Britain Will Send No War Material To Spain

Board of Trade's Prompt Decision

NO WAITING FOR OTHER NATIONS

Berlin Angry Again

SPANISH GOVERNMENT WARSHIP SEARCHES GERMAN STEAMER

News bearing on the Spanish war came from a wide variety of sources yesterday.

One of the most important messages announced that, without waiting for an international agreement, the British Board of Trade has revoked all export licences for war materials and aircraft to Spain or Spanish possessions.

Another 'incident' has angered Berlin, and the most serious war is taken of the action of a Government warship in stopping and searching a German steamer carrying Spanish refugees.

Reports from Spain itself tell of Government success, one from Madrid claiming an advance on the Guadarrama front and the other, from Hendaye, stating that the Government forces have pushed back the Rebel line near Irun.

Loyalist Victories

Without awaiting the conclusion of an international agreement, the Board of Trade yesterday revoked all licences for the export of all descriptions of arms, ammunition and aircraft to Spain or Spanish possessions.

Gas Story Denied

The Spanish Embassy in London has been authorized by the Government to deny the report of their intention to use poison gas bombs.

Rebels Forced Back

Reports from Hendaye state that the advance of a terrific battle with the Spanish Government forces forced back the insurgents in the Iron sector, and even repulsed some territory.

Air Force Revived?

A Paris message, received from London, reported that an insurgent aeroplane was shot down by the Government forces near the town of Hendaye.

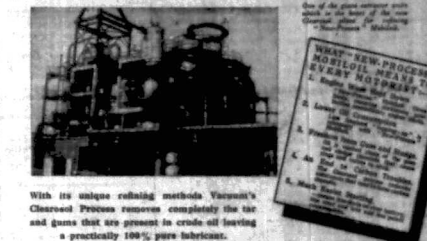

# The Future of Communism in France

### "The French Mentality Precludes

### Communism as well as Fascism"

and the general trend in France the Communist Party was remarkably successful, and the question of its future is a burning one. The results of the elections indicate that an increasing proportion of Frenchmen is favourably inclined towards the idea of revolutionary Marxism? No such a conclusion certainly would be wrong. The vast majority of those who voted for Communist candidates are anxious to change the existing economic and social order. What they want is the preservation of democratic institutions and the prevention of any restrictions of their liberties. They understand little or nothing of Marxism. Their political views do not differ considerably from those of the rest of the millions of workers, peasants, craftsmen and shopkeepers who voted for socialists of the bourgeois radicals. They were dissatisfied with the policies of past governments, and particularly with the agrarian theories of the Laval administration.

**Cling Fast to Property**  
French middle class people cling fast to their property. The small man who has invested his savings in state bonds and shares of banks or industrial concerns is not likely to be swayed by the theories of the Communist party. He would resist any change hurting him into the penultimate. Many workers, too, are accumulating whatever they can for their old age. Even among the workers there

are comparatively few convinced adherents of communism. A small fraction of them only are members of the Communist party, whose present total membership—including a large number of intellectuals—does not exceed 85,000. There is no other single party in France which has a membership of more than 100,000. The Workers and Central Europe that

is dedicated to so much disinterestedly towards communism or collectivism than the French are. They are individualists and their individualism seems to ultimate fairly any movement tending to make the State all-powerful. This naturally precludes communism as well as fascism.

**Their Combats are Not Lasting**  
It must be emphasized that Frenchmen combine most, or less

spontaneously for the attainment of an objective and immediately realizable. But their combats are not lasting. As soon as their aim is reached, they disperse again. Hence, for instance, strikes of sympathy can be arranged easily. But the workers do not organize in strong trade

unions which would be permanent instruments for the protection of their interests.

#### Social Reform in the Principal

The communist role in the reform has not been as large as it did not be for the fact that the French Communist Party has not been able to effect a stronger transformation. It no longer stresses the necessity of revolutionary action but, from all appearances, makes itself conform to the present principal task. It was the General Secretary of the Party, M. Maurice Thorez, who, in October 1934, put forward the proposal to form a people's front for liberty, work and peace. During 1935 the Communist Party took an important part in the actual formation of the coalition between the communists, socialists and bourgeois radicals. The programme of the People's Front does not contain anything that could be revolutionary.

#### The People's Front

In June 1936 the Communist Party issued a manifesto expressing its faith in the firmness of M. Leon Blum's government and promising to support it. The manifesto, however, stated the programme of the People's Front. It envisaged widely from the revisionist communist doctrine. Mr. Blum in his recent published book, "France today and the People's Front" (p. 177). The Communist Party refused to treat all capitalist parties as a single reactionary mass, or to believe that on the social changes toward there are only two forces, the bourgeoisie and the proletariat. The author stresses the necessity of "tempers" or lasting alliances between the workers and the democratic middle classes "in order to prevent the outbreak of fascism in France and to change the nature of the State from an authoritarian one to a democratic one."

#### The Trade Union Movement

Another unmistakable sign of the declining influence of revolutionary Marxism in France is the disappearance of the communist trade unions which existed for 15 years. In March 1936 the confederation generale du Travail was formed in France. The reformist delegates represented 600,000 members and the communist delegates 200,000 members. It is highly interesting that the communist trade union movement the communists could obtain a decisive influence. 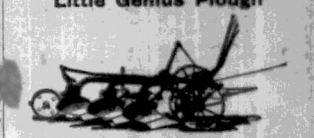

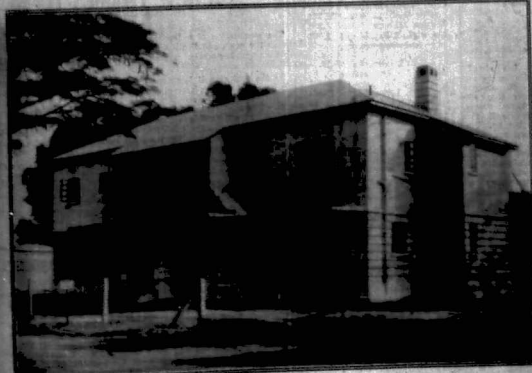

# Serious Situation in Palestine

## BRITAIN SHOCKED BY OUTRAGE AT JAFFA

### High Commissioner Issues Communique

CURFEW ORDER ENFORCED

(JERUSALEM SPECIAL AGENT'S REPORT.)  
 Jerusalem, August 14.—Palestine experienced a number of outrages last night. Names Naari, the Mayor of Hebron, was murdered by a mob and several others injured by a bomb. The Jewish watchman in a village on the Plain of Sharon died from wounds inflicted by a sniper.

A Jewish family, including three children, was practically wiped out by Arabs who made a concerted attack on their quarters with bombs and rifles.

Another outrage shocked Palestine last night. On this occasion Jaffa was the scene of the crime, in which two Jewish women, taking an evening stroll, were shot.

The situation in Jaffa and Tel-Aviv, where a Jewish girl was killed and several others injured by a bomb, the day before yesterday, is regarded as a serious one.

The drastic measure has been taken of ordering all the inhabitants of Jaffa to remain in their homes from eight a.m. to-day until five a.m. to-morrow. It is understood that this order not only shows the view taken by the authorities, but also indicates a community punishment for last night's dastardly murder.

The recent recurrence of violence in Palestine, of which the latest example is the shooting on Monday with fatal results of two Jewish nurses attached to the Government Hospital at Jaffa, has deeply shocked opinion here. The crime has been severely condemned by the Arab National Committee at Jaffa, and the Jewish National Assembly has decided to send deputations to wait on the High Commissioner and discuss the situation with him.

A communique issued in Jerusalem yesterday says: "The High Commissioner expresses his deepest sorrow and abhorrence at the recent brutal murders and attacks made on perfectly innocent persons. He is confident that the use of force will secure the removal of these individuals the whole people of Palestine will share his detestation of these horrible crimes, culminating in the murder in Jaffa of two Jewish nurses returning to Jaffa Government Hospital, where they had devoted themselves to the healing of the sick, regardless of race or creed. The High Commissioner relies on all members of the public to assist the authorities in the prosecution of all acts of attempted murder and violence."—British Official Wireless Service.

# Bond Scheme Turned Down by Secretary of State

## Objections to Mortgage Relief Plan

### "SERIOUS EFFECT ON FINANCE OF COLONY"

#### "Hardship to Creditors"

#### MR. GRIMSBY GORE SUGGESTS VOLUNTARY SETTLEMENT BASIS

The scheme prepared by the Standing Board of Economic Development for the discharge of mortgages on farms by the issue of long-dated Government Bonds, has been disapproved by the Secretary of State.

The Board's Memorandum, setting out the scheme, which provides for the transfer of securities from the present private creditors to the Government, was sent to the Colonial Office by His Excellency the Governor on April 15 of this year, and in a despatch to the Governor of Kenya, dated July 30, Mr. Ormsby Gore states:

"The scheme is open to so many fundamental objections that its introduction would fall in its object of alleviating the position of the settlers. Moreover the financial stability of the Colony as a whole would be seriously affected."

Dealing his objections, Mr. Ormsby Gore quotes the opinion that the strength of depression has not reached and states "to impose a settlement on creditors, just at the moment when their prospects are improving, might . . . be regarded as unjust."

He contends that after a debtor's obligation to Government had been defined he would be no better off, but rather worse, in his efforts to obtain cheap finance for his farm operations. There would be many problems in regard to valuation, and Government would have no difficulty than private mortgagees on the falling of the value of the property mortgaged to the farmer community.

The most serious objection is that concerning the financial position of Government, the ultimate liability of which, it is held, might be greater than the £4,000,000 expected. The event of failure by individual farmers would have a cumulative effect on the solvency of the whole country.

"Any direct intervention by Government" the despatch concludes "should be based on the principle of voluntary settlement. . . Government can and should play its part in this process by means of . . . a Conciliation Board and . . . assistance from the Land Bank."

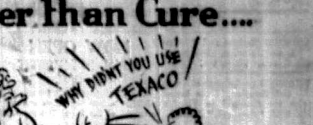

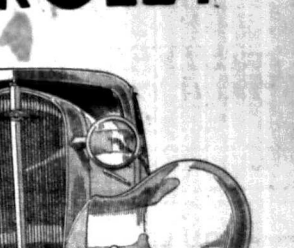

## TEA PROSPECTS AT TORO

(Continued from page 5).

Visual Commission and District Agricultural Officer inspected the existing tea at a short report.

It appeared that the number of hectares at present cultivated in the Kilgoris Division was roughly 500 hectares, requirements for 1968. Captain Njoroge outlined a scheme whereby boys who worked regularly for six months would receive a bonus of Sh.150 per month at the end of that period. It is pointed out that he hoped thereby to obtain a greater number of working days from the labourer and this would greatly use of the available labour force, and that if mature could be persuaded to turn out more regularly, the standard of their work would improve.

Mr. Freyhold stated that he had had a similar scheme but had found no response from the natives; Mr. Chini thought that one of the reasons of the shortage was an insufficient supply of food. It was understood that Mr. Mbitia, a District Officer, would be visiting Toru during August to appraise into these problems.

The Secretary informed the meeting that the cost of coffee had been purchased by the Association from Mr. Mellin's estate and would be sold to Government at the Johannesburg Exhibition.

### Lake Albert Road

The President stated that the Hon. the Chief Secretary if he could give any information as to the Hillside Lake Albert being constructed in the near future. The Hon. the Secretary replied that the road to Tororo would, in any case, have to be completed first, and that it was still to be proved that the Lake Albert road was necessary. He also enquired as to the possible future of Kilgoris Mills. Captain Buchanan said that he understood that, if production was allowed to continue, they would need to invest some 100 tons of copper daily and suggested that the Kilgoris road would not be able to deal with such a large volume of traffic. Captain Njoroge suggested that a temporary road might be constructed to Lake Albert to give a temporary relief to the traffic. The Association agreed that this road is an important and necessary scheme for development for the Western Province.

As it had been long known that the President of the 4th King's African Rifles would not be visiting Toru until July 1967 it was decided to hold an Association dinner this year.

### Coffee Controversy

The President stated that, at the last meeting of the Uganda Coffee Board, it had been decided that the Board should be represented at the Inter-territorial Coffee Conference to be held in Nairobi at the end of September. The Hon. the Director of Agriculture had suggested that two delegates and four non-official delegates should attend one of the latter to be the President of the Two Provinces Association. The meeting considered it essential that there should be no representation and endorsed this suggestion.

## CHINESE TREASURES FOR CANADA

### Feature of Vancouver Jubilee

Word has been received here that the Chinese government has granted permission to the Chinese Caravel Board of the Vancouver Jubilee Committee to bring to Vancouver a number of Chinese curios and antiques.

Some of these treasures, recently taken from private collections, are 4,000 years old. They will be exhibited in the Chinese section which is to be a feature of the Jubilee celebration.

The Jubilee was officially opened on July 1 by Mr. E. H. Bennett, former Vice-Minister of Canada, and will continue until September 1. It is expected that Canada's short stay will play host to about a million visitors from all parts of the world.

### Mr. Hore-Bullin Appeals to Historians

(By Mail)

There have been 2,500 more people injured on the roads this year than last year and this was a historian, said Mr. Hore-Bullin, appearing in a broadcast for the incorporation of the public in reducing accidents. Fifty nine people were killed in 1966, he said, and there had been an improvement over a greater part of Britain. The average number of accidents and those injured were: London, 1,200; Manchester, 700; Newcastle, 410; Coventry, 128; Sheffield, Nottingham and Blackburn (each), 100 each; and Doncaster, Hammersmith and West Sussex, 70.

"I do not attribute blame to the authorities in these areas," he said, "they are doing their best. But I want to warn the public and especially the young to be careful in these districts. Police have been taking a course and the houses were not up, and 800 fewer have been injured this year. The whole of the 2,500 increase is made up of motorists and cyclists, and I call those who may use either to be completely under control, involve you or someone in libelous proceedings."

Because it is out of date, though completed only nine years ago, as a cost of £600,000, the roads are to be replaced in total dual carriage ways, cycle-roads, and footpaths to improve the public safety and to cope with increasing traffic.

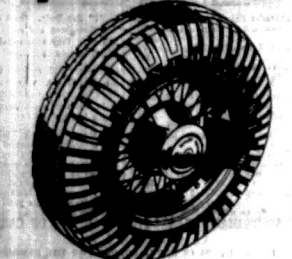

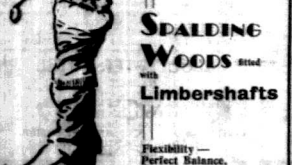
