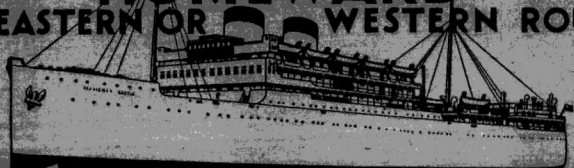

### Gloomy Outlook for Disarmament.

#### FRANCE NOT SATISFIED WITH GERMAN REPLY.

#### Profound Differences

#### FURTHER DIRECT NEGOTIATIONS IN JEOPARDY.

The German reply to the French note on disarmament has disappointed France as it is stated that it reveals a pessimism on principle and the continuance of direct negotiations is in jeopardy.

It is understood that the German reply made no concessions to the French proposals, but actually was a justification of Germany's previous demands.

#### British View Awaited.

Important documents, setting forth the German view thereon, will be made available to the British Government in London.

The newspapers describe an extremely disappointing and not calculated to improve Franco-German relations, the statement made by M. Chaumaine in the Senate yesterday which in effect nullified the negotiation between Paris and Berlin in a somewhat pessimistic manner.

#### Germany's Objections.

In regard to the German reply to the French aide memoire, it is thought to have been drafted by the French Ambassador in Berlin. It consists of 15 articles, but several articles are divided; but it is officially stated to be conciliatory and depicts explanation of certain points.

### Another Financial Scandal in France.

TO BE HANDLED BY A BUSINESS ORGANISATION.

### New British Proposal.

AWAITING THE APPROVAL OF THE IMPERIAL GOVERNMENT.

A new impulse will be given to Empire migration if the British Government backs a scheme which will be introduced before them during the next Parliamentary session.

The suggestion which is made as a result of an exhaustive enquiry by a Committee representing varied Empire interests is that settlement should be taken on a large scale by a special organisation.

The aim is to settle half a million people in the Empire during the next ten years.

### 500,000 in Ten Years.

(BRUNSON BATES'S AGENCY.)

London, Jan. 22. Empire migration may be resumed at an early date under a business organisation such as a large subsidiary of a chartered company. It is hoped to get straight ahead with a scheme for settling 500,000 emigrants.

A resolution will be considered during the next Parliament session, as a result of two years' investigation by a committee of Empire interests which has reported that this migration will partially solve the unemployment problem in Britain.

The committee was made fully conversant with the possibilities of emigration to the Dominions of the British Empire, and it is therefore intended to visit every acre of the territories in undeveloped territories and to hold large open air villages, housing together migrants from the same districts, in Britain.

A corporation will be incorporated for transporting the migrants, their families and their possessions. The British Government is being asked to provide the necessary Parliamentary sanction.

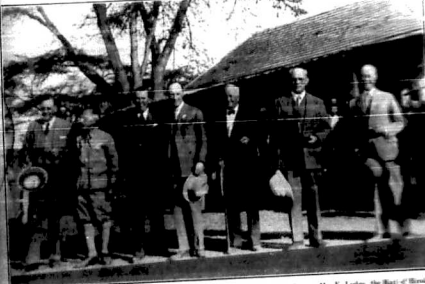

# Estimates of Kenya's Main Crops.

## OFFICIAL STATISTICS FOR DECEMBER.

### Effect of Drought.

### REDUCTION IN MAIZE OUTPUT BUT INCREASE IN WHEAT.

There has been a slight reduction in the output of maize for the present season in Kenya, harvesting of which is well advanced throughout the Colony. It is estimated that there will be a surplus of 350,000 bags for export although this figure is stated to be an over-estimate.

The Kenya wheat yield has shown a very considerable increase as compared with the previous season. Despite adverse conditions good crops are expected from the remaining wheat in all districts. It is anticipated that there will be a small surplus for export.

A considerable portion of the coffee crop is of low quality and will not be shipped to London. It is unlikely that a total of 11,000 tons will be exported.

### The Coffee Position.

The following report on Kenya crops in the European area for the month of December has been issued by the Department of Agriculture:—  
Maize: The yield for the Colony was estimated at 1,025,240 bags of 90 lb., or 7 1/2 tons to the acre, as compared with last season's yield of 1,150,610 bags or 9.0 to the acre. Harvesting is well advanced throughout the Colony. The intermediate season has been considerably affected by the continued dry weather, but earlier sowings have been sown in some districts.

Wheat: The yield for the Colony is estimated at 162,620 bags, or 4 1/2 tons to the acre, as compared with last season's yield of 69,390 bags, or 2 1/2 to the acre. Harvesting is general in all districts, and the crop is being marketed. The output of the crop is being sold on the whole as being unsatisfactory.

Coffee: The total production in the Colony from the present season is 330,000 cwt. It now appears probable that the output will be somewhat in excess of this figure. A preliminary estimate of the output of the crop is being sold on the whole as being unsatisfactory.

Estimated Surplus for Export. Maize: The estimated surplus for export is 350,000 bags, but there is some estimate that this figure is an over-estimate.

Wheat: After making allowance for seeds which will be required for the next season, it is anticipated that there will be a small surplus for export, although this figure is stated to be an over-estimate.

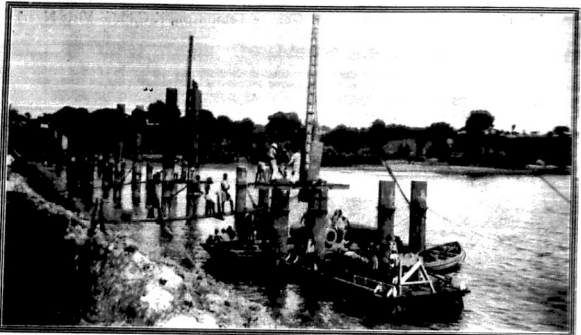

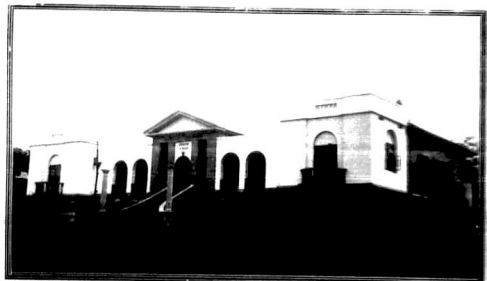




Reconstruction of old railway bridge at Mwarua, built in 1897, and now being used to carry electricity for line for water supply to Mwarua, Kenya.



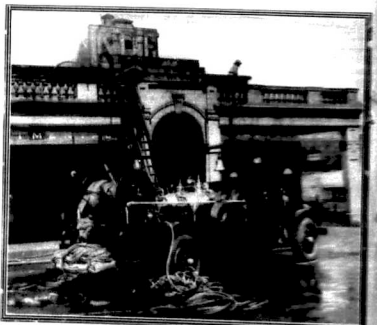
