OR ANY ATTEMPT TO INCREASE THE FISCAL BURDEN

Confident of Colony's Support

NOT PREPARED TO BE RUSHED INTO PIECE-MEAL ADOPTION OF PIM REPORT

The European Elected Members of the Kenya Legislative Council met at the beginning of this week to discuss the Pim Report.

Their unanimous decision to oppose the taxation proposals is announced in the following letter addressed to the East African Standard by Lord Francis Scott.

The Elected Members are confident the country will support them in opposing any proposals by Government to increase the burden of taxation by making permanent the temporary taxes voluntarily borne by the community in a time of emergency.

They are not prepared to be rushed into effecting only such proposals as commend themselves to Government.

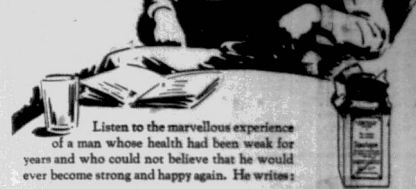

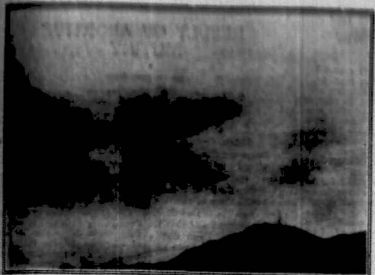

# Brighter Outlook for Forestry Department

## CAUSED BY BETTER ECONOMIC AND WEATHER CONDITIONS

### First Profit for Five Years

The report adds that it became obvious that the prolonged economic depression was lifting and though a drastic economy still continued work was carried out on an entirely different and distinctly hopeful atmosphere which was an enormous relief after the experiences of recent years.

For the first time since 1920 the revenue for the year showed an increase over the preceding year. The revenue of £20,273 being the highest since 1930 and the expenditure, of £20,612 being the lowest since 1926. The surplus on the year's working was £661 as compared with a deficit of £2,244 in the previous year.

# Research Work

The improvement was greatly aided by the partial breaking of the drought conditions which had prevailed for three years. Some districts continued to suffer but in general the rainfall for the year was not so far from normal as it had been so constant, and established once more the old healthy and growing conditions which were vital for the Department's work.

During the year a Select Committee on Economy, and as regards the Forestry Department, recommended that the year's expenditure should not exceed £1,000,000, but that the year's income should be £1,000,000.

### Forest Protection

With regard to forest protection it is stated that the year was a success. The total area of forest was 1,000,000 acres, an increase of 100,000 acres over the previous year. There were 84 outbreaks of fire, an increase of 100 over the previous year. The total expenditure on forest protection was £1,000,000.

### Increased Demand

The report states that the demand for forest products steadily increased and in fact the demand for forest products was 100 per cent. more than in the previous year.

and it wounded. The Government troops are preparing to resume the offensive at daybreak.

After the explosion, the survivors launched a fierce counter-attack, harassing the invaders with grenades and trench mortars. The Government troops were subsequently ordered to take the ruins, after which the Government military possessed the strategic quarters of the fortress with a rain of shells, while the Government troops erected strong barricades from which to start a new resistance. The infantry offensive resumed later in the day, and the Government appeared to make a considerable advance.

A message from Madrid stated that about 100 insurgents, including women and children, had taken refuge in the cellars of the Alcazar and were silent by the explosion.

new Civil Government and the military commander have arrived from Madrid and two thousand Government troops are expected today. As far as is at present known in London all British subjects remaining in Malaga have been evacuated to the British cruiser "Shropshire," only one British destroyer remaining at Malaga.

Red Cross Consent

Paris, Sept. 18.

The International League of Red Cross Societies has announced that the Spanish Government forces and the insurgents have undertaken to respect the Geneva Convention and the Red Cross and have agreed to the withdrawal of women and children.

Plight of Refugees

Brugby, Sept. 19.

A letter appeared in the morning papers, signed by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, the Archbishop of Westminster and others, appealing for funds for British refugees from Spain. Many of whom have reached England severely destitute. About 800 are being maintained from charitable funds and a comparable number, still in Gibraltar and Malaga, are also dependent on charity. Harrowing conditions are cited of men and women who have spent most of their lives in Spain and have built up professional, business or professional connections and everything down to their spiritual and personal effects. A committee has been formed to organize help for refugees—British Official Wireless Service.

Drusch in Walls

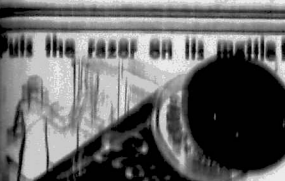

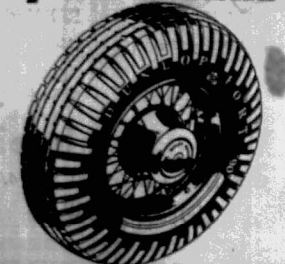
