The Old School Try It is amusing and rather shocking to find that in the midst of a war which is daily proving the worth of the so-called "common people" an Army officer of high rank can address to The Times the kind of letter from which we extract one day this week. Lieutenant-Colonel R. C. Bingham appears to be a relic of Feudalism but the important thing is that he does represent a section of society which still refuses to recognize that the days of privilege based on the tradition of caste are passing and that more and more in the future the lot will be not that a man can trace his ancestry back for several

centuries but that he has the qualities of a good citizen, the ability and willingness to use his intelligence for the good of all irrespective of class. Such ideas are anathema to people like Colonel Bingham who is all too ready to see the inevitable subservience to their betters. Colonel Bingham, we are told, is commander of an office cadet training unit, a 50-year-old Ethiopian, son of the late Major-General Bingham and grandson of the fourth Earl of Essex. He has had a distinguished military career and won the D.S.O., but his social outlook is to say the least of 14 centuries ago. He is horrified that members of the lower classes should be allowed to serve as officers and he says: "Never was the old school tie and what it stands for more justified than today. Our war armies are being led by classes of society new to the job. The middle, lower middle and working classes are now receiving the King's commission. These classes, unlike the old aristocratic classes, never had any special training, and they had no one to think of themselves. This aspect of life is completely new to them, and they, very largely, have fallen down on it in their capacity as Army officers. We have had to know that these curious views (curious indeed in a war we are waged for the service of the democratic way of life) are supported by the War Office and that the Chief of the Imperial General Staff has to tribute officers from the 'lower classes' who are proving their worth in a war as they did in the last."

It is people like Colonel Bingham who have tended to bring the old who are in a dispute, to cause what should be a legitimate source of pride to be considered as a crude class distinction. It is not surprising that the phrase nowadays is conveniently used to indicate the false and dangerous loyalties of public school men in high political or administrative office which sustain, conceal and even exalt inefficiency (and worse) which has by common public-school tradition, been regarded as the future of the British race. The ideas of people like Colonel Bingham are for the most part considered so out of date as to call for amused comment by men of cultivated folk. Mr. Wendell Willkie and other distinguished neutrals who have visited Britain in recent weeks have been struck by its spirit of unity and common purpose—old school or class distinctions and the King himself has set an example, for the message which more than any other, shines through his speeches is that: "It is a message of co-operation by all who truly believe in democracy and have faith in its power to defeat the evil of totalitarianism."

Under the Standard. The East African Standard learns that Mr. C. W. Hartman, who stands as a candidate for Legislative Council representation in the Nairobi constituency, the seat having been vacated by the death of the Earl of Bessell. It will be recalled that Mr. C. W. Hartman recently accepted an invitation to offer himself for election in the same constituency.

FARMING PROBLEMS OF SOTIK

Dairying On A Large Scale Advocated

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT]

On Tuesday, February 11, there was a well-attended meeting at the Sotik Estate, Sotik, when Mr. H. Burton, Director of Agriculture, was present. Mr. H. Burton, Mr. Oates and Mr. K. Danks of the Agricultural Commission, Captain Hishop, was also present. After the meeting started there was a conference with the local representatives of the District and Man Power Committees. The Chairman was Mr. H. Burton.

Mr. H. Burton in opening his remarks said he was delighted to have the opportunity of meeting with the representatives of the preceding conference. The one thing that was obvious was that Sotik was a dairy district. This precluded the economic growth of any other industry. It was necessary to stand the high cost of transport. It was necessary to have a concentration on such enterprises as dairying, stock raising, poultry and pig raising. Coffee, tea, and other crops were not so profitable under the head, but it was better. There would perhaps have to be a change in the future and dairying being as the market here, would be a large scale was the obvious industry. It was necessary to have a good market for a district with such a high standard of living.

Mr. H. Burton proposed to discuss dairying and give it as his opinion that a creamery in Sotik would be several years before it could be profitable. He did not consider it likely that a creamery could be profitable in the district. In the present state of the district, it was necessary to send cream to the nearest creamery at a considerable loss. A sweetening policy in Nairobi at least, will learn with a certain amount of public aid to loosen the black-out regulations so far as the public is concerned. A notice in the Official Gazette when translated into plain English means that the condition governing the black-out regulations in Nairobi will not be so onerous as they have been up to the present. It will be no longer necessary to take elaborate pains to guard against any light whatsoever escaping from a room and it may be possible to ensure that as people act in a commonsense way the authorities will not take action. In the explanation of the new order which we publish in another column it will be observed that the regulations continue to ban the showing of naked or very bright lights and that it is essential still to screen windows with reasonably thick curtaining material.

The authorities wisely insist that the black-out arrangements so far in operation should become complete unless as there are careless individuals in all communities there will be practice black-outs from time to time just to remind everyone that the possibility of air raids cannot be dismissed entirely. From this source did threaten, the full precautions could be at once imposed in the public mind. If we have any doubt about how the new order affects them should consult their own air raid wardens or the police. We suggest that in order that the advice tendered by these authorities should be nearly uniform as far as possible they should themselves have practical demonstrations of what would constitute a breach of the law rendering the people responsible liable to prosecution. It is suggested that air raid wardens or the police, who are rejecting that it has been found necessary to relax the regulations at the height of the hot season will sympathize with their neighbours in the scattered Nairobi District Council area, and with residents in certain wards in the Nairobi District Council area and at the Coast. It is suggested that the air raid wardens or the police have no control cannot share in the relaxation of the restrictions. We and they must accept the responsibility of the public interest and in the meantime they can take what comfort they can from the assurance that the whole black-out question is continuously under examination by all the responsible authorities and that the possibility of further relaxation is not entirely ruled out.

It remains to be seen whether the restrictions which though they may still seem to be irksome in some districts, are regarded as having been framed in the public interest. They are meant of course to apply equally to all sections of the community, to the military as well as the civil population, and we hope that there will be no complaint legitimate that their application in practice appears to be comprehensive.

before the next full meeting suggested, but that the project be deferred.

Railway Cartage Charges

The question of Railway cartage charges was one of the matters dealt with at Friday's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce, when it decided, with one dissenting vote, that the matter be deferred until at least the end of the financial year, when a report should be prepared, or that the Railway might be asked to consider reducing the charges and retaining the services of the cartage contractors.

THE K.R.B. & H. had submitted a memorandum requesting that the cartage charges on traffic forwarded from Nairobi, which at present is paid to the cartage firms, be paid to the Railway.

Mr. A. L. Doherty said that the object of the report appeared to be the elimination of the cartage charges in carting and shunting cartage charges by the Railway. He said he was a similar proposal to the Railway as well as for the cartage firms. He proposed that the cartage firms should be asked to consider reducing the charges and retaining the services of the cartage contractors.
