## HILTON YOUNG COMMISSION'S REPORT.

### HIGH COMMISSIONER TO PRECEDE A GOVERNOR-GENERAL.

#### Paramounty of Native Interests an Essential Factor in E. Africa.

#### CHANGES IN KENYA LEGISLATURE.

#### Addition of Four Nominees to Represent Africans and Decrease of Four Official Members.

#### THE IMPERIAL ASPECT OF E.A. PROBLEMS.

The Report of the Hilton Young Commission issued yesterday recommends as a preliminary and immediate step to closer union of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika, the appointment of a High Commissioner with executive powers to inaugurate discussions on native policy, promote union in the control of certain services of common interest and to discuss and work out arrangements for proposed modifications of Kenya Legisla-

ture. As a result of this preliminary work it is further recommended that at the end of a period not specified, the High Commissioner should be replaced by a Governor-General exercising as far as possible the functions of the Secretary of State.

It is proposed that the Governor-General should be assisted by a small Advisory Council, an Intercolonial Advisory Railway Council and an Intercolonial Customs Council. Periodical conferences in London attended by East African delegates, annual reports to Parliament and a small paid Advisory Council are proposals for the Home organization.

No changes are to be present in the Legislatures of Uganda and Tanganyika, although there will be a sub-division of the appointment of a Governor General if it is proposed that four of the official members of the Kenya Legislative Council should be replaced by four nominated unofficial members to represent native interests in addition to the missionary already appointed.

The Commission suggests that consideration be given to the replacement of adult franchise in Kenya by a franchise dependent on a civilisation test and that the ideal to be aimed at is a common roll of an equal franchise with no racial discrimination.

It is further proposed that the whole field of native interests should be clearly defined in order that the scope for developing native franchises can be determined. A co-ordinated native policy for all three territories is urged.

Administration in the Kenya Legislature is accompanied by the proposal for several powers to be given to the supreme authority including power of certification.

In regard to communications it is recommended that the Tanga-Moshi-Arusha Railway and probably the port of Kenya should be managed by the Kenya and Uganda Railway and that the position of the Kenya and Uganda and Tanganyika Railways be examined with a view to joint working.

Government House, Mombasa is proposed as the headquarters of the High Commissioner who will engage into the question of the location of the permanent headquarters of the Governor-General.

The Chairman, Sir Edward Hilton Young dissenting from many of the more important recommendations of the Commission including the alteration in the Kenya constitution.

The present status of Nyasaland and Northern Rhodesia is to be maintained pending further developments of the territories.

#### MOMBASA INITIAL HEADQUARTERS OF CENTRAL AUTHORITY.

The Report of the Committee on Central Authority in Eastern and Central Africa—more commonly known as the Hilton Young Commission—was presented to the Kenyan Government, now the Rt. Hon. Sir Edward Hilton Young, Sir Reginald Schuster, Mr. J. H. D. Polley, Mr. J. R. G. Thompson, Mr. J. H. D. Polley was appointed in November 1927 to inquire into the financial and administrative affairs of the territories of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika. A White Paper issued last year entitled "Native Policy" is referred to Eastern Africa.





### Africans' Growing Realisation of Their Utility.

The Native Affairs Department annual report does not fall into the category of most Government publications with their pages of figures and statistics and attraction only for those who are particularly interested in the activities of respective Departments.

The report is one of general interest and is presented in an interesting manner. It provides the opportunity of learning something about conditions in the reserves, political and general activities, trade and education among the natives, and such institutions as native councils and tribunals.

### AN INTERESTING REPORT.

The year 1927 has been, from many considerations, a period of political or social unrest, but it has also seen a remarkable transformation in the construction of roads in Kenya, the establishment of a constitution under the leadership of Mr. Logsdon, the meeting of the Kenyan Commission for the purpose of ascertaining the opinions of the different districts and the institution of a District Council for the Kiambu-Londiani area.

A meeting was held at Mukuru last week to discuss Local Government. The Acting Governor, Mr. Logsdon, and the District Commissioner for the Kiambu-Londiani area, Mr. Bokwe, were present. The Public Works Department and the members of the Legislative Council for the Lake constituency were also present.

After a long and interesting debate, during which delegations from Londiani, district showed that they had no objection to the establishment of more or less responsible government, the public opinion was in favour of local government.

Mr. Ernest Atkinson who sponsored the resolution expressed the hope that the formation of a District Council was in fact a vote of lack of confidence in the existing system.

The Acting Governor informed the Report Committee that the available water supplies in the Ulimbi and Massai Provinces, hydroelectric power and the later Province's programme of irrigation schemes in horning have met with considerable success.

Agricultural development has steadily progressed, and in parts of the country cultivation has become more intensive, and the supervision and guidance of the soil and likely areas are taken to ensure a maximum output of the land in the hands of man.

A Committee has been appointed to advise the Government on which the security and welfare of the people depend.

The Native Affairs Department seems to be fully satisfied with the work done by the Native Councils, on which the Native Commission has concentrated authority seems to be a failure of some of the native communities.



**AGRICULTURE****The Agricultural Census.****Big Increases in Production.**

Following is a summary of the Agricultural Census Report for 1928, covering the period from August 1, 1927 to July 31, 1928. This summary embodies the ideal information which is so often required and comprehensive that the previous annual reports published last month.

The most interesting feature of the report is the increase in production of coffee, which is shown in the number of acres sown, the amount of coffee produced, and the total value of coffee exported from the Colony.

### Topics for the Motorist.

## Lubrication Problems.

### New Light Following Investigations.

Because oil, like petrol, is purged or carried from one part of the engine to another, the motorist has to deal with consumption equivalent to only 15 per cent. of the oil he puts in. This is far less than eight of a very important distinction, namely, that the oil which is used by the engine to provide motive power, does it in a series of parts, the first being in the bearings where it withstands load and transmits force just like the oil in the cylinder walls. Consequently, the selection of the oil and the way in which it is used is of paramount importance to the life and reliability of the power unit.

#### Variable Viscosity.

Now, just as a measure of the insulation of a steel or aluminium frame can be determined by testing its physical strength, so the method of determining the oil is to have determined its viscosity. The viscosity of oil is measured in centi, very greatly increased by the temperature at which it is measured. The oil which is thick and viscous when it is cold, becomes thin when it is hot. This is due to the fact that when heated, the molecules of the oil become more active and move more rapidly. This is why it is necessary to have a good system of cooling.

This indicates clearly that when cold, some oil will be too viscous to flow through the system.

But when hot, the oil becomes too thin and may even damage the cylinder walls.

It is therefore necessary to have a system which will provide the correct viscosity throughout the entire range of temperatures.

At first sight it might seem that the remedy is to use thicker oil, but this while slightly improving the lubrication, has a very bad effect upon power consumption and, moreover, unless the oil is heated, it will not be able to provide the correct viscosity throughout the entire range of temperatures.

It is therefore great difficulty when testing because of the relatively short time of the flow of oil at various temperatures from the engine.

of 30 m.p.h. at a distance 450 miles to a point of 100 m.p.h. at 100 miles, the two figures are classed together by the average motoring man as being equal. This is not so, as it is not the case that the greater the speed, the greater the consumption. The greater the speed, the greater the percentage of the power consumed by the engine.

Another problem which has been tackled very thoroughly by the Duane Company is the question of the satisfactory lubrication of the engine when it is started from a cold morning, when giving the power unit time to warm up. This is of great importance to the piston and cylinder walls, owing to the fact that the oil which is used is of a lower viscosity at low temperatures, and it is necessary to have the ready to power unit after the engine is started.

#### An Interesting Experiment.

To illustrate this point on a normal basis, take a dummy cylinder, bearing, and cold oil as pump oil. At 30 m.p.h. at a distance of 450 miles, as was shown on page 230, the bearing was then tested. The oil pressure had fallen out to 20 per cent. after the engine had run for 10 minutes. This is a very good result, but it is not the best.





this way, there is no difficulty in settling native communities to a new land.

If natives return to their old lands, they are to be adequately compensated.

It is proposed to give a fair opportunity to learn improved methods of agriculture.

Under the scheme we have described, as the second stage of evolution, we have

described by the extraction of the land with population.

### Territorial Segregation.

We now come to the second of the two questions relating to a permanent land policy, namely, the question of what to do with the native tribes.

We have seen that the native tribes are not homogeneous.

The answer to this question

is to be found in the principles of racial segregation.

It so happens, for example, in Kenya that most of the European settlers form one community, while others, as in Uganda, are scattered among the native tribes.

For this reason, the first stage

of the proposed scheme of

territorial segregation

will facilitate the creation

of homogeneous native and non-native communities.

The arguments against the

proposed agricultural segregation

are generally based on the idea

that it will increase the division

between the different

races and black and white
