War Preparations Still Proceeding

IN SPITE OF PACIFIC EFFORTS AT GENEVA

Precautions Against Air Raids in Rome

LEAGUE COUNCIL TO PLACE ONUS OF FURTHER ACTIONS ON ITALY

In spite of intensive peace efforts at Geneva, both Italy and Abyssinia are steadily preparing for hostilities. An agreement has been reached between the Italian Government and the Vatican for joint precautions in the event of an air raid on Rome.

ETHIOPIAN PREPARATIONS

A Reuter message from Addis Ababa states that up to 500,000 horses and mules and a large number of camels will be bought by the Ethiopians, and a special department has been established for the purpose. Twenty expert judges of horseflesh have been sent to different parts of the country to carry out the purchase for which the Government is paying cash, as forcible expropriation would anger the farmers and peasants and render them unwilling to go to war.

In Addis Ababa a good horse costs £4, mules cost £7 each and camels £10 each, but provincial prices are lower though the quality is inferior. The majority of the animals will be sent to the Tigre (northern) front, but 80,000 camels will be concentrated in Ogden—the province next to Italian Somaliland.

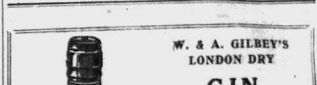

Says He Will Return to Ranch

LOUIS DEMON-LIKE FIGHTING

At this time blood was streaming down Baer's face, but the American was gone, and managed to get on one knee, but he was unable to continue. Baer's body was blanketed from that last smothering blow. And as he said to have ended the boxing career of Baer who earned for himself the nickname the "clever of the ring." So dumbfounded was the crowd at the sudden end to the contest that the result was scarcely observed. Louis walked unscathed out of the ring in the presence of an almost empty, silent arena from the crowd.

Killed by Politics

ONCE more the week has been extremely dull with very few transactions reported in the local market. Almost all shares are weaker although reports from London are slightly more encouraging.

It is difficult to see how any appreciable improvement can take place until the political position in Europe has become more clarified and the only consolation to local investors is the fact that even good South African Dividend Payers are mostly easier.

Kenian having topped 12/6 on the 20th, appeared to 14/3 and gave away well above the ordinary Kingstons which have fallen to 12/6. In sympathy with Kingstons, Elders have weakened to Shs. 5/4 bringing a new low level for many months. Holders of the latter shares purchased at relatively high prices might do well to consider averaging at to-day's attractive level. Great

activity seems to exist in the Suma Corporation. The No. 5 report of Kenan should be available shortly and is expected to contain surprising results.

Tanganyika Concessions are very low and need appreciable improvement for quick appreciation.

Both East African Goldfields and Kenya Consolidated closed easier on the week while Kenya Goldmining and Eastman remained fairly steady. The latter still seems undervalued in view of the fact that production proper is estimated to start early next year. A LETTER FROM LONDON

Experts Take Lessons in Geography

ABYSSINIA

PROXIMITY WORRYING THE SHARE MARKET

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT].

London, September 14. POLITICAL considerations still dominate the Mining Market, and on Friday the tone of the opening was very undecided. Later on the publication of M. Laval's speech regarding the attitude which France is prepared to adopt regarding the League of Nations, a much better tendency developed throughout the "House."

Such an issue is a measure of the large amount of money awaiting investment and the difficulty which large holders of funds have in working them at a profit.

A comparatively short time ago 2 per cent stock had been considered in the banking world a good return on three to five-year notes. There was all the difference in those days between the rate for three and a twelve month bill. But borrowers, with conditions all in their favour, have gradually raised their terms. As the African Railway issue shows, it is generally no more longer to secure the same yield.

Most of the concern in East Africa is due to the development and some considerable time may elapse before prospects can be judged with any degree of accuracy. Now that this section has been taken in hand, it is possible that any device may expand. Intersting buyers should, however, watch the speculative nature of the market.

"Truth" in their issue of the 11th point out that no fresh discovery of the Kenian interest has been announced, but there is no reason to believe that the re-opening of the shares during the past few days has been "good buy" for the investor. The company's new treatment plant is in operation early next year.

Geography

September 17. Developments over the week-end had a rather depressing influence over the Mining market as a whole and the political tone certainly did not tend to stimulate interest in the speculative departments. Furthermore, the output of the Mining market had been reduced to such small proportions that the Anglo-Abyssinian problem exercised moderately sympathetic effect. There was no news of importance and no movements of importance could be ascertained.

The Fairweather this week "Antiques" on two occasions refer to East African Goldmining. Road and Weather Report

Mr. Galton-Finzi writes as follows:

The weather has been very much warmer and drier in all parts of East Africa this week. Very little rain has fallen at all in Kenya. Uganda has had a few good showers in the Western Province and there has been light rain in various parts of Tanganyika.

The wettest place in Kenya this week was Kitale with just over 1 inch, followed by Kisumu with just under 1 inch, and Kiisi, Eldoret and Kericho with just over 1 inch. All the roads are in a good condition, but the repairs to the bridge on the Meru-Embo road are not yet completed.

In Uganda, the heaviest rain has been at Mocha, which had 3 1/2 inches, and at Port Portal which had 2 inches. All the roads are excellent.

Tanganyika Governor and the Convention

CRITICISM OF DELEGATES FROM HIS TERRITORY

Devaluation Denounced

REMARKABLE RECOVERY IN FINANCES OF THE COUNTRY

His Excellency the Acting Governor of Tanganyika, Mr. P. E. Mitchell lost no time in taking note of the fact that three delegates from Tanganyika supported the Kenya Convention resolution on devaluation.

Mr. Mitchell, who doubted whether in fact they could be properly described as Tanganyika delegates, said that his Government could not subscribe to such a policy.

In another part of his speech Mr. Mitchell hinted at the wisdom of approaching closer union from the point of view of replacing the three existing Governments by a single Government in the same model, thus avoiding the delay involved by a controversy as to the type of government.

He was able to reveal a striking improvement in the financial position of Tanganyika. It is expected that revenue will exceed the estimates by £210,000; that there will be a surplus of £78,000 at the end of this year on the Budget; and that Government has already informed the Secretary of State that the whole interest on the £100,000 of Treasury which was provisionally reformed by the Imperial Treasury will be paid in full.

A Closer Union Hint

An important speech was made by His Excellency the Acting Governor of Tanganyika, Mr. P. E. Mitchell who is Governor-designate of Kenya, at the Convention on Saturday last in Dar es Salaam by the Dares Salaam Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Mr. Mitchell has been 10 years in Tanganyika and he found himself deeply moved in taking leave of the country. He said that he had never known a time when Tanganyika was financially so sound as it is today. He said that the 1955 revenue would probably exceed the estimate by £200,000. Customs receipts had risen since being up by £100,000. The Government had a surplus of £100,000. He said that the Government had been able to pay its debts in full.

Federated E. Africa

The most of His Excellency's health was proposed by Mr. C. E. Lane, who in the course of his speech said that he was not far from being persuaded that he might have the pleasure of meeting Mr. Mitchell in London when as East African Federated States which was greeted with applause. "Most of us firmly believe," said Mr. Lane, "that such an eventuality is essential for the economic progress of the three territories. The mandate (the promotion to the status of independent countries) will be of the greatest benefit to the inhabitants of the territories. It will be interpreted in any other way as a serious step which has been proved by the amalgamation of Postal Services and the Customs Union of the territory and these have been of economic benefit to the territories. In this respect the idea of a federated States is the only one which is sound."

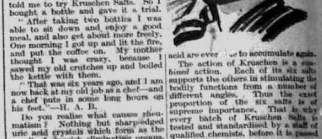

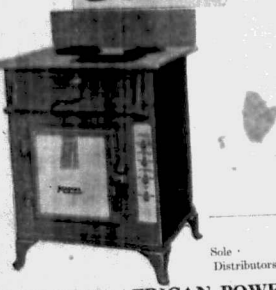

Strange as it may seem, the flesh of the Hawksbill Turtle, from which the beautiful tortoiseshell is obtained, is highly prized for human consumption, while that of the Green Turtle is considered a delicacy.

On Friday, families are served with roast turtle, fried turtle, stewed, and turtle curried, or in some or another method employed in the culinary art.

The Green Turtle is captured, either by being harpooned, from the flesh of the animal that is obtained, namely—Turtle Soup.

Bussing-Nag Diesel Trucks

STURDY PRODUCTS OF A PIONEER CONCERN

Many Interesting Constructional Features

On account of its economy and high thermal efficiency the Diesel or compression ignition engine has been widely adopted for bus and other commercial vehicles and its processes in manufacturing and the design of supports and fuel pumps have resulted in this form of power unit becoming as reliable, flexible and easy to operate as any petrol engine of equivalent size and power.

One of the pioneers of this type of power plant is the firm of Bussing-Nag and a range of their own motor vehicles, ranging in payload capacity from 20 cwt. to 10 tons, is now available for the Kenya market.

The chief point of interest in these vehicles is, naturally, the engine, but there are also a number of other most interesting features incorporated that make for long life, reliability, ease of replacement and freedom from heavy wear, and the component parts for replacement and renewal.

The following types are available—30 cwt., three cylinder, 40-45 h.p. engine; a two tonner with the same engine; 2½, 3½ and 4 tonners fitted with an 85-90 h.p. six cylinder engine; a 2½ ton chassis with a 120/130 h.p. engine and the 4½ and 10 ton units, most approved with the 155/145 h.p. engine, all the latter engines being of six cylinders.

In general design the engines follow the same line. All are vertical units, water cooled with pump circulation and a belt drive fan; the 10 ton pump and other accessories are shaft-driven from the timing gears at the front of the en-

gine and with all fuel pipes and other components readily accessible. A particular and noteworthy feature of the engines fitted by the 1½ to 4 ton chassis is that the principal components are all of the most interchangeable, parts—valves, etc.—making for ease and economy of repair. All high stressed parts, notably the crankshaft, pistons and connecting rods, are particularly massive, while to reduce wear will crankshaft journals and crank pins are hardened by a special process. Ample bearing surfaces add to the smoothness and flexibility of the units and the three cylinder engine has four main bearings, the four cylinder, five, and the six cylinder engine, seven.

Ease of starting is ensured by the use of an "auto-charger," which is completely water-jacketed and readily detachable without the necessity for the removal of the cylinder head. These auto-chargers, or auxiliary compression chambers, allow of the use of any low starting from cold, permit the adoption of low injection pressures and ensure smooth and flexible running with low fuel consumption, even on very low loads.

Gear box and engine are of unit construction and from the 2 tonner upwards four forward speeds are provided, while the 2½-10 ton vehicles may be fitted with an independent overdrive mechanism, permitting high cruising speeds combined with fuel economy. The frame is well swept down between the axles to give a low centre of gravity and "lean" line, while the final drive is through a torque tube, anchored at the front end by means of a mounting ball joint mounted on a sturdy

cross member. This torque tube takes all starting, accelerating and braking strains and the rear springs are not fixed in shackles, but allowed to slide in special self-adjusting slide bearings, with auxiliary springs above the main springs to deal with any temporary overload. This system permits of perfect cushioning of the load, as the springs are not called upon to lose stresses other than those set up by the carrying of the payload.

Pneumatic tires front and rear are fitted, the rear being on twin wheels as on the heaviest type, which are of the six-wheeler pattern.

Each model is of sturdy design, durable and excellent workmanship and the commercial utility of the vehicles is assured by the correct proportions, being of payload and useful carrying space to power and running cost. Full electrical equipment and front mudguards and bumper bar are standard fittings, while a considerable variety of bodywork may be fitted to pre-owners requirements. The agents are Messrs. 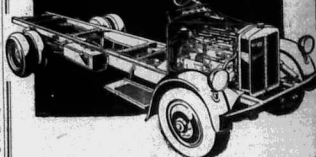

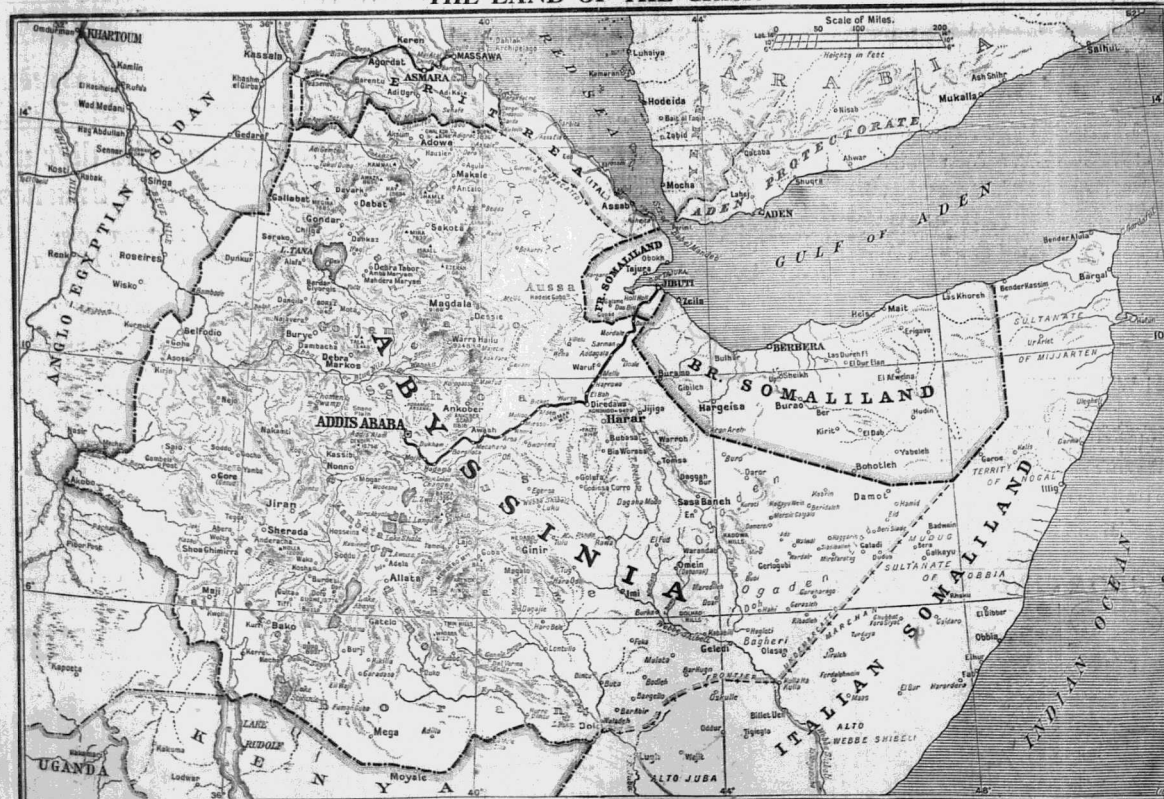

INCREASE OF CRIME IN TANGANYIKA
Among Native Population During Last Year
PRISON STATISTICS
Serious Overcrowding in Some Establishments

The daily average prison population in Tanganyika last year was 2,224, as against 2,083 in the year ending 31st Dec. 1934. In the 1934 annual report on the administration of the prisons in the territory. The figure shows an increase of 202.2 prisoners daily over the figure for 1933, and an increase during the last five years of 920. There are 49 prisons in the territory and they are classified as follows: First class, nine; second class, six; third class, 34. In addition there are four prison camps. First class prisons receive and retain all classes of offenders, irrespective of sentence. Second class prisons receive all classes of offenders sentenced to the district, but retain only the most serious and exceeding three years. Third class prisons receive all offenders sentenced in the district, but retain only those awarded a term of imprisonment not exceeding six months.

First and second class prisons also receive for the reception, trial and trial and criminal before they are transferred to the mental hospital at Dar es Salaam. During the year seven additional third class prisons were established in remote districts. The average number of petty offenders and other prisoners awaiting transfer to target prisons. The prisoner population totaled in 1934 for the purpose of releasing the remainder. Several Overcrowding
Several of the prisons were seriously overcrowded throughout the year, more especially those at Mwanza, Morogoro, and Tanga. At the last named the daily average prison population increased from 1,174 in 1933 to 3,045 last year. The establishment of Mwanza prison in 1930 in 1932 relieved the congestion in the Tanga prison to a certain extent. The number of commitments from native courts increased from 2,881 in 1932 to 3,097 last year. In 1933 only 1,347 persons were admitted from native courts, but since that time the numbers have been steadily increasing and no reduction is anticipated.

Hard Labour a Deterrent
The policy of concentrating all available convict labour on projects of hard labour was maintained. There is little doubt that this policy has resulted in a reduction in the number of inmates.
