Continued Necessity for Maintenance

BRITISH REPLY TO A HINT FROM MUSSOLINI

Flow of Troops to Libya

DOES NOT TEND TO IMPROVE THE INTERNATIONAL SITUATION

Suggestions emanating from Signor Mussolini that in return for a reduction of Italian forces in Libya, Britain should reduce the strength of her Fleet in the Mediterranean have not been favourably received in London.

The British Ambassador in Paris has been instructed to inform the French Prime Minister who put forward the enquiry that the necessity for maintaining precautions in the Mediterranean remains. Official circles in London express the view that the situation has not been improved by the flow of Italian troops to Libya.

Messages from Addis Ababa received yesterday state that one hundred thousand troops are at present engaged in the campaign. Round the capital the plains are covered with thousands of tents, among which swarm women, children and servants accompanying the warriors.

ETHIOPIAN AMAZON

A striking incident occurred on Wednesday when a woman, riding a magnificent white mule, arrived at the Royal Palace accompanied by a hundred retainers and demanded arms and munitions before proceeding to the front.

MAKALE CAPTURED?

It is reported from Addis Ababa that the Italian forces have invested Makale.

Two Italian aeroplanes are stated to have flown over the Djibouti-Addis Ababa railway in the neighbourhood of Aldem and Bicket, about 150 miles from Addis Ababa.

On the South front, the Italians are reported to be continuing their advance up the valley of the Webbe Shiheli under difficult conditions, due to intense heat and bitter opposition by the tribesmen.

Cabinet's Decision

(Reuter's Agency and British Official Wireless.)

London, Oct. 16.

It is learnt that M. Laval, in his interview with the British Ambassador in Paris, raised the point as to whether the situation would be improved by the reduction of British Forces in the Mediterranean to a more normal strength, and referred also to Signor Mussolini's suggestion in an interview with a French journalist that Italian forces in Libya might also be reduced.

The British Ambassador did not give a direct reply on behalf of the British Government, but it is thought possible that the matter might be considered by the Cabinet.

It is pointed out that the Fleet was concentrated in the Mediterranean before the League of Nations applied Article 18 and the question of reduction of strength in Europe, which Britain alone to decide.

It is stated that there is no question of the interests of affecting Anglo-French relations, which continue to be of the closest. It is recognized that M. Laval is anxious for an early termination of the war.

A Constant Attitude

"To hold Adowa and also effectively to dominate the Tigris province is in the capital, it is necessary for the Italians to possess a line drawn across the tops of mountains roughly from Adowa to Adiglat, and to ensure the arrival of a line of adequate supplies of food, water, and munitions. DEVELOPMENT GOALS

KENYA Consolidated's second ordinary general meeting of Shareholders is being held at Eldoret on 21st inst. when the Directors will submit a report for the year ending 31st inst. and a balance sheet as at May 31 last.

Operations during the year have been mainly concentrated in the Kikuyu section, the Concession Area (South Kavirondo), and the Lagerberg-Mageri group. These afforded the earliest prospects of arriving at the production stage. So encouraging have been the developments that the Board has decided that the time has now come to treat the Kikuyu section, an area of about 20 square miles in a separate working with sufficient working capital to allow for full development to the production stage and the erection of adequate reduction and treatment plants. The same will include the whole of the present extensive workings and development at Kikuyu, as well as additional ground where new discoveries may be made. Developments at Lagerberg have been rapidly extended in recent months, also. Road and Weather Report

Mr. Gallon-Pearl writes as follows:—

Again this week there has been but slight rain in Kenya, practically none in Tanganyika, but occasional rains in Uganda. Practically the whole way the country is dry and parched, rivers in these areas have less water now than they have had for many years, and most of the springs have dried up.

Practically all roads are in good to fair condition, and as mentioned last week, the Meru-Tanga road is now reopened to traffic.

In Tanganyika there has been hardly any rain, the wettest place being Bukoba, with 1 inch and Uru-e and Anzani 1 inch, most of the reporting stations give a nil return.

Uganda has had tremendous steady rain, the eastern provinces, Lira recording nearly 3 inches. Jinja 2 inches, Kampala 21 inches. Malindi 2 inches. East Port and Tororo 11 inches. All roads are however in fair to good condition.

BRITAIN AND THE LEAGUE

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard," Sir—"Hyland" lately, in your issue of the "East African Standard" of yesterday, voices an opinion which seems, to me, to be based entirely on a stupidly neglected British outlook. It is to be hoped that you will expect that any section of the public could be so stupidly ignorant, so man feels Abyssinia is being attacked unjustly, another opinion that Italy has just cause for grievance; in one camp is developed the theory that Ethiopia's continued isolation from world affairs encourages that country to maintain status quo, thereby greatly and the rest; while another argues the benefits of Italian fascism, and does so, perhaps, honestly believing the Abyssinians have no better for themselves than accept foreign suzerainty. Your correspondence tends to present definite conclusions reached by that fabulous person "the man-in-the-street." I must question his omniscience. Premises are dangerous inductions to serious argument. While the British consular authorities in Abyssinia may have obtained, and collated much data relative to the past and current attitude and administration of the Abyssinians by the Abyssinians, so few relative facts in this connection are known to those outside the country that, where special ideas are advanced, opportunities to substantiate them in the form of concrete facts, ill-informed hypotheses.

Taking one or two points labouring by "Hyland" I would offer for what it may be worth, my personal opinion of them, thus: He comments on the obliquity of vision of the League of Nations, which is demonstrated by some harrowing picture of a semi-barbarous State granted admission to the League. Surely any sane individual must give that admittance those "backward" people, the League has gained much, and only over their and their affairs, they can reasonably expect not to be treated as inferior nations, but also to persuade such voluntary subscribers to the League, which is amenable in situations where Geneva intervention may be called for. It should be remembered that the forbearance shown in face of Italian threats. Propagation of hatred between Black and White, and between European and European. I wish to reiterate the fact again: The League of Nations Assembly has created a state of mind in the past. What earthly good can be expected from the state of mind of updating its first-born principles? I cannot but help think with shame when I read the reports of critical and arrogant parts being played by the British and French delegations, like under the role of "exponents of peace."

There is no prospect of war, the chances of which are not to be remote. I think I can safely venture to forecast that the League will particularly from those who, by having spent our late heyday under the trenches of France and Italy in the Italian front, in Montenegro, and on many other fronts. We had more than our "guts" full, then, and what was our reward? A thousand and unutilized and broken promises. Not wanted and not imagined, contemptuous and arrogant, and numerous "old soldier" and other terms, and there are gentlemen of honour who on principle would not prostitute their honour by taking hand, or part in an unparalytic and deliriously engineered war. The days of slavery have gone, and humanity has been divided by greed, envy and hatred.

Mr. Charman Agrees with Mr. Rodway

The Present System Hampers Business

WHY THE LAW IS AN ASS!

A week ago we published the views of Mr. W. G. Rodway, on certain aspects of the Kenya motor licensing law, and the need for its reform, and the views of the relative Ordinances. This week we publish the opinions of another leading motor agent and distributor on the same subject. Mr. A. H. Charman, of Messrs. Nairobi Motors Ltd., agrees with most of the views expressed by Mr. Rodway, in particular the importance of the position regarding the use of "trade" plates. He considered that as the law stands, it is difficult for motor firms to be sure whether they were within the law in any matter, particularly when using such plates after normal business hours. At present they could not be sure that they were not transgressing the law when driving a car on a home file demonstration during that time. Again, customers are often walled to take delivery of a new car at an hour when the Revenue Office was closed, and they had an undoubted right to do so. In such cases, suggested Mr. Charman, motor traders should be allowed to fit the car with "trade" plates so that it could be driven by the customer until the Revenue Office opened the next morning. This had actually happened in the past and both parties appeared to be breaking the law. But it was obvious that there was no intention of evading the payment of revenue. Mr. Charman suggested that dealers should be allowed to issue an authorized form of permit

RULES AND CONDITIONS CONTROLLING THE EVENT

Everything is all set for the grand trial and speed race meeting which is being organised by the Civil Service Club to-morrow. The venue of the fixture is the Civil Service ground, near the K.A.B. lines.

First organised some four years ago, at Muthiga, these meetings have always proved a popular attraction. While entries have on occasion been on the small side, nevertheless, they have been such as to permit of a fast and well-organised race, being carried through with the exception of one instance only.

The rules for the present meeting will be the same as those which controlled the first vintage of the Civil Service Club, held in December last. A special enclosure will be roped off for competitors situated inside the course itself. Only competitors and officials will be allowed inside the enclosure and under no circumstances whatsoever will members of the public be allowed in the vicinity of this enclosure.

Members of the public should also note that they are not allowed on the course, nor should they encroach too close to the track, or beyond that. This is not only in the interests of themselves, but also in the interest and to safeguard the riders.

It is suggested that the Kenya motor licensing law should be revised in the same way as the law in Britain, where it was possible to license a car in the middle of a quarter on payment of two-thirds of a quarter's fee, and for the last month of payment of just over a third of the fee. 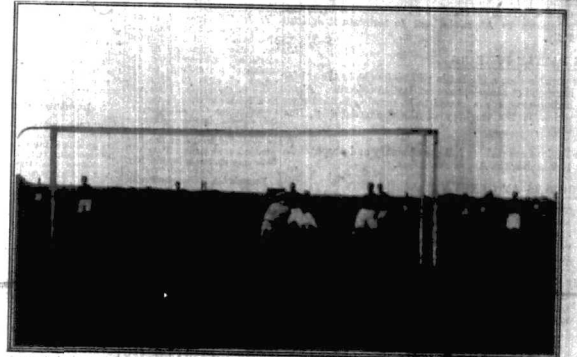

Big Range Guns

GREAT AIR FORCE CONTRIBUTES TO DOMINATING POSITION

A Reuter message from Suez states that the Italians are converting Massawa into a second Gibraltar.

Batteries of fifteen-inch guns with a range of nearly 20 miles are reported to be mounted in concealed positions among sand banks a few miles north of the base. Four-inch guns, capable of dealing with destroyers and light cruisers, command the bay.

At least five Italian submarines are in local waters.

AIR STRENGTH

The Italian Air Force in East Africa is now believed to total about 500 machines, including many bombers, a hundred of which are equipped with two machine guns each.

Three hundred and fifty planes, destined for Mogadiscio, are reported to be aboard an Italian steamer which has arrived at Djibouti.

This aerial offensive power, together with the naval fortification at Massawa, gives the Italians a dominating position in the southern half of the Red Sea.

The Mediterranean Question

(Reuter's Agency and British Official Wireless.)

London, October 17. The British Ambassador in Paris, Sir George Clerk, having concluded his visit to France, yesterday had an interview with M. Laval last night. PRINCE STARHEMBERG NOW ABSOLUTE DICTATOR

Ministers Deposed

A bloodless revolution has taken place in Austria as a result of which Prince Starhemberg is now virtually Dictator of the country.

It is stated that under the new regime, which is already causing dissatisfaction throughout the country, Austrian foreign policy will be more pro-Italian than ever.

Pro-Italian Policy

Vienna, October 17. Dr. Schuschnigg has resigned the Cabinet, in which Prince Starhemberg remains Vice-Chancellor and Dr. Berger-Wallberg Minister of Foreign Affairs. Herr Baron Felix replaces Major Fey in the House of Lords.

The distribution of forces is maintained the same but the Habsburg sources several important ministries, such as that of agriculture, and his position is regarded as having been strengthened.

Major Fey, who has been in the Cabinet for the past three years, is regarded as Prince Starhemberg's greatest rival. He has the support of approximately 30,000 Habsburg troops.

It is officially announced that Austrian auxiliary forces, numbering 20,000, are being mobilized the rival Habsburgs will be united and placed under the command of Prince Starhemberg.

AN INNOVATION IN THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The annual general meeting of the Kenya Lawn Tennis Association held at Nairobi Club on Wednesday was well attended, the following gentlemen being present:—

Messrs. R. D. England (Chairman), H. H. Dunsford and A. F. Mester (Railway), L. Prosser and R. C. Webster (Civil Service), G. Dewar and R. J. Plot (Parklands), R. C. M. Wood (Mombasa), R. J. S. Owin and A. C. Handa (Gymkhana), F. R. Peck (Rovers), L. H. Davidson (Kisumu), P. G. Galbraith (Plymouth), D. Dunsen (Nyeri), D. Tate (Muthaiga Golf Club), Gen. Sir Godfrey Rhodes, Messrs. G. I. H. Dunsford, I. Davidson, P. de V. Allen, F. Taylor, the Hon. Treasurer (Mr. E. B. Smet), and the Hon. Secretary (Mr. H. Vialon Clark).

The reports of the Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer were read and approved.

The following office-bearers were elected:—

President: Gen. Sir Godfrey Rhodes.

Vice-Presidents: Messrs. R. D. England, P. Taylor and R. Dunsford.

Hon. Vice-President: Mr. J. A. Batley.

The elected members of the Council: Messrs. P. de V. Allen, I. Davidson, G. I. H. Dunsford, F. R. Peck, and Mr. G. L. Hering.

Hon. Treasurer: Mr. E. B. Smet.

Hon. Auditor: Mr. E. J. Perrin.

Hon. Secretary: Mr. H. Vialon Clark.

The meeting decided that requests should not in future be given to individuals winning club competitions, but that any request should be handed to the club to keep as a permanent memento.

The following matters were left to the incoming Council to go into:—Running of Kenya Championships; arrangement of visits from outside teams; representative matches.

Crug Cup Competition

Mr. Dewar (Parklands) suggested that consideration might be given to an alteration in the dates allotted for the Crug Cup Competition (Ladies' Doubles League). His club felt that during the second half of the year there were so many events that players were getting a little tired.

The time suggested for the Crug Cup competition was when the East-King League was being played from the end of January, when it would probably be necessary to play matches on Sunday afterwards. This matter not being on the agenda no vote was taken on it, but the incoming Council were requested to deal with it.

At the conclusion of the meeting the Hon. Secretary, the new president, expressed the Association's thanks to Mr. R. D. England for the very able manner in which he had discharged the duties of President during the past year.

The following extracts from the Hon. Secretary's report:—

New Scoring Methods

In May last a meeting was called of representatives of affiliated clubs in Nairobi and districts to consider the question of modifications by the Association. This meeting was well attended, practically every club interested being represented.

A number of players had suggested that the method of running the leagues could be improved upon, so to play 45 games in an afternoon irrespective of sex was against the usual practice. It was decided as an experiment that the teams should consist of the usual number of players to be seen, but that each couple should play the opposing couples two long sets. A new system of scoring was also decided upon, the total number of sets won by each team being carried forward to the log, instead of two points being given for a win.

The new system of scoring certainly increased the interest in some respects, as it caused a tie between Railway and Gymkhana in the "B" Section, this being the first occasion a tie had occurred in any of the competitions. In the play-off Railway were successful, although a long and so on as to whether there would be another tie with nine sets all. The soci-commissioner mentioned, at the same time decided that it would be probable to play in the Misses Doubles in place of the Ladies' Doubles League, and commenced in October. The "Crug Cup" competition, therefore, started last week-end, although some of the matches could not be completed owing to a heavy downpour of rain. Owing to the postponement of the Crug Cup competition this event was not played at all during the year under review. Parklands as present being the address.

It was decided there should be no alterations in the rules of the Ladies' Doubles League (Crug Cup), as this continues to be played with each couple playing the opposing couples fifteen games.

The East King League, which commenced in January, has not yet been played under the new rules.

Touring Teams

As per the instructions of the last annual general meeting the outgoing Council have made every endeavour to arrange for a visit from an outside touring team, but so far without success. At one time three teams were proposed of a team coming up from South Africa to play in the Kenya championships, but at the last minute they were cancelled. We were fortunate, however, in retaining for the championships an expert representative from South Africa, who was in Kenya at the time on a holiday visit. Miss Hopkins having now an idea of local conditions has promised to do all she can to arrange for a second team from South Africa to play in the championships at some future date.

Lady Coach Visiting Kenya

Your Council have for some time had under consideration the question of the improvement of the standard of tennis by the employment of a professional coach. The time seemed hardly ripe for the Association to go to the expense of importing a professional, but as Miss Noel Wright is shortly arriving in Nairobi, it was considered a good opportunity to bid her visit. Miss Noel Wright is a most accomplished player and has been successful in many districts in Kenya towards the end of the present month.

The 1935 Championships did not show such a good profit as in 1934, this being partly due to the smaller gate. There is no doubt that if a touring team could be induced to visit and play in the Championships this item would be considerably increased.

An innovation was made this year in giving vouchers on stores to the runner-up, so that they could purchase some articles of utility of their own choice. From what one hears it appears that this met with the approval of the competitors.

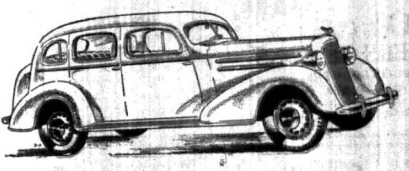

TOO MANY LAWYERS?

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir,—I should be highly obliged if you would be kind enough to allow me to express an idea through the hospitable columns of your widely read paper. This said idea which has recently struck me would be of immense benefit to lawyers of Kenya and I sincerely hope that it would do some good to our profession.

I may not be the least desired to say that lawyers are being increased annually by an unimpaired number and many of them spend a cramped life with very little earnings which hardly suffice to cover their daily expenses. I feel constrained to say that many of them have to live an obscure life while others are miserably engaged in shonkyable professions. They are contented with deplorable conditions of the times of depression. This is mostly the case with young barristers, after the completion of their studies. These gentlemen, after spending an innumerable amount of wealth are exposed to such deplorable conditions and may not be scruple to mention that all these miserable conditions are prevalent owing to the large number of lawyers, who even sazed ordinary clerks.

I can assure your worthy readers that I have every reason to believe the inherent effects of these extremely sad circumstances in the near future. In short no words of description can do full justice to the grave conditions of these young lawyers and I now venture to say that many more shall have to fall victims to the same misfortune sooner or later. All these deplorable conditions prevalent in Kenya are the result of the excessive number of barristers; and if the present conditions of the lawyers continue in the same miserable way, I can assure you, Sir, that the value of a barrister would be no more than an ordinary artisan and the ill fate of those who would be arriving in future can be realized by you. This excessive number of barristers has brought about such a grave circumstances that the profession in question has become undignified and unprofitable. I readily see the authorities concerned to take such the urgent steps to eliminate the said condition.

I have the anxiety to put forward my beneficial suggestion for the favorable consideration of the authorities concerned. I sincerely suggest that all the lawyers who are over sixty years of age should be retired from the profession. This method would be of incalculable benefit to the young barristers, otherwise there is very little possibility of their prospering and happiness. If the advocates of sixty or seventy years are made to retire then there would be ample scope for the young barristers to flourish; and this is only the most salable way to alleviate their sorrow and suffering. This suggestion hardly needs any elaboration as retirement after the age of sixty or seventy is often a practice in Government departments. So, if I do not find any reason why the authorities concerned should not put in force the said policy, I can assure you, so as to give opportunity to the new generation. If this suggestion is ignored then, I can assure there would be very little prospects for the young barristers to prosper.

So, I urge the authorities concerned to take the necessary steps to alleviate the above mentioned grievous which are most undesirable and to make this profession more prospective. This object can only be achieved when these barristers who are over sixty or seventy years are made to retire from the profession.

This main point is about the remittances either to Goa or India by civil servants. I can assure your correspondent that if he analyses the remittances to India by merchants, artisans and civil servants he will easily find that the civil servants stand high. He must not forget to compare the proportion of population also, while comparing the remittances. Also, he is trying to avoid mentioning that the Indian community owns large property in this country which was not possessed of without payment or investing. I can assure your correspondent that the Indians have invested more in this country than his community which is mostly in employment in the Civil Service and most of the civil servants are Indian. This amount is remitted to India.
