





SERIOUS FIRE AT THE KENYA GRAIN MILLS

MYSTERY OF RIVER ROAD EXPLOSION Enquiry into Indian Youth's Death.

Inquiries into the cause of the serious fire at the Kenya Grain Mills, Eldoret, were suspended yesterday by the police, who said they had no definite information to give.

When the fire broke out at about 10 p.m. yesterday, the factory was working at full capacity, turning out flour for the Indian market.

At 11 p.m. the factory was closed down and the workers were sent home. At 12.30 a.m. there was a loud explosion, followed by a series of smaller ones.

Mr. Powell and Mr. T. J. T. Smith, who was the first to arrive at the scene after the fire, found that there was still smoke coming from the building.


