VENUS SPACE RACE OFF COURSE

Chance to correct 500,000 mile error

AMERICA'S Venus probe Mariner II was yesterday slightly off course as it headed deep into space on a 189,000,000-mile journey towards the mysterious cloud-encrusted planet.

The 12½-ton spacecraft was launched on the top of an Atlas-Agena booster rocket, but excessive roll during the first of the first-stage jet off course. Five hours after the launching, officials said that Mariner II would miss Venus by some 600,000 miles instead of the 10,000 miles planned.

This would put the "excess" beyond the range of the spacecraft's six sensitive radionics which are the temperature and other features of Venus. Officials hope, however, to be able partially to correct matter by firing a special little rocket which can alter the spacecraft's course by up to 500,000 miles.

U.S. second Venus probe

Officials emphasized, however, that the estimate of the "miss" was based on preliminary data and "re-orientation" of it by computers could show that the spacecraft could bring its radiators within range.

A progress report on the calculations and on Mariner II's 109-day journey was expected late last night when the probe is expected to be 113,294 miles from the earth.

Mariner II is the second spaceship launched by the United States to find out something about Venus — which it will pass in 20 minutes. Mariner I was destroyed on July 22. Yesterday's launching had been delayed 24 hours by a short-circuit in the electrical system of the probe.

New plans for the 'forgotten' men

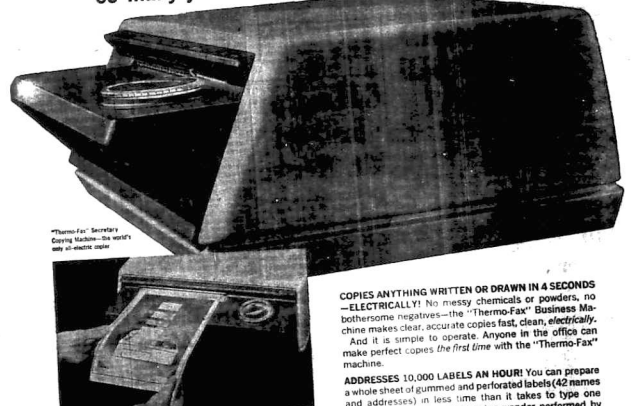

Kenya reunite as Federation

PRESIDENT THOMBE yesterday accepted the plan put forward by the U.N. Acting Secretary-General, U. Thant, for reuniting Katanga with the Congo, and declared: "A new era is now starting."

His agreement came on the last day of the 10-day time limit set for acceptance of the plan. The Katangese reply declared that the plan "tends to have the character of an ultimatum" but said its proposals "constitute the basis of an acceptable settlement."

Diplomatic sources in Elisabethville described the Katangese reply as "amenable." It was noted that the United Nations chief representative in Katanga, and the United Nations chief representative in the Congo, had both said they were satisfied with the plan. The plan envisages a central federal government with states having the right to fix taxes and control immigration, posts and communications.

'Step to real solution'

The agreement came on the last day of the 10-day time limit set for acceptance of the plan. The Katangese reply declared that the plan "tends to have the character of an ultimatum" but said its proposals "constitute the basis of an acceptable settlement."
