



PUBLIC EXECUTION

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard":
Sir—About Mr. Shammout's second letter on the subject of public execution, I would ask him if there is not a somewhat peculiar incompatibility in his statements in the context of his last-mentioned excerpts of which I would like to quote.

Your correspondent states, in my humblest terms, that: "The extraordinary circumstances of the Kenyan murder, render a public execution necessary." This is apparently his considered opinion.

Further in his letter he definitely states however, "I have always held that the death sentence is no punishment at all, and that a life sentence with real hard labour is real punishment."

This also seems to be his considered opinion. Therefore, I ask your correspondent if he can find it possible to reconcile his two submissions, the first by which he advocates what, in my opinion, is the most logical and reviving form of execution, viz., a public one, with his alternative, by which, with drawing towards the close of his letter, he former preference for capital punishment in favour of a life sentence, which would be tantamount to the abolition of capital punishment.

It would be interesting to enquire here whether or not he has any really pronounced view on the subject; as it is so difficult to do, after trying to interpret such disparate opinions, an understanding of what your correspondent really means or desires.



Daroga's Evidence Concluded

Incidents at Club

COUNSEL AND DIFFICULTY OF FIXING TIMES

His Honor the Chief Justice, who is hearing the arson trial with the Indian witnesses in the Supreme Court, Nairobi, sat on Saturday morning in order to hear the evidence of N. M. Daroga which he completed before the weekend adjournment. Although it was expected that this would not occupy longer than half an hour, the court was in session for over two and a quarter hours. Daroga was in the witness stand for altogether nine and a half hours.

An Inspection

A Racial Clash?

The Hon. A. B. Pandya, speaking as President at the Eastern Africa National Congress, devoted most of his address to alleged injustices to Indians, especially in regard to land settlement. He declared that the Government and European colonists were following a policy of racial discrimination which if persisted in would lead to racial wars in the Empire.

"Stigma of Inferiority"

The allegation, in regard to white settlement in Kenya, that a native is being made to "accept a stigma of inferiority" was made by the Hon. A. B. Pandya in his address at the thirteenth session of the Eastern Africa Indian National Congress, which was held at Mombasa on December 25 and 26.

The President began by outlining the political issues in Kenya which the Government was interested and declared that the question of the status of Indians in relation to that of Europeans was one which would not be surprised if it were not raised. He stated that the Government was not surprised if it were not raised.

A Racial Clash?

After touching on the importance of the Indian community of the position of the closer union of Kenya, Mr. Pandya urged the danger of a racial clash.

Land Settlement

"The Indian community is not against any legitimate interest which this country has in the privileged position of the White Highlands, which has received the approval of the British Government at all times of its history."

Equal Applied for a Theatres

Asked for the Bench how many bars had been given in the theatre in the past year, Mr. Justice said he had not given the exact number, but said that there were several.

Exercise of Discretion

In argument, the Crown Counsel submitted that the Licensing Court had no power to grant a licence for the sale of liquor in a public house, unless the applicant was a person who had been licensed to sell liquor in a public house.

There were representations in the Supreme Court on Friday of the decision of the Licensing Court on December 10 in regard to the Licensing of Public Houses. The Chief Justice (Mr. Justice Suttcliffe) and the members of the Licensing Court were detained in an application, before the Hon. Mr. Justice Webb and the Hon. Mr. Justice Gurnea, brought by the Capital Theatre, Ltd., Kenya Theatres, Ltd. (Empire Theatre), and Mr. Simon Mollath (Theatre Royal), for an order on the Licensing authorities to renew the general retail liquor licence in the public houses, without condition.

The Licensing Court, on December 10, granted a general licence, not renewable, for a period of only 12 months.

The reasons given by the Licensing authorities for their decision were "that the public interest and previously expressed views of the Court, the Court, in the exercise of its discretion, had decided that no licence should be granted for the period of 12 months."

Inspector of Meat From Districts Outside Municipality

When the Nairobi Municipal Council met on Thursday afternoon, Mr. F. T. Harrison, Inspector of Meat, reported that he had received from the Municipal Council a letter from the Municipal Council, asking him to send a representative to the Municipal Council to advise on the subject of the Meat Inspection Act.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir.—Contemporaneously with the Budget conference, those with influence have begun to agitate the question of inflation: in a recent issue you read Mr. Constantine, for example, asks a question of another correspondent which is not vital to be treated to any one person to answer. "If we have to pay one million pounds in England whether with inflation or without it, £1,000,000. Most substantially not."

As all our foreign commitments must be paid in sterling, the country where they exist, we would not be starting worth of goods to go ahead, while we produced those goods in East Africa with cheaper money.

The question of money and inflation is too often and too much, produced by interested people. We must assume now that most of the anti-inflationists are those who would mean open borrowing more funds with which to finance recovery—we must find funds from other sources. Yet our budget is in any way a budget regulated in any way by the Government for inflation. When we borrowed these millions a few years ago, we did not borrow to just that extent and now, if we want to borrow to get going we had better offer our money to keep here in East Africa all the roads of the west which we must proceed. If it is true, as someone remarks, that "to reduce wages is another way to meet foreign prices" Government, fortunately or unfortunately, may not do this what they may, or should be able to undertake and thus we have "put a hole" in the money market with which to finance reparation of business. Anyhow it would be better to have one and one-half million pounds with which to put a hole in the money market on which the present and any future we need contentedly to carry on with. All with cheaper money and enough of it to re-start business, we might hope to start some sort of recovery; without it, we have "put a hole" in the money market.

Every indication points to the position that in the future we must be prepared to hold stiff foreign prices for our produce in foreign markets. Then we must produce it at price competitive, without regard to its purchasing power. If A. Currency but with due regard for what we can get on foreign markets for our produce. It is not that we pay in foreign markets for goods, but rather what secures the price to avoid buying our own "we have" put a hole" in the money market. As a lower foreign value of our local money would tend to encourage smaller purchases abroad it would mean building up capital for more local development. So long as we have to develop our resources, just that much longer will we require in the hand of a foreign money-power. If we require another loan and run it through the local banks to try to get it into circulation, the rate of interest will need to rise. Our rate will either be bankrupt or else a deflator will need to close our ports and all aspects of capital and repatriate our foreign bills and debts, public and private. It seems from recent indications that the lack of middle intelligents, that we are really drifting to that position.
