DEATH OF KING OF BELGIANS. Tragic End of Popular Monarch.

KILLED INSTANTLY IN FALL WHILE MOUNTAINEERING.

Famous War-Time Figure.

DEFIED THE WHOLE MIGHT OF GERMAN'S ARMY.

Today the whole world will mourn the passing of one of the most famous figures of history in King Albert of the Belgians, who was killed on Saturday as a result of a mountaineering accident.

While making an ascent of the Rocher de Marche des Dames, a mountain near Namur, he slipped and fell. Death was instantaneous.

A popular and well-loved monarch by his own people, chiefly on account of his democratic personality, his refusal to accept of a crown and ceremony, and his great war-time example, he stood out among the great war figures in 1914 by his manly and loyal attitude to his people and country by defying the might of Germany. His refusal to permit his army to invade Belgium and his rejection, at the risk of complete annihilation, were events which will be remembered in history.

A Successful Reign.

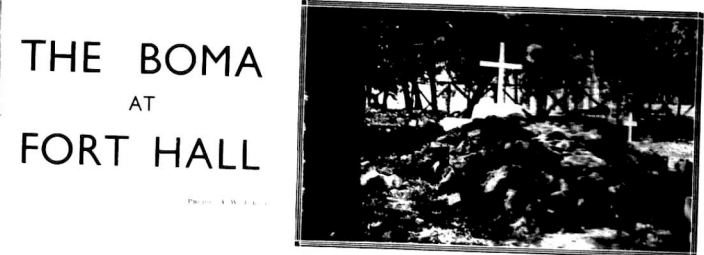

National Hunt Committee's Action.

WANTS TO TAKE BACK CONTROL.

(By air mail.)

[STANDARD COMMENTARY.]

The point-to-point meeting is the great event of the year in the country. It has a history of character—indeed it is the largest family party. Usually the Master's of the Hunt and their friends dispense hospitality to all the chief visitors round the races. The races are run on very uncommercial lines with a complete absence of formality, with each sort of mixture and open chance which give every variety a chance. The course are mostly heavy going, and are highly marked agricultural land. From this it will be seen that these functions have a really great value from every standpoint to people in the country to whom ably they make an appeal.

Many years ago they were run by the National Hunt Committee. Then the Master of Fox Hounds took over from the National Hunt Committee the organization of these meetings. Now the N.H.C. has notified all Master of Fox Hounds and the friends of Point-to-Point meetings are rather scared lest the "old" friendly, informal character of these functions should be wiped out and replaced by a stiff formal race meeting. The "best" of the "best" is as follows:

Ever since it was apparently agreed that some reform is necessary, the subject came under discussion two years ago, and there were two meetings on both sides. The M.F.H. Association approached the National Hunt Committee (the governing body of stockbreeding, who have hitherto granted an annual licence for the point-to-points to be held under M.F.H. control) for permission to make a charge for entrance to the meeting, thus implying that the primary object of the point-to-points is to make money for fox hunting rather than entertain farmers. The N.H.C. consented in return to give the impression that they wished to put up with the point-to-point, because the smaller stockbreeders' meetings were suffering from unfair competition—in fact that the motive was jealousy.

A New Set of Regulations.

It was thought by the M.F.H. agreement had been reached, but the N.H.C. then produced a new set of regulations which the M.F.H. could not agree. The M.F.H. has hitherto been so successful that as from July 1924 they would become donor of the licence. The latest news about the matter is the following statement by the N.H.C.

No Hunt for Reorganization.

"In view of the widespread misapprehension which appears to exist on the intention of the National Hunt Committee to take over the point-to-point racing, the stewards considered it advisable to state that they have no intention of recommending a Committee be appointed in any way to force point-to-point meetings to become horse-fair hunt meetings of requiring registration of horses other than for nomination in connection with the racing, but races for ladies' races. When published, the regulations for point-to-point meetings, which have been drafted will be found to differ very little from those in force when point-to-point races were controlled by the N.H. Committee, that is to say, down to 1919.

MOTOR DRIVEN PASSENGER AND CARGO SHIPS.

On South African Service.

MR. ROBERTSON GIBB OUTLINES FUTURE POLICY OF THE COMPANY.

Mr. Robertson Gibb, Chairman of the Union-Castle Company, has been in South Africa recently for the purpose of negotiating new freight contracts for the Government. Mr. Gibb expressed himself as being well satisfied with the agreement that had been arrived at although the Union-Castle Company had made very considerable concessions.

Arising from the freight agreement the Union-Castle Company are considering the early provision of two mobilized vessels capable of carrying 5,000 tons of perishable cargo and 3,000 tons of wool and other products. These steamers will be speedier than those generally employed in the cargo trade and will accomplish the voyage in 14 days, as against 16 days for the less. Two new passenger ships of probably slightly larger tonnage than the "Winchester Castle" which is just under 20,000 tons, are also to be built.

On the subject of the recent subsidies and contracts with the Italian Lines, Mr. Gibb was asked to explain the position of the Italian Lines, but he thought that if by the basis, the result had been approached on the same basis, the result would have been satisfactory to the exporters and producers of the Union.

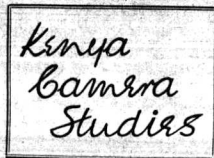

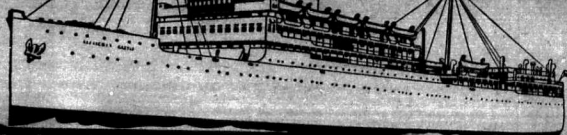

Former officials and members of the Imperial Chinese Court followed the Emperor to Manchukuo, there to resume their former duties, but they will no longer "kowtow," this form of obeisance has been abolished by the Emperor.



Increase of Currency in East Africa.

RESULTS OF AN IMPROVED TRADE BALANCE.

Report of the Board.

NO USE MADE OF POWERS TO RAISE LOANS FOR REDEMPTION PURPOSES.

Although legislation was enacted in the three East African Territories last year to authorize the raising of loans to enable the East African Currency Board to provide funds to meet further redemptions of currency, it was not found necessary to make use of the powers so given.

This is one of the most interesting facts revealed in the annual report of the Board, extracts from which are given below. For the first time since 1920 there was an increase in the amount of currency in circulation, due in the main to an improved trade balance.

The Report states that no new supplies of coin were required during the year but a supply of ten shilling notes were sent to East Africa. As a means of economy, attempts are being made to prolong the life of notes. Periodical examination of the currency necessitates the withdrawal from circulation of comparatively few coins.

Condition of the Coinage.

The report of the East African Currency Board for the year ended June 30, 1923, has just been received. The report is signed by Sir S. J. H. B. M. It states that the amount of currency in circulation has been reduced by the operations of the Board, and that the amount of the coinage has been increased by the issue of the ten shilling note.

Counterfeiting.

From time to time since the shilling currency was introduced into East Africa, there has been detected and sentenced to imprisonment a number of persons who have been found guilty of counterfeiting. 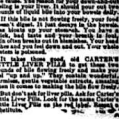

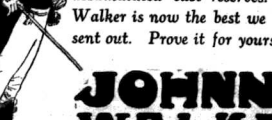

D. G. Bradman (N.S.W.). One of the few cricketers who need only be introduced to cricket enthusiasts. His motto is that records are made to be broken, and he has done more than his share in this respect. He led the Australian side in 1920, and was in his first tour, namely 27.5 and a double century, against a world class team. One of the pillars of Australian and Victorian teams. Has been in his form this season. Age 27. A schoolmaster.

B. J. Barnett (Victoria). A good wicket-keeper and left handed batsman. Quite a few of his best runs came the ball well on the leg side of fast bowling. Has made his mark in 1922-23 season. Has made highest individual scores in English matches. Test runs 194 and 100 in 1920. In 1921 he was called in to play for Australia at 18,000 and finished with an average of 86.6. 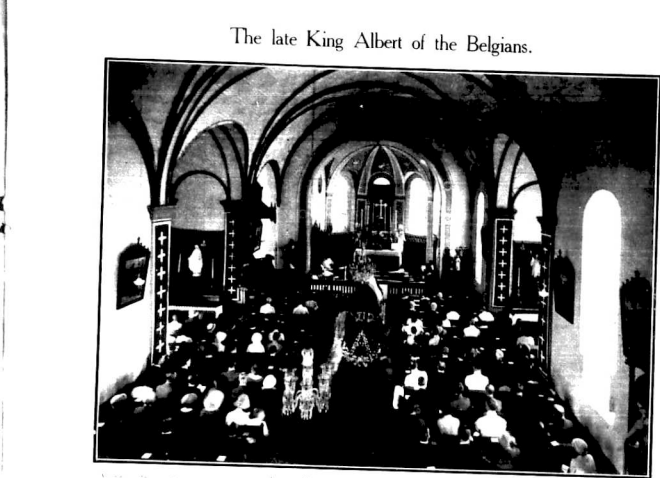

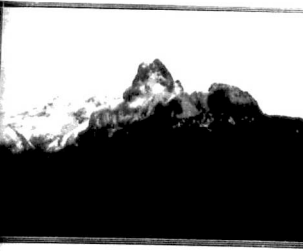

SATISFACTORY FINANCIAL POSITION

Ground Improvement.

I am sure you will all agree with me that in our ground we have a wonderful asset, and it is a source of consternation and pride to see the wonderful improvements that have been and are still being made on them. For this great improvement we are indebted entirely to Hon. Groundmaster Mr. Hock who has worked early and late in this arduous task. We deeply sympathized with him when the rain failed last year, but as soon as we have a normal supply of rain again we shall better be able to realize the extent of his labours. He has some schemes for beautifying the grounds between our entrance gates and the Club House, which we hope that he will be able to remain with us to complete the work.

Turning now to the particular activity of the club, we have had a successful year in all our sports.

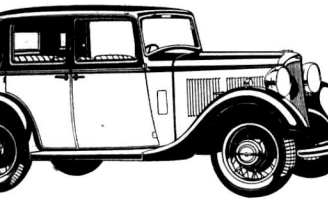

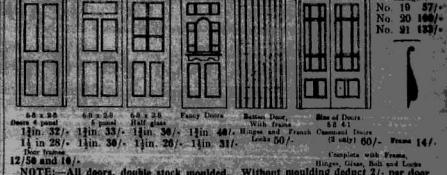

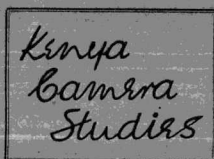
