## THE BY-ELECTION IN NAIROBI NORTH.

Nomination Date Likely to be End of February.

## NO ORGANISATION IN EXISTENCE.

Half a Dozen Names Mentioned as Possible Candidates.

The announcement of a by-election in the Nairobi North constituency following the resignation of the Hon. H. Ward from his seat on the Legislative Council has, so far, created little interest among the electors.

So far as could be ascertained yesterday, there is no permanent body representing the electors of the constituency, and it appears that nominations will be left to individuals rather than to sections holding any particular policy or outlook on public affairs.

## Present Committee.

There is a committee, still in existence, which under took the work in connection with Captain Ward's resignation, but its composition is of supporters of Captain Ward and it is not responsible to those who voted him into office or to those who voted him out.

The necessity for the formation of representative committees to select candidates and present their nominations becomes the more obvious when it is considered that over half a dozen names have been mentioned in connexion with the vacancy.

## Nomination Date.

At the Senatorial yesterday, it was stated that the papers in connexion with the resignation had been sent to His Excellency the Acting Governor, a procedure which must be adopted before preparations are made for the election.

In any case, a period of not less than 42 days must elapse between the date of the termination of office and the date of nomination.

Nomination Day will therefore be somewhere about the end of February.

## REPLY TO A QUERY IN UGANDA.

During the recent session of the Uganda Legislative Council, Mr. J. G. M. Ward, Acting General Manager of Railways, referred to the question of whether the line from the port of Mombasa to the interior of the country would be extended to the Lake Victoria area.

The Acting General Manager has now sent a reply to Mr. H. Ward, who asked the question. He said: "Regarding the means of transport, we can assure you that under the terms under which the Administration works, the Government will not be in a position to incur charges on the part of the line."

On the other hand, the line is open and the working arrangements for a limited time, namely, during the dry season, when the railway company's resources exceed the revenue the line is to receive for the Adminis-

tration. Separate figures have not been given for water rates now collected, but I think it may be £100 per month.

It is the second time that the Acting General Manager has referred to the Secretary of State in regard to the same subject. His previous letter dated January 10, 1923, to the Secretary of State, has de-

scribed as follows:

"The line is to be extended to the interior."

## YOUNG MASAI "WARRIORS" GIVING TROUBLE.

Murders of Neighbouring  
Tribesmen.

"BLOODY SPEARS" CUSTOM.

Extra Police Drafted to Disturbed  
Districts.

Trouble has again broken out in certain areas of the Masai Reserve, where it is believed, by a revival of the custom of the "blooding of spears" by the young men who have recently reached the age of "Morna" or warriors.

During the last few months a number of murders have been committed on the borders of Masailand, the victims being tribesmen of neighbouring tribes. While in most of the cases the perpetrators have not been discovered, it is believed that young Masai "warriors" were responsible. In view of the trouble the vicarious retaliation is attributed as the motive for these crimes.

In view of the position in the Massai area, certain areas of the reserve have officially declared as in a state of unrest, and extra police reinforcements have been drafted to the districts affected. No further trouble is expected, while the tribal elders are not considered to be in any way responsible for the outbreak.

## TRIBES TO PAY FOR POLICE PATROL.

A series of the old Massai trials showed that a young man, known as the "Morna" or warrior, until he had numbered amongst the "elders of his spear," was believed to be at the time of certain incidents in the Massai area, a "warrior" and had caused some concern in official circles. Recently, however, in a letter to the Secretary of State for War, a proclamation by His Excellency the Acting Governor of the Province to the effect that in a disturbed state and that from the members of the native tribes there was no need to have a number of police officers in the area, it was decided that there was no need of lawlessness among the Massai in 1922 following a period of disturbances. 

### MOTORISTS WHO SCARCE THEMSELVES.

Site of the side of a steep main road hill on a fine Sunday afternoon and you will be able to witness a most remarkable sight. You may be struck by the suggestion that for the average lay motorist, given an engine with an air or mass cylinder rated at 10 h.p. or less, there will always be a risk of woman whose very experience does not fit her with the knowledge of appreciation. ## G.P.U. MEETING

A meeting of the Council of the Colony Planners' Union of Kenya was held at the Secretary's Office on Friday, Jan. 4. Mr. A. E. Boulton, Mr. George H. Morris, Mr. George Grey, Miss Ethel Knight, Walsh and the Secretary, Letters of apology were received from Mr. J. C. M. Moses, Mr. R. H. Arches, Mr. F. G. Moore and Mr. Stedman. It was agreed that the annual general meeting should be held on January 11, 1908, at 10.30 a.m. Mr. Boulton was invited and the Secretary was requested to have a special seat for him. Mr. Boulton accepted the invitation to the Annual General Meeting. He was also requested to send his resignation to the Board of Directors of the Colony Planners' Union.

The Secretary also informed Mr. Boulton, Mr. Morris, Mr. Co. and Mr. Grey, putting forward a suggestion to nominate the chairman of the meeting. The chairman informed the meeting that he understood Government proposed to nominate Mr. Boulton as the chairman of the meeting. It was decided to accept the nomination of Mr. Boulton as chairman of the meeting.

Regarding storage of coffee, it was decided that the draft plan forwarded by the Director of Agriculture, and the Director of Trade.

When the subject of disease and pests came under discussion the Secretary informed the meeting that he had been approached by the President to enable the Colonial Service to meet the expenses of the survey of the colony in 1907, with a view to securing financial assistance from the industry. Binding.

Bounding cotton wool for binding. Mr. Boulton, Chairman of Cotton Wool, a leading firm of cotton wool manufacturers, where communications are difficult, is the sole representative of the industry. He believes that, in view of the fact that the industry is now more than half a century old, it is time that the industry should be represented by a committee of its own.

Mr. Boulton was instructed to take this matter further, to ascertain what was needed for this purpose and that it did not necessarily mean an increase in the amount of money required, but rather an increase in the quality of the product.

Mr. Boulton, and others, met Mr. T. H. Tait, the Colonial Secretary, in Nairobi, and the United States of America, and also met him in London, where he stated that the London Market was not able to give fair prices to cotton wool, and that Colons could not get a reasonable price.

The Secretary had written to H. M. Trade, asking him to instruct Dr. W. H. Boulton, the Colonial Secretary, that it was impossible to leave the value of cotton wool to the market.

Op. Quality.

During the discussion on October 26th, Mr. Boulton, Chairman of Cotton Wool, attended. He informed the meeting that while the American Market was not an ideal market, it was an excellent market to pay a price which would make other business enterprises.

He also informed the meeting that the cotton wool market in Nairobi was doing business as the prices quoted in America, without loss.

He suggested that only a small quantity should be shipped to America, and that the rest should be sold locally, and that a good market for immediate purchases.

The question of the railway was discussed, and it was decided to have a delegation to the General Meeting.

The Secretary was instructed to write to Col. Tucker to attend and





