METHOD OF CALCULATING THE FIGURE.

A Table of Examples.

OF SALARIES RANGING FROM £200 TO £1,100 PER YEAR.

In order to assist taxpayers of all ranks in the Income Tax, the following table is published for their use. It is intended to show the amount of tax payable on various amounts of income, ranging from £200 to £1,100 per annum.

These figures of course, do not include rebate for insurance premium and other special allowances to which individual taxpayers may be entitled, but should be added to the statutory personal allowance and Poll Tax deduction.

A Simple Process.

How Income Tax should be paid. The Income Tax is paid in arrears, that is, the tax is deducted from the salary or other income as it is received. The tax is deducted by the employer or the person receiving the income. The tax is deducted from the gross amount of the income, and the net amount is paid to the taxpayer.

REGGIE MEEN'S BIG FIGHT. Worst Beating of His Career. GERMAN HEAVYWEIGHT WINS.

Reggie Meen received the worst beating of his career, yet fought the greatest battle of his life, at Leicester on January 9, when he met the 22-year-old German heavy-weight, Walter Nessel.

For nearly six months Meen took a moral punishment as it usually amounted into three contests. But with one eye streaming blood and his jaw shattered repeatedly with smashing left hooks he went down to defeat gloriously.

Meen's spirit was of the bravest. His career was a hopeless one from the first minute, when Nessel, with a steady timed left to the jaw brought the former British champion down heavily for a count of eight.

At the start of it Meen was crowding with his head in his hands, dead tired, while blows shot at him from all angles, producing bruises and cuts on his face, until he presented a pitiable figure.

At Meen straightened up, one terrific right which reached his jaw landed most enough to put him out altogether but it was just at this moment that Meen began some of his greatest fighting.

Meen's blinks. Doubled-up suddenly with one-handed attack he tore after the surprised German, landing 1916, shaking him time

and again almost sending him off his feet with one smashing right. But Nessel, a beautifully built man, kept wonderfully cool in counter-attacks, and after ducking and defensive work with a straight left were good to look upon.

Even in the most hectic rallies he was always placing his blows the more shrewdly. But counting more heavily against Meen was the state of his left eye. Two in the jaw was a shocking cut across the nose, and his other eye was damaged, and long before the final bell his vision was so blurred as to be practically sightless in one eye and it was impossible for him to continue.

Foolish People. Yet foolish people actually booed him. He is deserving only of cheers.

No fighter could have put up a better show. After his first knock-down he was dropped again by left and right hooks, and there were stages when only clever weaving and bobbing in the last Dempsey fashion saved him from a knockout.

Meen I thought bit every left as hard as Nessel, but he had not the ability of his young conqueror. Nessel's footwork and his skillful placing of straight lefts were always rather too much for the heavy-looked Englishman, and when he got in close he looked with an accuracy that Meen could rarely show.

Sheer Grit. Sheer grit and nothing else kept Meen going for so long. In the second round a rapid tidal wave of blows struck into his stomach and his knees were sufficient to have beaten most men, but he amazed everybody by remaining upright.

The end came with surprising suddenness. Meen was fighting like a tiger one moment. The next he held out his hand, waving his head in despair, and walking a sickly to his corner.

It would have been sheer madness to have continued. He did not win a round, and in the end while he was taking a hiding in from a man who was faster and cleverer in every way.

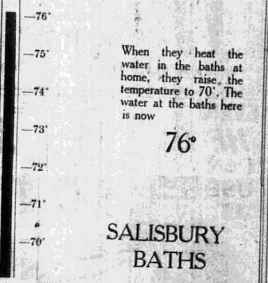

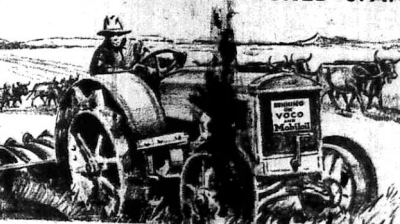

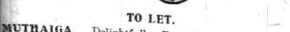

MAJORITY OVER ALL PARTIES IN THE DAIL.

Uneasiness in Ulster. SPECULATION AS TO IMMEDIATE POLICY OF FREE STATE GOVERNMENT.

Mr. De Valera has obtained a small, but clear, majority over all parties in the Dail as a result of the general election in the Irish Free State, which has now concluded. Out of 143 seats Mr. De Valera has obtained 77, which is a clear majority of one, but eight Labour members, who are allies of Mr. De Valera have also been returned.

The partition of Ireland is the leading issue and there is considerable speculation as to what the immediate policy of the Free State Government will be.

British Proposals on Disarmament.

DISSENT TO PRESIDENT CONFERENCE. Practical Suggestions.

INDICATION OF DETERMINATION TO PRESS FORWARD WITH ISSUES.

Great Britain has disclosed to the President of the Disarmament Conference and to delegates representing the United States, France, Germany and Italy, proposals for the expediting of the work of the Conference.

The proposals suggest that the discussion be divided into two main heads—political questions, having bearing on security, and practical disarmament. The document sets out at length the general principles which should be followed.

The General Principles.

The British proposals for expediting the work of the Disarmament Conference, which were disclosed yesterday to the President of the Conference, and to the delegates representing the United States, France, Germany and Italy, are regarded here as indicating the intention to press forward the issues before the Conference and to reach early decisions.

These general principles are as follows:—Firstly, affirmation by the European powers that they will in no case resort to force; secondly, affirmation that security should be based on regional arrangements; and thirdly, that limitations on armaments should be based on the principle of equality.

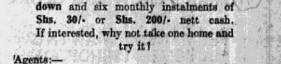

BUSINESS REPLY CARDS.

Scheme Suggested for East Africa.

Mr. A. C. Tomhall introduced a memorandum to the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce on Thursday last, which sets out a scheme for the system of business reply cards and envelopes in East Africa with an advocacy of the adoption of the system in Kenya.

A supplier, by circulating the members with a request for a reply card does not want the reply to pay the postage. As an experiment for a year, the British authorities have provided for a reply card and envelope which the recipient is obliged to stamp with the supplier, who pays the postage on its return. The distributing firm must obtain a licence to participate in the scheme, and open a current account with a bank sufficient to cover the charges on all correspondence delivered to it under the arrangement during an accounting period to be agreed upon. The card or envelope has to be of a special design to ensure its use for a half-year, and a first rate of a half-ounce, in addition to the normal postage to be charged on each one returned to the sender.

THIRD ROUND OF THE CUP.

Arsenal's Dismissal.

AN UNFORTUNATE INCIDENT LEAVES MARK.

London, January 27

There are always surmises as to the Cup contest, though they differ in magnitude. This year, in the Third Round, they were very striking, due to what were perhaps unusual conditions. In England is sweeping the country, and the physically fit seem to be suffering more than the others. Hence many a Club had absentees on Saturday, varying from one or two to half a dozen, and men were even employed who were not quite fit for the demands of the game. This may explain some of the minorities of form, though for the most part the best teams won.

What were the chief features of the games? Well, Dronowich, Alton, Bolton Wanderers, Huddersfield Town, Everton, Blackburn Rovers, Tottenham Hotspur, who share with Derby County the distinction of scoring six goals away from home, Sheffield Wednesday and Burnley were recipients of the Cup who held it.

On the other hand Arsenal, Newcastle, Preston North End, Wolverhampton Wanderers, Manchester United and Stoke County, all past holders, have fallen. At Aston, Villa, Bradford City, Burnley, Nottingham Forest, Manchester City and Sheffield Wednesday, scores also, are to be replayed. Of those who have passed into the Fourth Round only Birmingham, Bradford, Derby County, Grimsby, Huddersfield, Blackpool, Dover, Sheffield United and West Ham did so last season. Southern teams were thinned out in Saturday's loss. Among the fallen in the Third Round were Arsenal, Chelsea, Fulham, Portsmouth, Plymouth, Charlton, Southampton, Queens Park Rangers, Fleetwood and Corinthians. The "Span" showed their fighting spirit by scoring six goals at Oldham. They are now the chief hope of the south. The Millwall v.

Arsenal's Defeat.

The star surprise was the defeat of the Arsenal, the champion team of the League which last week many thousands by a Lewis XI made up for the most part of players dismissed by other Clubs. It is significant that the hardest shot Cunningham had to deal with came from Black, the visitor's left full-back Bennett. Incident of the Penalty.

The goal to which I have alluded was a last one. The ball had rebounded from the Arsenal goal following a wallall advance, and Black, departing for Haggard at half-time, was seen to raise his foot against Alton, the home centre forward. Immediately there was a great uproar. Retaliation followed and soon a whole mob of players were aiming blows at the offending Arsenal man, and the referee brought play to a standstill. Such a spectacle can rarely have occurred in a big football match in living memory. The incident ended swiftly. To every-body's surprise no one was sent off the field. Alton had to go off, though, for his trainer's attention. Wallall was awarded a penalty and Sheppard scored the goal that made their victory certain. The Arsenal played for the rest of the game as though they had no hope left.

Contemporary soccer has no more handsome or sporting side, and they looked quite distressed.

It is true that the chief actor of that latest dramatic incident was one of the young and inexperienced newcomers. He had, indeed, never before kicked a ball for Ilighbury's premier team. There can be no doubt, but it ought to be said that as a consequence of Wallall's knock-out methods several of the Arsenal players were already looking like millionaires retaining faces of despair, and when Mal and Holbert stepped after the interval their faces were all above and below.

Wallall people did not expect their straggling Third Division side to triumph over the mighty Arsenal. They expected an Arsenal walk-over. That is clear by the way. The Arsenal had been equipped to hold 20,000 odd 11,000 paid before to see the match. But when the drama became a reality, only Wallall had. The fortunate 11,000 surprised on the playing pitch, swarming in, their lips tightly sealed, to "cheer" the players. It was like a miniature Waterloo. Alton, the contemporary, who had scored the first and almost decisive goal, put his halberd and fall from the shoulders of his admirers, slightly injuring himself in the process of nearly reaching home on goal.
