be worth making the improvement was immediate.

Now run privately by the original manager, the offer of the trade was more enthusiastic.

As a result of negotiations which were being conducted between certain members of the trade and the chairman of the board, Mr. C. J. Valentine, who was then working in the Eastern African interest at the Empire Exhibition, Johannesburg, returned to Nairobi to assume the interest of the Coffee Auctions in March 1957.

In that year, the Governor of Kenya opened the Nairobi Coffee Exchange, which eventually established the Nairobi market, we hope for all time.

The Auctions have grown both in turnover and in reputable organized market which have called a model of its kind. Expenses are low and no other growth of Africa exist.

their support from neighbouring territories; more buyers arrived or appointed local agents.

This meant that in a very short time there was no corner of the world which could not buy from an exporter of its own choosing for direct shipment from Mombasa.

Kenya's commercial and quick payment attracted the planter from districts imposed by the trade assured a sound market and the surplus of the Auctions was assured.

The Nairobi market progressed slowly but satisfactorily under conditions were normal which was for a period of some 14 months when it was closed with all problems of distribution and administration.

Mr. C. J. Valentine, the proprietor of Kenya Coffee Auctions, already at that time an officer in the Kenya force,

was called up and an arrangement had been made to acquire the services of Mr. J. J. Clark of Seattle, Hartley and Co. of London.

To meet the new and serious situation, the board resolved to suspend the operation of the 'Dollars' Board.

It was agreed that an independent parts of the industry, from London, should be controlled on the best possible basis of assisting the survival of the coffee industry.

In the subsequent planning, Kenya Coffee Auctions were appointed to handle the sale of coffee and to fit coffee for sale to the requirements of 'buyers' contracts.

The flow in the Coffee

Board was responsible to the control for the classification of the crop and Mr. Clark arrived in Nairobi in time to join in the general task presented by the institution of control.

Sales by auction were not contemplated but by the sale of the crop and by the sale of Kenya Coffee Auctions.

With the end of the war the need for control waned but it all through had been there to the virtue of stabilizing some steps of single-auction marketing in the shape of a Coffee Marketing Board and the was in fact in being by February 1948.

In due course, Kenya Coffee Auctions became buyers and auctioneers under contract to the new Coffee Marketing Board. The marketing of coffee was then subject to that appointment ever since.

FORWARD SALES

During the years there was interesting and varied schemes applied with definite objects in mind and as examples, in 1948 a contract of coffee was sold to the local trade the shipment of which was restricted to South Africa and in 1950, British Columbia was offered subject to its being sold to the United States and Canada with permission to be made from the other countries of 'free' countries.

Also a scheme provided for the allocation of certain coffee to the Ministry of Food, London.

Later, in order to give a start to a season and to provide a definite sale of a percentage of crop before marketing 'free world sales' were made by the Marketing Board to dealers.

All of these undertakings were conducted through Kenya Coffee Auctions. They meant extra work, but always intelligent work.

By the removal of controls and the introduction of Auctions returned at the accepted method of disposal of the total crop and there seems to be no good reason, in normal times, why they should not continue.

IN 30 YEARS

Two events in 1952 are worth noting. Firstly, the firm changed from a partnership to an incorporated limited liability company and, secondly, Mr. Clark and Mr. Valentine, who had been partners for 15 years, were joined by the latter's son, Mr. A. Valentine.

Providing support

MR. JOHN ASSER **MR. L. W. MITCHELL**

There have been planter agents since the very early days of the coffee industry. At that time there was no central marketing organization such as the present Coffee Marketing Board and agents were responsible for the actual sale of their clients' crops.

Although that function is now carried out by the Coffee Marketing Board it is generally recognized by both the planters and the Board that agents still have a most important part to play in the industry.

QUALITY POINT

Among the most services provided by the agents probably the most important, and certainly the one most valued by the planter, is the provision of finance on the security of the crop.

The need for financial backing is felt by planters most during the picking season when expenses are heavy and no other growth of Africa exist.

The price which the planter

receives for his coffee depends largely on its quality and the premiums obtained for quality are substantial.

The agent who is generally a qualified farmer, can often draw the attention of his client to the causes of inferior quality.

The Marketing Board classifies all coffee received from planters and that classification is in fact, an assessment of quality upon which payment is based. The higher the classification the agent receives samples of his client's coffee and if he considers that the coffee warrants a higher classification an appeal is lodged with the Coffee Marketing Board, otherwise it is revised classification.

ONE of the major coffee-producing organizations in the world which incidentally demonstrates the confidence of Kenya, is the Society of Modern Africanists, better known as the Socimat Co. Ltd., which has had holdings totalling 39,900 acres in the Rift Valley and Dandenong Gabbler areas.

The visitor to the company's estates is immediately struck by the predominant note of modernity and efficiency: the clean lines of the up-to-date office block, the carefully maintained estate factories and machinery and the well-lighted houses for the European and African staff.

In the day offices, situated around the inevitable headquarters of healthy coffee trees, trained African personnel keep track of operations on cultivating machines and through streamlined filing systems, and graphs on the walls give up-to-the-minute information on rainfall and other vital factors.

WEEK-END STANDARD PERMANENT WAY' LED EAST AFRICA TO PROSPERITY

By Anthony Lavers

NEW documentary films on East Africa have been made with so stimulating a theme as Permanent Way, the film version of Mervyn Hill's classic history of the building of East African Railways and the development of three countries which followed it.

East African Railways and Harbours and Colfax the joint producers, plan to project the essential elements of Mr. Hill's two major works. These books are standard works not only on the Railway, but on modern East African history.

They cover the whole wide canvas of East African economic and social development. A generation is growing up in East Africa who cannot visualize these difficulties which faced the pioneer engineers who were solving problems of the pioneer.

It is difficult to appreciate the enormity which led to the construction of the railway, the most important of which was the need for modern communications to aid the civilization of the vast continent of Africa. The international conference which was held in London in 1890 had stipulated the building of railway systems as a essential means to this end.

Food areas provide for expanding home population

From Australia's rich orchards pour vast quantities of fruit, apples, pears, peaches, oranges, pineapples and many others. In wonderful profusion, from her farms and cattle stations her people draw an increasing food supply of wheat, mutton, beef and dairy products.

NEW POWDER HAS MORE DIETIC VALUE THAN WHOLE MILK

Australian scientists have found a method of converting skimmed milk into a vitamin-enriched powder which has greater dietetic value than whole milk.

The powder, now in steady production, is unlike milk powders of the past in that it is easily soluble.

The product is the result of co-operation between private industry and the Australian Government's Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation.

Secret of the process is the introduction of vitamins which have hitherto been missing from milk with powder.

In one of the numerous tests, C.S.I.R.O. scientists found that the powder retained 92 per cent of its original potency after being stored for six months at a constant temperature of 10° C. This proved two points: That a method had at last

been found to add vitamins A and D to skimmed milk so that the nutritional value equaled that of whole milk. And that the synthetic milk was ideal for tropical regions.

As vitamin A is a perfect protection against malnutrition the powder is ideal for areas where fresh milk is not available.

Another outstanding advantage of the new powder, for such areas, too, is that the powder dissolves instantly in cold water without mechanical action.

Dried milk, a previously popular means of a powder, has a tendency to settle. But on the surface of the water or heavy lumps they become wadded, unless given strong mechanical agitation.

In the new process, particles are much smaller and they disperse without stirring in cold water. The powder is a perfectly reconstituted milk.

The granulated size is then dried and ready for packaging—all in less than 30 seconds.

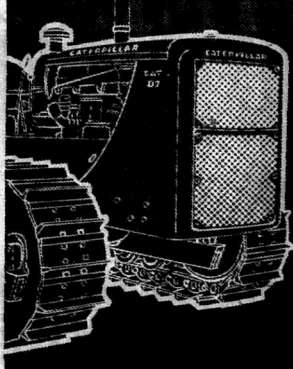
