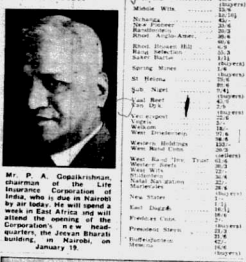

Outside experts' plan urged for Kenya

A NATIONAL economic plan for Kenya should be formulated with all speed by a mission of experts drawn from outside the Colony, on the lines of the Harro Mission to the High Commission...

This is one of the suggestions of a member of the Fabian Commonwealth Bureau in London, Mr. T. P. Betts, who has prepared what is described as a "blueprint document" on the Kenya land question.

The mission, it is claimed, must of necessity include a representative of the food and Agriculture Organisation since United Nations funds are likely to be involved, and an expert on co-operative in view of the importance of the agricultural development to agriculture.

Mr. Betts suggests the mission should be asked to make recommendations on such matters as the optimal maximum and minimum different crops and the allocation of finance and arable services between the Highlands and the African areas.

It should also be asked to make proposals regarding the maintenance of land values in the Highlands, the security of existing leasehold and land tenure property generally.

A multi-racial committee of the Executive Council, representing the Government, should be set up to advise on agricultural policy and to coordinate legislative and financial provisions required to implement it.

It is stressed that it was too late to halt the enactment of legislation now in draft, the Kenya Government should be urged to proceed with without action on the Government of Kenya Bill.

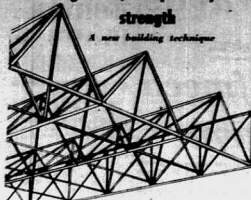

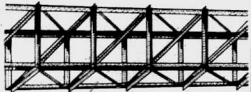

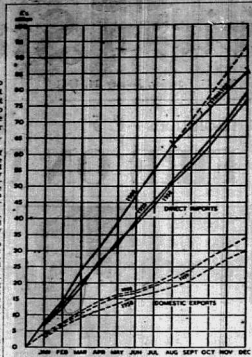
