DR. FISHER URGES

LUKIKO TO DROP SECESSION AIM

Kenya and Central Africa are in uneasy conflict, and Uganda has internal conflicts of interests not yet solved — but there are no barriers that patience, restraint and regard for others cannot solve. This was the message to East Africa delivered yesterday by the Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr. Fisher, who was inaugurating the new Anglican Province of Uganda and Ruanda-Urundi.

He said that the new Church Literature Centre at Mukono, near Kampala, had been opened and that he and his wife were guests of honour at a garden party held at Mukono, which was attended by several hundred guests.

G. Edwards, at the opening of which he said: "I think it is a pity to show a progressive part of the country of Kenya in this way. The Polytechnic has been built to cater for all craft and technical courses up to sub-graduate level. It is hoped that about 150,000 people will visit about 1950."

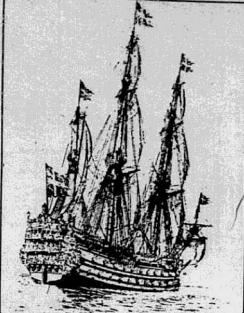

On the right, a gang lifts a length of track from authentic 1880 low-sided wagons and carries it to the rail head while other extras lay and fish-pole the sleepers during filming.

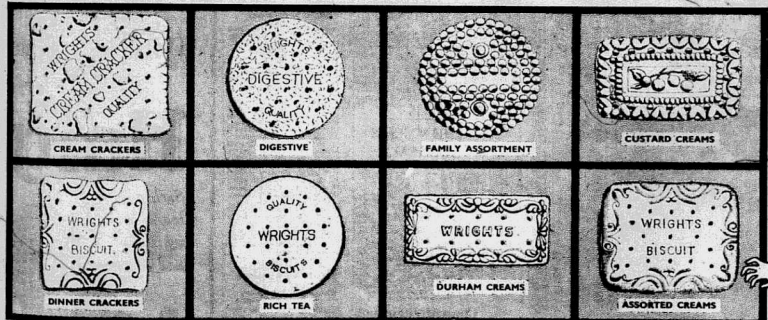

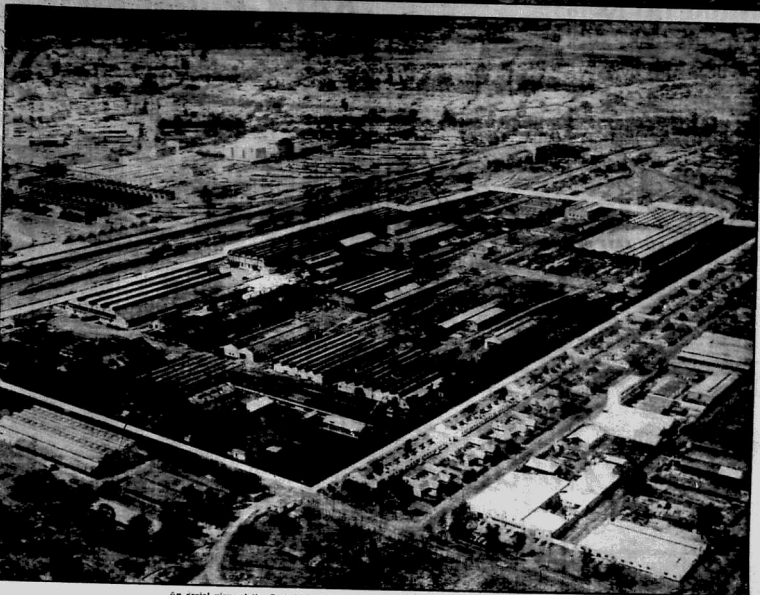

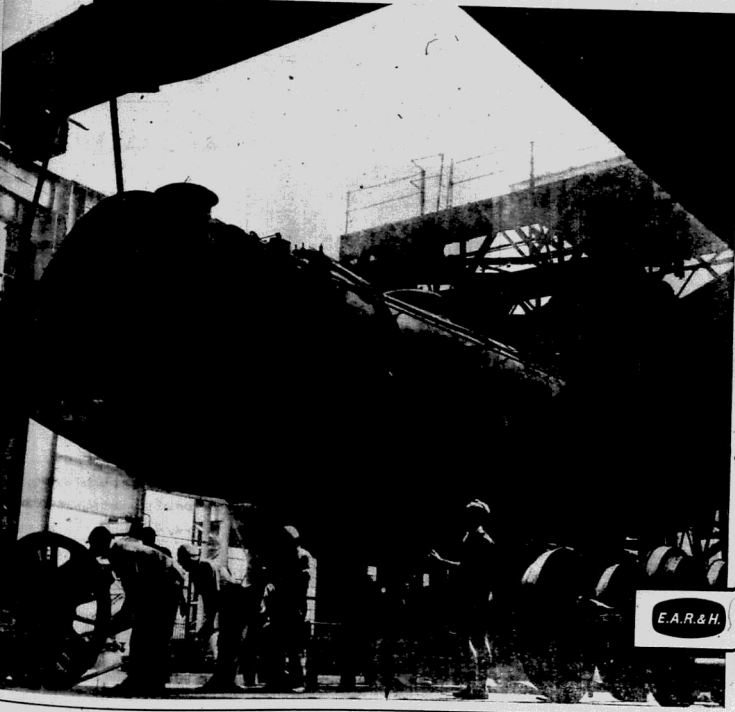

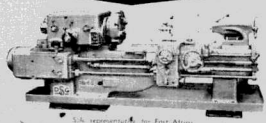

BREWERY HYGIENE WOULD DO CREDIT TO HOSPITAL

Oh good beer I love thee,

THAT little rhyme was recited to me by a dear old journalist when, many years ago, I was a cub reporter in Sunderland.

As one who has always been fond of the old pint I have never forgotten it and thought of it this week when I had the pleasure of being shown round Allsopp's Brewery on the Thirls Road.

At the brewery, and every single one of these bottles, inspected after filling.

The system of food inspection is so strict that the bottles are washed in a special tank, which is surrounded by any kind of foreign matter.

On every new batch 25 bottles are carried out to the laboratory. The tests for samples taken at random from the ingredients show the beer is progressing through the various stages.

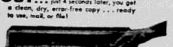

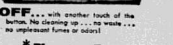
