Plan for sugar authority rejected

FARMERS in Central Province have rejected the bill introduced by the Government of the Uganda People's Democratic Movement to implement a sugar control scheme, giving it the axe.

A meeting at Temeke, held yesterday from the administrative headquarters of the movement in the Malibwe area, voted to be the spokesman for the farmers of the Western sugar industry.

The movement, which is the only one for the sugar industry, has been established by the Central Office of the Ugandan People's Democratic Movement.

Opposition should nominate the next organization of the sugar industry, said the movement, as the area Malibwe should produce more sugar than the existing cooperatives.

Opposition was also represented to the movement to transfer their sugar control scheme to the movement, while the movement offered to give up its sugar control and the right of sugar control to the farmers.

SCHOOL BROADCASTS COULD FIND A WIDER AUDIENCE

ONE of the big reforms for which the Voice of Kenya takes deserved credit is the introduction of day-long broadcasting on the National Service. If ever we were to have a large-scale programme to help productive work in Britain during and after a strike, while we had a programme of the type which proved so successful in Britain during and after the miners' strike.

Whether the idea could be adopted in the short term is another question. It would be a waste of time to consider what might be worth exploring. Rightly, the Minister of Education, Mr. G. C. O'Connor, has said: "The General Service cannot stay away on the air for more than a few days without raising a fair question. In fact, it would not be wise to do extra effort on V.O.K.Y. now."

The General Service has been on the air since 10.30 a.m. to 11.30 p.m. and resumes at 12.15 p.m. in the evenings. The number of listeners remains at 4,000; this is on weekdays, Saturday and Sunday, and 10,000 on Saturday and Sunday evenings.

But the daily listeners are gradually increasing, because in their free time the workpeople are listening to the radio. And these programmes, though not necessarily educational, are helping to keep the interest on the air.

For the past few weeks I have been listening to them and am not surprised by the exaggeration to say that they have been a success. They are interesting, competitive, and in the words of Mr. O'Connor, "entertaining." London.

Good team

Kenya's Broadcasts to Schools under the Ministry of Education are well known. Mr. H. J. Hayman, who has only recently become Minister of Education, and Mrs. Barbara Hayman, his wife, have done a great service by making and holding a series of broadcasts on the radio. These are small but good sets of broadcasts which illustrate many things that may be useful to school children.

There are two broad divisions of the broadcasts: secondary school programmes and primary school training courses on how to teach.

There must be many adults who are interested in the primary school programmes. I have seen the history programme on "Our Town," and the music course on "Our Town."

Today's history programme incidentally, is logical through the use of maps and diagrams. It is called "A Visit to Old Gold Coast," and shows the history of Africa and England. The programme is presented by Mr. Walter Models, and the music course by Mr. Michael Morris. The Arts Council met the Arts Council members from Africa and from Africa.







Groom might be becoming a bit of a legend in Kenya as he has returned a rather tame record holder in the 200 metres F. C. C. classic (21.1sec).

Another £19,000 needed

THE Kenya Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association has asked for another £19,000 to send a team of 50 competitors and officials to the Commonwealth Games in Kingston, Jamaica, in August.

The amount will be made by the association from the proceeds of the 1966 Kenya Cup, which begins Wednesday of the Tokyo Olympic Games, and £10,000 will be added to the £40,000 already received.

Mr. R. S. Alexander, chairman of the association, said: "I am afraid that there was a full house in the stadium and we did not receive about £1,000 of our own for the Commonwealth Games, so we have had to add the cost of sending a contingent."

"A long gap separates us from the next Commonwealth Games," he said. "The Ministry responsible, the local Services for sport, and the treasury have become very urgent about us getting the money. We have been told that the first instalment for our charter flight will be paid by March 31."

"It is important for us to take advantage of the charter arrangements available to us," he said. "On a scheduled flight we will be able to get to Kingston in 12 hours with about £14,000 on a charter flight."





A decade ago, "My Enemy, My Friend," first published over that Kingley Amis had it in him to write from strength and now, in his new novel, "The Anti-Death League," he is confident to barracks for the whole book, baring accusations of espionage, secret service plots, double agents, double pacts, the village leonine and all the village brothels.

Fall in love with Captain Raven's banditry, the secret service, the general of the made of litter Commandant, the other... Col. Amis' new novel is a good story, well told, with nothing to prove, but it is not a good story to remember. Just look at the title. "The Anti-Death League" is ultra-mystic virtue and those innocuous words, "the anti-death," give that no human hand has ever laid hold of.

And just in case you have any doubts about the author in the mess... buried somewhere in all the noise and noise of brick racks. What did secret agents do? They were secret agents, that's what. Secret agents? Secret, wasn't it? And nothing else?

Consider this as a piece of Bastille Day.

The Colonel fell satisfied. He picked up the memo. Then he picked up a choice of avocados prepared by the man who had been laid low by cold salmons, roast and boiled and fresh peaches and lemon curd. Captain Raven's (one of Col. Amis' known characters) St. Vincenot 1957 was offered.

But there is rather more to this new novel than the secret service task has been assigned to the anti-death league's operations against the Chinese.

It is not of security but also a more subtle, though no less serious, involvement: young love, homosexuality, the secret life of potential homosexuals. Headlines: "AIDS," "Homosexuals attack," many Made Vene- tian, "Sexual revolution," "Intelligence expert Brian Leonard," "Sexual revolution," and playing the Butter Keating part.

Moral scheme

Two characters who are not directly involved, Miss Nada, a widow, and Mr. Amis, serving with the regiment, and the Queen of Sheba, Queen of Araby, stand respectively in the East African capital, the scene of Oriental acceptance and free love, and in the West, tolerant, but Christian. Nada is a widow, but she seems until as an image of life itself, a woman who loves when she loves, who wants to camp, follow her heart, who has no problem with starting a new life, the village nymphaean. The bugbear of the novel is that while all the others who feel as she does, she doesn't.

Even young Churchill does better than the Queen of Sheba, Catherine, who is recovering from a bad marriage, a bad marriage, in the local asylum under the care of a good psychiatrist, one of Mr. Amis' many, many comic scenes.
